



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

The San Bernardino Community College District student population declined by 22.2%, from 19,939 in Fall 2017 to 15,504 in Fall 2021, with a five-year average of 18,962. Overall, San Bernardino Valley College represented 68.0% of the student population, and Crafton Hills College represented 32.0% of the student population. A decrease in the number of students was observed at Crafton Hills College (-15.4%) and San Bernardino Valley College (-24.4%).

Racial/Ethnicity Distribution: SBCCD





In the Fall 2021 semester, 81.8% of the SBCCD student population were from historically underrepresented racial/ethnic groups. Over the past five years, there has been an increase in Hispanic and Asian students and a decrease in White and African American students.

Between Fall 2017 and Fall 2021, the greatest decrease in the number of students was observed among Hispanic (-2,493), White (-1,055), and Black or African American (-607) students. Over this same period, an increase in the number of students was observed for unknown race (+70) students.

Racial/Ethnicity Distribution: Crafton Hills College






In the Fall 2021 semester, 67.3% of the CHC student population were from historically underrepresented racial/ethnic groups. Over the past five years, there has been an increase in Hispanic, Asian, and Two more race students and a decrease in White, Black or African American, and American Indian/Alaska students.

Between Fall 2017 and Fall 2021, the greatest decrease in the number of students was observed among White (-511), Hispanic (-345), Two or more race (-60), Black or African American (-54), and Asian/Pacific Islander (-23) students. Over this same period, an increase in the number of students was observed for unknown race (+33) students.







In the Fall 2021 semester, 88.8% of the SBVC student population were from historically underrepresented racial/ethnic groups. Over the past five years, there has been an increase in Hispanic and Asian students and a decrease in White and Black or African American students.

Between Fall 2017 and Fall 2021, the greatest decrease in the number of students was observed among Hispanic (-2,143), Black or African American (-549), White (-544), Asian/Pacific Islander (-126), and Two or more race (-101) students. Over this same period, an increase in the number of students was observed for unknown race (+37) students.

Gender Distribution: SBCCD





Between Fall 2017and Fall 2021, the percentage of female students increased 2.9% from 56.5% to 59.4%, while the percentage of male students decreased by 2.9% from 43.2% to 40.3%.

Over the past five years, the number of female students declined by 2,054, from 11,261 in Fall 2017 to 9,207 in Fall 2021, while the number of male students decreased by 2,374, from 8,621in Fall 2017 to 6,247 in Fall 2021.

Gender Distribution: Crafton Hills College





Between Fall 2017 and Fall 2021, the percentage of female students at Crafton Hills College increased by 1.9%, from 54.3% to 56.2%, while the percentage of male students decreased by 1.9% from 45.4% to 43.3%.

Over the past five years, the number of female students decreased by 425, from 3,406 in Fall 2017 to 2,981 in Fall 2021, while the number of male students decreased by 554, from 2,850 in Fall 2017 to 2,296 in Fall 2021.







Between Fall 2017 and Fall 2021, the percentage of female students increased by 3.6% from 57.6% to 61.2%, while the percentage of male students decreased by 3.5% from 42.1% to 38.6%.

Over the past five years, the number of female students decreased by 1,593, from 7,406 in Fall 2017 to 7,672 in Fall 2021, while the number of male students decreased by 1,826, from 5,934 in Fall 2017 to 4,108 in Fall 2021.

Age Range Distribution: SBCCD





Between Fall 2017 and Fall 2021, the percentage of students 20-24 years of age declined by 4.3% from 34.6% to 30.3%. Over the same period, the percentage of students under 17 years of age increased by 1.8% from 4.9% to 6.7%. The percentage of students 18-19 years old also increased by 1.0% from 21.3% to 22.3%.

An increase in the number of students was observed among students under 17-years-old (+58). Over this same period, a decrease was observed among students 20-24-years-old (-2,214), students 25-29-years-old (-1,018), and 18-19 years of age (-799), students 30-34-years-old (-199), students 50 years of age or older (-124), students 35-39-years-old (-87), and students 40-49-years-old (-52).

Age Range Distribution: Crafton Hills College





Between Fall 2017 and Fall 2021, the percentage of students 20-24 years of age declined by 7.0% from 38.0% to 31.0%, while the percentage of students under 17-years-old increased by 4.4% from 3.9% to 8.3%. The percentage of students 18-19-years-old also increased by 1.9% from 26.0% to 27.9%.

An increase in the number of students was observed among under 17-years-old (+199), and students 40-49-years-old (+53). A decrease was observed among students 20-24-years-old (-741), students 25-29-years-old (-242), students 18-19-years-old (-152), students 35-39-years-old (-31), students 30-34-years-old (-27), and students 50 years of age or older (-26).







Between Fall 2017 and Fall 2021, the percentage of students 20-24 years of age declined by 3.0% from 33.3% to 30.3%. Over the same period, the percentage of 30-34-years-old increased by 1.3% from 9.4% to 10.7%. The percentage of students 35-39 years of age also increased by 1.3% from 5.5% to 6.8%.

The greatest decrease in the number of students was observed among students 20-24-years-old (-1,471), students 25-29-years-old (-793), students 18-19-years-old (-628), students 30-34-years-old (-176), and students under 17-years-old (-143).

Student Headcount By Disability Status



Student Headcount By Veteran Status







Between Fall 2017 and Fall 2021, the percentage of first-time students increased by 11.5%, representing 25.6% of the Fall 2021 student population. However, the percentage of continuing students declined by 7.5% from 63.4% to 55.9%.

An increase in the number of students was observed among first-time students (+1,229). A decrease was observed among continuing students (-3,989), returning students (-881), first-time transfer students (-589), and Special admits students (-159).

Between Fall 2017 and Fall 2021, the percentage of first-time students at Crafton Hills College increased by 13.6%, representing 27.6% of the Fall 2021 student population. The percentage of special admit students also increased by 2.9% from 4.3% to 7.2%. Over the same period, the percentage of continuing students declined by 7.7%, representing 54.3% of the Fall 2021 student population. The percentage of returning students also declined by 5.6% from 15.7% to 10.1%.

An increase in the number of students was observed among first-time students (+588), and special admit students (+115). A decrease was observed among continuing students (-1,012), returning students (-446), and first-time transfer students (-227).



Between Fall 2017 and Fall 2021, the percentage of first-time college students at San Bernardino Valley College increased by 10.6%, representing 24.7% of the Fall 2021 student population. However, the percentage of continuing students declined by 7.3% from 64.1% to 56.8%. The percentage of first-time transfer students also declined by 2.5% from 2.7% to 0.2%.

An increase in the number of students was observed among first-time students (+641). A decrease was observed among continuing students (-2,977), returning students (-435), first-time transfer students (-362), and special admit students (-274).





Student Headcount By Full-time/Part-time Status (Unit Load): Crafton Hills College






Between Fall 2017 and Fall 2021, the percentage of students taking 12 or more units declined by 3.6%, representing 29.5% of the Fall 2021 student population. The percentage of students taking 6-11.9 also declined by 1.5% from 38.4% to 36.9%. Over the same period, the percentage of CHC students taking less than 6 units increased by 4.8% from 28.5% to 33.3%.



Between Fall 2017 and Fall 2021, the percentage of SBVC students taking 12 or more units declined by 2.9%, representing 28.2% of the Fall 2021 student population. 





Number of Students Receiving Financial Aid Awards By Award Type: SBCCD









Total Financial Aid Award Amount By Award Type: SBCCD





Between 2017-18 and 2021-22, the total amount of students that received financial aid declined by 18.8% from \$8,602,666 to \$6,989,213. Largest increases were observed in EOPS Grant (+195.4%), SEOG Grants (+255.0%), Cal Grants (+28.3%), Scholarships (+36.3%) and Chaffe Grants (+65.8%). Largest decreases were observed in Pell Grants(-32.0%), CARE Grants (-29.3%), California College Promise Grants (-28.7%), and Work Study (-33.1%).

Between 2017-18 and 2021-22, the total amount of students that received financial aid declined by 30.2%, from \$30,797,175 to \$21,490,996. Largest increases were observed in Chaffe Grants (+133.1%), Cal Grants (+26.1%), and EOPS Grant (+850.8%). Largest decreases were observed in California College Promise Grant (-34.4%), Pell Grants (-36.4%), SEOG (-22.7%), Student Success Completion Grants(-12.9%) and Work study (-61.3%).
