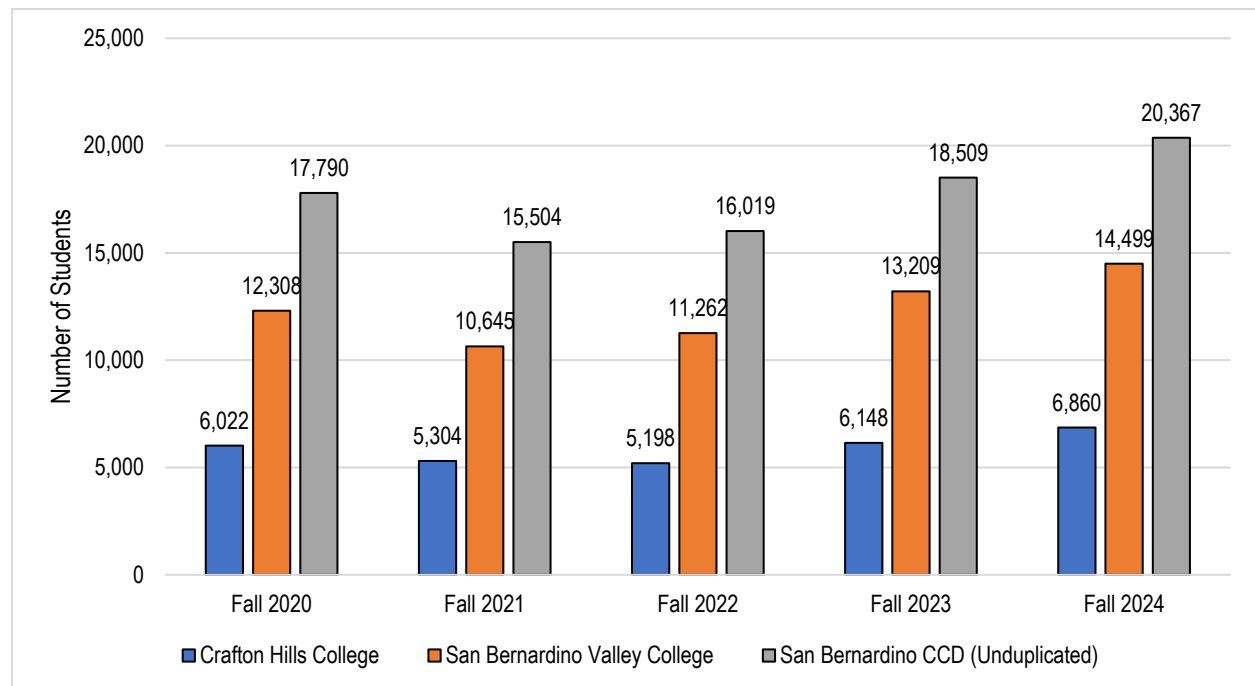

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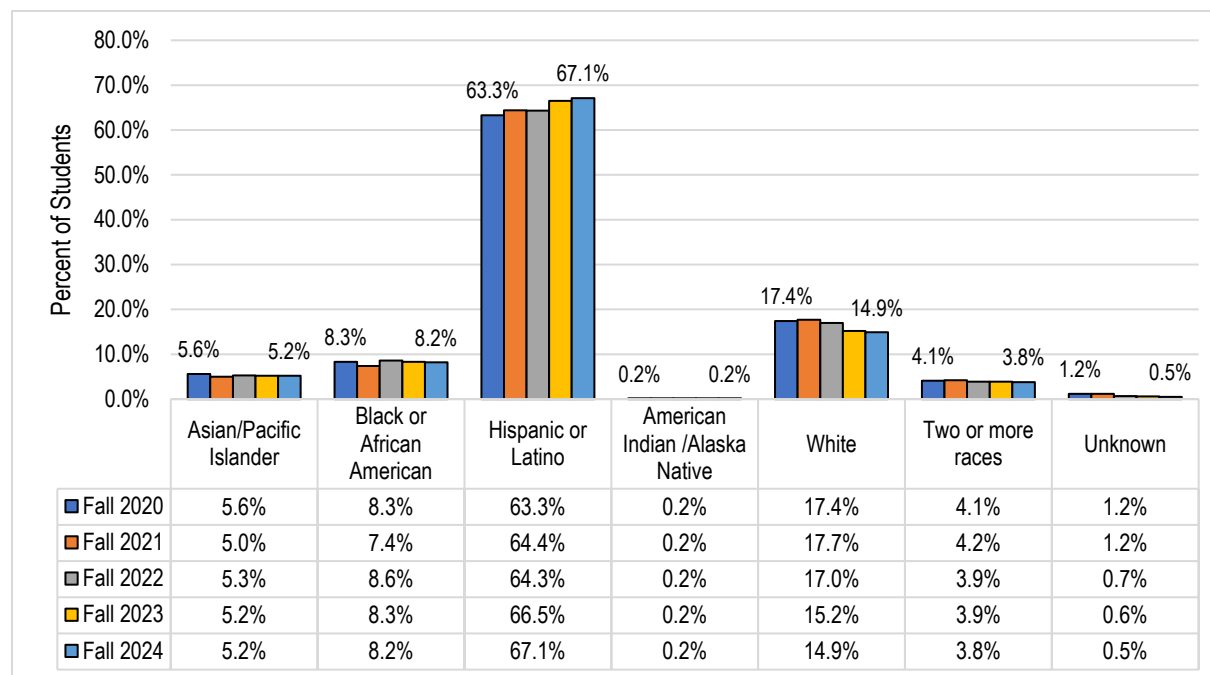

The San Bernardino Community College District student population increased by 14.5%, from 17,790 in Fall 2020 to 20,367 in Fall 2024, with a five-year average of 17,638. Overall, San Bernardino Valley College represented 67.7% of the student population, and Crafton Hills College represented 32.3% of the student population. An increase in the number of students was observed at Crafton Hills College (+13.8%) and San Bernardino Valley College (+17.8%).

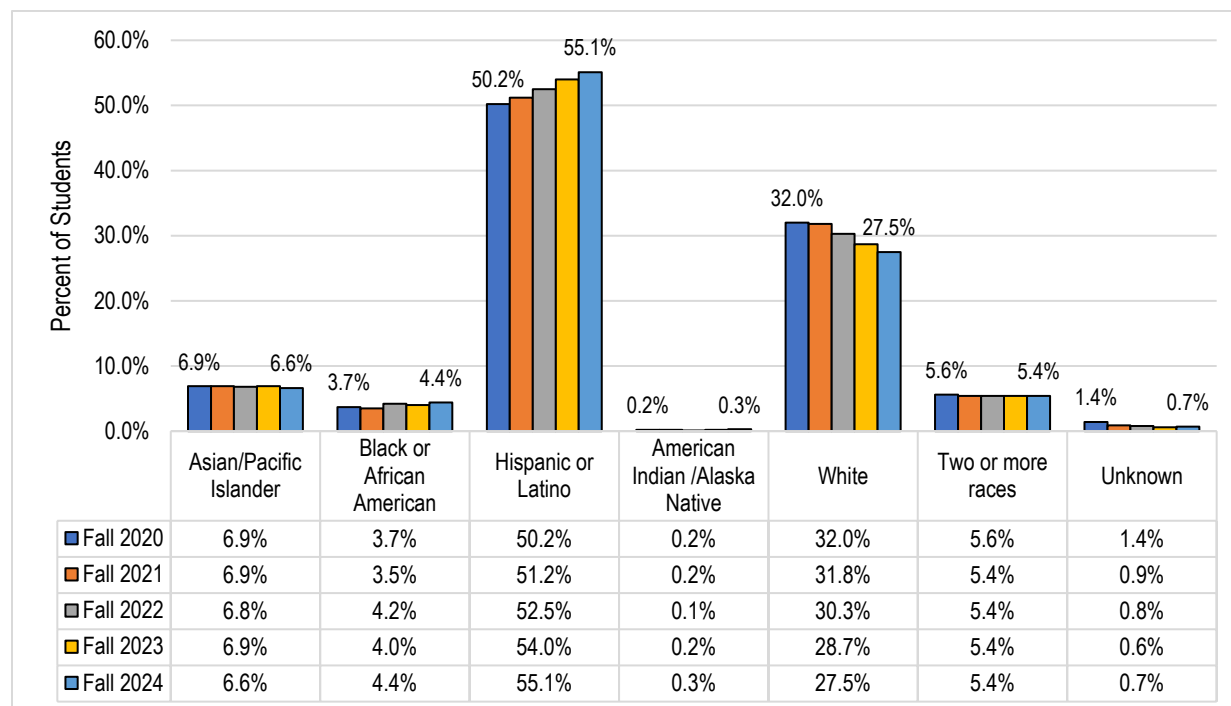

Between Fall 2020 and Fall 2024, the greatest increase in the number of students was observed among Hispanic (+2,415), and Black or African American (+196) students. Over this same period, a decrease in the number of students was observed among White (-56), and Unknown race (-97) students.

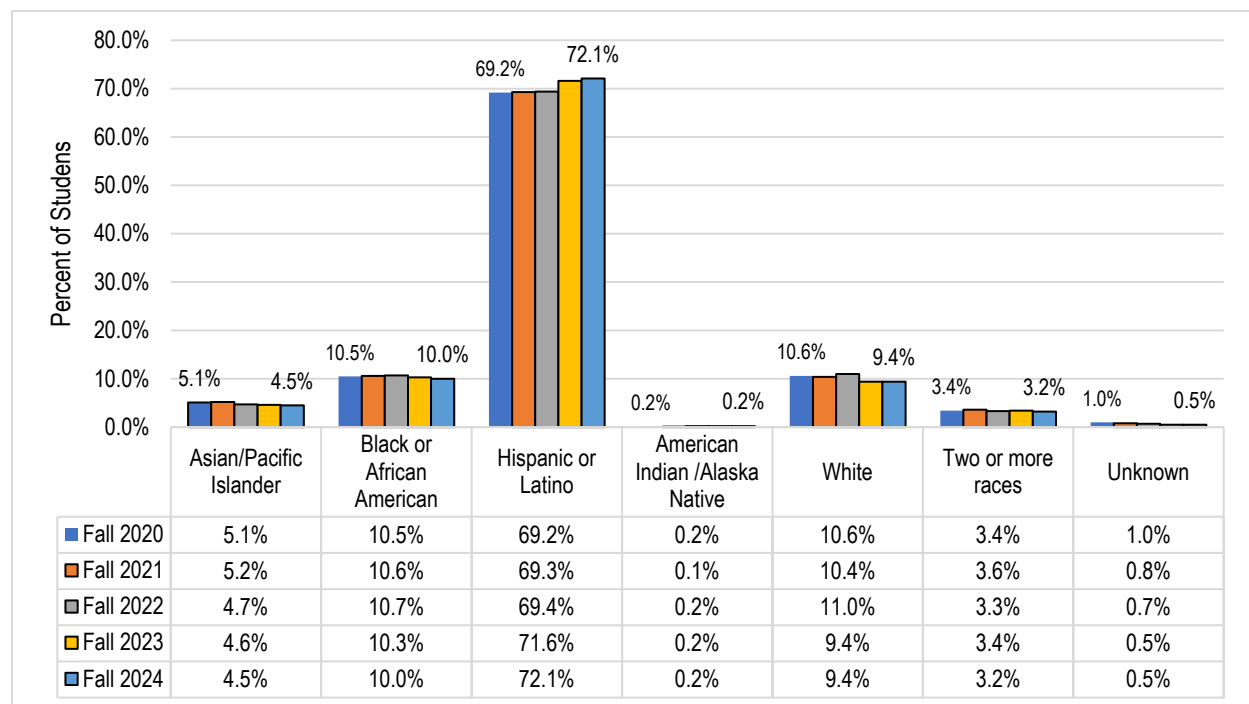

In the Fall 2024 semester, 71.9% of the CHC student population was from historically underrepresented racial/ethnic groups. Over the past five years, there has been an increase in Hispanic, and Black or African American students and a decrease in White students.

Between Fall 2020 and Fall 2024, the greatest increase in the number of students was observed among Hispanic (+760), Black or African American (+81), and Asian/Pacific Islander (+36) students. Over this same period, a decrease in the number of students was observed for White (-41) and Unknown race (-40) students.

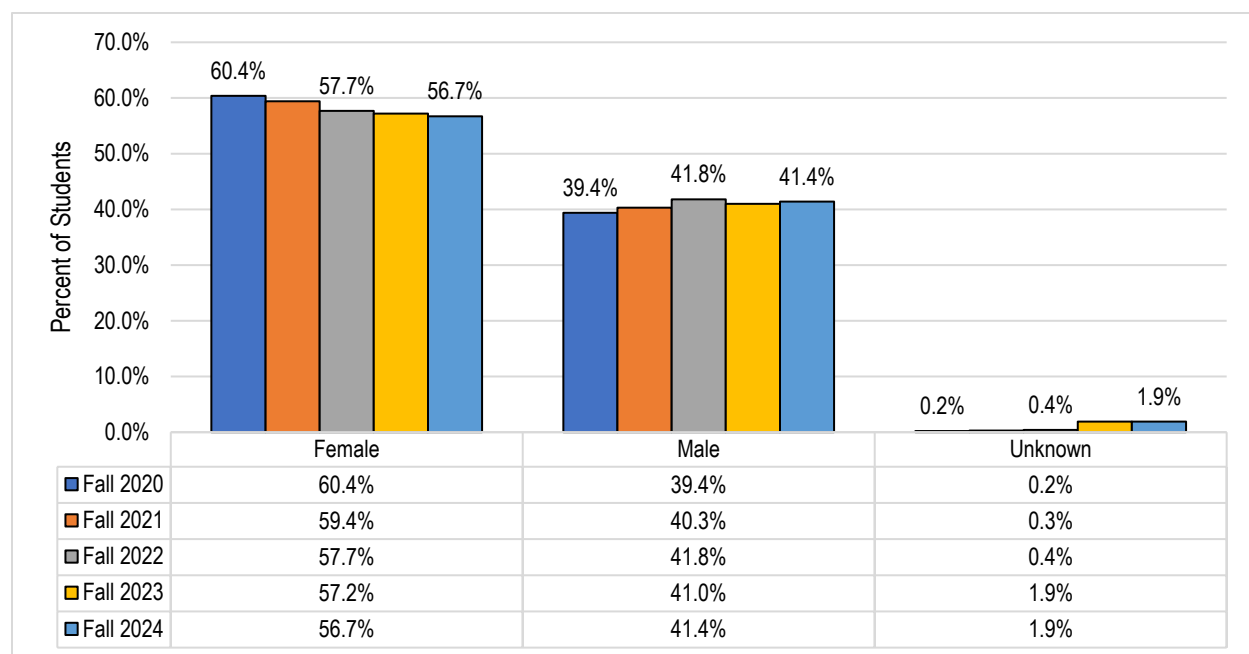

In the Fall 2024 semester, 90.1% of the SBVC student population was from historically underrepresented racial/ethnic groups. Over the past five years, there has been an increase in Hispanic students and a decrease in White, Asian, and Black or African American students.

Between Fall 2020 and Fall 2024, the greatest increase in the number of students was observed among Hispanic (+1,934), Black or African American (+166), White (+63), and Asian/Pacific Islander (+36) students. Over this same period, a decrease in the number of students was observed for unknown race (-52) students.

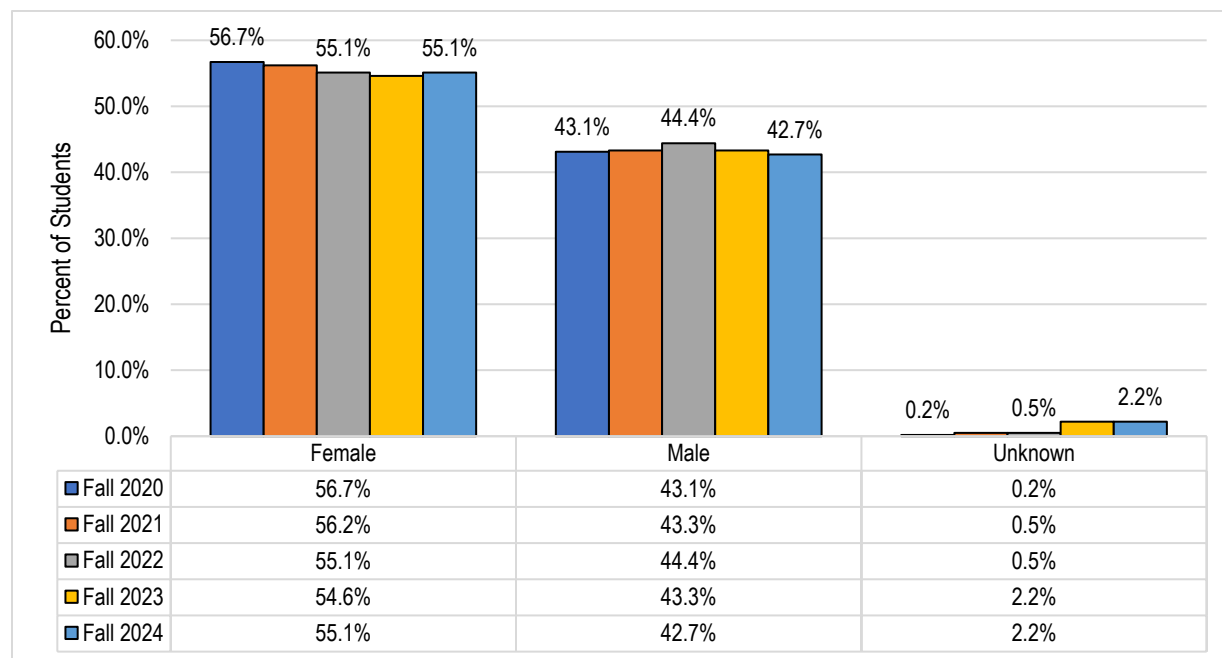

Between Fall 2020 and Fall 2024, the percentage of female students decreased by 3.7% from 60.4% to 56.7%, while the percentage of male students increased by 2.0% from 39.4% to 41.4%.

Over the past five years, the number of female students increased by 797, from 10,742 in Fall 2020 to 11,539 in Fall 2024, and the number of male students increased by 1421, from 7,012 in Fall 2020 to 8,433 in Fall 2024.

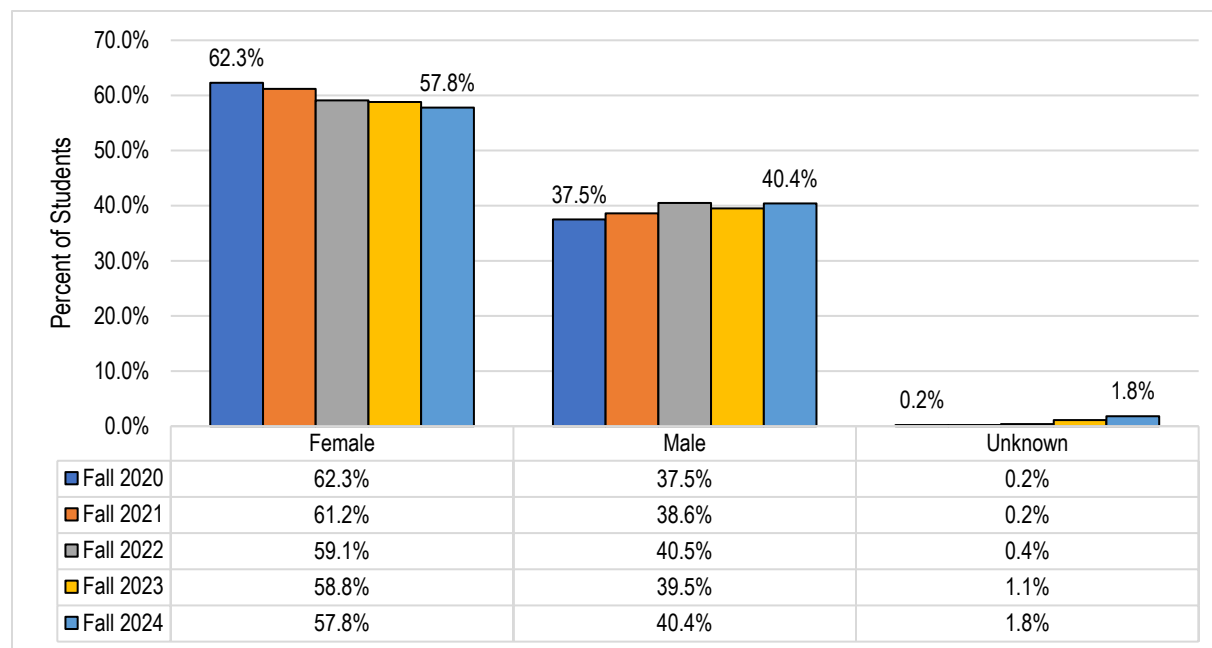

Between Fall 2020 and Fall 2024, the percentage of female students at Crafton Hills College decreased by 1.6% from 56.7% to 55.1%, and the percentage of male students also slightly declined by 0.4% from 43.1% to 42.7%. Over the same period, the percentage of students with an unknown gender increased by 2.0%.

Over the past five years, the number of female students increased by 370, from 3,413 in Fall 2020 to 3,783 in Fall 2024, while the number of male students increased by 329, from 2,598 in Fall 2020 to 2,927 in Fall 2024.

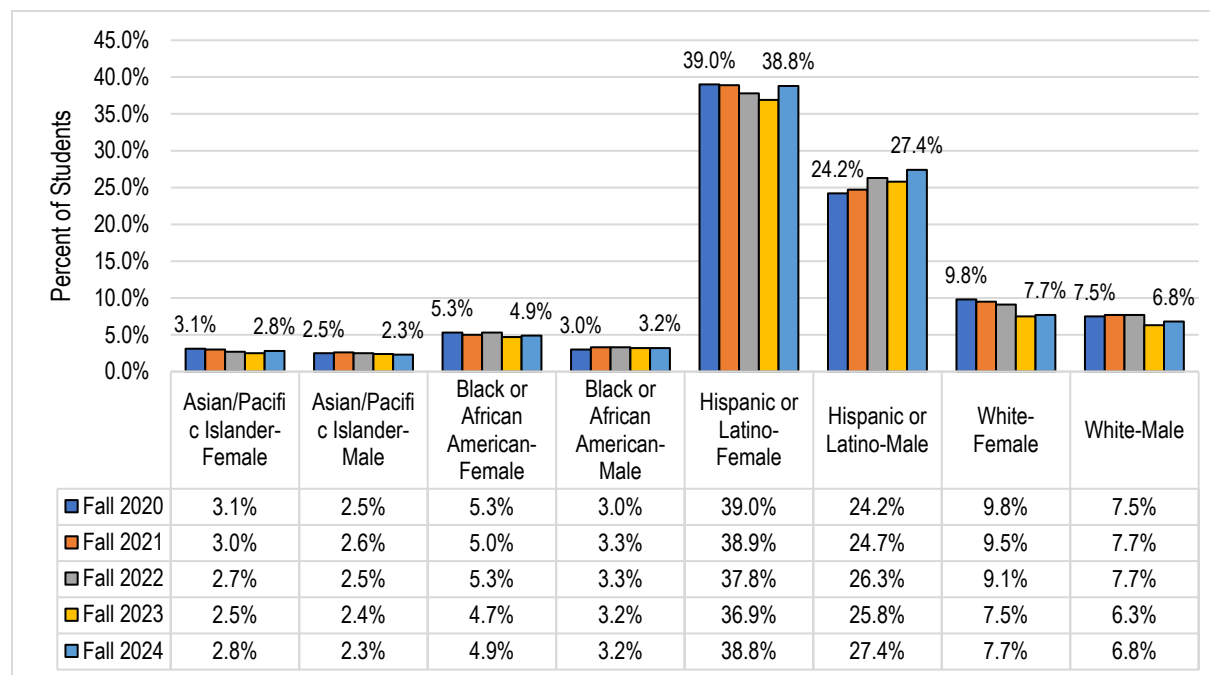

Between Fall 2020 and Fall 2024, the percentage of female students at San Bernardino Valley College declined by 4.6%, from 62.3% to 57.8%, while the percentage of male students increased by 1.6%, from 37.5% to 39.5%.

Over the past five years, the number of female students increased by 705, from 7,672 in Fall 2020 to 8,377 in Fall 2024, while the number of male students decreased by 971, from 6,193 in Fall 2020 to 5,222 in Fall 2024.

Racial/Ethnicity and Gender Distribution: SBCCD



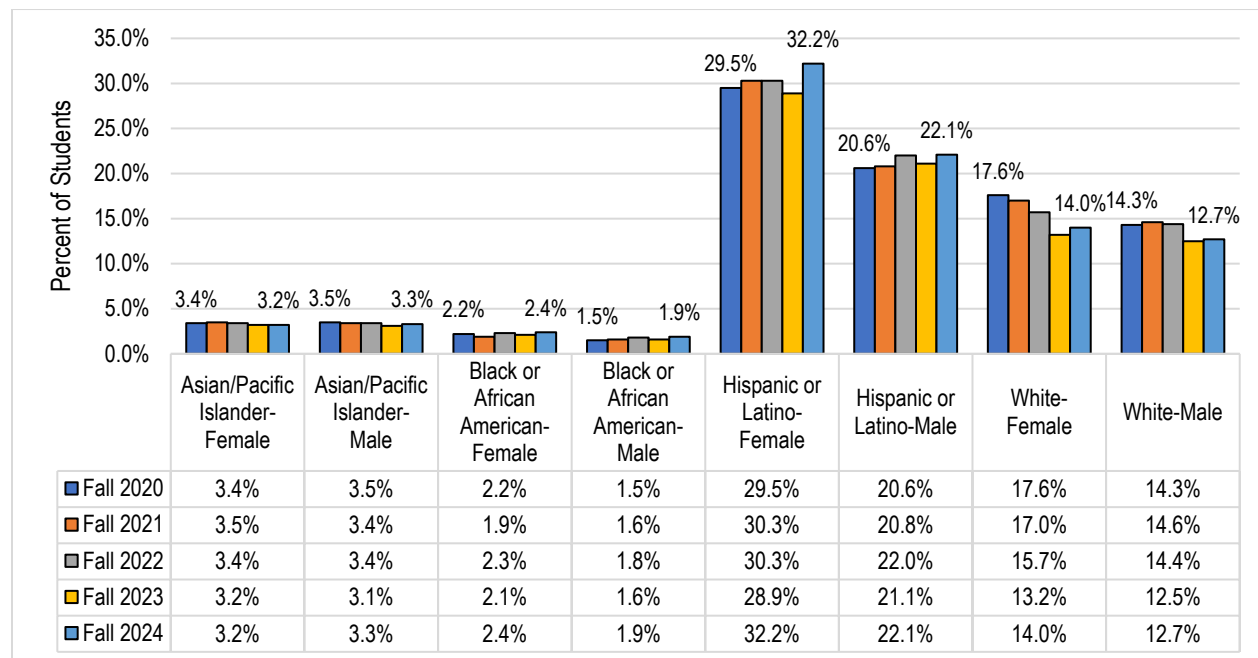

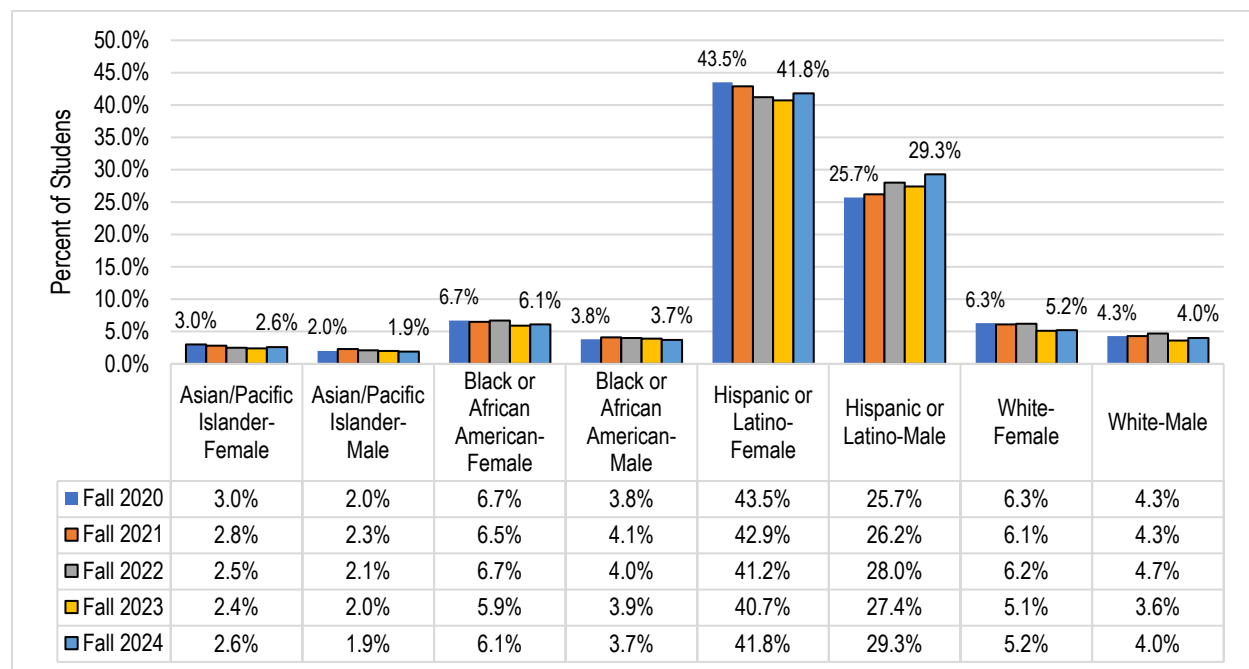

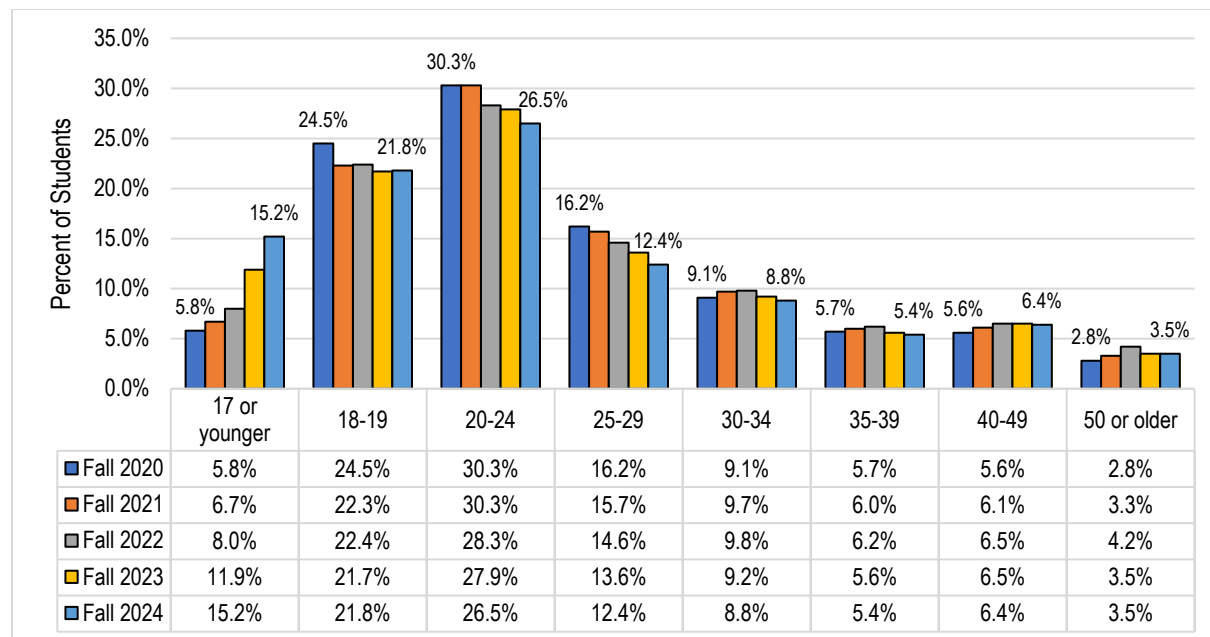

Age Range Distribution: SBCCD



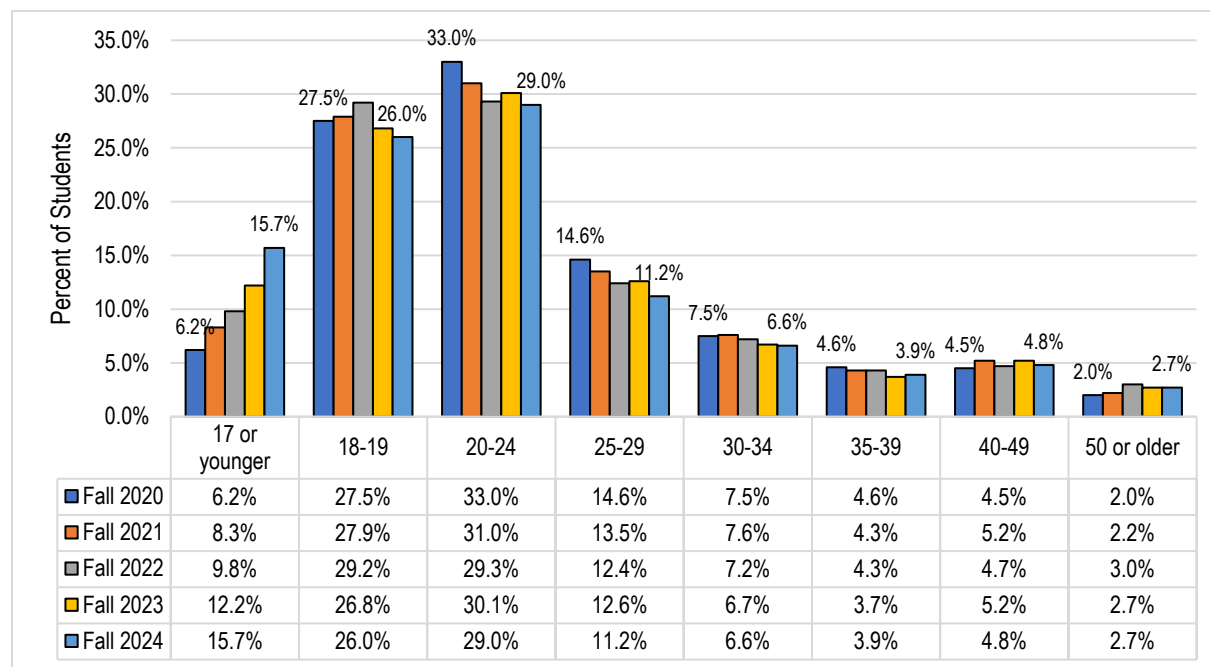

Between Fall 2020 and Fall 2024, the student body demographics saw a notable shift toward younger students. The percentage of students under 17 rose substantially by 9.4% from 5.8% to 15.2%. Over the same period, the percentages of students aged 20-24, 25-29, and 18-19 declined by 3.8%, 3.7%, and 2.7%, respectively.

The greatest increase in the number of students was observed among the under-17 age group (+2,059). The other groups saw growth in students aged 40-49 (+314), 30-34 (+156), 35-39 (+86), and 18-19 (+81). Over this same period, a decrease was observed among students aged 25-29 (-345) and 20-24 (-1).

Age Range Distribution: Crafton Hills College



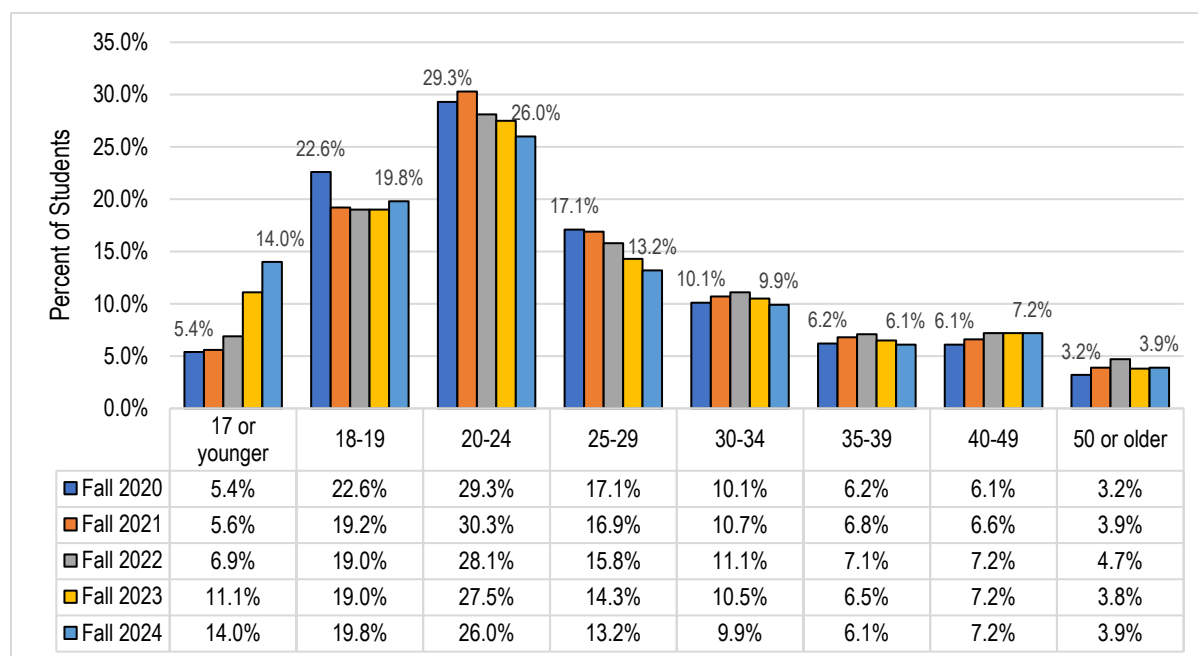

Between Fall 2020 and Fall 2024, the percentage of students under 17 rose substantially by 9.5% from 6.2% to 15.7%. Over the same period, the percentages of students aged 20-24, 25-29, and 18-19 declined by 4.0%, 3.4%, and 1.5%, respectively.

The greatest increase in the number of students was observed among the under-17 age group (+701). The other groups saw growth in students aged 18-19 (+130), Over 50(+63), 40-49 (+59), and 20-24 (+2). Over this same period, a decrease was observed among students aged 25-29 (-110), 35-39 (-5), and 30-34 (-2).

Age Range Distribution: San Bernardino Valley College



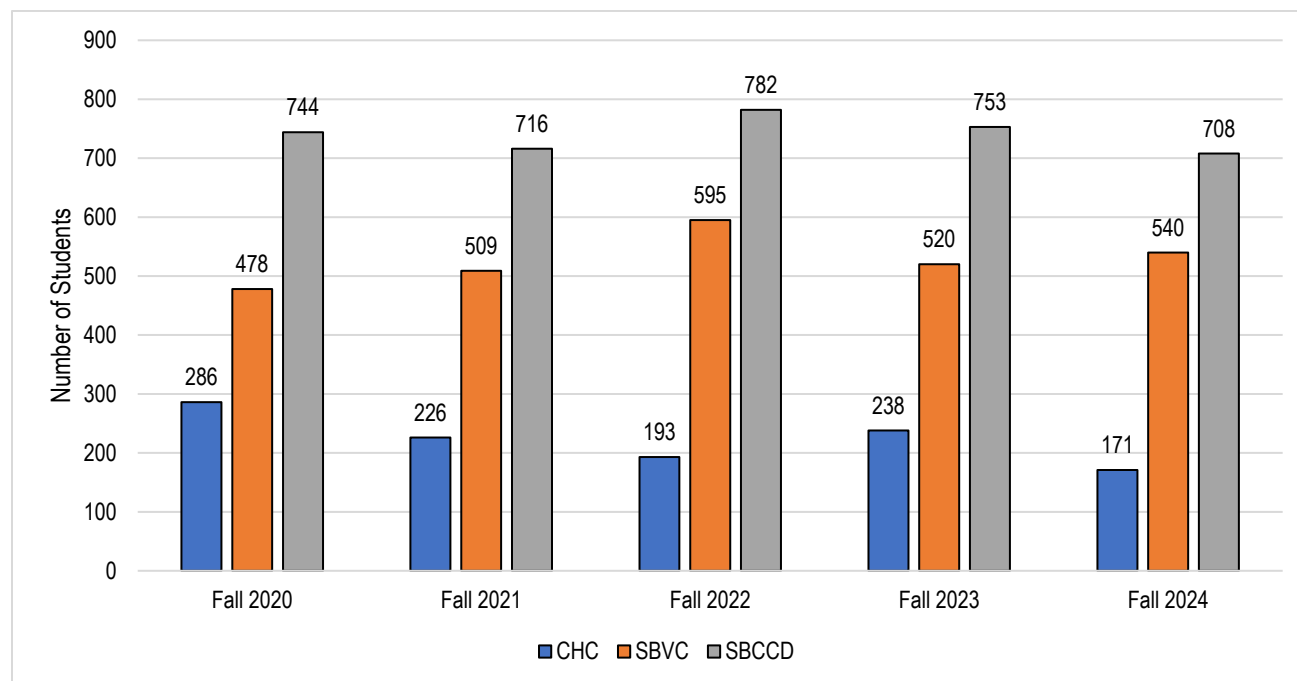

Between Fall 2020 and Fall 2024, the percentage of students under 17 rose substantially by 8.6% from 5.4% to 14.0%. Over the same period, the percentages of students aged 20-24, 25-29, and 18-19 declined by 3.3%, 3.9%, and 2.8%, respectively.

The greatest increase in the number of students was observed among the under-17 age group (+1,368). The other groups saw growth in students aged 40-49 (+288), Over-50 (+174), 30-34 (+187), 20-24 (+161), and 18-19 (+89). Over this same period, a decrease was observed among students aged 25-29 (-196).

Student Headcount By Disability Status

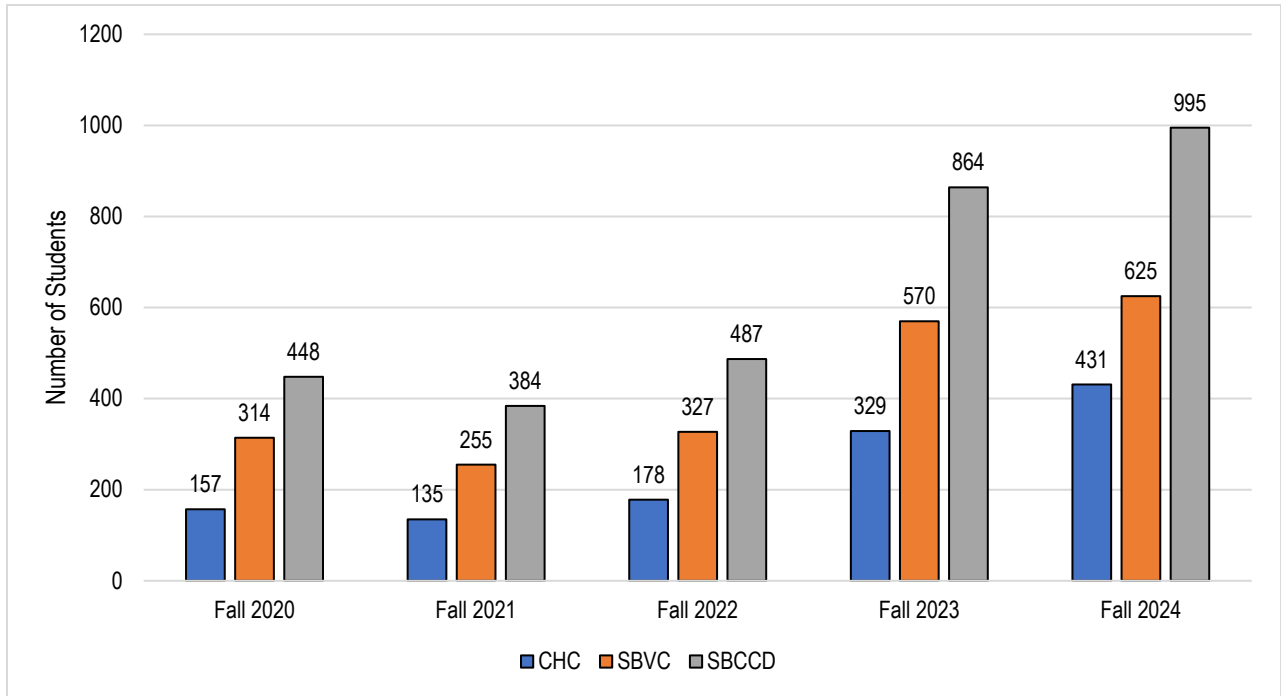

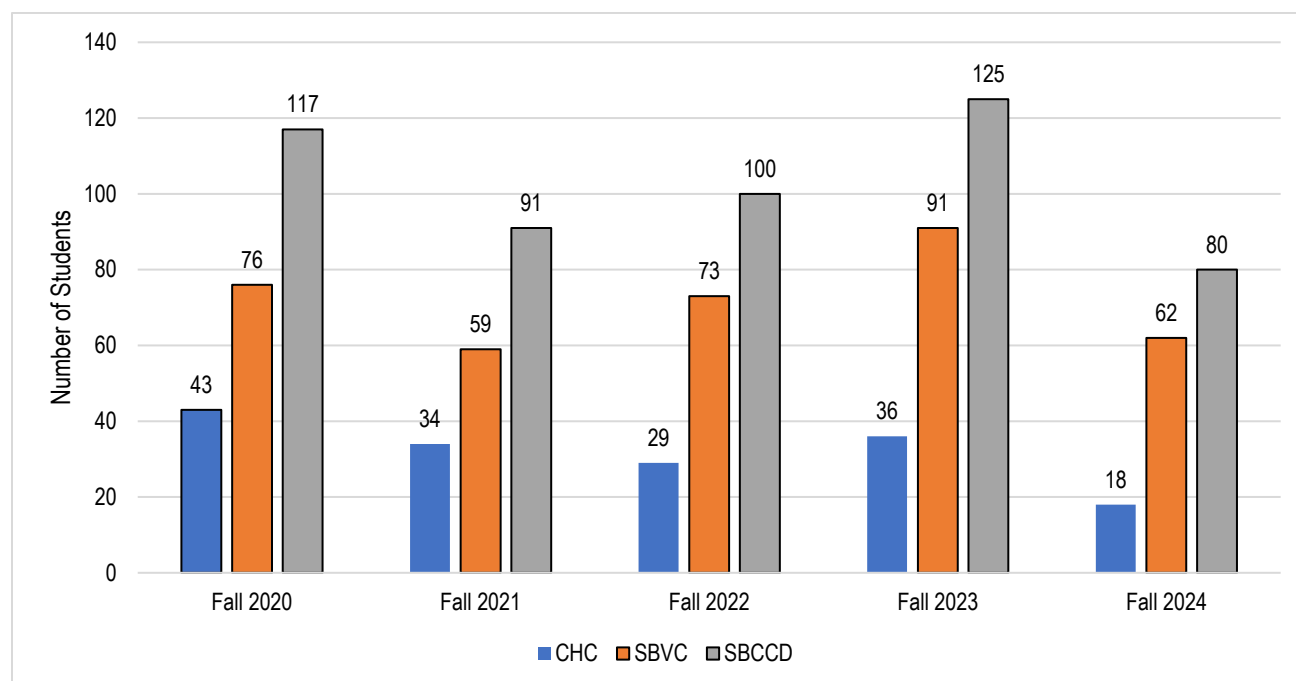

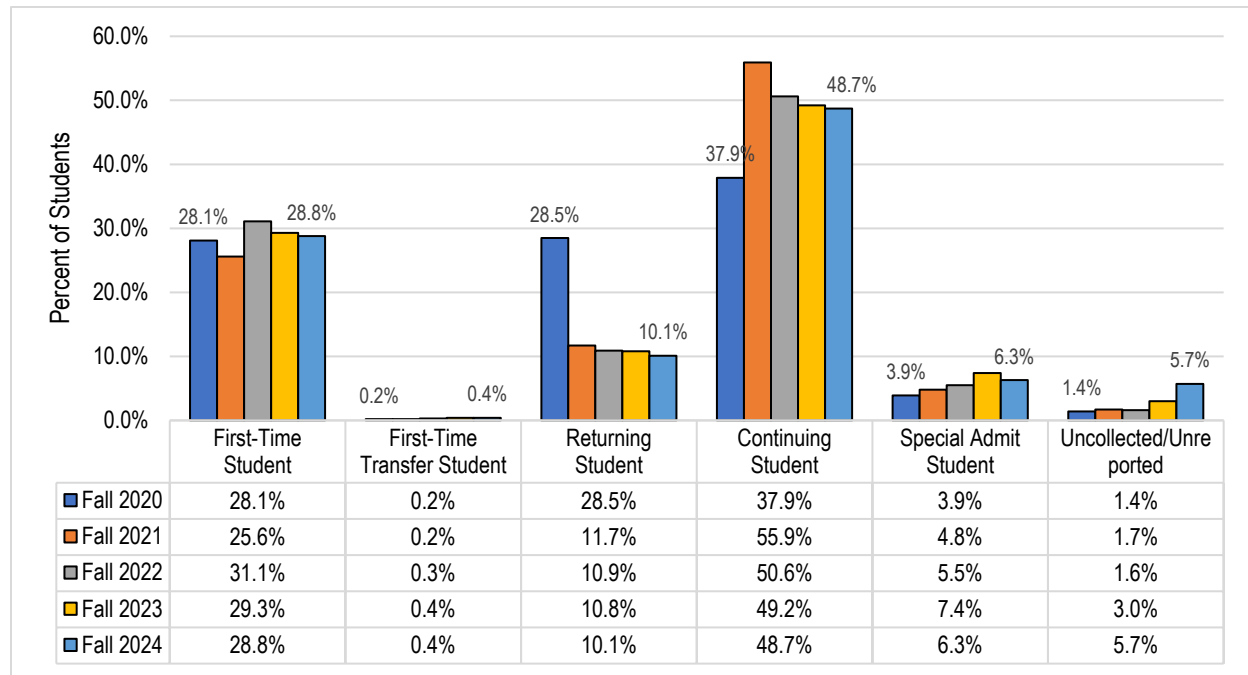

Student Headcount By Enrollment Status: SBCCD



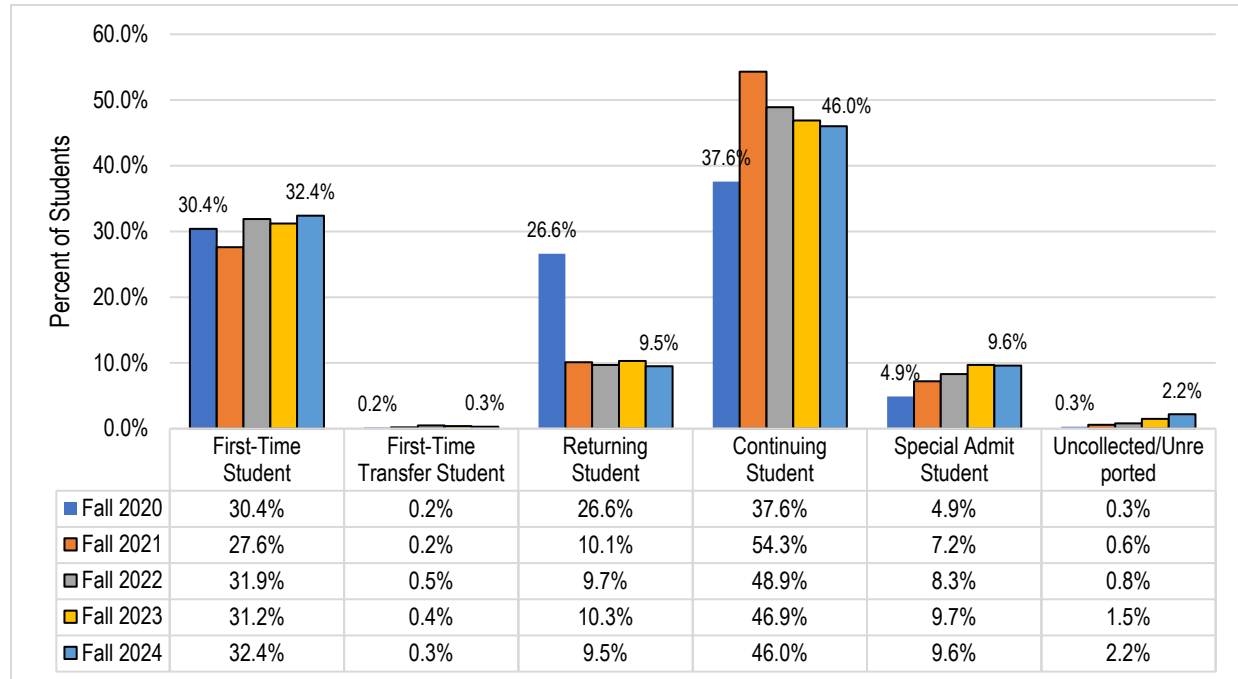

Between Fall 2020 and Fall 2024, the percentage of first-time students increased by 0.7%, representing 28.8% of the Fall 2024 student population. The percentage of special admit students also increased by 2.4%, from 3.9% to 6.3%. Over the same period, the percentage of returning students declined by 18.4%, from 28.5% to 10.1%.

An increase in the number of students was observed among continuing students (+3444), first-time students (+1005), Special admits students (+630), and first-time transfer students (+42). A decrease was observed among returning students (-3066).

Student Headcount By Enrollment Status: Crafton Hills College



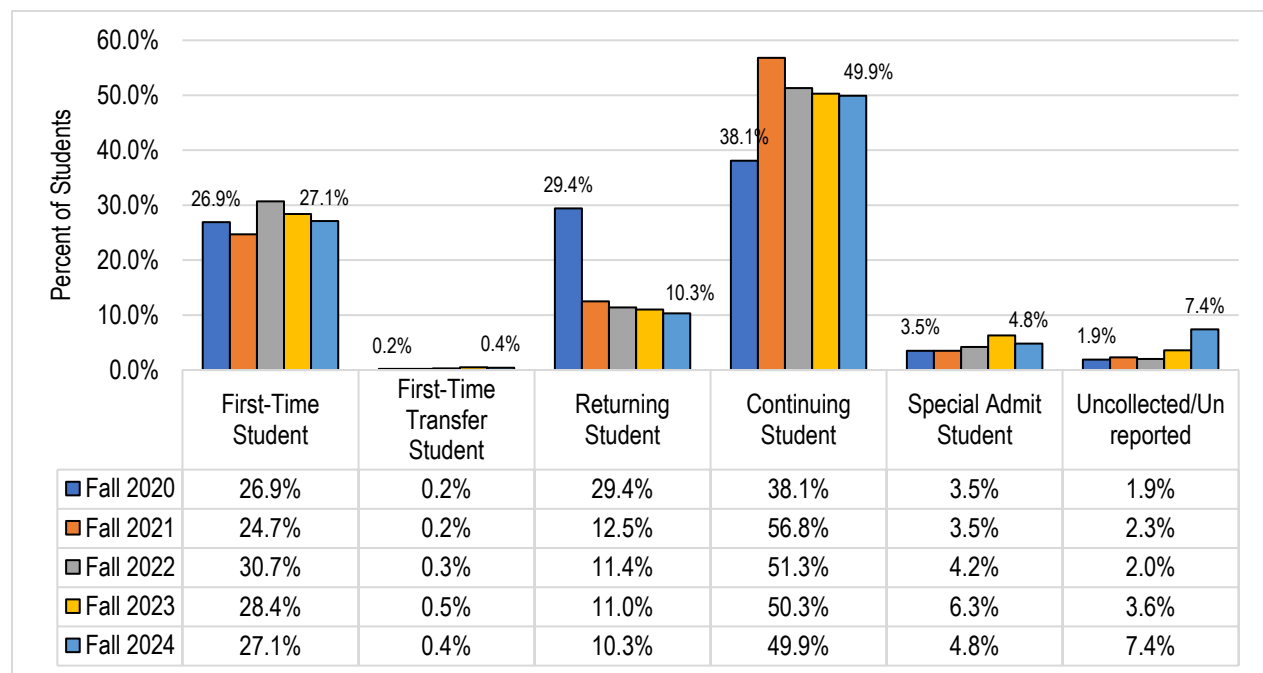

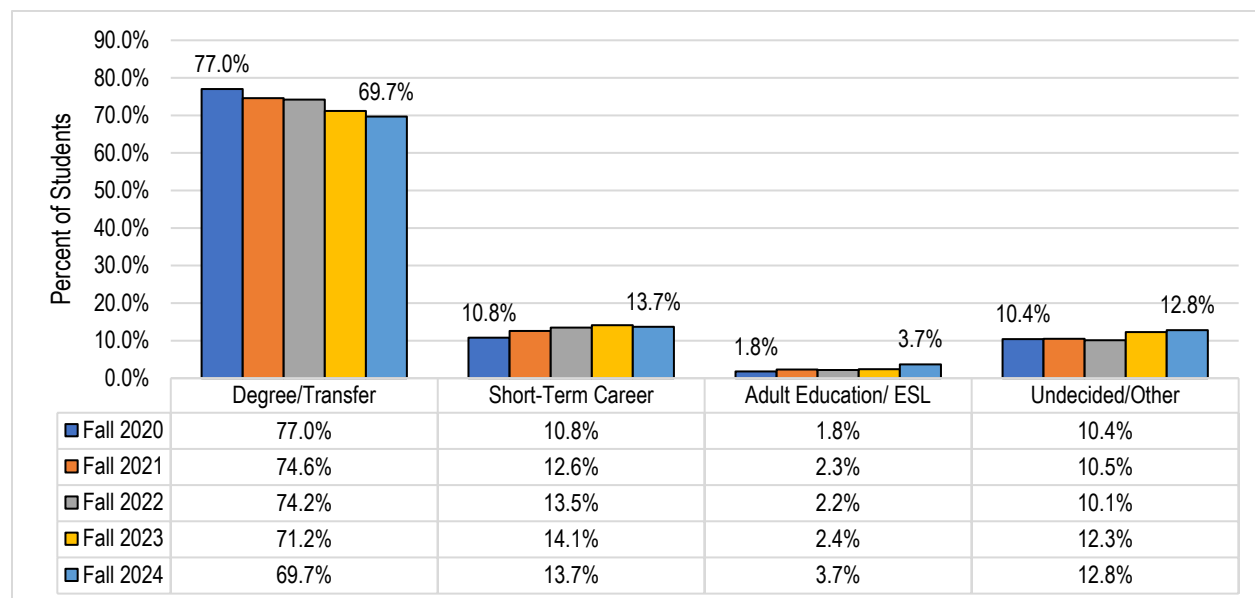

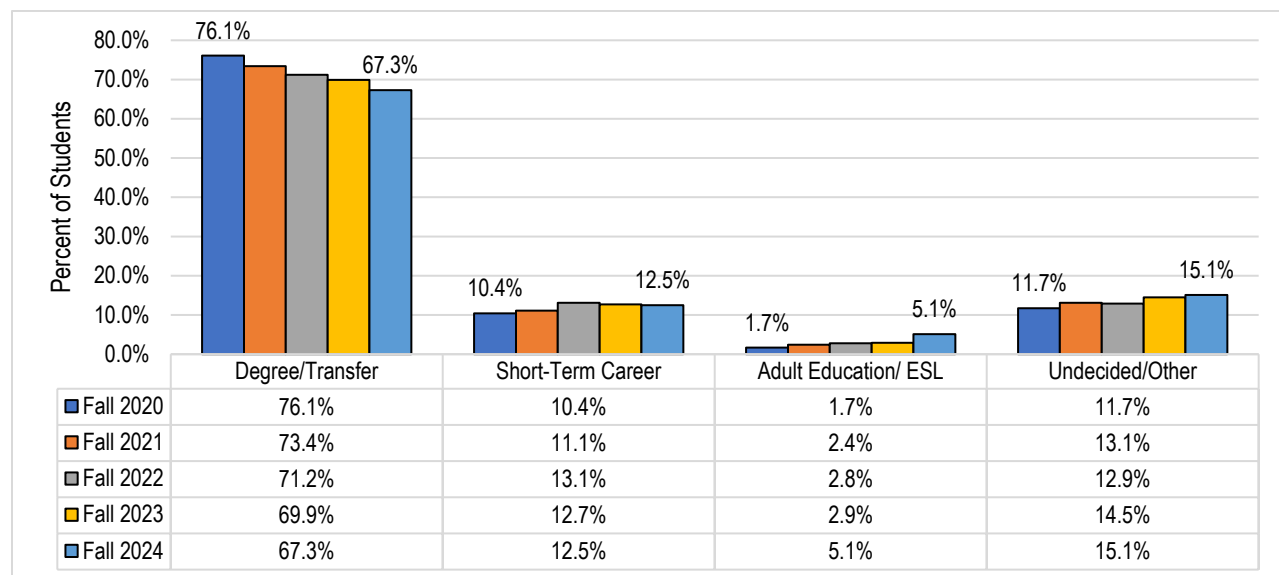

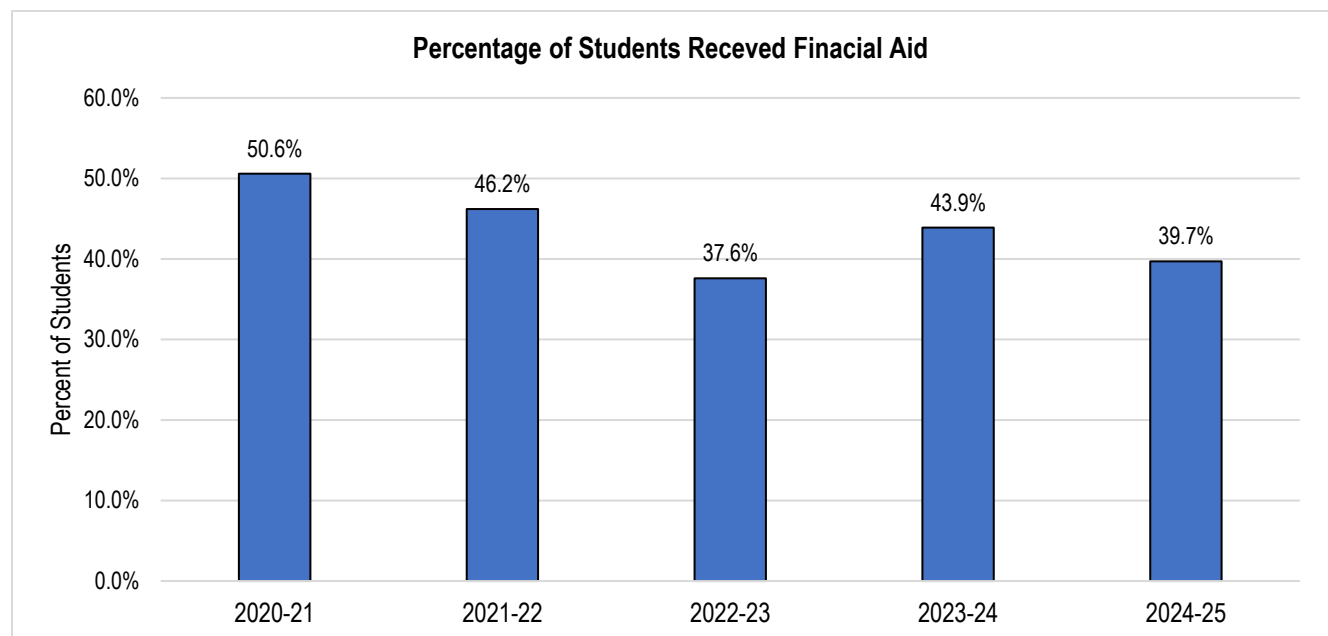

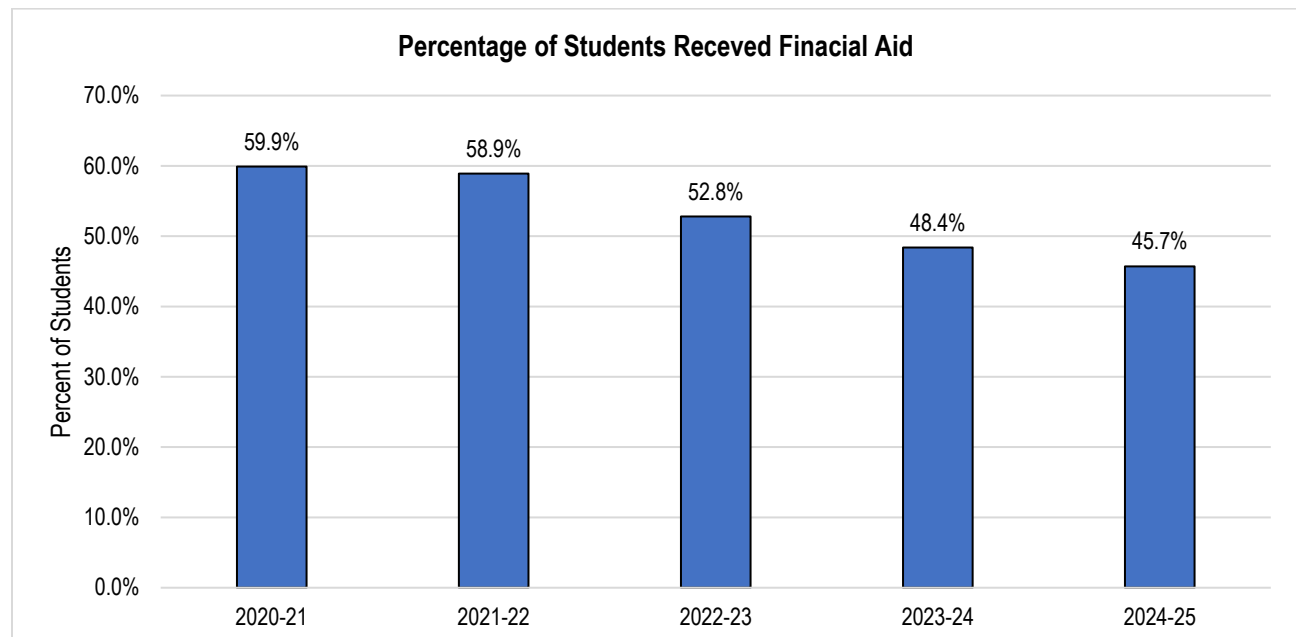

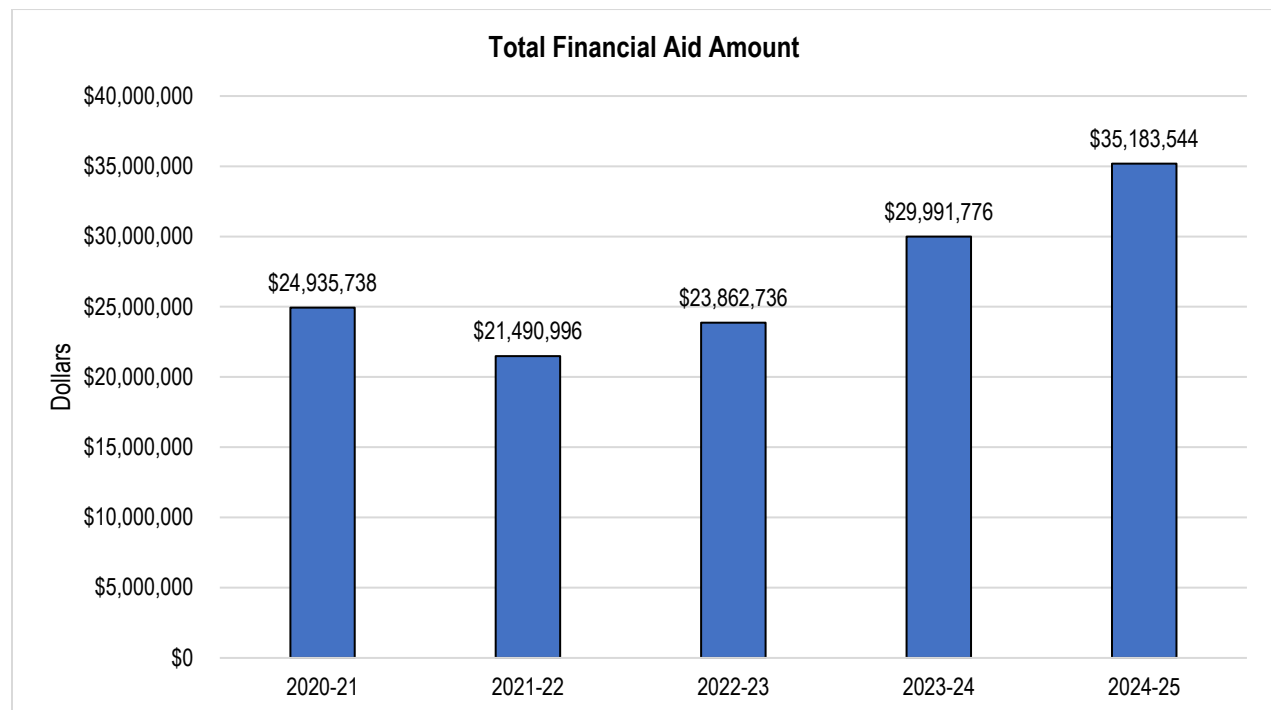
