



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

The San Bernardino Community College District student population declined by 20.5%, from 20,151 in Fall 2018 to 16,019 in Fall 2022, with a five-year average of 18,178. Overall, San Bernardino Valley College represented 67.8% of the student population, and Crafton Hills College represented 32.2% of the student population. A decrease in the number of students was observed at Crafton Hills College (-21.9%) and San Bernardino Valley College (-19.2%).

Racial/Ethnicity Distribution: SBCCD





In the Fall 2022 semester, 82.3% of the SBCCD student population were from historically underrepresented racial/ethnic groups. Over the past five years, there has been an increase in Hispanic and Asian students and a decrease in White and African American students.

Between Fall 2018 and Fall 2022, the greatest decrease in the number of students was observed among Hispanic (-2,291), White (-1,111), and Black or African American (-443) students. Over this same period, an increase in the number of students was observed for unknown race (+55) students.

Racial/Ethnicity Distribution: Crafton Hills College



In the Fall 2022 semester, 69.0% of the CHC student population were from historically underrepresented racial/ethnic groups. Over the past five years, there has been an increase in Hispanic, Black or African American, and Asian students and a decrease in White and American Indian/Alaska students.

Between Fall 2018 and Fall 2022, the greatest decrease in the number of students was observed among White (-751), Hispanic (-579), Two or more race (-64), Asian/Pacific Islander (-39), and Black or African American (-36) students. Over this same period, an increase in the number of students was observed for unknown race (+25) students.



Racial/Ethnicity Distribution: San Bernardino Valley College



In the Fall 2022 semester, 88.4% of the SBVC student population were from historically underrepresented racial/ethnic groups. Over the past five years, there has been an increase in Hispanic students and a decrease in White and Black or African American students.

Between Fall 2018 and Fall 2022, the greatest decrease in the number of students was observed among Hispanic (-1,689), Black or African American (-400), White (-391), Asian/Pacific Islander (-126), and Two or more race (-100) students. Over this same period, an increase in the number of students was observed for unknown race (+30) and American Indian/Alaska (+3) students.

Gender Distribution: SBCCD






Between Fall 2018 and Fall 2022, the percentage of female students increased by 0.5% from 57.2% to 57.7%, while the percentage of male students decreased by 0.8% from 42.6% to 41.8%.

Over the past five years, the number of female students declined by 2,276, from 11,524 in Fall 2018 to 9,248 in Fall 2022, while the number of male students decreased by 1,872, from 8,575 in Fall 2018 to 6,703 in Fall 2022.







Between Fall 2018 and Fall 2022, the percentage of female students at Crafton Hills College increased by 1.5% from 55.2% in Fall 2018 to 56.7% Fall 2020, but the percentage declined by 1.6%, from 56.7% Fall 2020 to 55.1% in Fall 2022.

Over the past five years, the number of female students decreased by 810, from 3,674 in Fall 2018 to 2,864 in Fall 2022, while the number of male students decreased by 655, from 2,962 in Fall 2018 to 2,307 in Fall 2022.







Between Fall 2018 and Fall 2022, the percentage of female students at San Bernardino Valley College increased by 3.9% from 58.4% in Fall 2018 to 62.3% Fall 2020, but the percentage declined by 3.2%, from 62.3% Fall 2020 to 59.1% in Fall 2022.

Over the past five years, the number of female students decreased by 1,473, from 8,133 in Fall 2018 to 6,660 in Fall 2022, while the number of male students decreased by 1,209, from 5,770 in Fall 2018 to 4,561 in Fall 2022.

Age Range Distribution: SBCCD





Between Fall 2018 and Fall 2022, the percentage of students 20-24 years of age declined by 5.0% from 33.3% to 28.3%. Over the same period, the percentage of students under 17 years of age increased by 3.2% from 4.8% to 8.0%.

An increase in the number of students was observed among students under 17-years-old (+330). Over this same period, a decrease was observed among students 20-24-years-old (-2,183), students 25-29-years-old (-1,053), 18-19 years of age (-852), students 30-34-years-old (-206), students 35-39-years-old (-118), and students 40-49-years-old (-30), and students 50 years of age or older (-21).

Age Range Distribution: Crafton Hills College






Between Fall 2018 and Fall 2022, the percentage of students 20-24 years of age declined by 7.2% from 36.5% to 29.3%, while the percentage of students under 17-years-old increased by 5.2% from 4.6% to 9.8%. The percentage of students 18-19-years-old also increased by 2.9% from 26.3% to 29.2%.

An increase in the number of students was observed among under 17-years-old (+206). A decrease was observed among students 20-24-years-old (-906), students 25-29-years-old (-356), students 18-19-years-old (-228), students 35-39-years-old (-89), students 30-34-years-old (-60), and students 50 years of age or older (-23), and students 40-49-years-old (-3).







Between Fall 2018 and Fall 2022, the percentage of students 20-24 years of age declined by 4.0% from 32.1% to 28.1%. The percentage of students 25-29 years of age also declined by 2.1% from 17.9% to 15.8%. Over the same period, the percentage of students under 17-years-old increased by 2.2% from 4.7% to 6.9%.

A decrease in the number of students was observed among students 20-24-years-old (-1,308), students 25-29-years-old (-716), students 18-19-years-old (-596), and students 30-34-years-old (-131), while an increase in the number of students was observed among students under 17-years-old (+123) and students 50 years of age or older (+8).

Student Headcount By Disability Status



Student Headcount By Veteran Status







Between Fall 2018 and Fall 2022, the percentage of first-time students increased by 19.2%, representing 31.1% of the Fall 2022 student population. However, the percentage of continuing students declined by 16.1% from 66.7% to 50.6%.

An increase in the number of students was observed among first-time students (+2,668) and Special admits students (+167). A decrease was observed among continuing students (-5,409), returning students (-790), and first-time transfer students (-746).



Between Fall 2018 and Fall 2022, the percentage of first-time students at Crafton Hills College increased by 20.2%, representing 31.9% of the Fall 2022 student population. The percentage of special admit students also increased by 4.5% from 3.8% to 8.3%. Over the same period, the percentage of continuing students declined by 17.4%, representing 48.9% of the Fall 2022 student population. The percentage of returning students also declined by 2.7% from 12.4% to 9.7%.



Between Fall 2018 and Fall 2022, the percentage of first-time college students at San Bernardino Valley College increased by 18.7%, representing 30.7% of the Fall 2022 student population. However, the percentage of continuing students declined by 15.6% from 66.9% to 51.3%. The percentage of first-time transfer students also declined by 3.3% from 3.6% to 0.3%.

An increase in the number of students was observed among first-time students (+1,784) and special admit students (+36). A decrease was observed among continuing students (-3,540), first-time transfer students (-472), and returning students (-471).







Between Fall 2018 and Fall 2022, the percentage of students taking 12 or more units decreased by 2.2%, representing 27.3% of the Fall 2022 student population. Over the same period, the percentage of students taking less than 6 units and students taking Non-Credit courses increased by 1.5% and 1.0%, respectively.



Between Fall 2018 and Fall 2022, the percentage of students taking 12 or more units declined by 2.5%, representing 29.1% of the Fall 2022 student population. The percentage of students taking 6-11.9 units also declined by 3.4% from 39.1% to 35.7%. 

Between Fall 2018 and Fall 2022, the percentage of SBVC students taking 12 or more units declined by 2.0%, representing 26.5% of the Fall 2022 student population. Over the same period, the percentage of students taking 6-11.8 units increased by 1.1% from 40.4% to 41.6%. The percentage of students taking Non-Credit courses also increased by 1.3% from 0.5% to 1.8%.

Student Headcount By Education Status: SBCCD








