





Between 2018-19 and 2022-23, the number of unduplicated students served via distance learning has increased (+4,648 students, 14,371 in 2018-19, 19,019 in 2022-23, a 32.3% increase). The number of enrollments via distance learning has increased (+30,930 students, 31,262 in 2018-19, 62,192 in 2022-23, a 98.9% increase).



Between 2018-19 and 2022-23, the percentage of students who enrolled in fully online courses increased by 9.0% from 79.2% to 88.2%.





Significant differences were observed in the gender ratio of instructional methods. In fully online courses, 61.1% of the unduplicated population were female while 38.5% were male. More female than male students enrolled in fully online courses.



The median age for students in fully online courses was older than the median age of the hybrid and face-to-face course students (23, 22, and 22, respectively).




On average, between 2018-19 and 2022-23, the success rate of face-to-face courses was higher than the success rates of the hybrid and fully online courses (73.2% vs 67.9% vs 67.1%). Over the period, the success rate of the fully online courses declined by 1.0% from 66.8% in 2018-19 to 65.8% in 2022-23. The success rate of fully online courses in 2022-23 is still 8.6% lower than face-to-face courses.



Asian students had a statistically significant higher success rate in face-to-face courses than in fully online courses.


In 2022-23, female and male students had statistically significant higher success rates in face-to-face courses than in hybrid and fully online courses.




On average, between 2018-19 and 2022-23, the retention rate of face-to-face courses was higher than the retention rates of hybrid and fully online courses (90.5% vs 87.3% vs 87.1%). Over the period, the retention rate of fully online courses increased by 0.8% from 85.8% to 86.6%. However, the retention rate of fully online courses in 2022-23 is still 4.6% lower than face-to-face courses.


