



Between 2017-18 and 2021-22, the number of unduplicated students served via distance learning has increased (+7,703 students, 13,316 in 2017-18, 21,019 in 2021-22, a 57.8% increase). The number of enrollments via distance learning has increased (+44,495 students, 27,948 in 2017-18, 72,443 in 2021-22, a 257.9% increase).

Distance Education Enrollments: 2017-18 Through 2021-22



Demographic Comparison of Students who Enrolled in Face-to-Face, Hybrid, and Fully Online Courses By Ethnic Group: 2021-22



Compared to their representation in fully online and hybrid courses, African American students were underrepresented in face-to-face courses. White students were more prominent in face-to-face courses than in fully online and hybrid courses.

Demographic Comparison of Students who Enrolled in Face-to-Face, Hybrid, and Fully Online Courses By Gender: 2021-22



Significant differences were observed in the gender ratio of instructional methods. In fully online courses, 62.3% of the unduplicated population were female while 36.9% were male. More female than male students enrolled in fully online courses.

Demographic Comparison of Students who Enrolled in Face-to-Face, Hybrid, and Fully Online Courses By Age Group: 2021-22








On average, between 2017-18 and 2021-22, the success rate of face-to-face courses was higher than the success rates of the hybrid and fully online courses (72.3% vs 66.3% vs 67.2%). Over the period, the success rate of the fully online courses increased by 1.5% from 64.6% in 2017-18 to 66.1% in 2021-22. However, the success rate of fully online courses in 2021-22 is still 5.1% lower than face-to-face courses.







In 2021-22, female and male students had statistically significant higher success rates in face-to-face courses than in fully online courses. Male students had statistically significant higher success rates in face-to-face courses than in hybrid courses while female students had statistically significant lower success rates in face-to-face courses than in hybrid courses.

Course Success Rate By Course Delivery Methods and Age Group: 2021-22





On average, between 2017-18 and 2021-22, the retention rate of face-to-face courses was higher than the retention rates of hybrid and fully online courses (90.2% vs 86.4% vs 87.0%). Over the period, the retention rate of fully online courses increased by 2.3% from 84.8% to 87.1%. However, the retention rate of fully online courses in 2021-22 is still 3.2% lower than face-to-face courses.

Course Retention Rate By Course Delivery Methods and Ethnic Group: 2021-22



Course Retention Rate By Course Delivery Methods and Gender: 2021-22


