



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General Population – Service Area Cities 2010-2022



The San Bernardino Community College District service area represents 28.3% of the total San Bernardino County population. The top 3 cities – San Bernardino, Rialto, and Redlands represent about 64.5% of the service area population. The service area population declined by 0.5 percent to 616,367 between 2020 and 2022. Service area cities with the largest numeric growth were San Bernardino (+12,100), Riato (+4,879), Redlands (+4,186), and Highland (+3,811). Fastest growing service area cities are Calimesa (8.7%), and Loma Linda (1.4%).



Ethnically, the population of the SBCCD service area cities is 58.9% Hispanic, 23.6% White, 8.9% African American, 5.2% Asian, 2.5% Two or More Race, 0.2% American Indians/Alaska Natives, 0.3% Pacific Islander, and 0.4% Some other race. In Rialto, Colton, and San Bernardino, more than 65% of the residents are Hispanic. In Big Bear Lake, Calimesa, and Yucaipa, more than 55% of the residents are White. In Loma Linda, 24.9% of the residents are Asian.

Gender Distribution: 2021



Age Range Distribution: 2021





The two largest age groups in the SBCCD's service Area cities are residents under 15 years of age (22.2%) and residents 55 years of age or older (22.4%). Together these ages groups make up nearly 44.6% of the service area population. The median age in the SBCCD service area population is 36.2 years old, which is older than the county's median age.

The median age in Big Bear is the highest in the service area at 45.3 years. Calimesa's median age of 44.2 years is the next highest. Riato had the lowest median age (31.0 years), followed by San Bernardino (31.3 years).



Among the civilian population 18 years and older, 5.0 percent of the service area population are veterans, which is lower than the state's percentage (5.5%). The service area city with the highest percentage of veterans is Calimesa (10.3%). Grand Terrace (8.4%), Big Bear Lake (7.9%), and Redlands (6.8%) follow.

Disability Status - Civilian Noninstitutionalized Population: 2021





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



Approximately 15.4 percent of the service area residents are below the federal poverty level. The poverty level for a household of four in 2021 was an annual income of \$26,500.





Among adults aged 25 and older, approximately fifty percent of the service area population have a high school diploma or lower, while 29.0 percent have a college degree (Associates degree or higher). Over 55 percent of the residents in San Bernardino (60.6%), Rialto (59.2%), and Colton (54.4%) have a high school diploma or have not completed High School. About 50% of the residents in Loma Linda (60.2%) and Redlands (51.3%) hold college degrees.






The box plots above show the summary of the minimum income, first quartile, median, third quartile, and maximum income for each education level. Educational attainment is strongly correlated with median incomes, per the Census Bureau's data. The median annual earning of the residents who hold a high school diploma or did not complete high school was lower than the residents who hold a college degree. The median annual earnings were different among the 10 service area cities. Redlands (\$53,320) and Yucaipa (\$49,630) had the highest median earnings, while San Bernardino (\$33,564), and Rialto (\$36,613) had the lowest median earnings.

During the 2021-2022 Academic year, 9,517 students graduated from service area high schools. This was a decrease of 249 students over the 2017-18-2021-22 academic year. Yucaipa-Calimesa Unified School District (6.5%) had the largest increase in the number of graduates. However, Bear Valley (-11.1%), Redlands (-5.8%), and Rialto (-4.9%) Unified School Districts had the largest decrease in the number of graduates.



Feeder Public School Enrollments By Grade Levels, 2017-18 Through 2021-22




