Whereas, the District and the SBCCDTA have been presented with a comprehensive outline detailing the roles of the local Academic Senates in managing recommending course maximums, and their proposed implementation process at each campus, and

Whereas, both the District and SBCCDTA acknowledge the necessity for a temporary pause in the arbitration process to continue discussions at the negotiation table and to seek recommendations from the academic senates, and on the issue of "zero load" courses until the SBVC and CHC Academic Senates' course maximums process is fully established, and

Whereas, the District and the SBCCDTA mutually recognize and respect the individual processes implemented by each college within SBCCD for their recommendations on course maximums,

Therefore, let it be resolved that the District and SBCCDTA agree to hold all arbitration proceedings until an agreement is reached at the table. cease all—"zero load" class scheduling for all affected courses starting in Spring semester of 2024, until the Academic Senates' prescribed course maximum process is fully in place and operational, and District and SBCCDTA complete all negotiations on "zero load" workload issue.
