





The San Bernardino Community College District student population declined by 11.6%, from 21,428 in Fall 2019 to 18,509 in Fall 2023, with a five-year average of 17,850. Overall, San Bernardino Valley College represented 67.9% of the student population, and Crafton Hills College represented 32.1% of the student population. A decrease in the number of students was observed at Crafton Hills College (-10.1%) and San Bernardino Valley College (-12.3%).

Racial/Ethnicity Distribution: SBCCD





In the Fall 2023 semester, 84.2% of the SBCCD student population were from historically underrepresented racial/ethnic groups. Over the past five years, there has been an increase in Hispanic students and a decrease in White and Black or African American students.

Between Fall 2019 and Fall 2023, the greatest decrease in the number of students was observed among Hispanic (-1,357), White (-810), and Black or African American (-290) students.





In the Fall 2023 semester, 70.7% of the CHC student population were from historically underrepresented racial/ethnic groups. Over the past five years, there has been an increase in Hispanic, and Black or African American students and a decrease in White and American Indian/Alaska students.

Between Fall 2019 and Fall 2023, the greatest decrease in the number of students was observed among White (-457), Hispanic (-83), and Asian/Pacific Islander (-44) students. Over this same period, an increase in the number of students was observed for Black or African American (+8) students.



In the Fall 2023 semester, 90.1% of the SBVC student population were from historically underrepresented racial/ethnic groups. Over the past five years, there has been an increase in Hispanic students and a decrease in White and Black or African American students.

Between Fall 2019 and Fall 2023, the greatest decrease in the number of students was observed among Hispanic (-2,674), White (-298), Black or African American (-264), and Asian/Pacific Islander (-70) students.

Gender Distribution: SBCCD





Between Fall 2019 and Fall 2023, the percentage of female students stayed the same at 57.2%, while the percentage of male students decreased by 1.4% from 42.5% to 41.0%.

Over the past five years, the number of female and male students decreased by 1,670, from 12,254 in Fall 2019 to 10,584 in Fall 2023, and the number of male students decreased by 1,532, from 9,115 in Fall 2019 to 7,583 in Fall 2023.

Gender Distribution: Crafton Hills College





Between Fall 2019 and Fall 2023, the percentage of female students at Crafton Hills College increased by 0.4% from 54.2% in Fall 2019 to 54.6% Fall 2023, while the percentage of male students declined by 2.1%, from 45.4% Fall 2019 to 43.3% in Fall 2023.

Over the past five years, the number of female students decreased by 353, from 3,709 in Fall 2019 to 3,356 in Fall 2023, and the number of male students decreased by 446, from 3,106 in Fall 2019 to 2,660 in Fall 2023.







Between Fall 2019 and Fall 2023, the percentage of female students at San Bernardino Valley College increased 0.1% from 58.7% to 58.8%, while the percentage of male students decreased by 1.6% from 41.1% to 39.5%.

Over the past five years, the number of female students decreased by 1,069, from 8,837 in Fall 2019 to 7,768 in Fall 2023, and the number of male students decreased by 971, from 6,193 in Fall 2019 to 5,222 in Fall 2023.

Age Range Distribution: SBCCD





Between Fall 2019 and Fall 2023, the percentage of students 20-24 years of age declined by 3.9% from 31.8% to 27.9%. Over the same period, the percentage of students under 17 years of age increased by 5.7% from 6.2% to 11.9%.

An increase in the number of students was observed among students under 17-years-old (+888) and students 40-49-years-old (+88). Over this same period, a decrease was observed among students 20-24-years-old (-1,656), 18-19 years of age (-966), students 25-29-years-old (-930), students 30-34-years-old (-132), students 35-39-years-old (-124), and, and students 50 years of age or older (-89).

Age Range Distribution: Crafton Hills College





Between Fall 2019 and Fall 2023, the percentage of students 20-24 years of age declined by 4.4% from 34.5% to 30.1%, while the percentage of students under 17-years-old increased by 6.6% from 5.6% to 12.2%. The percentage of students 18-19-years-old also slightly increased by 0.9% from 25.9% to 26.8%.

An increase in the number of students was observed among under 17-years-old (+367). A decrease was observed among students 20-24-years-old (-508), students 25-29-years-old (-192), students 18-19-years-old (-119), students 35-39-years-old (-96), students 30-34-years-old (-92), and students 50 years of age or older (-52).







Between Fall 2019 and Fall 2023, the percentage of students 20-24 years of age declined by 3.3% from 30.8% to 27.5%. The percentage of students 18-19 years of age also declined by 2.7% from 21.7% to 19.0%. Over the same period, the percentage of students under 17-years-old increased by 4.9% from 6.2% to 11.1%.

An increase in the number of students was observed among students under 17-years-old (+531), students 40-49-years-old (+109), and students 30-34-years-old (+7), while a decrease in the number of students was observed among students 20-24-years-old (-1,017), students 18-19-years-old (-759), students 25-29-years-old (-691), students 50 years of age or older (-31), and students 35-39-years-old (-7).

Student Headcount By Disability Status



Student Headcount By Veteran Status





Between Fall 2019 and Fall 2023, the percentage of first-time students increased by 1.3%, representing 29.3% of the Fall 2023 student population. The percentage of special admit students also increased by 3.2% from 4.2% to 7.4%. Over the same period, the percentage of continuing students declined by 6.3% from 55.5% to 49.2%.

An increase in the number of students was observed among Special admits students (+510) and first-time transfer students (+13). A decrease was observed among continuing students (-2,630), first-time students (-477), and returning students (-137).



Between Fall 2019 and Fall 2023, the percentage of first-time students at Crafton Hills College increased by 3.6%, representing 31.2% of the Fall 2023 student population. 



Between Fall 2019 and Fall 2023, the percentage of first-time college students at San Bernardino Valley College increased by 0.2%, representing 28.4% of the Fall 2023 student population. The percentage of special admit students also increased by 2.2% from 4.1% to 6.3%. Over the same period, the percentage of continuing students declined by 4.9% from 55.2% to 50.3%.

An increase in the number of students was observed among special admit students (+214) and first-time transfer students (+15). A decrease was observed among continuing students (-1,681), first-time students (-506), and returning students (-127).







Between Fall 2019 and Fall 2023, the percentage of students taking 12 or more units decreased by 6.5%, representing 25.9% of the Fall 2023 student population. Over the same period, the percentage of students taking less than 6 units and students taking 6-11.9 units increased by 4.2% and 1.5%, respectively.

A decrease in the number of students was observed among students taking 12 or more units (-2,068), and students taking 6.0-11.9 units (-650), while an increase in the number of students was observed among students taking less than 6 units (+66) and students taking Non-Credit courses (+104).









Student Headcount By Education Status: SBCCD









Number of Students Receiving Financial Aid Awards By Award Type: San Bernardino Valley College







Between 2019-20 and 2023-24, the total amount of students that received financial aid increased by 14.5% from \$8,526,132 to \$9,765,773. Largest increases were observed in EOPS Grants (+306.5%), Chaffe Grants (+144.4%), CARE Grants (+113.9), Work Study (+66.4%), Pell Grants (+21.5%), Cal Grants (+13.0%), and Scholarships (+12.8%). Largest decreases were observed in and SEOG Grants (-25.6%) and California College Promise Grants (-12.6%).

Between 2019-20 and 2023-24, the total amount of students that received financial aid decreased by 8.9%, from \$32,910,312 to \$29,991,776. Largest increases were observed in EOPS Grant (+44262.5%), Student Success Completion Grants(+195.0%), Care Grants (+84.4%), and Chaffe Grants (+83.7%). Largest decreases were observed in California College Promise Grant (-21.2%), Cal Grants (-19.4%), Scholarships (-22.5%), SEOG (-15.3%), Pell Grants (-13.8%), and Work study (-8.7%).
