Mr. Robert Moreno, Jr. introduced himself as a Marketing consultant for *Positive Influences*.

9. PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS

A. Resolution for Middle College High School – SBVC

Assemblywoman Wilmer Amina Carter presented a resolution honoring the Middle College High School to SBVC Dean Gloria Fischer.

John Futch noted that Dr. Terrell has been a great supporter of the Middle College High School. Dr. Terrell acknowledged former trustee Stephanie Cereceres for her role in the Middle College High School. Mr. Ramos thanked Assemblywoman Carter for acknowledging the collaboration between the district and San Bernardino City Unified School District.

B. Accreditation Status Report – CHC

Dr. Vela introduced Dr. Matthew Lee who has been working with CHC and SBVC to respond in a very successful way to the recommendations made by the accrediting commission.

He highlighted his report to the Chancellor and provided updates on that report. He reviewed the nature of accreditation sanctions. He pointed out there are severe consequences to inadequate action, and the Commission actions are unpredictable. He updated the Board on the progress on each recommendation, noting that a handbook has been developed to assist with the process. Rubrics for evaluating the documents are still under development and will be completed soon.

He stated he is impressed with what he has observed in meetings and conversations over the last few weeks. He added that everyone must pull together and share the burden over the next academic year.

Board members expressed their sense of urgency for the work that must be done and their support for everyone who must work together to do it. Dr. Singer expressed his appreciation to Dr. Lee for the comprehensive oral and written report. He was impressed that Dr. Lee was able to get to the heart of the matter and he himself understands and supports that administrators and faculty should get more involved on accreditation visiting teams. He is looking forward to positive outcomes.

Mr. Vizcaino stated this process is "a group effort and with President Harrison in the lead, we can get it done, and we are all behind her."

Dr. Vela thanked Dr. Lee and advised the Board and the public that in terms of addressing the urgency, that President Harrison has expressed her commitment to removing the college from probation before her retirement in 2011. She added that the district is looking forward to a very positive outcome and future achievements.

10. REPORTS

A. Board Members

- Mr. Longville stated that, given the state of the economy, unemployment will continue. He is interested in any suggestions on what the district can do to assist with increasing employment opportunities. He reported that SBVC was one of two colleges who will be receiving ten internships from a grant funded for water management practices. An announcement will be forthcoming.
- Mr. Futch and Mr. Vizcaino took a tour of the Sheriff's Academy and the jail. Mr. Futch said a couple of those programs could be partnered with the district's programs. Mr. Futch attended the graduation for the Psych Tech program students, and thanked Dr. Daniels for being a good hostess.
- Mr. Lockwood thanked the Board for its patience with his absences due to his mother's illness. He was most appreciative for the thoughts and prayers he received and thanked the Board for adjourning the last meeting in her honor.
- Dr. Singer attended the AACC retreat where discussions took place on what is happening at the national level. He reported Dr. Barbara Beno from the Accrediting Commission will be serving on a panel to discuss accreditation at the ACCT Leadership Congress which will be held in October.
- Mr. Vizcaino attended the Nanotechnology Conference. He also thanked Dr. Daniels who did an excellent job on a recent article that appeared in the San Bernardino SUN newspaper.
- Mr. Ramos asked the Chancellor if handicapped students could be depicted on the mural behind the Board table. Dr. Vela will follow up.

B. Student Trustees

- Ms. Hrisoulas reported that the Textbook Committee at CHC has met with Scott Rippy and the new bookstore manager. She was elected Region IX Communications Officer at the last Region IX meeting. She will be attending the CCLC student trustee workshop.
- Mr. Buckner thanked Assemblywoman Carter for her support of the Middle College High School. "Our programs serve as models at the state and federal level." He added that the Associated Students also support the high school students attending the Middle College. He thanked everyone for the opportunity to attend the CCLC student trustee workshop.

C. Chancellor

- Dr. Vela reminded the Board of opening day events on Friday, August 14, and thanked Dr. Daniels for hosting the event. Dr. Pamela Cox-Otto will be the keynote speaker. She will speak on the topic of Inter-Generational Differences.
- The Chancellor stated that President Obama has recognized the importance and contribution of community colleges in the workforce and in stimulating the economy. At the recent AACC board meeting, Dr. Vela and others had the opportunity to meet with members of President Obama's cabinet. She had the opportunity to dialogue with these individuals. They wanted to know what we as community colleges can do to assist the President meet one of his goals for the nation, which is to increase the number of graduates by 5 million by 2020. Secretary of Labor. Hilda Solis, asked five community college CEO's to present information on some of the contract programs that enhance workforce development. Dr. Vela featured our district's state funded programs for Lean Applications as well as the partnerships with American Wood Finishing to provide companies training to convert the production from non-compliant paints to water-based nonvolatile paints. Dr. Vela invited Secretary Solis to visit our District and observe our efforts to train incumbent and new employees. importance of partnerships was also discussed, and AACC members were asked to submit feedback about the process we use with our local Workforce Investment Boards. She was pleased to speak about the good work being done in our district.
- Dr. Vela reported Mr. Longville was appointed to the CCLC Legislative Advisory Board.
- The Board will have its annual retreat on Thursday, August 27, at 4:00 p.m.
- Bruce Baron reported the district is working very hard to prepare a budget for adoption on September 3, 2009. The budget will include unrestricted General Funds and Categorical Funds. He added that we have a \$2.3 million reduction to our General Fund and a \$2.5 million reduction to the categorical funds. He said the district is working on a number of solutions to meet the \$2.3 million cut, and he

believes the district will be able to fund those cuts this year; however, there may be a mid-year cut. He is hoping the district will receive the one-time stimulus money to assist with the cuts to the categorical budgets which impact direct service to the students.

San Bernardino Community College District 2009-2010 FINAL BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS

- No COLA, no growth funding.
- Reduction of about \$2.3 million in the unrestricted general fund. These are the funds that support most of our instructional program.
- In 2009-2010 the District is funded for 13,780 full-time equivalent students (FTES), a **reduction** of about 539 funded, FTES from 2008-2009.
- We recommend an enrollment target is 14,600 or about 820 FTES above the level funded by the State. We intend to serve these unfunded FTES through efficiency measures and **not** by increasing costs.
- Cuts of \$2.5 million to categorical programs range from 16% to 35% of last year's allocations. We initially anticipated about \$1.2 million in Federal Stimulus funds to be allocated by the State Chancellor's Office to back-fill the cuts, although latest information from the state is that amount may be reduced to \$500,000, if any. All Federal funds are one-time only. If less than the anticipated Federal funds are allocated, further cuts to categorical programs will be necessary.
- We plan avoid layoffs in 2009-2010 by using one-time savings from the prior year budget in supplies, operating expense and equipment.
- Expenditure savings to meet the budget cuts is being achieved by using a portion of the salary and benefit savings from the SERP incentive (about \$1.9 million). The remainder of the SERP Savings will be used to fill necessary retiree positions and to provide hourly instruction.
- Additional one-time savings of about \$1 million will come from prior year unspent funds.
- Other savings will come from the selective filling of vacant positions during this fiscal year.
- We will achieve a balanced budget based on our current revenue allocations. Any further budget reductions in January or May can have a negative impact on the District's budget.
- Tax collections continue to decline and mid-year cuts are likely.

BUSINESS MANAGER

DEFINITIONSUMMARY DESCRIPTION:

Under the general direction of the Vice Chancellor, Fiscal Services, supervises manages and coordinates the activities and operations of Business Services Division, including the District's purchasing functions including purchasing and contracts, and fixed assets inventory; management, warehouse operations, risk management and various budgeting and auditing functions. the District Warehouse; the District Printing Center; and the Professional Development Center which includes general coordination of the District Economic Development Program and VATEA funding Assists with state reportings and annual audit requirements. Oversee financial functions of categorical and grant programs and the District's risk management program. Assists as requested overall with budget and auditing functions, and advises District staff on financial matters and resource utilization. Performs other duties as assigned.

EXAMPLES OF REPRESENTATIVE DUTIES:

Duties may include, but are not limited to the following The following duties are typical for this classification:

- 1. Assists in the development of District Purchasing, Professional Development Center, Warehouse, and Printing policies and procedures. Manages and participates in the development and implementation of goals, objectives, policies, and priorities for assigned areas and programs; recommends and administers policies and procedures.

OVERVIEW

An agreement for services is amended when there is a change in the scope of work, usually due to unforeseen conditions, or when the Department of State Architecture (DSA) requires changes in the plans, or when the District requires changes in design to accommodate the essential needs of the project.

This amendment is due to two reasons. First, there has been an increase in the 'special inspections' required of Converse Consultants. The original contract was developed based on a percent of total contract dollar value for standard 'materials and laboratory testing'. When the inspection program for this project began, the amount of 'special inspections' increased, i.e. the unbonded brace frame design which was new to DSA required additional inspections. These inspections were generated both by structural design and DSA requests, and conducted in accordance with industry standards. They significantly increased the cost of materials and laboratory inspections for this project assigned to Converse Consultants. Second, there is an increase in the prevailing wage rates for building/construction inspectors and field soil material testers that went into effect on July 1, 2009.

Please note that the projects budgets for these items are not over budget and this increase is inside of the budgeted amounts for the projects.

ANALYSIS

The effect of this Amendment will be an addition of \$326,600.00 to the Converse Consultants contract, resulting in a revised contract amount of \$709,736.00. There is no change to the project schedule.

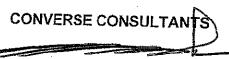

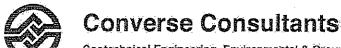

OVERVIEW

A change order to a construction contract may be generated by a number of circumstances. These include changes directed by the District to address contractor or architect recommendations for efficiency, occupant needs, or to improve future building or space usability. A construction contract is amended when there is a change in the scope of work due to unforeseen conditions that must be corrected in order for work to proceed.

All changes orders and amendments are approved following a specific process of review by the construction manager, architect, program/project managers, and District staff. Nonessential changes are rejected and never receive approval. Any changes determined to be essential to the health of the project and of major benefit to the District are approved and implemented.

ANALYSIS

The overall impact of these change orders and amendments increase the Bond Measure P CIP construction contracts by \$39,052, representing a total increase of 0.03% of the program construction budget of \$149,920,991.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve Change Order 01 to Fast-Track Construction for the Tenant Improvement project at San Bernardino Valley College in the amount of \$245,316.00. Approval of this change order acknowledges it is over the 10% permissible limit; it is in the best interest of the District to proceed with the same contractor without going out to bid; the work is complete and acceptable and approval of this recommendation authorizes the overage as a claim against the District.

OVERVIEW

A change order to a construction contract may be generated by a number of circumstances. These include changes directed by the District to address contractor or architect recommendations for efficiency, occupant needs, or to improve future building or space usability.

This change order is due to three specific categories of change which had significant impact on the scope and cost of this project:

Project Improvement & Support

- Replace damaged interior walls, paint, provide data and light fixtures to three modular buildings
- Provide additional data switch
- Provide temporary power to Interim Housing and Refrigeration areas
- Omit overhead door for KVCR storage room 107
- Omit painting in KVCR storage room 107
- Additional demo and framing for relocated sound windows
- Furnish and install electrical panel
- Revise fire alarm point of connection
- Change wood studs to metal studs; add fire blocking and floor protection

Requirements by Division of State Architect

- Provide man gate and access ramp at Avionics modular
- Provide epoxy anchors in lieu of designed shot pins
- Provide additional wall framing, drywall and paint to support proposed stairwell design
- Remove wire mold and install rigid conduit

<u>User Requests</u>

- Provide additional power to flight simulator
- Provide generator during switchover
- Provide 8'x10' opening and temporary double doors for KVCR storage room 107
- Soil remediation and electrical service at CMU block wall.

ANALYSIS

The effect of this change order will be an addition of \$245,316.00 to the previously revised Fast-Track Construction contract of \$966,246, resulting in a newly revised contract amount of \$1,211,562.00. This change order represents an addition of 25.4% to Fast-Track's contract amount.

The accelerated timeline presented to the architect, construction manager, and project/program manager set into motion a number of changes that occurred during the construction phase of the project that was not anticipated during the planning phase.

While this project was completed on the timeline dictated by the District, we have put safeguards in place to prevent change orders from exceeding the 10% guideline in the future.

Summary for Change Order No. TI-BC1-CO1 Item Inclusions

August 6, 2009

Aeronautics

Change Order TI-BC1-CO1: Item No. 1.1 – Interim housing P1-P4 are located at the aeronautics area. P1 and P2 were provided by a modular company and currently being leased. P3 and P4 are District own and relocated. During the remodel P3 and P4, several of the walls had FRP paneling. During a field walk, the contractor was authorized to remove the FRP. The removal of the FRP incidentally damaged the drywall due to the adhesive. Subsequently the drywall needed to be replaced and painted. The exterior color of interim housing P3 and P4 did not match the adjacent P2 interim housing color scheme. The contractor was authorized to paint the portables the two-tone brown. Interim housing P1, P3, and P4 did not reflect any power, data or lighting. A plan was provided to add power and data to P3 and P4, as well as power to P1. New light fixtures were added P3 and P4. There several light fixtures not operating in P3 and P4 that required repairs. The cost is \$25,971.00.

Change Order TI-BC1-CO1: Item No. 1.2 – Provide additional power to accommodate the flight simulator. The cost is \$9,585.00.

Change Order TI-BC1-CO1: Item No. 1.3 – The category 6 cable distances from P1 to P2-P4 is greater than the allowable 300 foot distance. An additional data switch was necessary to provide the signal capacity for proper usage. The cost is \$23,855.00.

Change Order TI-BC1-CO1: Item No. 1.4 – Provide temporary power to Interim Housing and Refrigeration areas. The cost is \$57,418.00.

Change Order TI-BC1-CO1: Item No. 1.5 – During the coordination to power down switch #4 to connect permanent power for the interim housing it was not discovered that additional buildings were feed from this switch. A campus event was scheduled to take place the same weekend as the switch over; therefore, a generator was necessary as not to impact both the switchover and the campus event. The cost is \$3,136.00.

Change Order TI-BC1-CO1: Item No. 1.6 – Provide man gate and access ramp to Interim Housing modular P1. The cost is \$8,216.00.

KVCR

Change Order Ti-BC1-CO1: Item No. 1.7 — Omit overhead door in room 107. Deductive cost of (\$8,143.00).

Change Order TI-BC1-CO1: Item No. 1.8 – Omit the painting in room 107. Deductive cost of (\$1,015.00).

Change Order TI-BC1-CO1: Item No. 1.9 – Per RFI #43, provide an 8'x10' double door opening on the north wall of room 107 to allow movement of sets in & out of the facility. Provide / build temporary doors (until the permanent doors are installed) as to provide a lockable storage area, to allow the necessary remodeling to take place in the KVCR area. The cost is \$16,983.00.

Change Order TI-BC1-CO1: Item No. 1.10 — Relocated sound windows noted on the plans to the proposed existing opening that was too small for the existing window. Additional demo and framing and incidental repairs was necessary. The cost is \$4,450.00.

Change Order TI-BC1-CO1: Item No. 1.11 – Provide epoxy anchors in lieu of the designed shot pins per DSA recommendation. The cost is \$2,620.00.

Change Order TI-BC1-CO1: Item No. 1.12 – Provide additional wall framing, drywall, paint to support proposed handrail at the stairs. The cost is \$6,218.00.

Change Order TI-BC1-CO1: Item No. 1.13 – Furnish and install a new electrical panel adjacent to the existing electrical panel located in the corridor. The existing panel did not have the capacity for the proposed additional power. In addition, provide dual compartment wire mold in lieu of two single compartment wire mold n rooms 102, 103, and 104. The cost is \$6,039.00.

Change Order TI-BC1-CO1: Item No. 1.14 – The fire alarm point of connection as noted in the drawings was not an option as the existing device did not exist in the Lobby. The next closest point of connection was located on the other side of the KVCR building. The cost is \$2,392.00.

Refrigeration

Change Order TI-BC1-CO1: Item No. 1.15 — Change wood studs to metal studs, add fire blocking and floor protection. The cost is \$3,309.00.

Change Order TI-BC1-CO1: Item No. 1.16 — Upon inspection after the installation of the proposed wire mold, it was determined that the wire mold was unacceptable. Per RFI #65, remove wire mold and install rigid conduit. The cost is **\$11,106.00**.

Change Order TI-BC1-CO1: Item No. 1.17 – The refrigeration yards, including the block wall, concrete slab, fences and gates. Wall was changed from chain link to CMU to provide better security and safety. A credit for the chain link was provided by Oakview. During the installation, the same soil condition as noted in the KVCR-Chiller pad installation, as well as the Aeronautics – switch gear pad was similar in nature. Additional soil remediation was necessary to achieve substrate compaction. In addition, during the installation of the wall, the existing irrigation lines and domestic water lines were exposed. The water lined has been leaking for quite sometime as evident to the soil saturation. The necessary repairs were made. The irrigation lines and valves were in conflicted with the wall location, subsequently, the lines and valves and the associated control wiring was relocated to accommodate the new wall. The cost is \$73,176.00.

* **NOTE:** None of the above **Contract Amendment** items impacts the Contract Schedule.

Summary: Kitchell/BRj has reviewed each item and has determined the values identified above are appropriate and recommend acceptance of the changes.

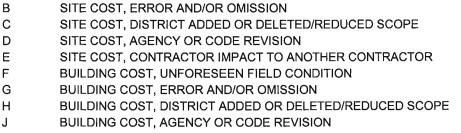

Summary for Contract Amendment No. TI-BC1-CA1 Item Inclusions

August 6, 2009

Aeronautics

Contract Amendment TI-BC1-CA1: Item No. 1.1 – During the installation of the concrete pad for the proposed switchgear, the soil was determined unsuitable as a substrate for the concrete pad. The soils field report recommended to additional over excavation and re-compaction. Upon several attempts, compaction could not be achieved. To achieve the necessary compaction and to minimize any additional expense to continue digging deeper, it was decided with the Soil's consultant approval to provide a rock substrate with a slurry mix backfill to achieve the required compaction. In addition, due to the soil condition, the concrete slab was increased in thickness, as well as additional reinforcement added to support the existing soil condition. The cost is \$27,268.00.

KVCR

Contract Amendment TI-BC1-CA1: Item No. 1.2 — In order to accomplish completion of construction for the Tenant Improvement project, the Construction Documents were bid prior to DSA approval. DSA approval took longer than expected and when changes to the scope of work were incorporated by the Agency's direction there were multiple changes from the bid set to the permitted construction set of plans. Change is scope included additional demo, asphalt patching and ADA striping, railing, metal stud framing, stair framing detail, drywall, cabinets, painting, stucco, interior signage and exterior ADA signs. The cost is \$16,762.00.

Contract Amendment TI-BC1-CA1: Item No. 1.3 – As-built condition did not match the proposed plan. When the existing hard lid ceiling was exposed to connect the new duct to room 108, it was noticed that the existing ducting did not exist. 75 feet of additional ducting was provided to extend conditioned air to room 108. The cost is \$3.096.00.

Contract Amendment TI-BC1-CA1: Item No. 1.4 – The existing routing of the chiller piping did not match the as-built conditions. A detection company was hired to locate the lines. The ends of the pipes were found approximately 60 feet further. Upon locating the lines, it was discovered that the piping were transite. It was decided to route the proposed chiller lines into the basement and make the necessary connection where transite piping did not exist. The cost is \$33,508.00.

Contract Amendment TI-BC1-CA1: Item No. 1.5 – The soil were the proposed chiller pad was to be placed as well as the pipe support pads required additional soil improvements to achieve the necessary compaction. This included addition over-excavation, rock base for the substrate and slurry backfill. The cost is \$31,276.00.

Contract Amendment TI-BC1-CA1: Item No. 1.6 – The proposed sewer connection did not match the as-built conditions. The connection was routed approximately 60 feet further south through the building into the basement. The cost is \$9,248.00.

Refrigeration

Contract Amendment TI-BC1-CA1: Item No. 1.7 — In order to accomplish completion of construction for the Tenant Improvement project, the Construction Documents was bid prior to DSA approval. DSA approval took longer than expected and when changes to the scope of work were incorporated by the Agency's direction there were multiple changes from the bid set to the permitted construction set of plans. Aeronautics

1. During the installation of the concrete pad for the proposed switchgear, the soil was determined unsuitable as a substrate for the concrete pad. The soils field report recommended to additional over excavation and recompaction. Upon several attempts, compaction could not be achieved. To achieve the necessary compaction and to minimize any additional expense to continue digging deeper, it was decided with the Soil's consultant approval to provide a rock substrate with a slurry mix backfill to achieve the required compaction. In addition, due to the soil condition, the concrete slab was increased in thickness, as well as additional reinforcement added to support the existing soil condition

OVERVIEW

The analysis shows that construction contract change orders and amendments for all Measure P projects have been held to a minimal amount of \$1,205,880.00 which is only 1.2% of the project cost of \$100,201,334.

Nonessential changes are rejected and never receive approval. Any changes determined to be essential to the health of the project and of major benefit to the District are approved and implemented.

OVERVIEW

The District is updating the process for the screening and recommendation of vendors for professional services associated with the Measure M Bond Program. This update is intended to ensure that the process is implemented in a fair and objective manner, established with a consistent standard of evaluation, and involves college stakeholders.

ANALYSIS

The updated screening and recommendation process for Measure M projects will accomplish the goals identified above. The process includes the following elements: reaching out to the professional services community twice a year and through publications, professional organizations, and other means; establishing Screening Advisory Committees which are comprised of District and College stakeholders; and providing the Committees with the responsibility of developing evaluation and rating criteria, interviewing firms for specific bond projects, and recommending firms for consideration of appointment by the Board of Trustees. The attachment provides a detailed description of the professional services selection process.

San Bernardino Community College District MEASURE M PROCESS FOR SELECTING PROFESSIONAL SERVICES *

Phase I - Outreach Process

The District will reach out to the professional services community twice a year to solicit registration to be on the Measure M Project Interest List.

Outreach will be done using newspapers, notice to publications and professional organizations, and posting on District website. Firms will self-identify their experience in specific project categories. A registration list will be developed and firms will be notified as projects become available.

Phase II - Screening Advisory Committee

A Screening Advisory Committee will be established for each project or project group. Membership will include one faculty member, and one classified staff member appointed by their appropriate constituency group; the College President and/or designee; the V.P. for Administrative Services; Director of College Facilities (M&O); Bond Planning and Development Director and/or Bond Program Manager and Bond Program Director and the Vice Chancellor, Fiscal Services. Whenever possible, the administrator responsible for the instruction/services to be housed in the proposed facility will participate in the process at the president's discretion.

Phase III - Criteria and Screening Process

The Screening Advisory Committee will approve evaluation criteria and rating schedule specific to the project requirements. Firms with self-reported experience in the specific area will be invited to submit a formal proposal that would minimally include relevant experience, approach to the project, project schedule, and a staffing plan. The firms with the highest overall scores will be invited for interviews with the Screening Advisory Committee. A minimum of four to six firms will be invited for interviews whenever possible.

Phase IV - Final Recommendation and Fees

Members of the Screening Advisory Committee will approve evaluation criteria and rating schedule for use during the interview process. The Screening Advisory Committee will rank the top firms. The District will conduct reference checks on the top firms. The District will negotiate a draft contract with the highest ranking firm and submit the draft contract to the Board of Trustees for action. The recommendation will come with a summarized review of the process.

* Professional Services are those services that are selected through the Request for Proposal (RFP) process such as architects, engineers, etc. Construction contractors are selected through the formal bidding process.
