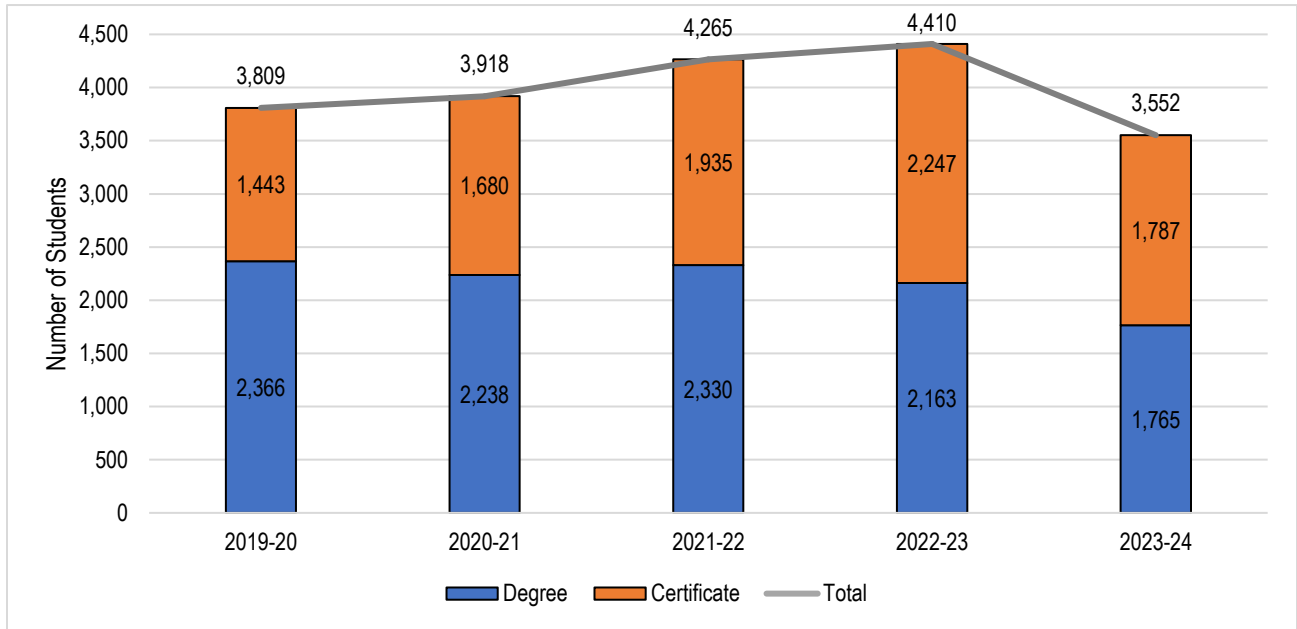

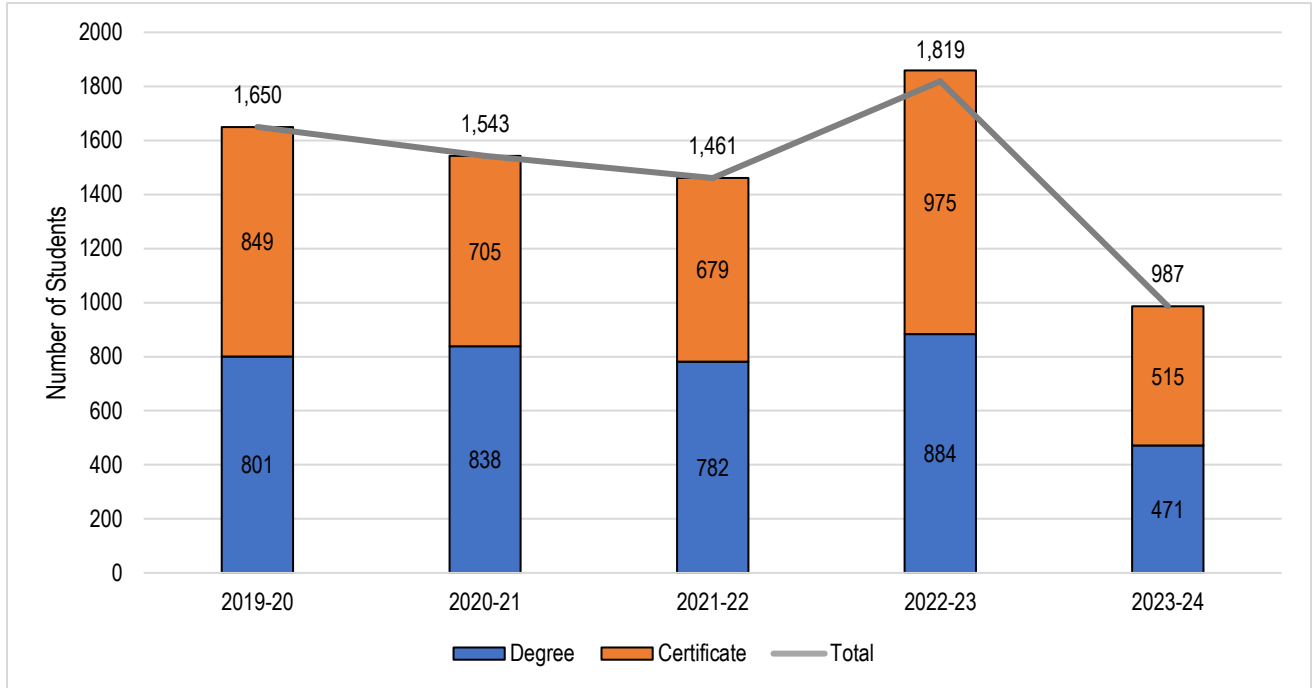

On average, between 2019-20 and 2023-24, 54.4% of total awards conferred were associate degrees and 45.6% were certificates. The number of associate degrees conferred in the last five academic years decreased by 25%, from 2,366 in 2019-20 to 1,765 in 2023-24 while the number of certificates conferred increased by 24%, from 1,443 in 2019-20 to 1,787 in 2023-24.

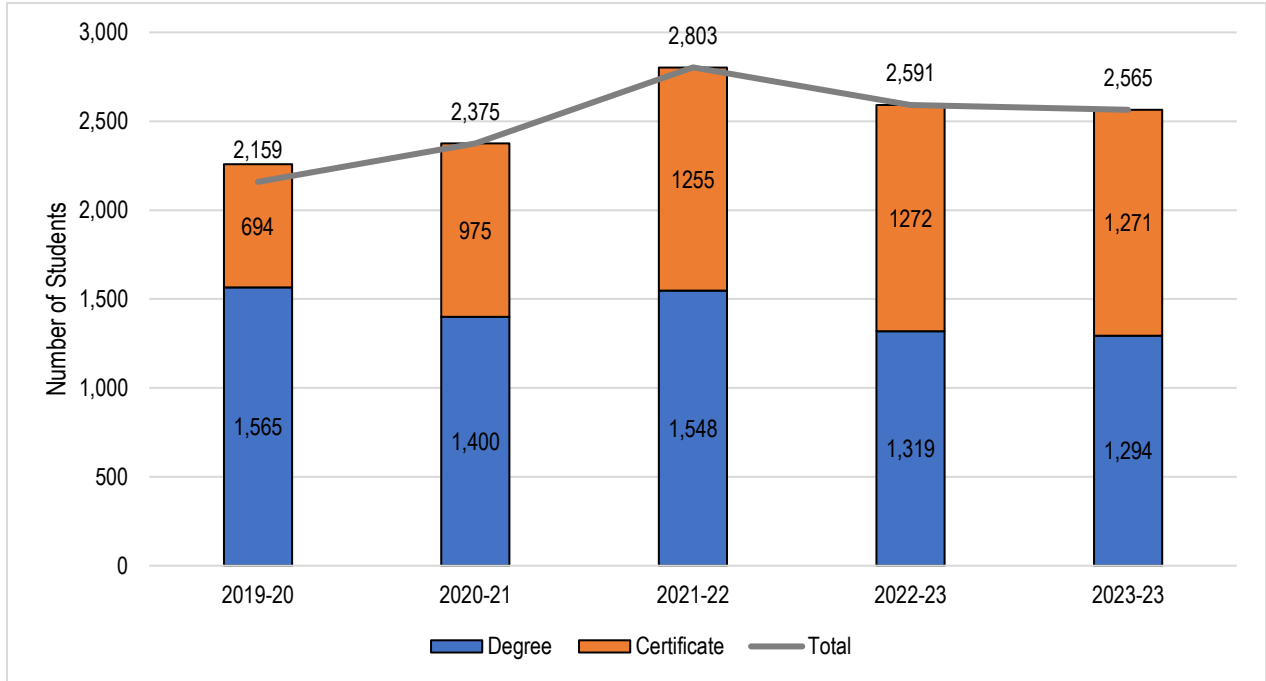

On average, between 2019-20 and 2023-24, 50.1% of total awards conferred at Crafton Hills College were associate degrees and 49.9% were certificates. Over this period, the number of associate degrees conferred decreased by 41%, from 801 in 2019-20 to 471 in 2023-24, and the number of certificates conferred reduced by 39%, from 849 in 2019-20 to 516 in 2023-24.

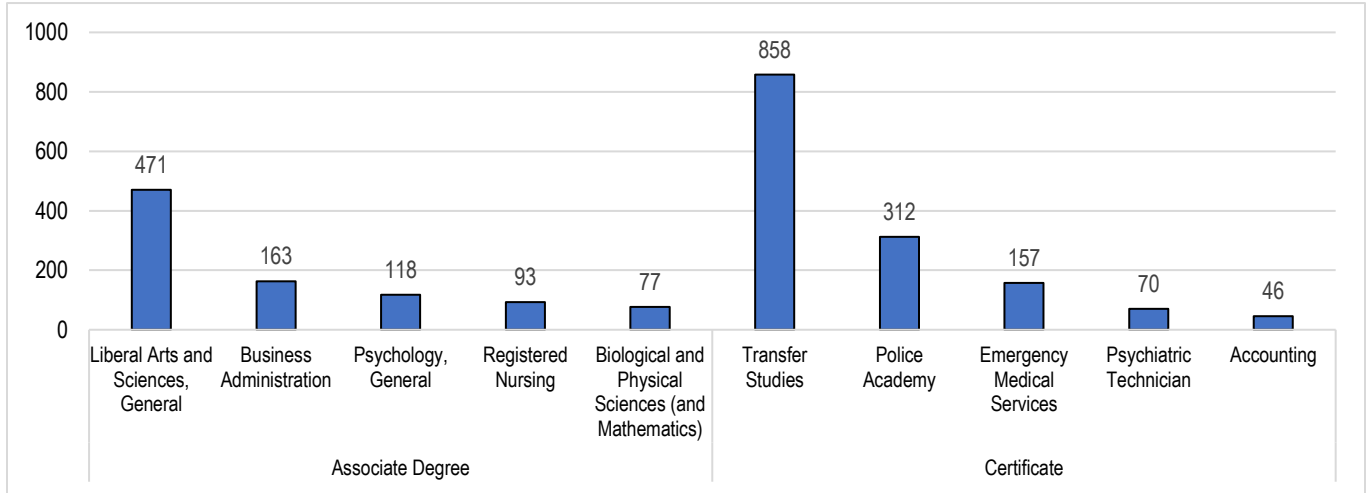

On average, between 2019-20 and 2023-24, 57% of total awards conferred at SBVC were associate degrees and 43% were certificates. Over this period, the number of associate degrees conferred decreased by 17%, from 1,565 in 2019-20 to 1,294 in 2023-24 while the number of certificates conferred increased by 114%, from 594 in 2019-20 to 1,271 in 2023-24.

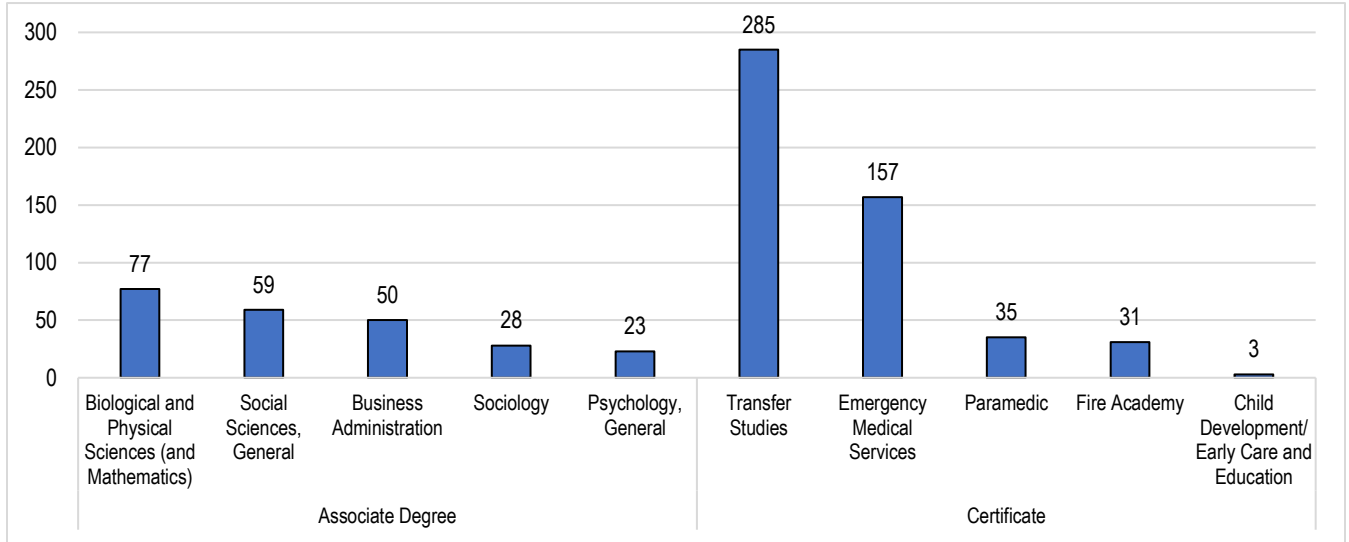

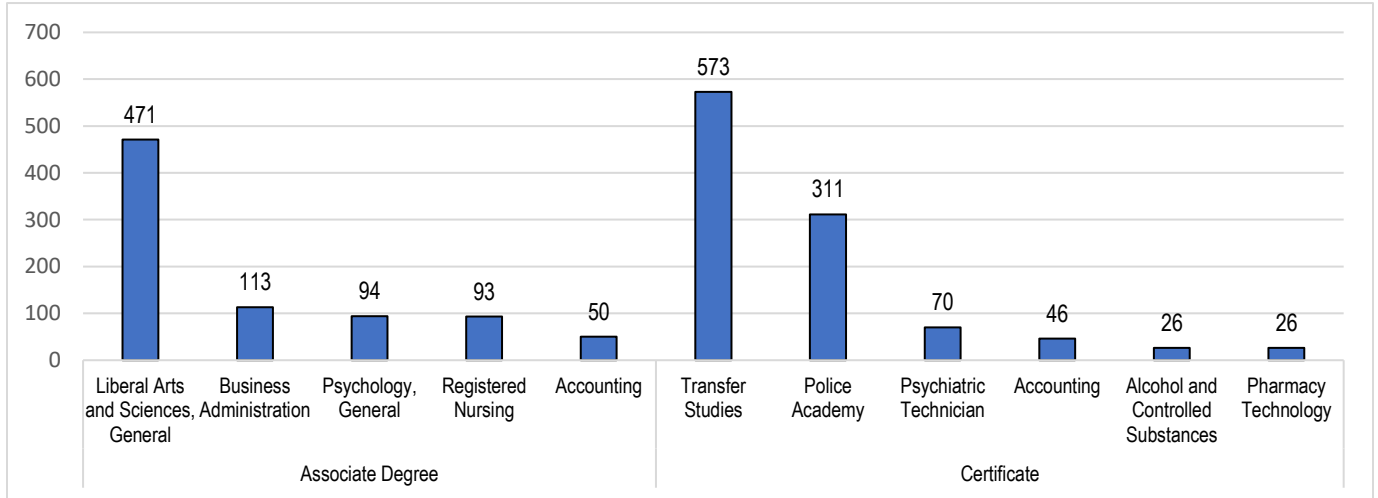

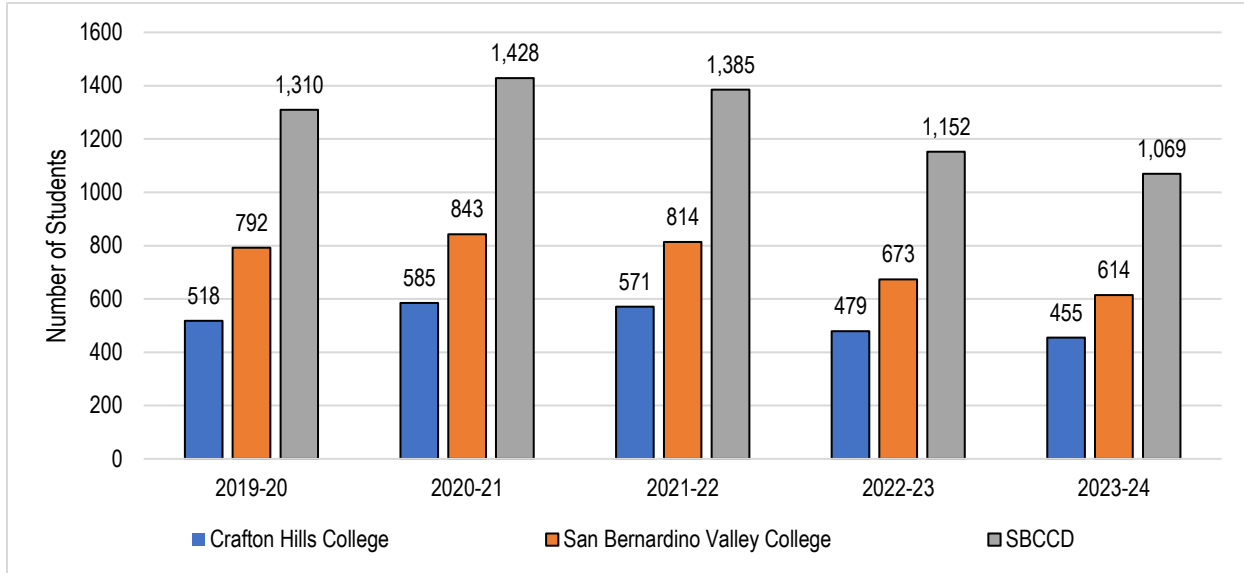

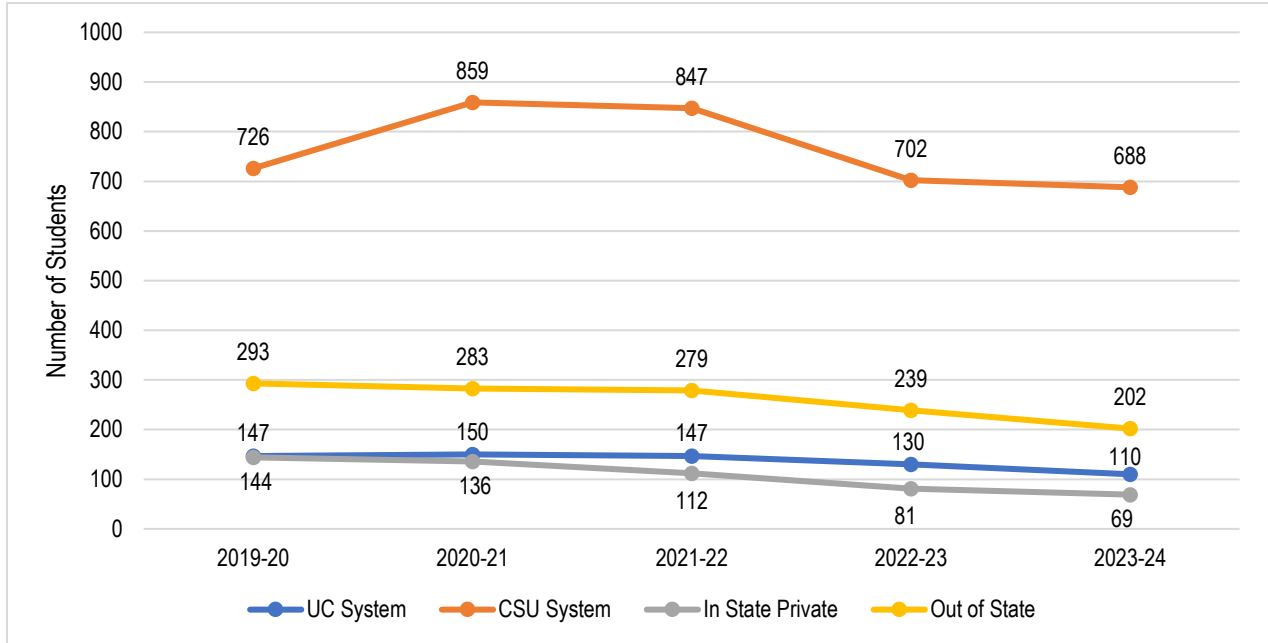

Between 2019-20 and 2023-24, the annual transfer volume for SBCCD declined by 18.4%, from 1,310 in 2019-20 to 1,069 in 2023-24, with a five-year average of 1,269.

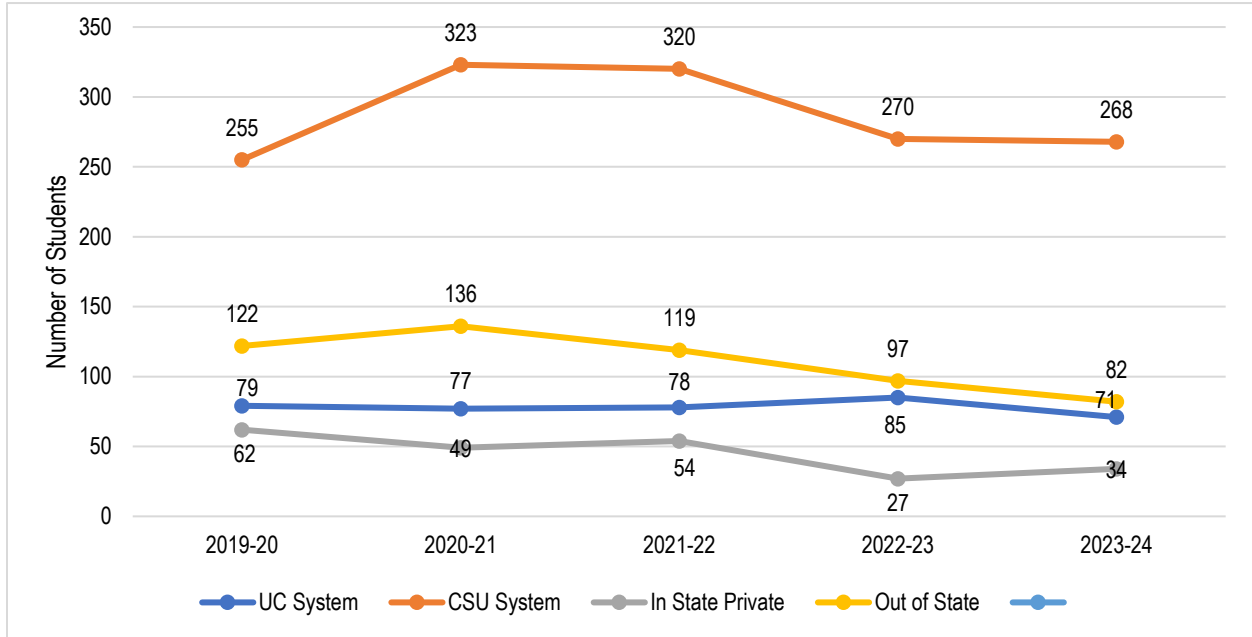

Between 2019-20 and 2023-24, transfer volume decreased to in-state private institutions (-52.1%), out-of-state institutions (-31.1%), the UC system (-25.2%), and the CSU system (-5.2%).

Over this period, of total students who transferred from both colleges in the District, on average, 60.2% transferred to the California State University (CSU), followed by students who transferred to out-of-state institutions (20.4%), the University of California System (10.8%), and in-state private institutions (8.5%).

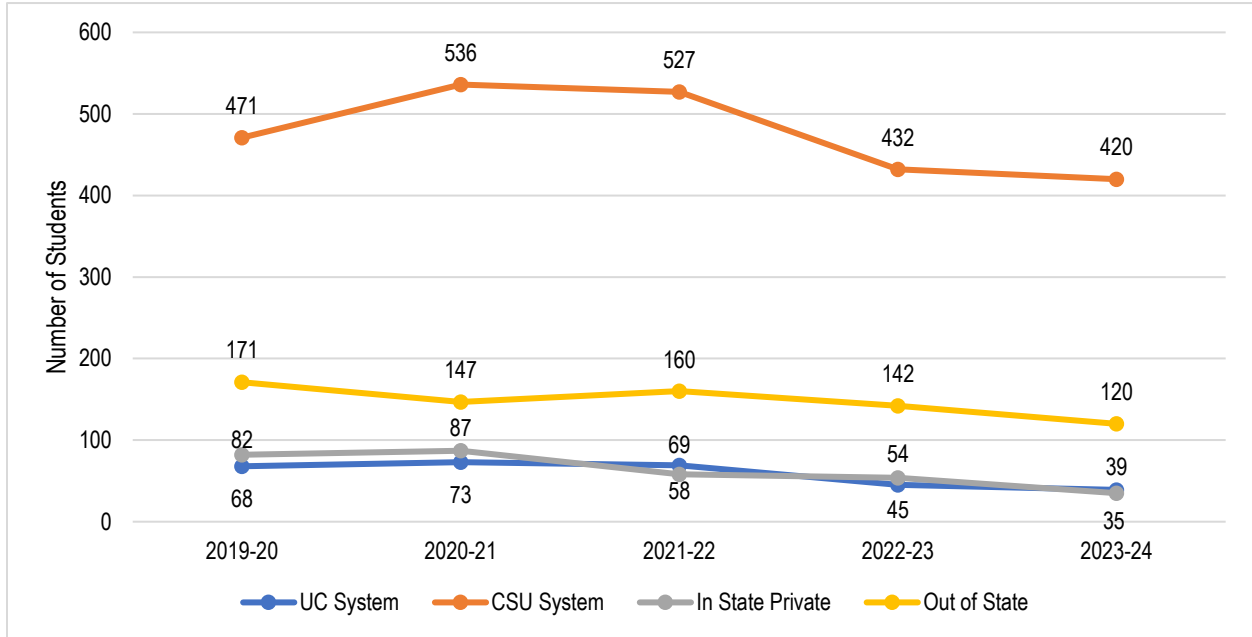

Between 2019-20 and 2023-24, the annual transfer volume for Crafton Hills College decreased by 12.2%, from 518 in 2019-20 to 455 in 2023-24, with a five-year average of 522. Transfer volume increased to the CSU system (+5.1%), while there was a decrease in transfer volume to in-state private institutions (-45.2%), out-of-state institutions (-32.9%), and the UC system (-10.1%).

Over this period, of total students who transferred, on average, 55.1% transferred to the California State University (CSU), followed by students who transferred to out-of-state institutions (21.3%), the University of California System (15.0%), and in-state private institutions (8.7%).

Between 2019-20 and 2023-24, the annual transfer volume for San Bernardino Valley College declined by 22.5%, from 792 in 2019-20 to 614 in 2023-24, with a five-year average of 747. Transfer volume decreased to out-of-state institutions (-57.3%), the CSU system (-42.6%), in-state private institutions (-29.8%), and the UC system (-10.8%).

Over this period, of total students who transferred, on average, 63.9% transferred to the California State University (CSU), followed by students who transferred to out-of-state institutions (19.8%), in-state private institutions (8.5%), and the University of California System (7.9%).

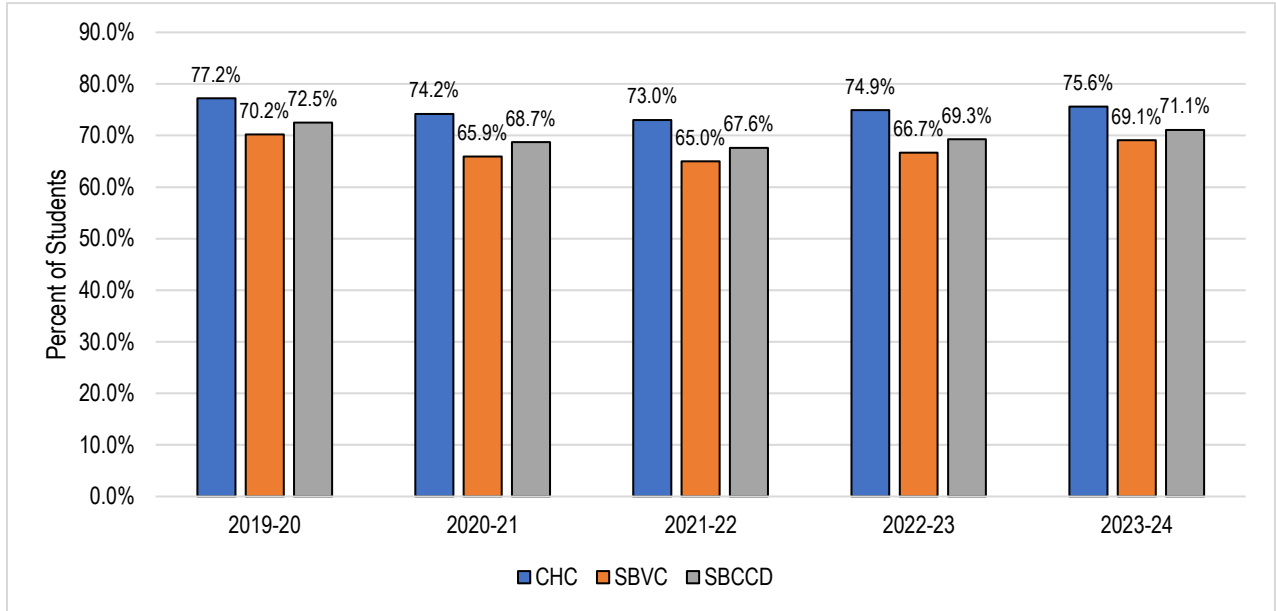

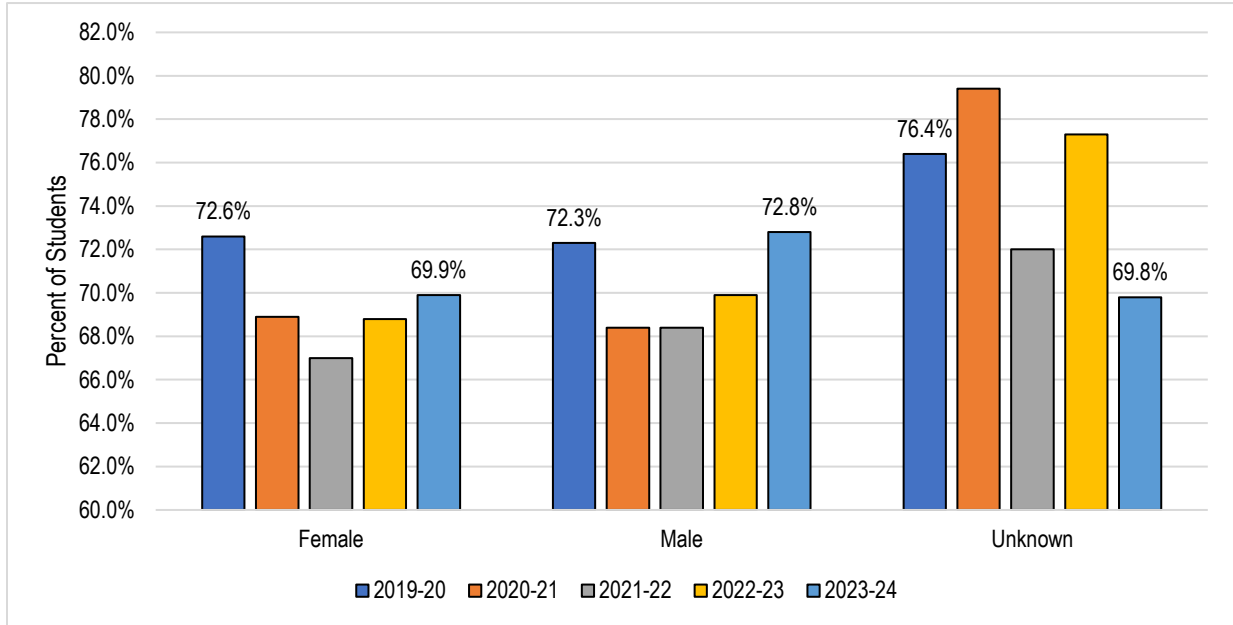

Course Success Rates by Gender: SBCCD

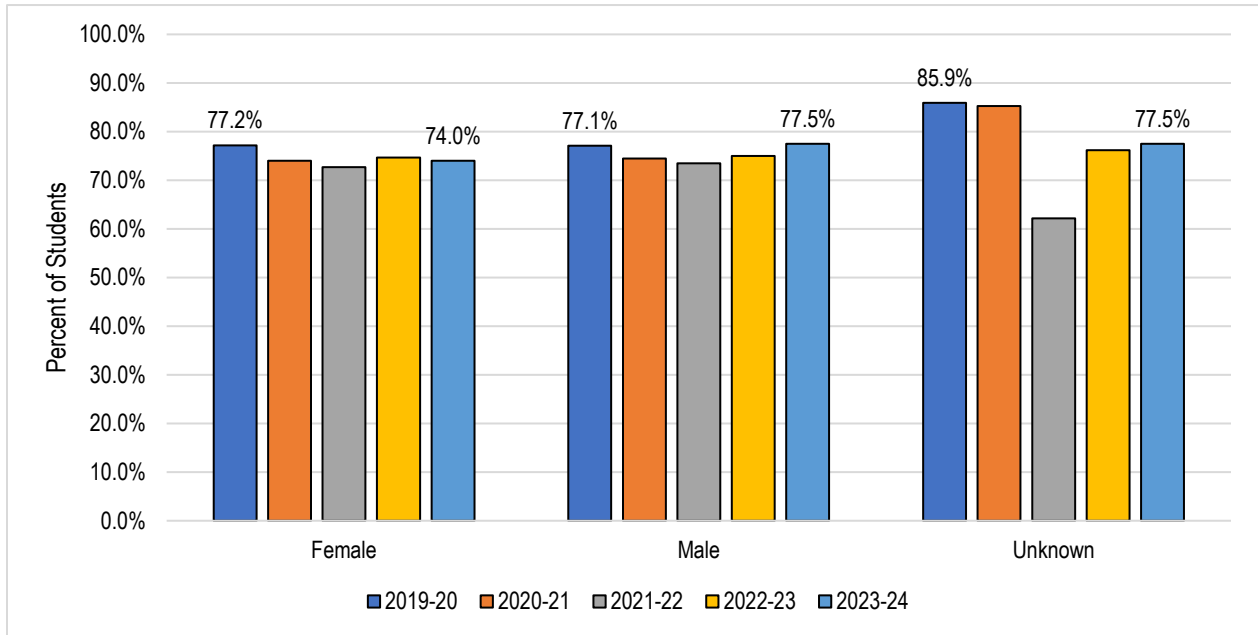

Course Success Rates by Gender: Crafton Hills College

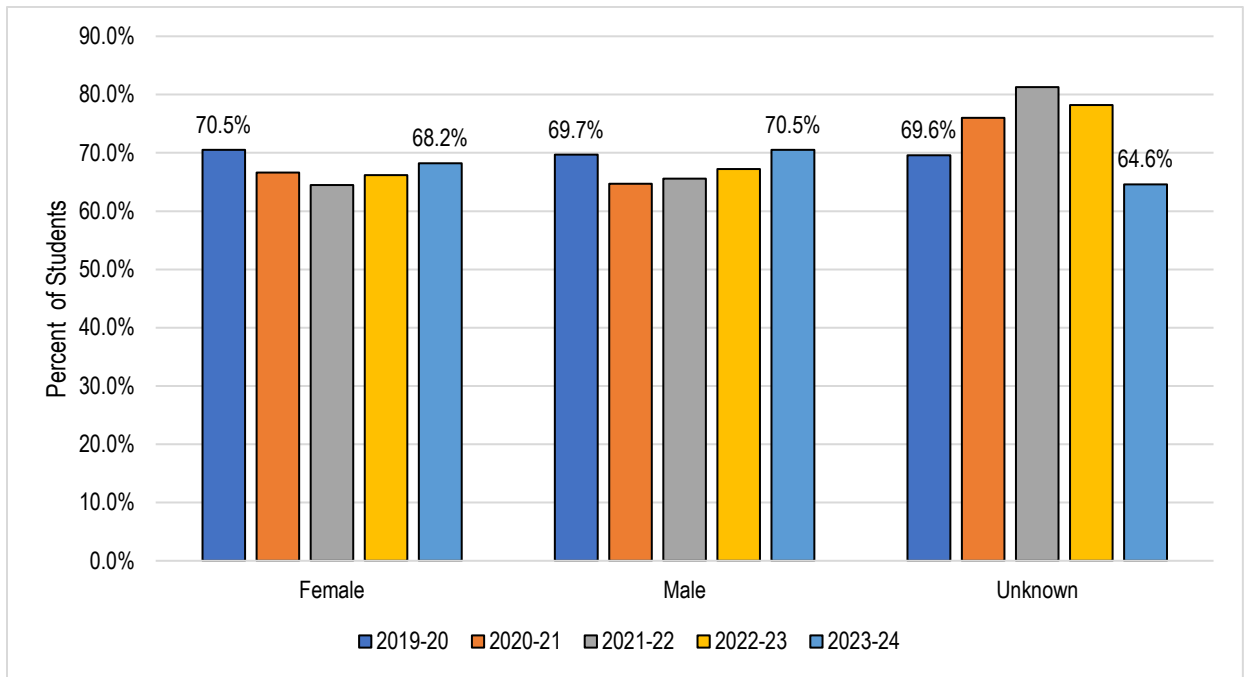

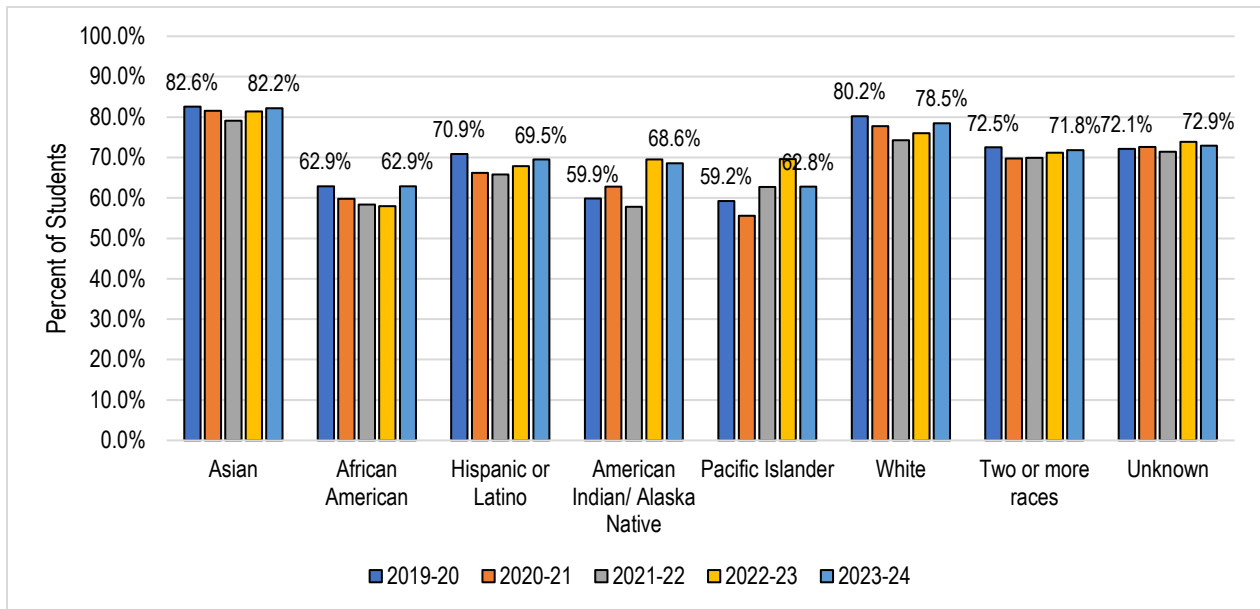

Course Success Rates by Race/Ethnicity: SBCCD



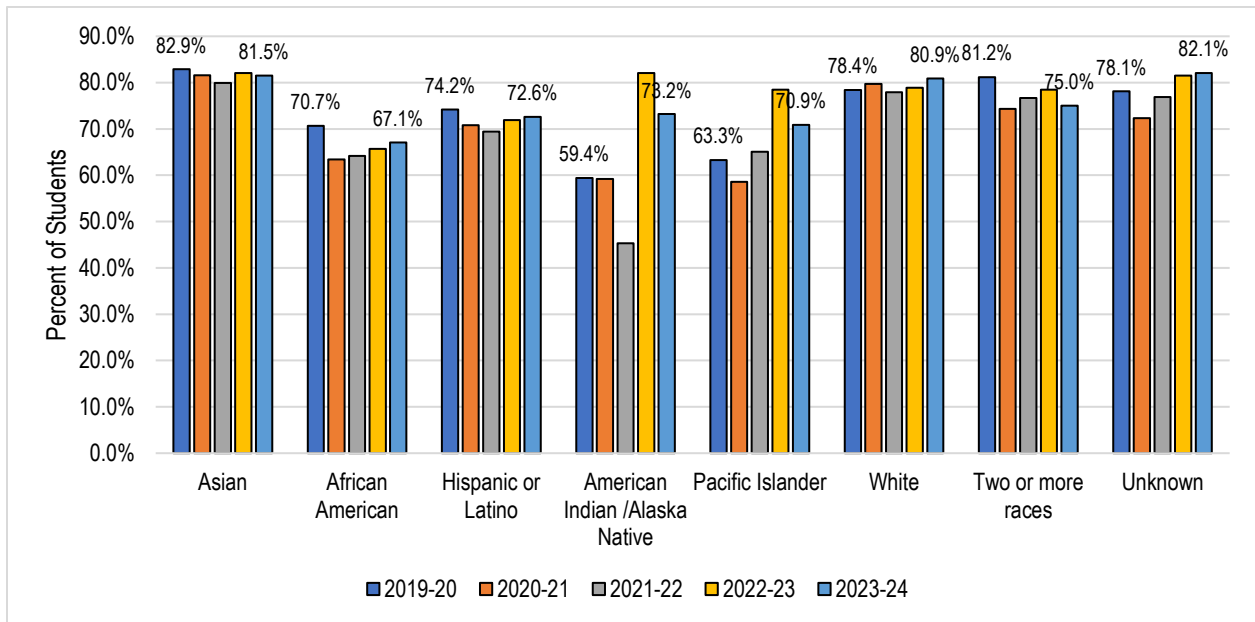

On average, between 2019-20 and 2023-24, Asian students had the highest success rate (81.5%). The second highest were White students with 77.5%. The lowest were African American students (60.6%) and Pacific Islander students (62.3%).

Over this period, the success rates of American Indian /Alaska Native (+8.7%) and Pacific Islander (+3.6%) students increased, while the success rates of White (-1.7%) and Hispanic (-1.4%) students decreased.

Course Success Rates by Race/Ethnicity: Crafton Hills College



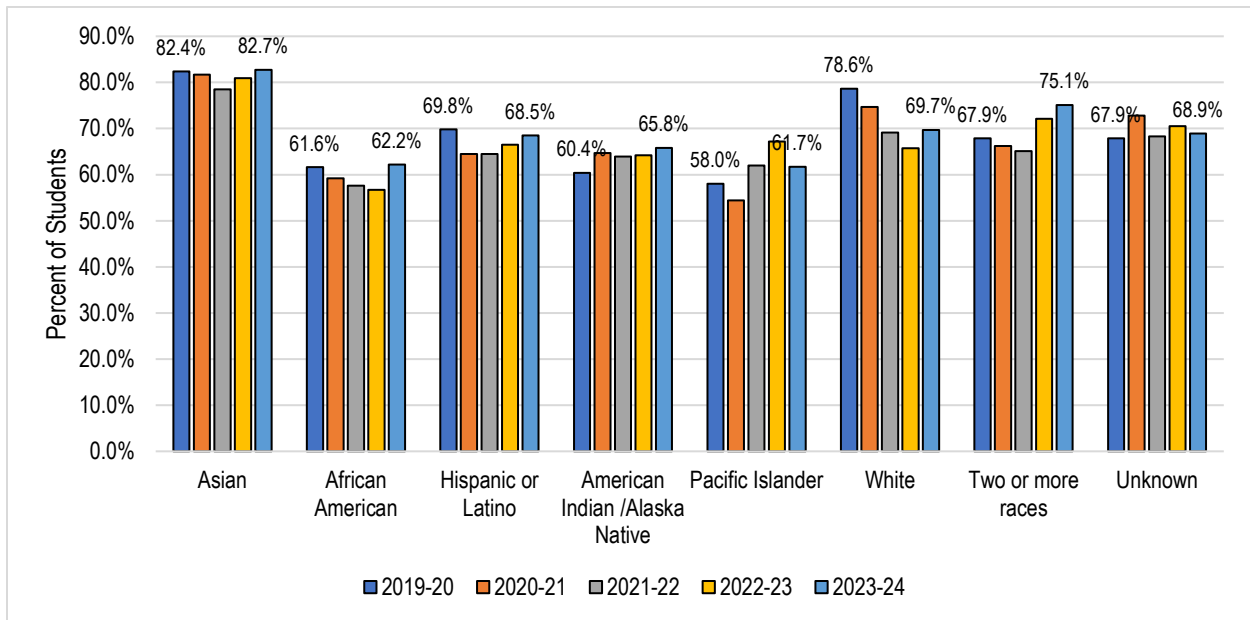

On average, between 2019-20 and 2023-24, Asian students had the highest success rate (81.7%). The second highest were White students with 79.8%. The lowest were Pacific Islander students (58.8%), American Indian /Alaska Native students (64.2%), and African American students (66.4%).

Over this period, the success rates of American Indian /Alaska Native (+13.3%), Pacific Islander (+7.6%), and White (+2.5%) students increased while the success rates of Multiracial (-6.2%), African American (-3.6%), and Hispanic (-1.6%) students decreased.

Course Success Rates by Race/Ethnicity: San Bernardino Valley College



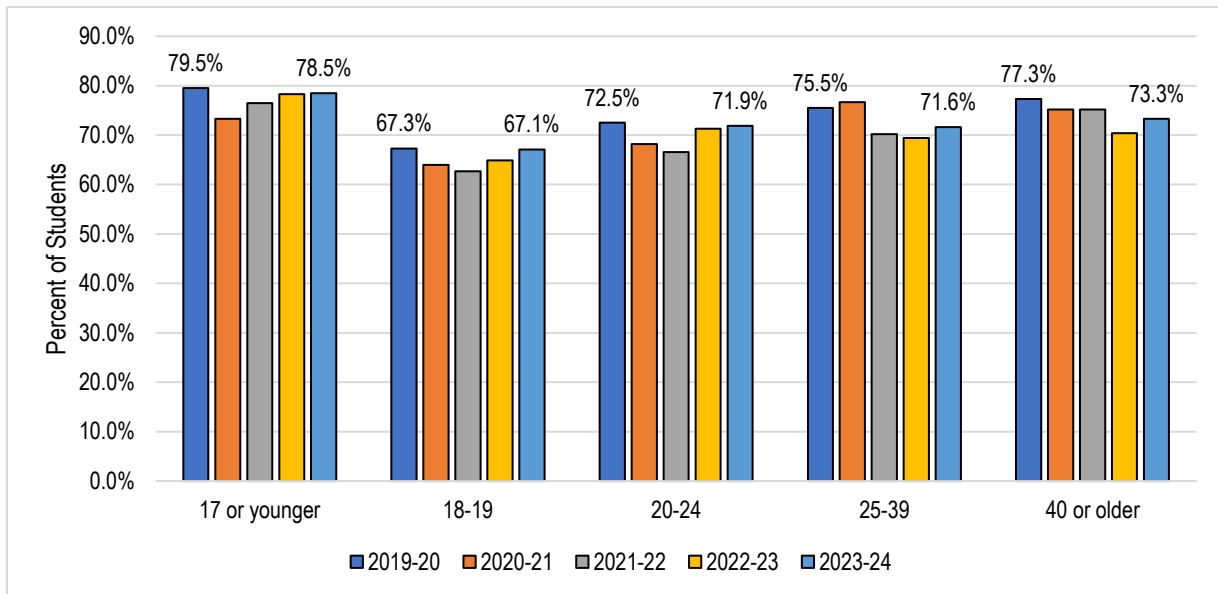

On average, between 2019-20 and 2023-24, Asian students had the highest success rate (81.3%). The second highest were White students with 74.1%. The lowest were Pacific Islander students (61.1%) and African American students (64.0%).

Over this period, the success rates of American Indian /Alaska Native (+5.4%), Pacific Islander (+3.7%), White (+1.8%), and Black or African American (+0.6%) students increased, while the success rate of Multiracial (-3.5%) and Hispanic (-1.3%) students decreased.

Course Success Rates by Age: SBCCD



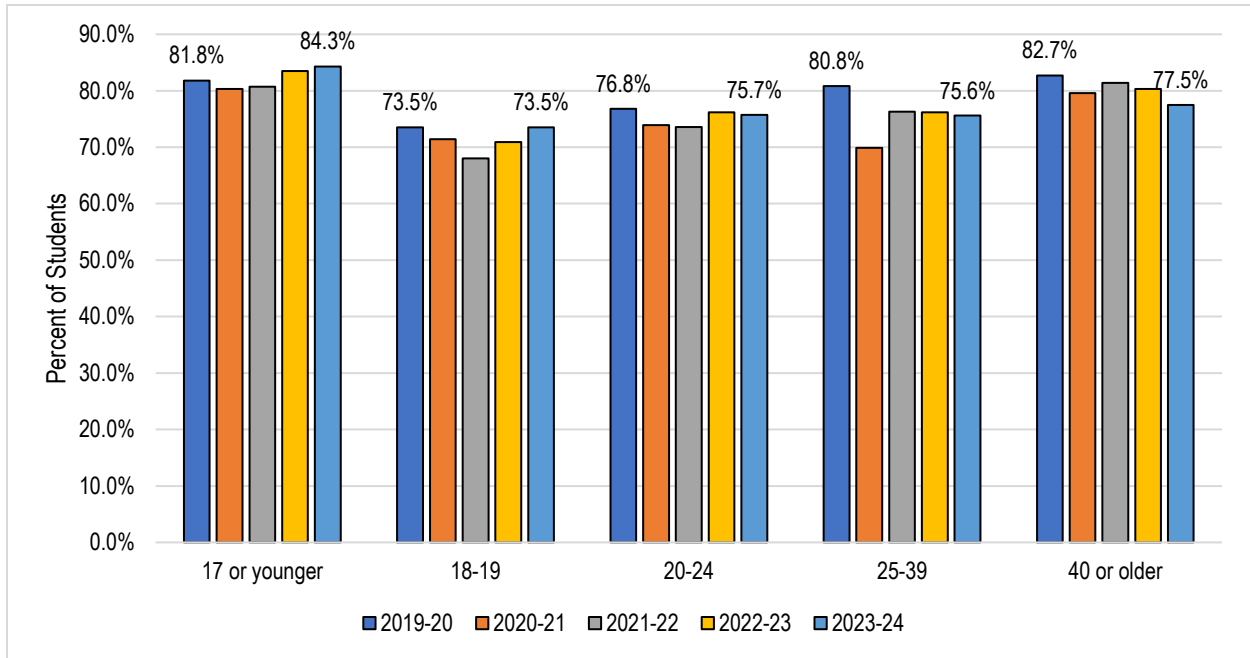

On average, between 2019-20 and 2023-24, students under 17 years old had the highest success rate (77.4%). The lowest success rate was seen in students 18-19 years old (65.3%).

Over this period, the success rates of students under 17 years old (-1.0%), students 18-19 years old (-0.2%), students 20-24 years old (-0.6%), students 25-39 years old (-3.9%), and students over 40 years old (-4.0%) decreased.

Course Success Rates by Age: Crafton Hills College



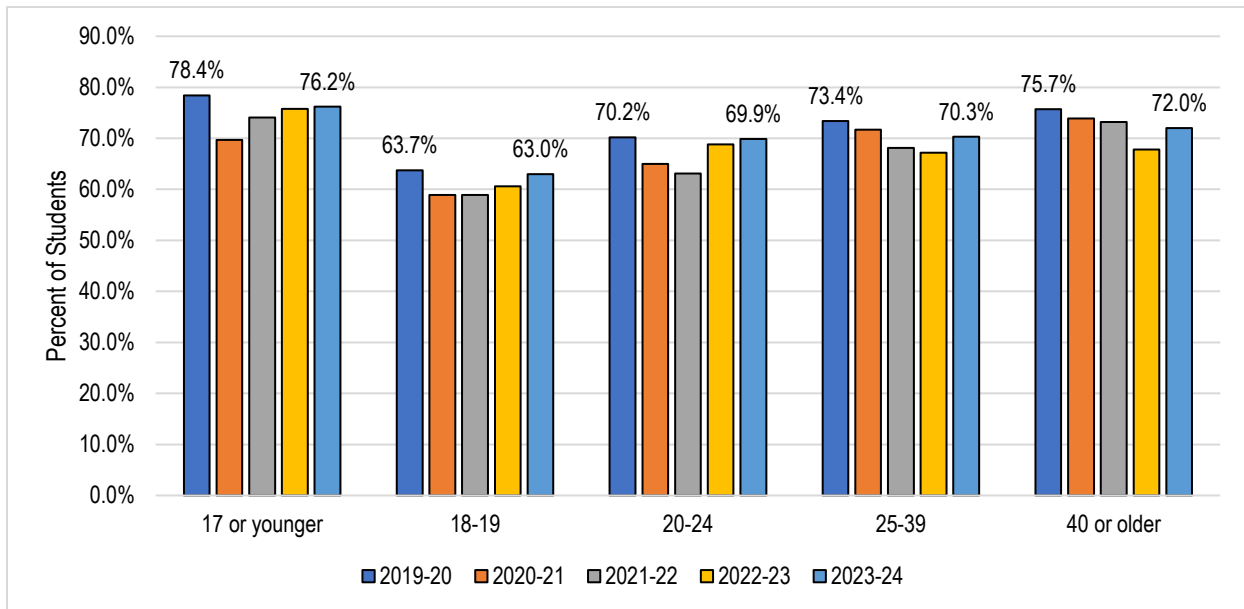

Course Success Rates by Age: San Bernardino Valley College



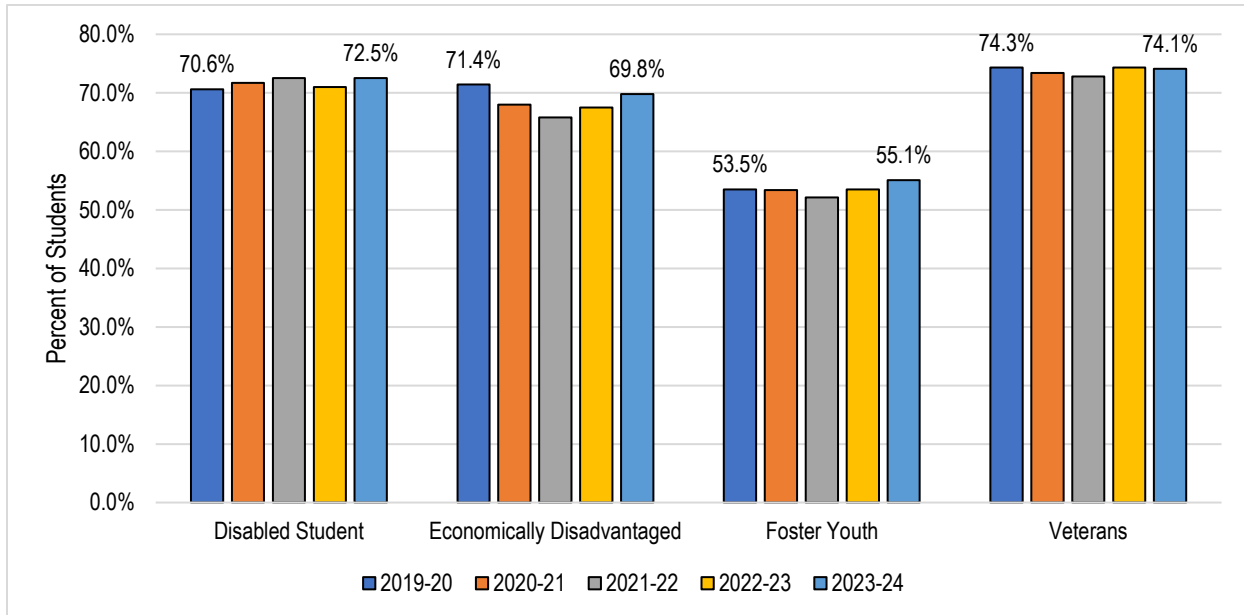

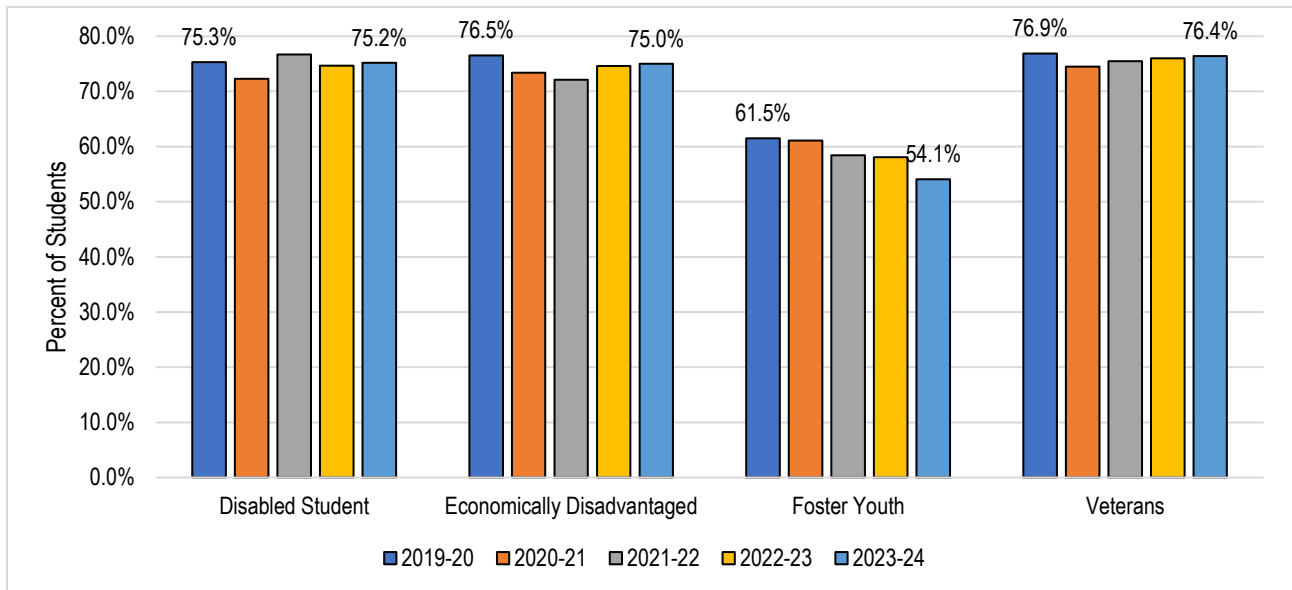

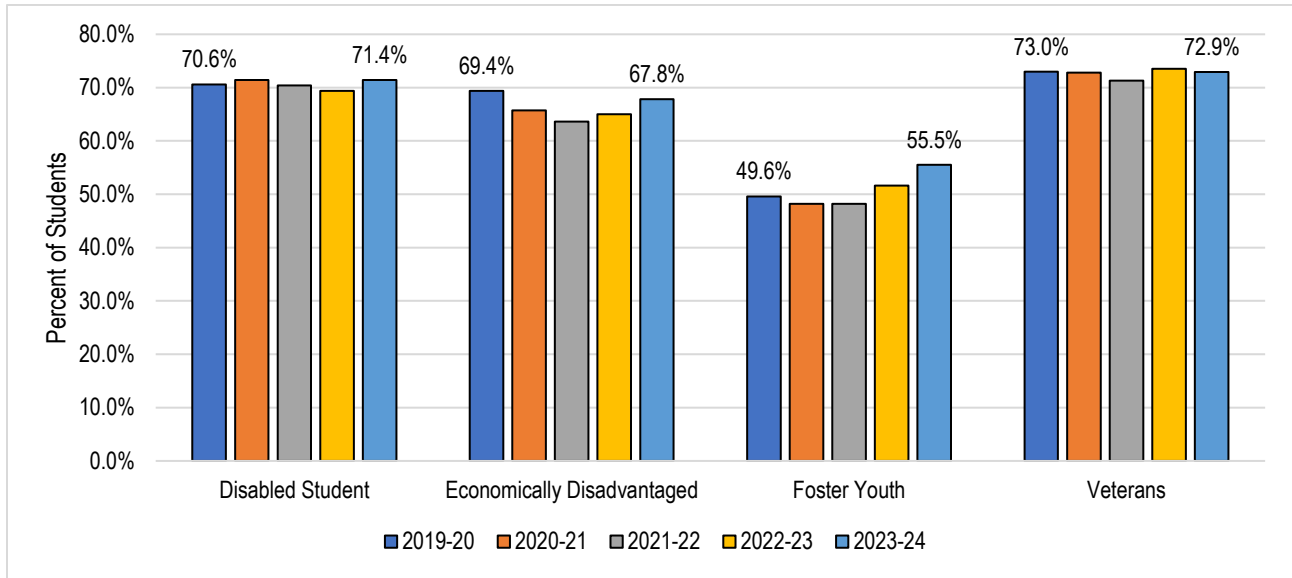

Course Success Rates by Special Population: San Bernardino Valley College



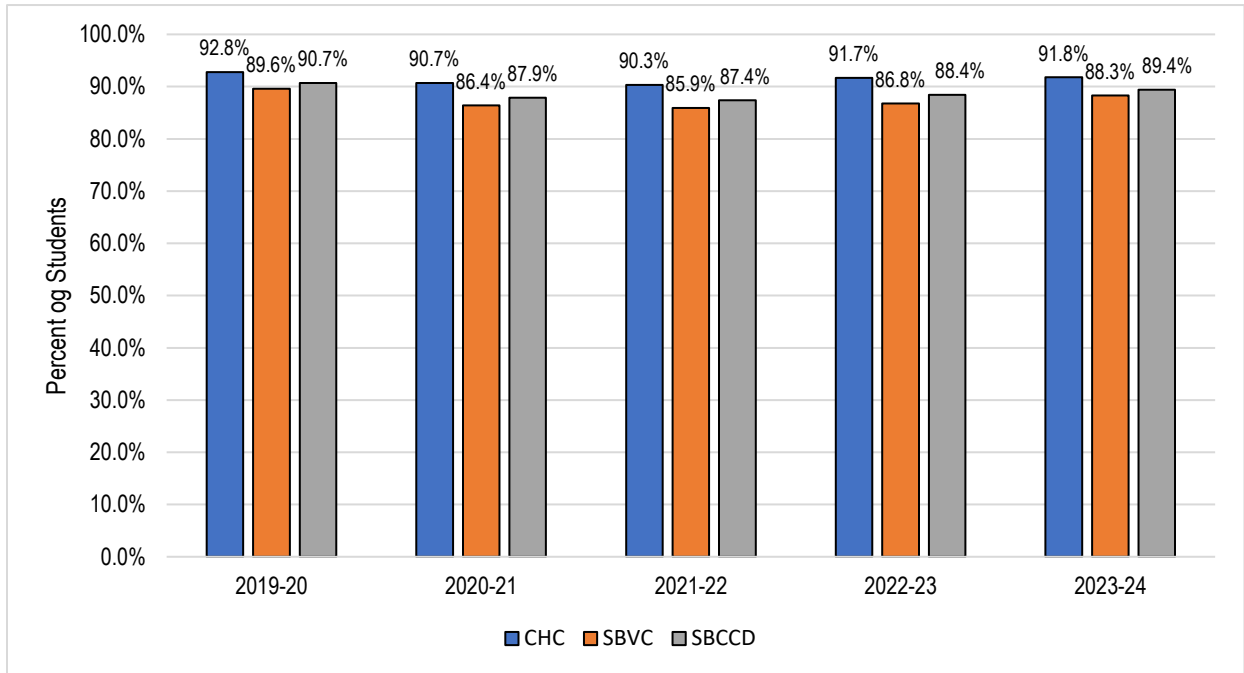

Course Completion Rates



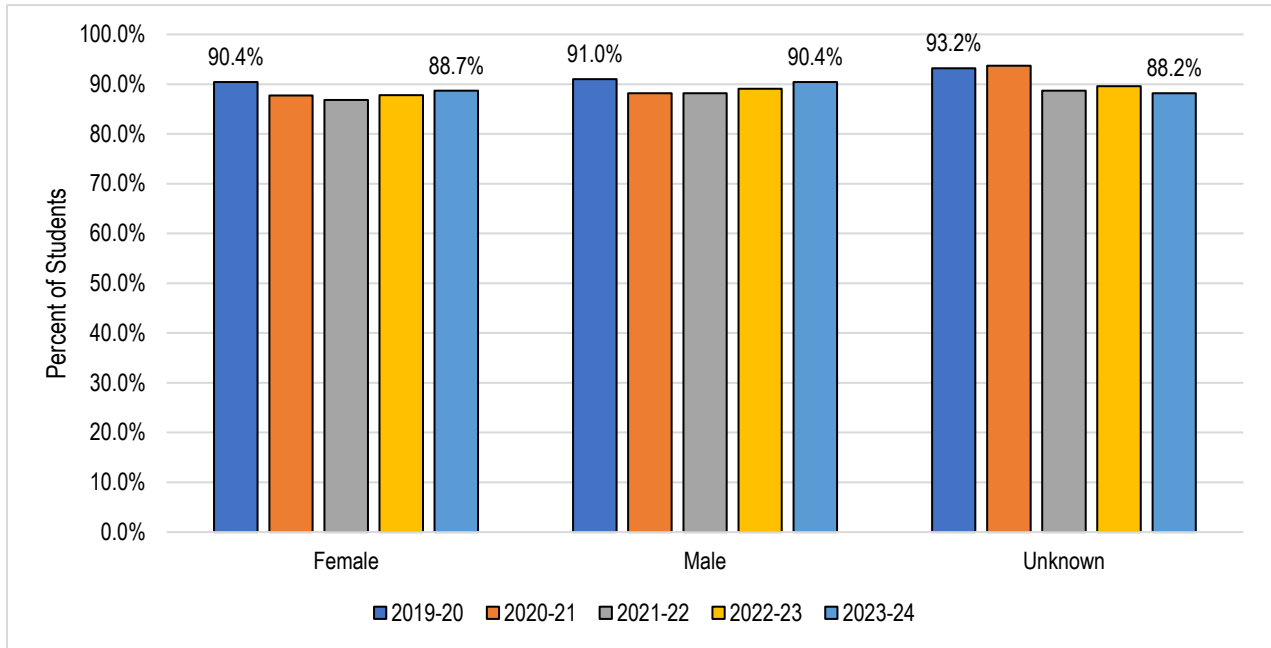

Course Completion Rates by Gender: SBCCD

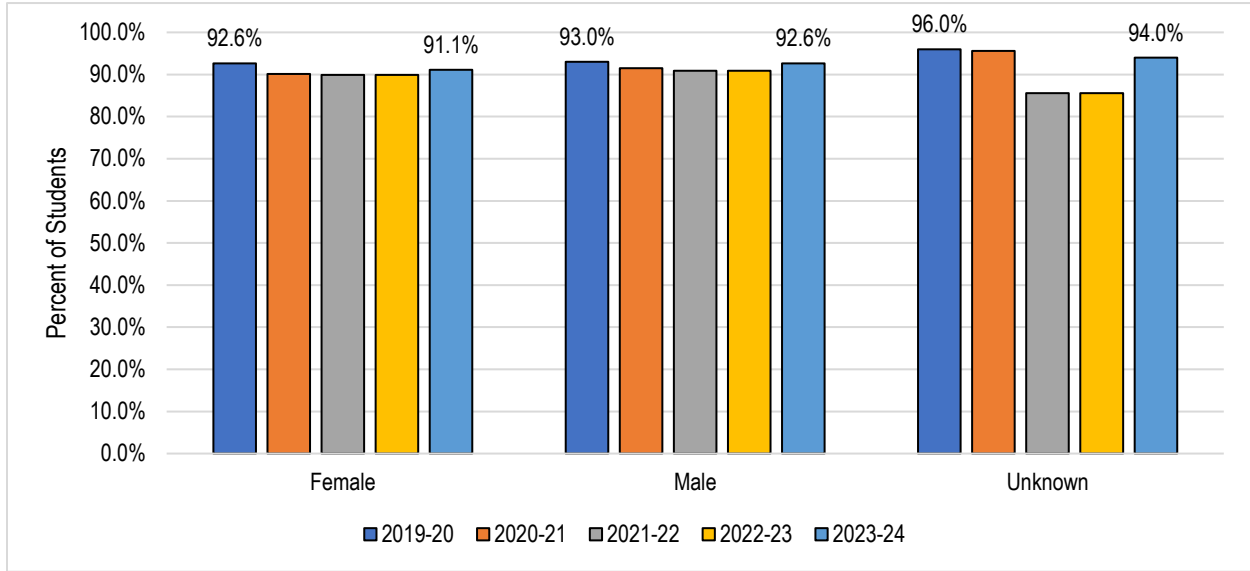

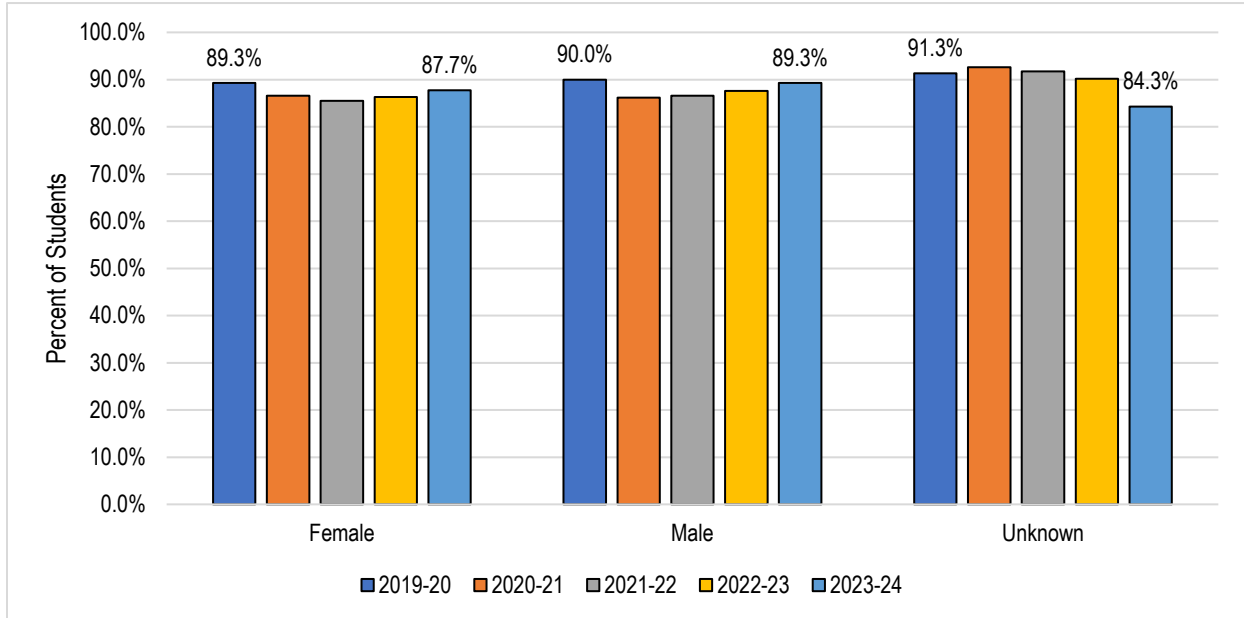

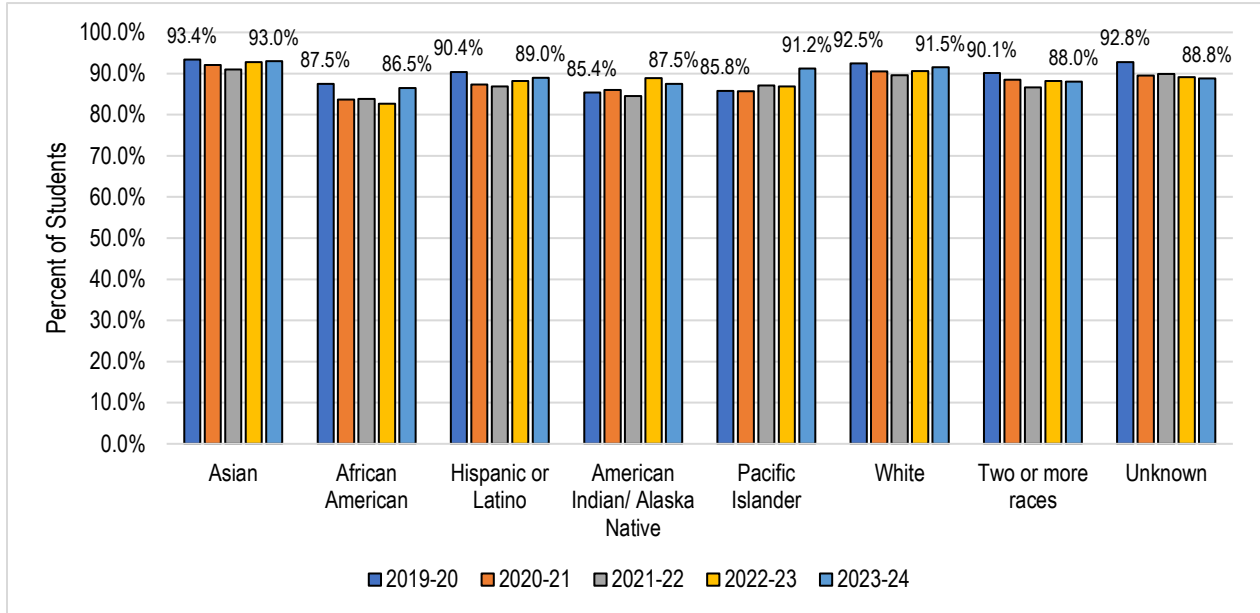

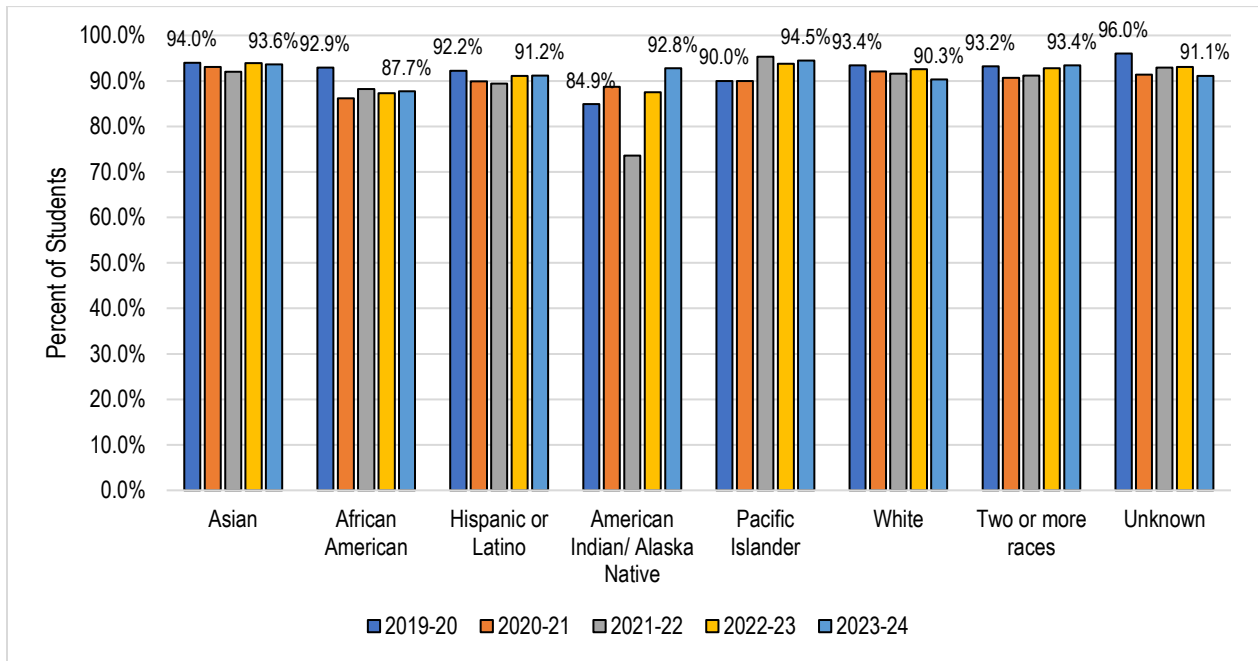

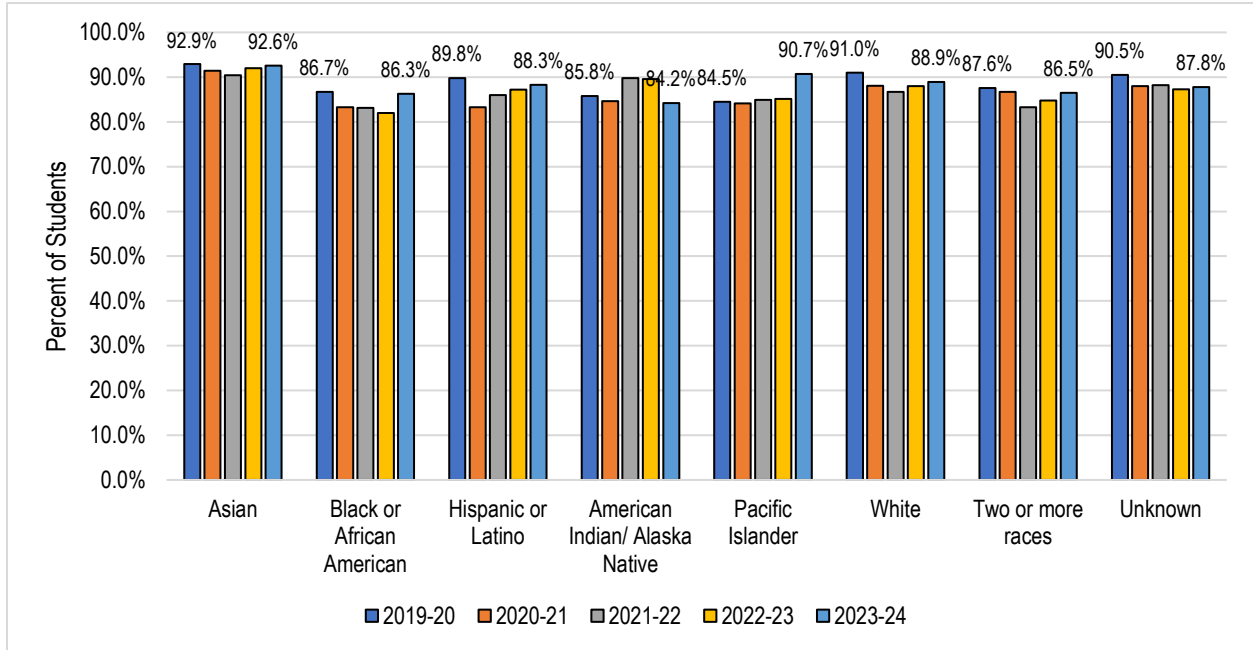

Course Completion Rates by Race/Ethnicity: San Bernardino Valley College



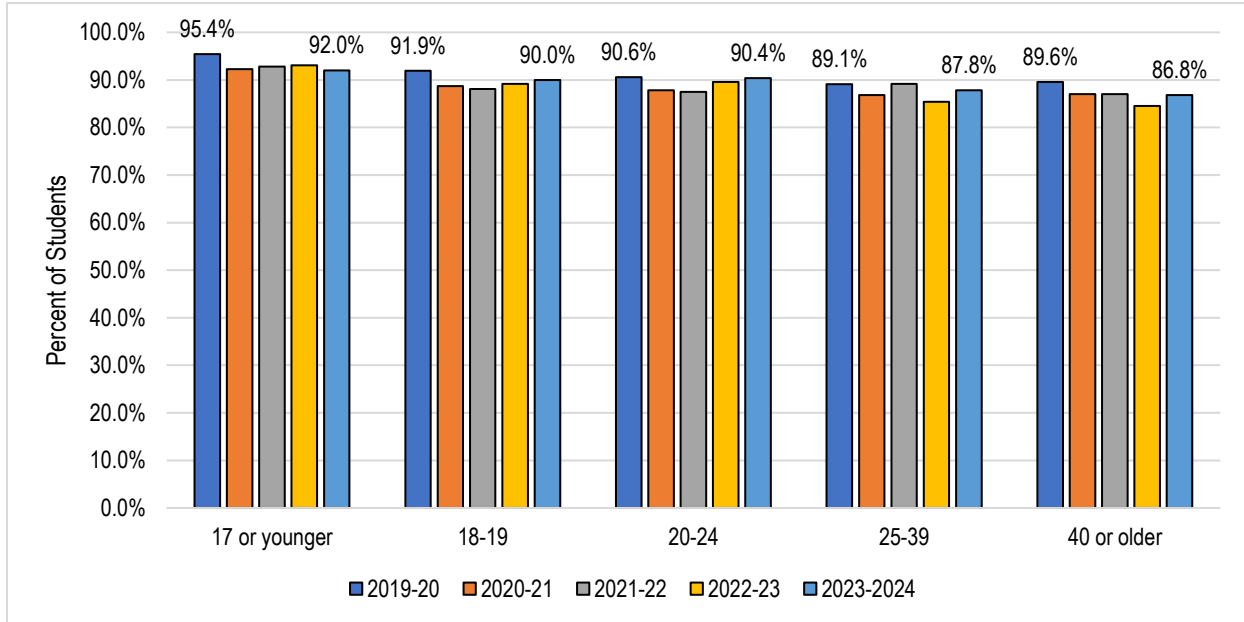

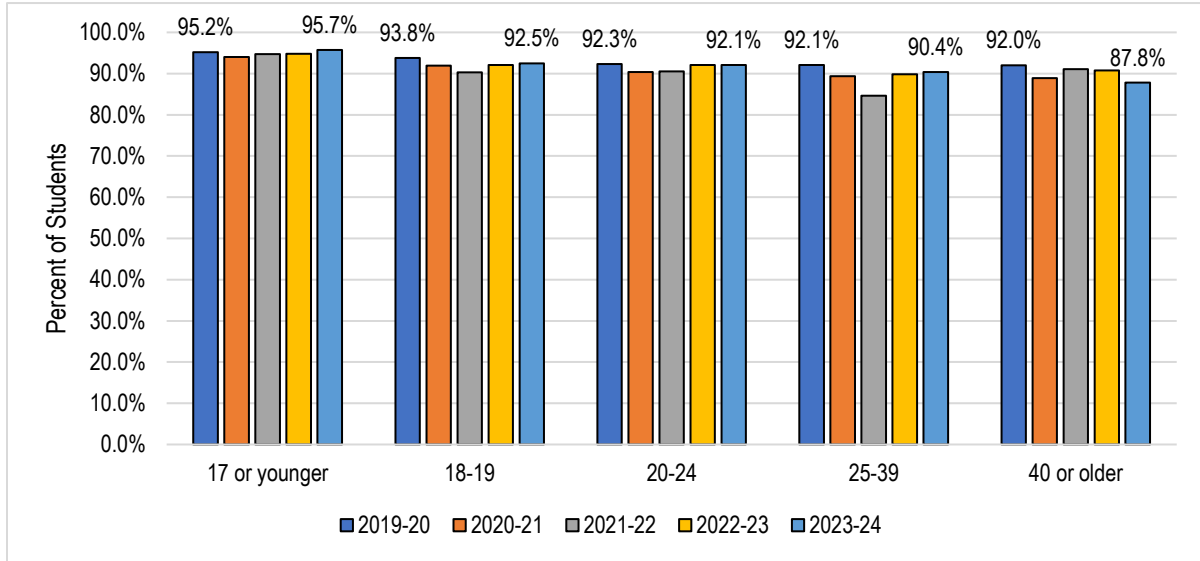

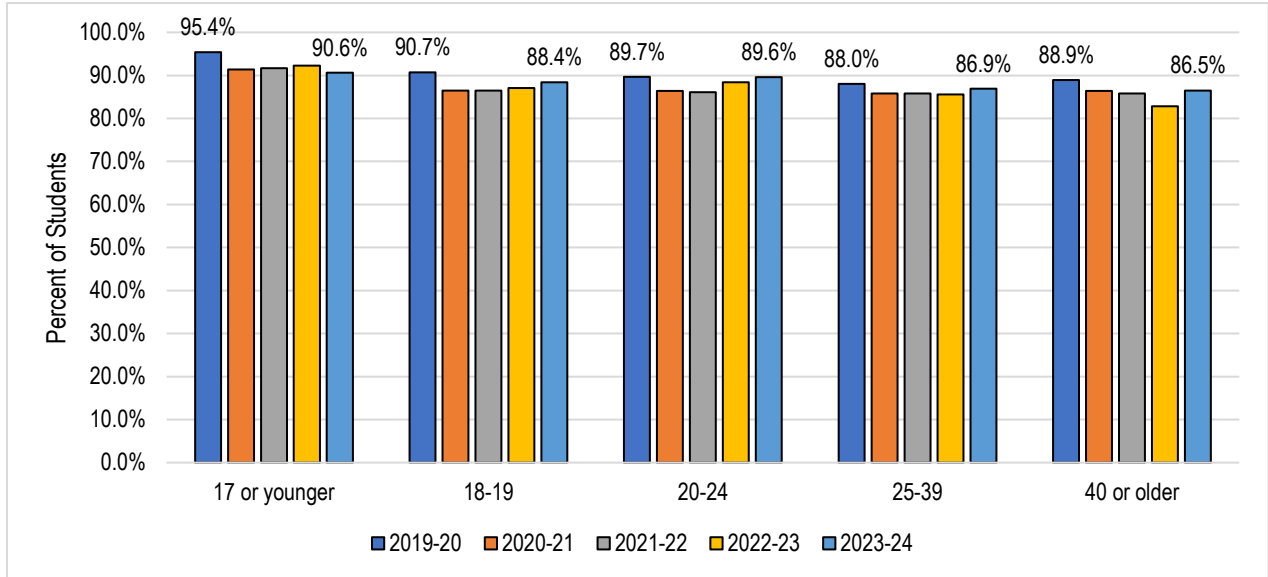

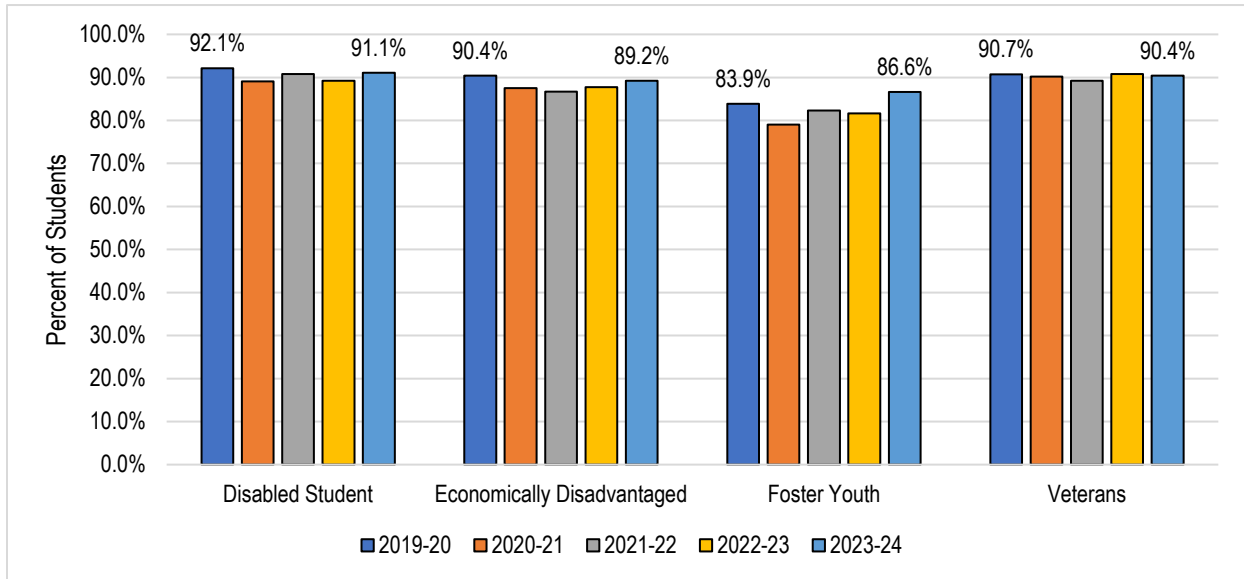

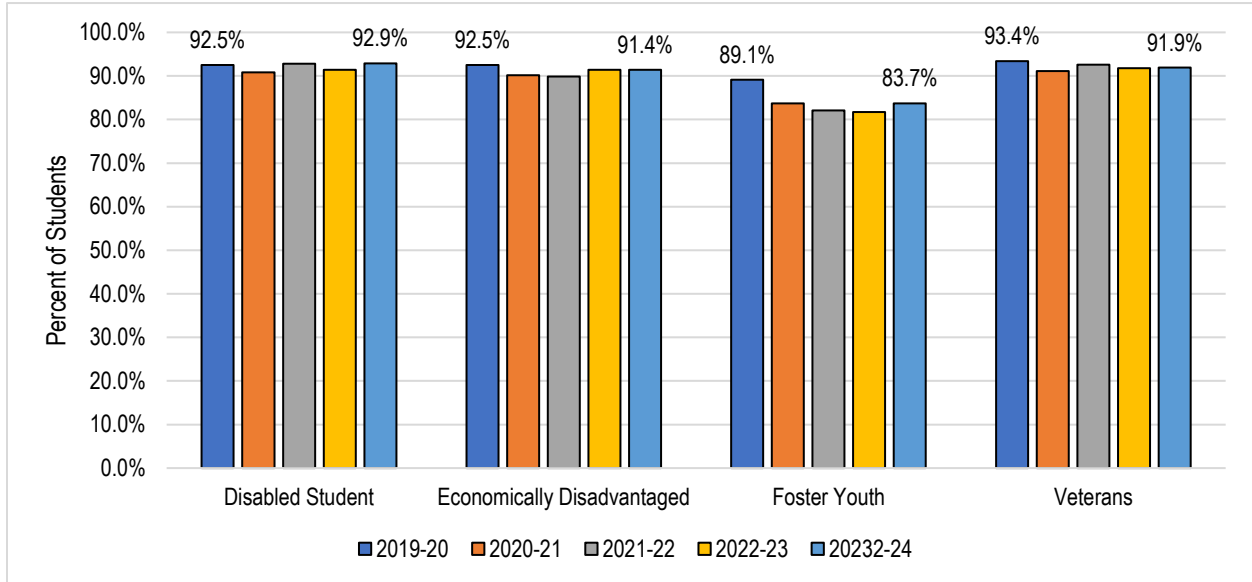

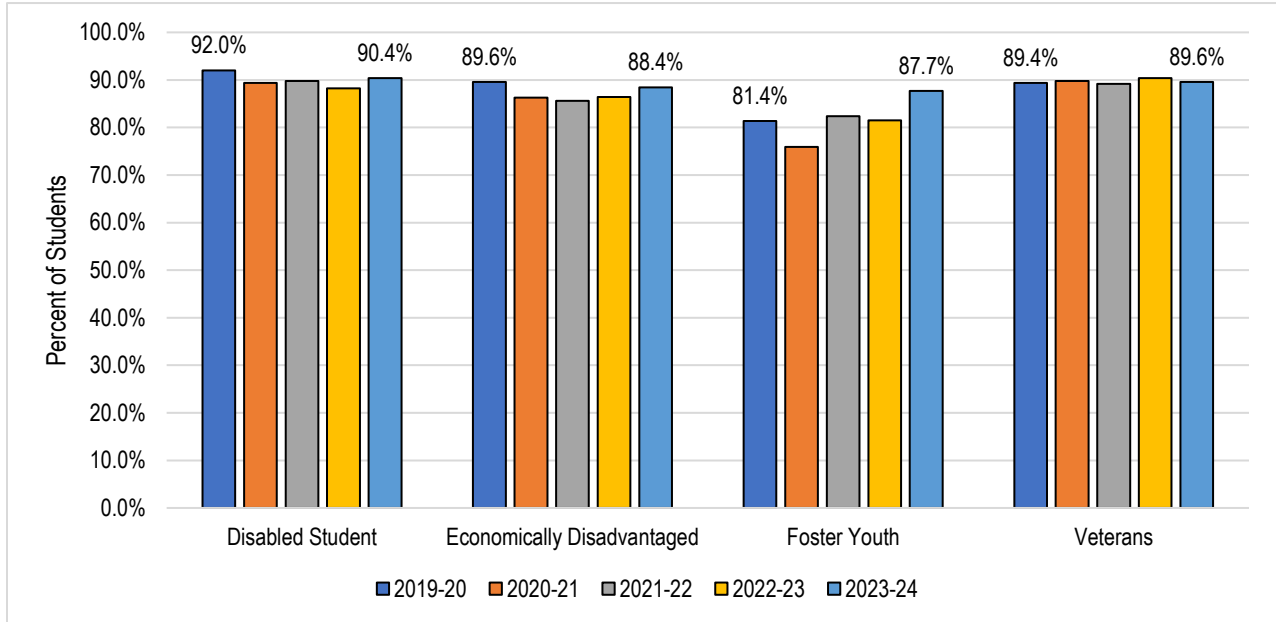
