







On average, between 2020-21 and 2024-25, 52.4% of total awards conferred were associate degrees and 47.6% were certificates. The number of associate degrees conferred in the last five academic years decreased by 2%, from 2,238 in 2020-21 to 2,194 in 2024-25 while the number of certificates conferred increased by 23%, from 1,680 in 2020-21 to 2,073 in 2024-25.



On average, between 2020-21 and 2024-25, 51.0% of total awards conferred at Crafton Hills College were associate degrees and 49.0% were certificates. Over this period, the number of associate degrees conferred decreased by 10%, from 838 in 2020-21 to 753 in 2024-25, and the number of certificates conferred reduced by 5%, from 705 in 2020-21 to 670 in 2024-25.



On average, between 2020-21 and 2024-25, 53.1% of total awards conferred at SBVC were associate degrees and 46.9% were certificates. Over this period, the number of associate degrees conferred increased by 3%, from 1,400 in 2020-21 to 1,441 in 2024-25 while the number of certificates conferred increased by 44%, from 975 in 2020-21 to 1,403 in 2024-25.









**Course Success Rates by Gender: SBCCD**







**Course Success Rates by Race/Ethnicity: SBCCD**





On average, between 2020-21 and 2024-25, Asian students had the highest success rate (81.7%). The second highest were White students with 77.2%. The lowest were African American students (61.3%), Pacific Islander students (63.6%), and American Indian /Alaska Native students (65.2%).

Over this period, the success rates of Pacific Islander (+9.7%), Hispanic (+6.7%), and African Americans (6.2%) students increased.

**Course Success Rates by Race/Ethnicity: Crafton Hills College**





On average, between 2020-21 and 2024-25, Asian students had the highest success rate (81.9%). The second highest were White students with 79.9%. The lowest were Pacific Islander students (61.8%), African American students (66.6%), and American Indian /Alaska Native students (67.1%).

Over this period, the success rates of Pacific Islander (+19.9%), American Indian /Alaska Native (+10.3%), African American (+7.8%), Multiracial (+6.1%), and Hispanic (+5.6%) students.

**Course Success Rates by Race/Ethnicity: San Bernardino Valley College**





On average, between 2020-21 and 2024-25, Asian students had the highest success rate (81.5%). The second highest were White students with 73.4%. The lowest were Pacific Islander students (62.0%) and African American students (60.4%).

Over this period, the success rates of Pacific Islander (+8.4%), Black or African American (+5.8%), Multiracial (+5.6%), and White (+0.5%) students increased, while the success rate of American Indian /Alaska Native (-3.0%) students decreased.

**Course Success Rates by Age: SBCCD**





On average, between 2020-21 and 2024-25, students under 17 years old had the highest success rate (78.7%). The lowest success rate was seen in students 18-19 years old (66.1%).

Over this period, the success rates of students under 17 years old (+8.7%), students 18-19 years old (+6.7%), and students 20-24 years old (+6.0%) increased, while the success rates of students 25-39 years old (-2.8%) and students over 40 years old (-1.0%) decreased.

**Course Success Rates by Age: Crafton Hills College**





On average, between 2020-21 and 2024-25, the age groups with the highest success rates were students under 17 years old (83.4%), while the lowest success rate was seen in students 18-19 years old (72.3%).

Over this period, the success rates of students 25-39 years old (+7.7%), students 18-19 years old (+5.5%), students under 17 years old (+5.3%), and students 20-24 years old (+4.9%) increased, while the success rates of students over 40 years old (-3.0%) decreased.

**Course Success Rates by Age: San Bernardino Valley College**





On average, between 2020-21 and 2024-25, the age group with the highest success rate was students under 17 years old (76.6%), while the lowest success rate was seen in students 18-19 years old (61.8%).

Over this period, the success rates of students under 17 years old (+11.0%), students 18-19 years old (+7.7%), students 20-24 years old (+6.8%), and students 25-39 years old (-3.1%) increased, while students over 40 years old (-0.4%) decreased.

**Course Success Rates by Special Population: SBCCD**





On average, between 2020-21 and 2024-25, veteran students had the highest average success rate (74.9%). The average success rates of foster youth students (55.5%) and economically disadvantaged students (68.9%) were lower than the average success rate for SBCCD (70.3%).

Over this period, the success rates of the foster youth and economically disadvantaged students increased by 10.1% and 5.1%, respectively.

**Course Success Rates by Special Population: Crafton Hills College**





On average, between 2020-21 and 2024-25, veteran students had the highest average success rate (77.0%). The average success rates of foster youth students (60.6%), students with disabilities (74.5%), and economically disadvantaged students (74.7%) were lower than the average overall success rate for Crafton Hills College (75.3%).

Over this period, the success rates of the foster youth students, economically disadvantaged students, and students with disabilities increased by 15.5% and 4.6% and 2.2%, respectively.

**Course Success Rates by Special Population: San Bernardino Valley College**





**Course Completion Rates**





**Course Completion Rates by Gender: SBCCD**











**Course Completion Rates by Race/Ethnicity: San Bernardino Valley College**














