8. PUBLIC COMMENT

Teresa Parra who identified herself as a "constituent of yours" asked the Board to table the recommendation to award a one-year contract for program management services to Kitchell CEM, Inc. She stated there was no RFQ and the process was not open to the public.

Classified employee Ben Gamboa stated there has been an issue of turnover in the District Police Department, adding that this is not good for morale and raises the issues of whether or not Human Resources is hiring good employees and whether or not the police department is managing its employees properly. He asked that the Board consider what has been occurring in that department.

9. REPORTS

A. Board Members

- Mr. Vizcaino was impressed with his tour of the Middle College High School. He stated in trying to understand the Measure M process, he met with Bruce Baron. Mr. Baron assisted with auditing one change order, and Mr. Vizcaino prefaced his remarks by stating that the staff is doing a great job. He said the response he received when he asked questions was "it has always been done that way." Mr. Vizcaino said he owes it to the citizens to look at things with a "fresh set of eyes" and he really didn't like what he saw while taking apart this particular change order. Some of the items included were extension cords and SOP (supervision/overhead/profit). He thanked Mr. Baron and Larry Klumas for the opportunity to meet with them.
- Mr. Futch will be attending the Fall School Board Meeting on October 29.
- Dr. Terrell expressed an interest in the outreach program at KVCR.
 He complimented President Harrison, her staff and the District Police
 Department for working with the fire departments during the recent
 fire
- Mr. Ramos reported that Native American remains were recently found at SBVC. The incident is being handled by the San Bernardino County Coroner's Department. The Native American Heritage Commission was notified, and they will pick up the remains from the coroner's office to arrange a burial. Mr. Longville stated we should have a policy that specifically states the way in which we can use human remains on campus. Mr. Ramos concurred, adding the policy needs to be in place to ensure this does not happen again because it is against the law. With the assistance of Presidents Harrison and Daniels, Dr. Vela will bring a policy forward for the Board's consideration.
- Mr. Lockwood applauded President Harrison and the CHC staff on the way they worked with the other fire departments during the recent fire.
- Mr. Futch thanked Dr. Vela for keeping the trustees updated on the fire. He also had the opportunity to tour the Middle College High School and added we are "proud to be a part of something that good." Mr. Futch reported he is chairing Dr. Vela's evaluation committee and stated additional members were added to the committee, the timeline has been established, and a confidential employee has been designated to receive the responses.

B. Student Trustees

• Kaylee Hrisoulas reported she will be visiting various clubs on campus to let them know what the Student Trustee does and to discuss various campus issues. She attended a Region IX meeting where a roundtable discussion transpired about the budget cuts to categorical programs. Students decided a resolution would be appropriate which will be delivered at the November Student Senate General Assembly Fall Conference. Kaylee asked the Board to save the date of November 5 from 3 to 4 pm for the "Student Senate/Board of Trustees Mixer". Invitations will be mailed to the Board.

C. Chancellor

- Dr. Vela added her comments about the communication to the employees and the staff regarding the fire. She said it was commendable that our staff, Charlie Ng and Chief Pat McCurry, were included in the fire department planning. She thanked and congratulated Gloria Harrison, Charlie Ng and Pat McCurry.
- The Chancellor commented in the past about how impressed she is with our Student Trustees and once again thanked Student Trustee Kaylee Hrisoulas for her work. College staff will be accompanying students to an upcoming leadership conference where they will have the opportunity to learn about leadership and other issues. Our categorical programs have been deeply cut, and these programs make a difference to students. Dr. Vela was pleased to hear our students are involved in advocacy to support these programs.
- Dr. Vela reported a number of committees have been formed to begin work to address the accreditation recommendations on the Educational Master Plan, Resource Allocation Plan, Technology Plan, Human Resources Plan and the District Strategic Plan.
- Our Economic Development and Corporate Training Center received a grant in the amount of \$869,651 to address workforce development needs in our community. Approximately 200 people will receive customized training to move into green technology. The district also received \$220,000 from the California Energy Commission. Dr. Vela thanked Dr. Matthew Isaac and his staff for their work and dedication to meet the workforce development needs of our communities.
- Dr. Vela had the privilege to serve as a speaker for the AAUW. Many
 of the members of the audience were proud alums and asked that she
 say "thank you" to the faculty and staff for the fine education they
 received from them. Dr. Vela expressed her hope that they will have
 some scholarships for our students.

Approve Agreement for One Year of Program Management Services for Measure M Bond Program with Kitchell CEM, Inc.

The following discussion began after Mr. Vizcaino voted to table this item:

Mr. Vizcaino expressed his concern about receiving this item for Board approval when the decision has already been made by district staff. "We need to have confidence in the Chancellor but when we get things to vote on which are already done, I have a problem with that."

Mr. Baron said this is only a one-year extension of the Kitchell CEM contract, and an RFP could be sent out right away for future work. He stated that if this item is tabled, there will be no contract and the Measure M projects would be delayed.

Mr. Baron stated that since the Trustees said they wanted to move forward on Measure M, he looked at the process that was used to hire Kitchell CEM. A satisfaction survey was distributed in which all the users rated the firm highly. He explained the cost negotiated was competitive and standards were looked at and Kitchell CEM is somewhere in the mid-range. The district has had a good experience with this firm, and the college presidents are pleased with their work. The district went through a comprehensive process to bring this firm on board. Again, he stressed the goal is to move Measure M forward, but progress could be delayed until Spring, 2010, if action is not taken on this item. He reiterated that no Measure M work will move forward if this item is tabled.

Mr. Lockwood stated we need to keep in mind that when we go out for professional services, we want the best services for a reasonable price.

Mr. Futch said the Board was told there was going to be changes and that the Board would become more involved, and "we haven't been involved yet." He added that the district is rushing into things and someone needs to "rush us into it as well."

Mr. Baron explained there was not time to put out an RFP and still maintain the Measure M deadlines to which the district is committed. It was his desire to begin the process much earlier and to bring the recommendation to the Board long before the Kitchell CEM contract expires. There is a lot of work involved in getting out an RFP and additional time involved in getting the results back to the Board. Mr. Baron suggested he talk to Kitchell CEM regarding their fee, but we need to keep the momentum going while we do the RFP. He added that the negotiated fee agreed upon between the district and Kitchell CEM was because of the services requested by the district. He said 3% as stated by a community speaker is not a typical fee.

Larry Klumas stated the 5% was calculated on individual work requested by the district to ensure that Measure M "rolls out." Newspaper ads from which professional services will be selected are scheduled to be released. If this item is tabled, those newspaper ads and any meetings associated with the Measure M projects will be delayed. He said he feels confident that the amount that Kitchell CEM has recommended represents a fair value for the work the district has requested them to do. It is actually a not-to-exceed amount which includes reimbursables and contingencies.

Mr. Longville shared much of the sentiment expressed by some of the other trustees that "we are window dressing." He said he could appreciate the fact that tabling this item causes problems, and he could appreciate Mr. Baron's desire to avoid that, but he felt frustrated that he didn't feel he had as much information as he would like so he felt inclined to "grudgingly" move forward with the one-year contract. He added that he wants to make sure staff understands that it is frustrating as Board members to have to choose this way.

Mr. Vizcaino moved, Mr. Futch seconded and the Board members voted as follows to table this item for 30 days to allow the administration an opportunity to renegotiate the contract with Kitchell CEM:

The attached SBCCD Discrimination Complaint Procedures Plan has gone through the collegial consultation process and is recommended for first reading. The SBCCD Discrimination Complaint Procedures was derived from the Model Policy that the State Chancellor's Office disseminated to all California Community Colleges. The changes are in italics.

Policy and Procedures for Handling Complaints of Unlawful Discrimination Under Title 5 Sections 59300 et seq.

Introduction and Scope

These are the written policies and procedures for filing and processing complaints of unlawful discrimination at *San Bernardino Community College District*. These policies and procedures incorporate the legal principles contained in nondiscrimination provisions of the California Code of Regulations, title 5, sections 59300 et seq. as well as other state and federal substantive and procedural requirements.

A copy of these written policies on unlawful discrimination will be displayed in a prominent location in the Office of Human Resources, San Bernardino Valley College President's Office, Crafton Hills College President's Office main administrative building or other area where notices regarding the institution's rules, regulations, procedures, and standards of conduct are posted.

Unlawful Discrimination Policy

The policy of the San Bernardino Community College District is to provide an educational and employment environment in which no person shall be unlawfully denied full and equal access to, the benefits of, or be unlawfully subjected to discrimination, in whole or in part, on the basis of ethnic group identification, national origin, religion, age, sex or gender, race, color, ancestry, sexual orientation, or physical or mental disability, or on the basis of these perceived characteristics or based on association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics, in any program or activity that is administered by, funded directly by, or that receives any financial assistance from the State Chancellor or Board of Governors of the California Community Colleges.

The policy of the *San Bernardino Community College District* is to provide an educational and employment environment free from unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, sexual favoritism, or other verbal or physical conduct or communications constituting sexual harassment.

The policy of San Bernardino Community College District is to comply with the accessibility requirements of Section 508 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 in the development, procurement, maintenance, or use of electronic or information technology and respond to and resolve unlawful discrimination complaints regarding accessibility. Such complaints will be treated as complaints of discrimination on the basis of disability.

Employees, students, or other persons acting on behalf of the *District* who engage in unlawful discrimination as defined in this policy or by state or federal law may be subject to discipline, up to and including discharge, expulsion, or termination of contract.

In so providing, the *San Bernardino Community College District* hereby implements the provisions of California Government Code sections 11135 through 11139.5, the Sex Equity in Education Act (Ed. Code, § 66250 et seq.), title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. § 2000d), title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 (20 U.S.C. § 1681), section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. § 794), section 508 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. § 794d), the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. §§ 12100 et seq.) and the Age Discrimination Act (42 U.S.C. § 6101).

Authority: Cal. Code Regs., tit. 5, § 59300; Ed. Code §§ 66250 et seq., 66271.1, 66700, and 70901; Gov. Code § 11138. Reference: Ed. Code §§ 66250 et seq. and 72011; Gov. Retaliation

It is unlawful for anyone to retaliate against someone who files an unlawful discrimination complaint, who refers a matter for investigation or complaint, who participates in an investigation of a complaint, who represents or serves as an advocate for an alleged victim or alleged offender, or who otherwise furthers the principles of this unlawful discrimination policy.

Authority: 20 U.S.C. §§ 1681 et seq.; 34 C.F.R. § 106; Cal. Code Regs., tit. 5, §§ 59300 et seq.; Revised Sexual Harassment Guidance: Harassment of Students by School Employees, Other Students, or Third Parties, Title IX, Office for Civil Rights, January 19, 2001.

Responsible District Officer

The San Bernardino Community College District has identified the Vice Chancellor of Human Resources & Employee Relations to the State Chancellor's Office and to the public as the single District officer responsible for receiving all unlawful discrimination complaints filed pursuant to title 5, section 59328, and for coordinating their investigation. Informal charges of unlawful discrimination should be brought to the attention of the responsible district officer, who shall oversee the informal resolution process pursuant to section 59327. The actual investigation of complaints may be assigned to other staff or to outside persons or organizations under contract with the District. Such delegation procedures will be used whenever the officer designated to receive complaints is named in the complaint or is implicated by the allegations in the complaint.

Administrators, faculty members, other *District* employees, and students shall direct all complaints of unlawful discrimination to the responsible *District* officer.

Authority: Cal. Code Regs., tit. 5, § 59324; 34 C.F.R. § 106.8.

Informal/Formal Complaint Procedure

When a person brings charges of unlawful discrimination to the attention of the *District*'s responsible officer, that officer will:

- (1) Undertake efforts to informally resolve the charges;
- (2) Advise the complainant that he or she need not participate in informal resolution:
- (3) Notify the person bringing the charges of his or her right to file a formal complaint and explain the procedure for doing so;
- (4) Assure the complainant that he or she will not be required to confront, or work out problems with, the person accused of unlawful discrimination;
- (5) Advise the complainant that he or she may file a nonemployment-based complaint with the Office for Civil Rights of the U.S. Department of Education (OCR) where such a complaint is within that agency's jurisdiction.
- (6) If the complaint is employment-related, the complainant should also be advised that he or she may file a complaint with the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) and/or the California Department of Fair Employment and Housing (DFEH) where such a complaint is within that agency's jurisdiction.

Efforts at informal resolution need not include any investigation unless the responsible *District* officer determines that an investigation is warranted by the seriousness of the charges. Selecting an informal resolution does not extend the time limitations for filing a formal complaint. Efforts at informal resolution may continue after the filing of a formal written complaint, but after a complaint is filed an investigation is required to be conducted pursuant to title 5, section 59334, and will be completed unless the matter is informally resolved and the complainant dismisses the complaint. *Even if the complainant does dismiss the complaint, the responsible district officer may require the investigation to continue if he or she determines that the allegations are serious enough to warrant an investigation.* Any efforts at informal resolution after the filing of a written complaint will not exceed the 90-day period for rendering the administrative determination pursuant to title 5, section 59336.

In employment-related cases, if the complainant also files with the Department of Fair Employment and Housing or with the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, a copy of that filing will be sent to the State Chancellor's Office requesting a determination of whether a further investigation under title 5 is required. Unless the State Chancellor's Office determines that a separate investigation is required, the District will discontinue its investigation under title 5 and the matter will be resolved through the Department of Fair Employment and Housing or the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission.

The *District* will allow for representation where required by law and may allow for representation for the accused and complainant in other circumstances on a case by case basis.

Filing of Formal Written Complaint

If a complainant decides to file a formal written unlawful discrimination complaint against the *District*, he or she must file the complaint on a form prescribed by the State Chancellor. These approved forms are available from the *District* and also at the State Chancellor's website, as follows:

The completed form must be filed with the *District* representative or mailed directly to the State Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges.

Once a complaint is filed, the individual(s) accused of engaging in prohibited discriminatory conduct should be advised of that filing and the general nature of the complaint. This should occur as soon as possible and in a manner that is appropriate under the circumstances. The *District* will also advise the accused that an assessment of the accuracy of the allegations has not yet been made, that the complaint will be investigated, that the accused will be provided an opportunity to present his/her side of the matter, and that any conduct that could be viewed as retaliatory against the complainant or any witnesses must be avoided.

Threshold Requirements Prior to Investigation of a Formal Written Complaint

When a formal written complaint is filed it will be reviewed to determine if the complaint meets the following requirements:

- The complaint must be filed on a form prescribed by the State Chancellor's Office.
- The complaint must allege unlawful discrimination prohibited under title 5, section 59300.
- The complaint must be filed by one who alleges that he or she has personally suffered unlawful discrimination or by one who has learned of such unlawful discrimination in his or her official capacity as a faculty member or administrator.
- In any complaint not involving employment, the complaint must be filed within one year of the date of the alleged unlawful discrimination or within one year of the date on which the complainant knew or should have known of the facts underlying the specific incident or incidents of alleged unlawful discrimination

 In any complaint alleging discrimination in employment, the complaint shall be filed within 180 days of the date the alleged unlawful discrimination occurred, except that this period will be extended by no more than 90 days following the expiration of that 180 days if the complainant first obtained knowledge of the facts of the alleged violation after the expiration of 180 days.

Authority: Cal. Code Regs., tit. 5, § 59328.

Defective Complaint

If a complaint is found to be defective it will be immediately returned to the complainant with a complete explanation of why an investigation will not be initiated under California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 59300 et seq. The notice will inform the complainant that the complaint does not meet the requirements of section 59328, and shall specify in what requirement the complaint is defective. A copy of the notice to the complainant will also be sent to the State Chancellor's Office.

Authority: Cal. Code Regs., tit. 5, §§ 59328, 59332.

Notice to State Chancellor or District

A copy of all formal complaints filed in accordance with the title 5 regulations will be forwarded to the State Chancellor's Office immediately upon receipt, regardless of whether the complaint is brought by a student or by an employee. Similarly, when the State Chancellor's Office receives a complaint a copy will be forwarded to the *District*.

Authority: Cal. Code Regs., tit. 5, § 59330.

Administrative Determination

In any case not involving employment discrimination, within 90 days of receiving an unlawful discrimination complaint filed under title 5, sections 59300 et seq., the responsible *District* officer will complete the investigation and forward a copy of the investigative report to the State Chancellor, a copy or summary of the report to the complainant, and written notice setting forth all the following to both the complainant and the State Chancellor:

- (a) the determination of the chief executive officer or his/her designee as to whether there is probable cause to believe discrimination occurred with respect to each allegation in the complaint;
- (b) a description of actions taken, if any, to prevent similar problems from occurring in the future;
- (c) the proposed resolution of the complaint; and

(d) the complainant's right to appeal to the *District* governing board and the State Chancellor.

In any case involving employment discrimination, within 90 days of receiving an unlawful discrimination complaint filed under title 5, sections 59300, et seq., the responsible *District* officer will complete the investigation and forward a copy or summary of the report to the complainant, and written notice setting forth all the following to the complainant:

- (a) the determination of the chief executive officer or his/her designee as to whether there is probable cause to believe discrimination occurred with respect to each allegation in the complaint;
- (b) a description of actions taken, if any, to prevent similar problems from occurring in the future;
- (c) the proposed resolution of the complaint; and
- (d) the complainant's right to appeal to the District governing board and to file a complaint with the Department of Fair Employment and Housing.

The *District* will keep these documents on file for a period of at least three years after closing the case, and make them available to the State Chancellor upon request.

The San Bernardino Community College District recognizes the importance of and is therefore committed to completing investigations and resolving complaints as quickly as possible, consistent with the requirements for a thorough investigation.

Authority: Cal. Code Regs., tit. 5, § 59336.

Complainant's Appeal Rights

Complainants have appeal rights that they may exercise if they are not satisfied with the results of the *District's* administrative determination. At the time the administrative determination and summary is mailed to the complainant, the responsible *District* officer or his/her designee shall notify the complainant of his or her appeal rights as follows:

- First level of appeal: The complainant has the right to file an appeal to the
 District's governing board within 15 days from the date of the administrative
 determination. The District's governing board will review the original
 complaint, the investigative report, the administrative determination, and the
 appeal.
- The District's governing board will issue a final District decision in the matter within 45 days after receiving the appeal. Alternatively, the District's governing board may elect to take no action within 45 days, in which case the original decision in the administrative determination will be deemed to be affirmed and shall become the final District decision in the matter. A copy of the final decision rendered by the District's governing board will be forwarded to the complainant and to the State Chancellor's Office.

• Second level of appeal: The complainant has the right to file an appeal with the California Community College Chancellor's Office in any case not involving employment-related discrimination within 30 days from the date that the governing board issues the final District decision or permits the administrative determination to become final by taking no action within 45 days. The appeal must be accompanied by a copy of the decision of the governing board or evidence showing the date on which the complainant filed an appeal with the governing board, and a statement under penalty of perjury that no response was received from the governing board within 45 days from that date. In any case involving employment discrimination, the complainant has the right to file a complaint with the Department of Fair Employment and Housing (DFEH) where the case is within the jurisdiction of that agency.

Complainants must submit all appeals in writing.

Authority: Cal. Code Regs., tit. 5, §§ 59338 and 59339.

Provision of Information to State Chancellor

In any case not involving employment discrimination, within 150 days of receiving a complaint, the responsible *District* officer will either:

Forward the following to the State Chancellor:

- A copy of the final *District* decision rendered by the governing board or a statement indicating the date on which the administrative determination became final as a result of taking no action on the appeal within 45 days.
- A copy of the notice of appeal rights the *District* sent the complainant.
- Any other information the State Chancellor may require; or

Notify the State Chancellor that the complainant has not filed an appeal with the district governing board and that the *District* has closed its file.

The *District* will keep these documents on file for a period of at least three years after closing the case, and in any case involving employment discrimination, make them available to the State Chancellor upon request.

Authority: Cal. Code Regs., tit. 5, §§ 59338 and 59340.

Extensions

If for reasons beyond its control, the *District* is unable to comply with the 90-day or 150-day deadlines specified above for submission of materials to the complainant and the State Chancellor's Office, the responsible *District* officer will file a written request that the State Chancellor grant an extension of the deadline. Where an extension is

deemed necessary by the *District*, it must be requested from the State Chancellor regardless of whether or not the case involves employment discrimination. The request will be submitted no later than 10 days prior to the expiration of the deadlines established by title 5 in sections 59336 and/or 59340 and will set forth the reasons for the request and the date by which the *District* expects to be able to submit the required materials.

A copy of the request for an extension will be sent to the complainant, who will be advised that he or she may file written objections with the State Chancellor within 5 days of receipt.

The State Chancellor may grant the request unless delay would be prejudicial to the investigation. If an extension of the 90-day deadline is granted by the State Chancellor the 150-day deadline is automatically extended by an equal amount.

Definitions

Definitions applicable to nondiscrimination policies are as follows:

- "Appeal" means a request by a complainant made in writing to the San Bernardino Community College District governing board pursuant to title 5, section 59338, and/or to the State Chancellor's Office pursuant to title 5, section 59339, to review the administrative determination of the District regarding a complaint of discrimination.
- "Association with a person or group with these actual or perceived characteristics" includes advocacy for or identification with people who have one or more characteristics of a protected category listed under "Unlawful Discrimination Policy" and title 5, section 59300, participation in a group associated with persons having such characteristics, or use of a facility associated with use by such persons.
- "Complaint" means a written and signed statement meeting the requirements
 of title 5, section 59328 that alleges unlawful discrimination in violation of the
 nondiscrimination regulations adopted by the Board of Governors of the
 California Community Colleges, as set forth at title 5, sections 59300 et seq.
- "Days" means calendar days.
- "Gender" means sex, and includes a person's gender identity and gender related appearance and behavior whether or not stereotypically associated with the person's assigned sex at birth.
- "Mental disability" includes, but is not limited to, all of the following:
 - (1) Having any mental or psychological disorder or condition, such as mental retardation, organic brain syndrome, emotional or mental illness, or specific learning disabilities, that limits a major life activity. For purposes of this section:

- (A) "Limits" shall be determined without regard to mitigating measures, such as medications, assistive devices, or reasonable accommodations, unless the mitigating measure itself limits a major life activity.
- (B) A mental or psychological disorder or condition limits a major life activity if it makes the achievement of the major life activity difficult.
- (C) "Major life activities" shall be broadly construed and shall include physical, mental, and social activities and working.
- (2) Any other mental or psychological disorder or condition not described in paragraph (1) that requires specialized supportive services.
- (3) Having a record or history of a mental or psychological disorder or condition described in paragraph (1) or (2), which is known to the *District*.
- (4) Being regarded or treated by the *District* as having, or having had, any mental condition that makes achievement of a major life activity difficult.
- (5) Being regarded or treated by the *District* as having, or having had, a mental or psychological disorder or condition that has no present disabling effect, but that may become a mental disability as described in paragraph (1) or (2).

"Mental disability" does not include sexual behavior disorders, compulsive gambling, kleptomania, pyromania, or psychoactive substance use disorders resulting from the current unlawful use of controlled substances or other drugs.

- "Physical disability" includes, but is not limited to, all of the following:
 - (1) Having any physiological disease, disorder, condition, cosmetic disfigurement, or anatomical loss that does both of the following:
 - (A) Affects one or more of the following body systems: neurological, immunological, musculoskeletal, special sense organs, respiratory, including speech organs, cardiovascular, reproductive, digestive, genitourinary, hemic and lymphatic, skin, and endocrine.
 - (B) Limits a major life activity. For purposes of this section:
 - (i) "Limits" shall be determined without regard to mitigating measures such as medications, assistive devices, prosthetics, or reasonable accommodations, unless the mitigating measure itself limits a major life activity.
 - (ii) A physiological disease, disorder, condition, cosmetic disfigurement, or anatomical loss limits a major life activity if it makes the achievement of the major life activity difficult.
 - (iii) "Major life activities" shall be broadly construed and include physical, mental, and social activities and working.
 - (2) Any other health impairment not described in paragraph (1) that requires specialized supportive services.
 - (3) Having a record or history of a disease, disorder, condition, cosmetic disfigurement, anatomical loss, or health impairment described in paragraph (1) or (2), which is known to the *District*.
 - (4) Being regarded or treated by the *District* as having, or having had, any physical condition that makes achievement of a major life activity difficult.

- (5) Being regarded or treated by the *District* as having, or having had, a disease, disorder, condition, cosmetic disfigurement, anatomical loss, or health impairment that has no present disabling effect but may become a physical disability as described in paragraph (1) or (2).
- (6) "Physical disability" does not include sexual behavior disorders, compulsive gambling, kleptomania, pyromania, or psychoactive substance use disorders resulting from the current unlawful use of controlled substances or other drugs.
- "District" means the San Bernardino Community College District or any
 District program or activity that is funded directly by the state or receives
 financial assistance from the state. This includes the District Personnel
 Commission and any other organization associated with the District or its
 college(s) that receives state funding or financial assistance through the
 District.
- "Responsible District Officer" means the officer identified by the District to the State Chancellor's Office as the person responsible for receiving complaints filed pursuant to title 5, section 59328, and coordinating their investigation. The Responsible District Officer for San Bernardino Community College District is the Vice Chancellor of Human Resources and Employee Relations.
- "Sex" includes, but is not limited to, pregnancy, childbirth, or medical conditions related to pregnancy or childbirth. 'Sex' also includes, but is not limited to, a person's gender, as defined in section 422.56 of the Penal Code. Discrimination on the basis of sex or gender also includes sexual harassment.
- "Sexual harassment" is unlawful discrimination in the form of unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and other verbal, visual, or physical conduct of a sexual nature, made by someone from or in the workplace or in the educational setting, and includes but is not limited to:
 - (1) Making unsolicited written, verbal, physical, and/or visual contacts with sexual overtones. (Examples of possible sexual harassment that appear in a written form include, but are not limited to: suggestive or obscene letters, notes, and/or invitations. Examples of possible visual sexual harassment include, but are not limited to: leering, gestures, display of sexually aggressive objects or pictures, cartoons, or posters.)
 - (2) Continuing to express sexual interest after being informed that the interest is unwelcomed.
 - (3) Making reprisals, threats of reprisal, or implied threats of reprisal following a rebuff of harassing behavior. The following are examples of conduct in an academic environment that might be found to be sexual harassment: threatening to withhold, or actually withholding, grades earned or deserved; suggesting a poor performance evaluation will be prepared; or suggesting a scholarship recommendation or college application will be denied.
 - (4) Engaging in explicit or implicit coercive sexual behavior within the work environment which is used to control, influence, or affect the employee's career, salary, and/or work environment.
 - (5) Engaging in explicit or implicit coercive sexual behavior within the

- educational environment that is used to control, influence, or affect the educational opportunities, grades, and/or learning environment of a student.
- (6) Offering favors or educational or employment benefits, such as grades or promotions, favorable performance evaluations, favorable assignments, favorable duties or shifts, recommendations, reclassifications, etc., in exchange for sexual favors.
- (7) Awarding educational or employment benefits, such as grades or duties or shifts, recommendations, reclassifications, etc., to any student or employee with whom the decision maker has a sexual relationship and denying such benefits to other students or employees.
- "Sexual orientation" means heterosexuality, homosexuality, or bisexuality.
- "Unlawful discrimination" means discrimination based on a category protected under title 5, section 59300, including retaliation and sexual harassment.

Confidentiality of the Process

Investigative processes can best be conducted within a confidential climate. Therefore, the *District* does not reveal information about such matters except as necessary to fulfill its legal obligations.

Potential complainants are sometimes reluctant to pursue a complaint if their names will be revealed. The inability to reveal the name of a complainant or facts that are likely to reveal the identity of the complainant can severely limit the ability of the *District* to respond. Complainants must also recognize that persons who are accused of wrongdoing have a right to present their side of the matter, and this right may be jeopardized if the *District* is prohibited from revealing the name of the complainant or facts that are likely to disclose the identity of the complainant.

If a complainant insists that his or her name not be revealed, the responsible officer should take all reasonable steps to investigate and respond to the complaint consistent with the complainant's request as long as doing so does not jeopardize the rights of other students or employees.

It is also important that complainants and witnesses understand the possibility that they may be charged with allegations of defamation if they circulate the charges outside of the *District's* process. In general, persons who are participating in a *District* investigative or disciplinary process that is related to a charge of discrimination are protected from tort claims such as defamation. However, persons who make allegations outside of these processes or who discuss their claims with persons outside of the process may expose themselves to tort charges. Complainants, witnesses, and

those accused of discrimination will all be asked to sign a confidentiality acknowledgement statement.

Where an investigation reveals the need for disciplinary action, the complainant may wish to have information about what disciplinary actions the *District* took. However, the privacy rights of the persons involved often prevent the *District* from providing such information. In student disciplinary actions for sexual assault/physical abuse charges, Education Code section 76234 provides that the victim shall be informed of the disciplinary action, but that the victim must keep the information confidential. Disciplinary actions taken against employees are generally considered confidential.

Notice, Training, and Education for Students and Employees

The San Bernardino Community College District's responsible officer shall make arrangements for or provide training to employees and students on the District's unlawful discrimination policy and procedures. Faculty members, members of the administrative staff, and members of the support staff will be provided with a copy of the District's written policy on unlawful discrimination at the beginning of the first quarter or semester of the college year after the policy is adopted.

All District employees will receive this training and a copy of the unlawful discrimination policies and procedures during the first year of their employment. Because of their special responsibilities under the law, supervisors will undergo mandatory training within six months of assuming a supervisory position and annually thereafter. In years in which a substantive policy or procedural change has occurred all *District* employees will attend a training update and/or receive a copy of the revised policies and procedures.

A training program or informational services will be made available to all students at least once annually. The student training or informational services will include an explanation of the policy, how it works, and how to file a complaint. In addition, a copy of the *District's* written policy on unlawful discrimination, as it pertains to students, will be provided as part of any orientation program conducted for new students at the beginning of each quarter, semester, or summer session, as applicable.

Authority: Ed. Code, § 66281.5; Cal. Code Regs., tit. 5, §§ 59324 and 59326. Reference: Cal. Code Regs., tit. 5, §§ 59300 et seq.; 34 C.F.R. § 106.8(b).

Academic Freedom

The San Bernardino Community College District governing Board reaffirms its commitment to academic freedom, but recognizes that academic freedom does not

allow any form of unlawful discrimination. It is recognized that an essential function of education is a probing of opinions and an exploration of ideas that may cause some students discomfort. It is further recognized that academic freedom insures the faculty's right to teach and the student's right to learn. Finally, nothing in these policies and procedures shall be interpreted to prohibit bona fide academic requirements for a specific community college program, course or activity.

When investigating unlawful discrimination complaints containing issues of academic freedom *San Bernardino Community College District* will consult with a faculty member appointed by the Academic Senate with respect to contemporary practices and standards for course content and delivery.

Record Retention

Unlawful discrimination records that are part of an employee's employment records may be classified as Class-1 Permanent records and retained indefinitely or microfilmed in accordance with title 5, California Code of Regulations, section 59022. Unlawful discrimination records of a student that are deemed worthy of preservation but not classified as Class-1 Permanent may be classified as Class-2 Optional records or as Class-3 Disposable records. Class-2 Optional records shall be retained until reclassified as Class-3 Disposable Records. Class-3 Disposable Records shall be retained for a period of three years after being classified as Class-3 Disposable records.

Records related to a student discrimination complaint will be deemed worthy of preservation if, at the end of three years after the case is closed, a complaint on similar grounds has been filed against the same employee. In such cases, the records shall continue to be classified as Class 2 records and shall not be reclassified as Class-3 Disposable Records until complaints against that particular employee have been resolved.

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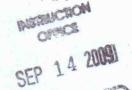

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve Amendment 004 to the General Conditions portion of the Tilden-Coil Constructors, Inc. contract at SBVC in the amount of \$408,289.00.

OVERVIEW

An agreement for services is amended when there is a change in the scope of work, usually due to unforeseen conditions, or when the Division of the State Architect (DSA) requires changes in the plans, or when the District requires changes in design to accommodate the essential needs of the project.

Tilden-Coil has been working as our Construction Manager (CM) since November 2007. Over the course of time since their contract was approved, they have been asked by prior administrators to expand the scope of their work to meet the objectives of Measure P. This vendor has been very helpful in assuming and performing the additional tasks for construction management, which has kept the bond program and projects on schedule.

This amendment covers the billing for the work performed by Tilden-Coil at the request of the District and outside the scope of their original contract. A breakdown of their work includes:

- 1) CM services for Interim Housing, Custodial Building, and Tenant Improvement projects were not defined and specified as part of the original Tilden-Coil contract, but were expanded and added as Measure P projects progressed, resulting in an additional cost of \$334,063.00.
 - a. Interim Housing included 20 modular buildings 10 for classrooms; 4 for Criminal Justice; 2 for KVCR; and 4 for Technical Education which were added as a new project after the fact when these functions could not be integrated into existing facilities during construction.
 - b. The Custodial Building was originally planned as part of the Maintenance & Operations Building. The Custodial Building was eventually split out of that project and became a standalone building project.
 - c. Tenant Improvements were modifications to the existing North Hall Building to accommodate KVCR radio and TV (which had to move to the part of North Hall not being demolished), and to the Technical Building for the move of the Refrigeration function. There were improvements not part of the original scope of work for instructional programs. Support to these tenant improvements are part of this amendment (i.e. generators plus fuel, handicap ramp modifications, door relocations, etc.).

2) District-directed tasks accomplished through General Conditions to cover construction expenditures not in original contract but required for project accomplishment (i.e. security gates and fencing, emergency power controls, internet for inspector of record trailer, etc.) resulting in an additional cost of \$74,226.00.

ANALYSIS

The effect of this amendment will be an addition of \$408,289.00 to the Tilden-Coil Constructors, Inc. contract, resulting in a revised contract amount of \$4,996,485.77. There is no change to the project schedule.

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve Amendment 001 to the Earth Consultants International, Inc. contract at SBVC in the amount of \$88,445.00.

OVERVIEW

An agreement for services is amended when there is a change in the scope of work, usually due to unforeseen conditions, or when the Division of the State Architect (DSA) requires changes in the plans, or when the District requires changes in design to accommodate the essential needs of the project.

This amendment is for a geological Fault and Fold Screening Study for the proposed parking structure in the southeastern portion of SBVC, as requested by the District. This study will evaluate the potential for surface fault rupture and deformation due to folding associated with the San Jacinto Fault. This study will build upon previous studies conducted of the San Jacinto Fault line running through campus, which allows it to specifically focus on the full width of the proposed structure plus 50 feet beyond the structure footprint as required by Ed. Code. ECI's proposed scope of work includes studying three trenches over a ten-day period and preparing a report summarizing their findings, conclusions and recommendations regarding faulting and folding in the study areas. The report involves critical measurement and projected scenarios obtained through computer modeling and careful analysis.

ANALYSIS

The effect of this amendment will be an addition of \$88,445.00 to the Earth Consultants International, Inc. contract, resulting in a revised contract amount of \$247,882.00. There is no change to the project schedule.

NARRATIVE:

Per District's request, Earth Consultants International, Inc. (ECI) was tasked to prepare a proposal to perform a Fault and Fold Screening Study for the Proposed Parking Structure in the Southeastern Portion of the San Bernardino Valley College Campus. This study will evaluate the potential for surface fault rupture and deformation due to folding associated with the San Jacinto Fault. Per California Code of Education requirements, the full width of the proposed structure plus 50 feet beyond the footprint of the building must be evaluated. ECI proposed scope of work includes studying 3 trenches over a 10 day period and preparing a report summarizing their findings, conclusions and recommendations regarding faulting and folding in the study areas.

At your request, Earth Consultants International, Inc. (ECI) has prepared this scope of work and estimated budget and schedule to conduct a geologic study of the site where a Parking Structure is proposed, immediately east of Mission Drive and north of Grant Avenue, in the southeastern portion of the San Bernardino Valley College Campus. Specifically, our study is designed to evaluate the potential for surface fault rupture and deformation due to folding associated with the San Jacinto fault. Over the years, we have conducted several similar studies on the SBVC campus, and the scope of work presented herein takes these previous studies in consideration, limiting the area where additional data are needed to evaluate the full width of the proposed structure, plus 50 feet beyond the footprint of the building, per California Code of Education requirements.

Specifically, we have used the data obtained during our evaluation of the Health Care building north of the site (ECI, 2002c) to constrain the location where additional trenching is required. We also reviewed the data we obtained from trenches excavated to the east and southeast, for the Child Care Development Center (ECI, 2002b), and trenches excavated to the west, for our initial assessment of the San Jacinto fault (Leighton, 1996), to determine the appropriate depth and sediments that we can expect to expose in the new trenches that we propose herein. Specifically, we propose to excavate three trenches (referred to as Trenches 1, 2 and 3) that combined evaluate the western approximately one-half of the proposed new structure, plus 50 feet to the west of the structure. [The eastern one-half of the structure and 50 feet east of the structure were effectively evaluated by the trenches excavated for the Health Care Center (ECI, 2002c).]

Trench 1 will be approximately 91 feet long, and will extend in a northeasterly direction across the parking lot on the east side of Mission Drive (see Figure 1). Trench 2 will be placed along the northern half of the vegetated median between Mission Drive on the north, and Grant Avenue on the south. This trench will be approximately 50 feet long, and will parallel Mission Drive. Trench 3 will be located in the southwest corner of Parking Lot 9 (also referred to as the

Jefferson Knoll Parking Lot), and will be approximately 50 feet long. The locations of these proposed trenches have been selected so as to limit the exposure of known utilities, and impact, as little as possible, traffic on Mission Drive. The trenches will impact parking lot traffic and will reduce the number of parking lot spaces available. Specifically, Trench 1 will reduce the Staff parking by approximately 9 spaces, and will also limit the number of spaces available for motorcycle parking. Trench 3 will reduce by approximately 3 the number of parking spaces in Lot 9 (Jefferson Knoll Parking Lot).

SCOPE of the STUDY and METHODOLOGY

Combined, the scope of work described above amounts to nearly 200 lineal feet of trenching. Specific tasks that we propose to conduct or subcontract to others include:

- We will mark the locations of the proposed trenches in the field and notify Underground Services Dig Alert in accordance with State law. If necessary, we will meet in the field with utilities personnel that respond to the DigAlert call.
- Where necessary, we will have the asphalt, concrete and curbs cut in the areas proposed for trenching.
- We will arrange for temporary 6-foot tall fencing (panels and/or posts) to be installed around the three trench locations to keep unauthorized personnel from entering the excavation and setup areas.
- We will subcontract the excavation of the trenches described above. The trenches will be about 12 feet deep, and we will shore them in accordance with CalOSHA requirements for safety.
- We will subcontract the repair of electric, water, sewer and irrigation lines that may be broken in the process of excavating these trenches. We have included in our budget a line item of \$3,000 to do this. Actual expenses may differ. If our estimate is not sufficient to cover the repairs, we will prepare a change order within 24 hours of receiving notification from the repair company or utility as to the actual costs of the repair. Please note that we are not responsible for, nor have we included an estimate to repair any fiber optics, communication or gas lines. If there is reason to suspect that these types of utilities may be present in the area of our proposed trenches, we can prepare for you an additional cost estimate to conduct a survey in advance of the trenching program in an effort to locate these lines. However, these types of surveys are not necessarily foolproof either.
- We will clean the trench walls and log the trenches. The geologic units exposed in the trenches will be described, and the lateral continuity of these units will be reviewed. Fractures and faults observed will be logged in detail to determine their location, and if possible, their recency of activity. We will also photograph the trenches.
- Samples of organic material, such as detrital charcoal, that we may find in the trenches will be collected. Given the amount of work that we have conducted before on campus, the age of the geologic deposits in the near-surface is relatively well constrained. However, the California Geological Survey may request additional dating of some of these sediments. To that end, we have included in our proposed budget the cost of dating one sample.
- We will subcontract the backfill of the trenches with the soil removed during the excavation. The soils will be compacted to at least 90 percent of their maximum dry

density under engineering testing and observation. A compaction report will be issued as an appendix to the overall project report. Additional soil may be necessary to backfill the trenches to their original ground level. We have not included herein a cost estimate to buy soil offsite, but rather have assumed that there is soil elsewhere on campus that can be used for this effort. If additional soil needs to be purchased, we will notify you and prepare a change order as needed.

- We will subcontract the replacement of the asphalt in the parking lots and concrete in the curbs and sidewalk. The green median at the south end of Mission Drive will be seeded and replanted, but we do not propose to replace the vegetation therein to the same density as it is now.
- We will prepare a report that summarizes our findings, conclusions and recommendations regarding faulting and folding in the study areas.

COST, SCHEDULE and LIMITATIONS

We propose to perform the trenching study described above on a time-and-materials basis for an estimated amount of Eighty-Eight Thousand Four Hundred and Forty-Five Dollars (\$88,445) subject to the limitations and conditions described herein. A breakdown by task and personnel hours is provided in Table 2. We will not exceed this amount without your prior written authorization. This cost estimate assumes that we are not impacted by rainfall, as rain has the potential to ruin the trench faces, destroying any cleaning of the trench walls that we may have already completed. It also has the potential to fill the trenches with water, requiring the use of pumps to remove the water before we can continue with re-cleaning and logging.

Please note that our scope of work and cost estimate do not include retention of an archaeological firm to monitor the excavations.

We can schedule this study within 2 weeks of receiving notification to proceed, contingent on the availability of the equipment, shoring and fencing, and as discussed above, weather-permitting. Our proposed day-by-day activities and personnel staffing are described below, in Table 1. The fieldwork component of the study is estimated to take 10 days, not including some preparatory time before hand for setup. Specifics regarding preparation and submittal of our summary report are also provided in Table 1.

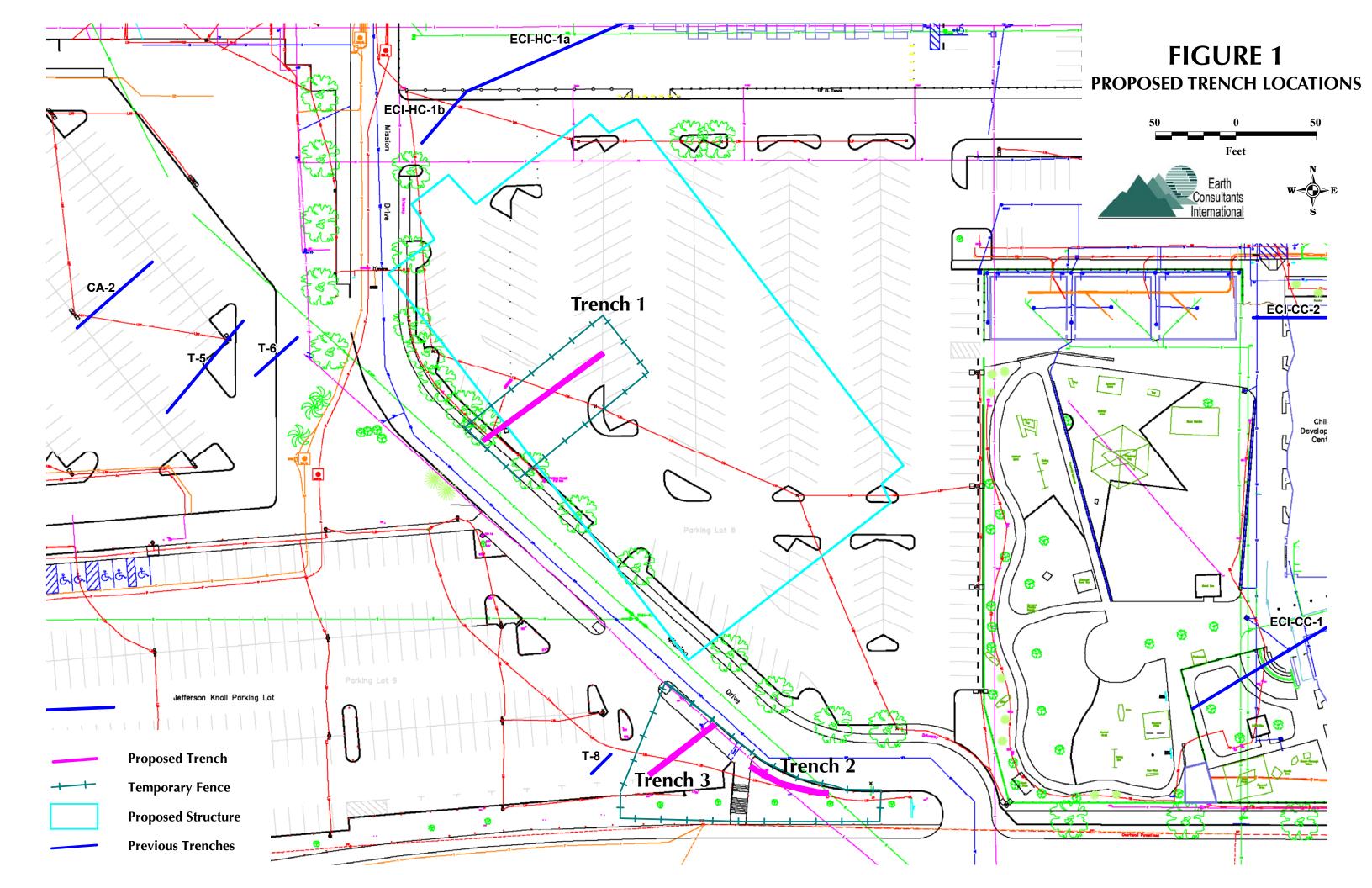

OVERVIEW

An agreement for services is amended when there is a change in the scope of work, usually due to unforeseen conditions, or when the Division of the State Architect (DSA) requires changes in the plans, or when the District requires changes in design to accommodate the essential needs of the project. This amendment is for NTD to provide additional services for the development of design and construction documents for the following.

- 1) Special modifications to Tech Core Room MC-150 in the Media/Communications building, as requested by KVCR. This increase was necessary to expand the emergency generator capacity and the uninterrupted power supply to the building so that KVCR can stay on-air during an emergency loss of power. The total fixed fee cost for this item is \$32,150.00.
- 2) Irrigation controllers for the Liberal Arts building and the remote irrigation controller for the Chemistry/ Physical Science building were discovered after the demolition of North Hall, and required relocation. This resulted in an additional fee of \$2,665.00. As-built drawings of the irrigation system did not exist during the design phase.

Originally the faculty was going to install these, but now cannot because the scope of work is beyond their technical abilities.

OVERVIEW

An agreement for services is amended when there is a change in the scope of work, usually due to unforeseen conditions, or when the Division of the State Architect (DSA) requires changes in the plans, or when the District requires changes in design to accommodate the essential needs of the project.

The original study approved by the Board on April 9, 2009 for \$26,040, conducted by Kitchell CEM, was to evaluate the five current construction projects for special environmental requirements relating to sustainable and "green" building practices. The projects were reviewed for performance and compliance with current design parameters and LEED requirements.

Different LEED versions have varied scoring systems based on a set of "prerequisites" and a variety of "credits" in the six major categories listed below. In LEED v2.2 for new construction and major renovations for commercial buildings there are 69 possible points, and buildings can qualify for four levels of certification – Certified: 26-32 points, Silver: 33-38 points, Gold: 39-51 points, and Platinum: 52-69 points. Points are given for 1) sustainable sites, 2) water efficiency, 3) energy and atmosphere, 4) materials and resources, 5) indoor environmental quality, and 6) innovation and design process.

ANALYSIS

1. The findings of this study, completed in June 2009, are that each project will meet U. S. Green Building Council (USGBC) prerequisites with moderate design revisions. A rough order of magnitude budget to pursue LEED certification for all five projects equated to \$9,800,000, including design revisions, construction costs, and project administration. A subsequent evaluation made in July 2009, coordinated between the District and the colleges, analyzed the current status of completion for all five buildings and determined it was cost effective to pursue LEED certification for only two – the Community Recreation Facility at CHC, and the Chemistry/Physical Science building at SBVC.

Scope of Services and Fee

Scope of Services

The objective of commissioning is to provide documented confirmation that the facility fulfills the functional and performance requirements of the San Bernardino Community College District, occupants, and operators. To reach this goal, it is necessary for the commissioning process to establish and document the SBCCD's criteria for system function, performance, and maintainability; as well as to verify and document compliance with these criteria throughout design, construction, start-up, and the initial period of operation. In addition, it is important to ensure that operation and maintenance (O&M) manuals are complete, thorough and accurate, as well as making sure that the training on system operation is appropriate so the building continues to operate as intended.

Kitchell's Engineering and Architectural Services Department Commissioning Agent (CA), will be involved in the Community Recreation Facility at Crafton Hills College, and the Chemistry/ Physical Science Building at San Bernardino Valley College from the beginning of the design revisions required for LEED certification, through the balance of the construction phase and closeout phases. The primary role of the CA during the initial design phase is to develop a detailed commissioning plan and review the design to ensure it has all the components to meet SBCCD's commissioning objectives. During construction the CA will develop and coordinate the execution of a testing plan, which includes observing and documenting all LEED related system's performance to ensure that systems are functioning in accordance with the contract documents and requirements of the commissioning plan. The CA will not be responsible for design, general construction scheduling, testing instrumentation, cost estimating, or construction management, but may assist in solving or resolving non-conformance issues or deficiencies.

Task 1:

Kitchell's Engineering and Architectural Services Department commissioning staff (CA) will review the Owner's Project Requirements (OPR) and provide written comments as to appropriateness for the desired LEED certification level. This is a LEED commissioning requirement of the commissioning agent.

Task 2:

The commissioning agent will review the architects Basis of Design (BOD), which is a document submitted to SBCCD by the architect prior to commencing with LEED related redesign. The review will comment on the BOD and it's compliance with the OPR.

Task 3:

The commissioning agent will review all LEED certification related specifications prepared by the architect to ensure compliance with OPR and BOD requirements and provide written comments documenting their findings. The CA will follow up with the architect to ensure that any deficiencies are corrected prior to finalizing the construction documents.

Task 4:

The CA will develop project specific commissioning plans for both the Community Recreation Facility and the Chemistry/ Science Building which include LEED required pre-functional test (PT) check lists and functional test (FT) sheets. PT's are developed from the architect's design and specifications at approximately the 65% construction document phase. The FT's are based on PT requirements and will be used by the CA staff during compliance documentation during the construction phase.

Task 5:

The commissioning agent will document preceding Tasks 1 through 4 in U. S. Green Building Council (USGBC) audit format as required by the LEED commissioning process.

Task 6:

The commissioning agent will conduct and document two on site meetings for each project which include the architect, selected contractors, construction manager and LEED documentation manager, to report on compliance with the commissioning plan and discuss solutions to any areas of deficiency.

Task 7:

Commissioning agent staff will visit both project sites to ensure that the construction manager and selected contractors are installing all components of a system receiving LEED points in accordance with the construction documents. Correct installation will be documented with PT sheets which are signed by the specified contractor, construction manager, architect and commissioning agent. Non compliant installations will be documented and tracked for future observation and acceptance.

Task 8:

Kitchell commissioning agent staff will prepare and submit a summary commissioning report for the Community Recreation Facility at Crafton Hills College, and the Chemistry/ Physical Sciences Building at San Bernardino Valley College. This report will document system LEED point compliance with the construction documents. Confirming our recent discussions I understand that the Crafton Hills College program is moving forward with implementing LEED for the Community Recreation Facility project. Upon the District's request, Tilden-Coil has previously provided a cost estimate associated with LEED implementation for the CRF. Below is this implementation budget general conditions amount for implementation of the LEED design and an estimated budget amount for 5 months of additional supervision and management of the LEED design and construction:

A. LEED Implementation at the Community Recreation Facility: The amount noted below is a budget (as the full scope of work of LEED implementation has yet to be defined) to study the cost and schedule impact with the applicable trades (this was identified as Task 4 on the Kitchell/BRJ LEED study). We would suggest creating a separate line item to track increased hours and incidentals:\$ 27,0000

B. LEED Supervision and Management at the Community Recreation Facility: The amount noted below is a budget (as the full scope of work of LEED work and the timeframe to complete the added work has not been determined) to Supervise and Manage the construction portion of the added LEED work. This estimate is based on an additional 5 3 (rev 10/2/09) months of supervision and management general conditions at \$15,000/month. (This is based on this work being performed while the existing LRC project, and the related office facility, is still underway so that the LEED work can share the use of these facilities). We would suggest creating a separate line item to track increased hours and incidentals: \$ 75,000 45,000 (Rev 10/2/09)

Again, these costs are budget estimates as the extent of the LEED design and scope of work has yet to be determined and quantified. Also, this does not include the construction waste

management/waste diversion/recycling management for the Crafton Hills construction program. As requested I will provide a separate estimate and request to manage the waste and recycling for the program. And finally, these costs do not reflect the any additional fee related to the added scope of work related to the added LEED scope. It is understood that the fee will be adjusted through a change order based on the added cost of construction for the added scope per the terms of our existing contract agreement.

OVERVIEW

Construction change orders may be generated by a number of circumstances. These include changes directed by the District to address contractor or architect recommendations for efficiency, occupant needs, or to improve future building or space usability. California Public Contract Code 20118.4 establishes a guideline that limits construction contract change orders to 10% of the base contract amount.

A construction contract is amended when there is a change in the scope of work due to unforeseen conditions that must be corrected in order for work to proceed. Amendments alter the base contract amount and are not limited to the 10% guideline.

All change orders and amendments are approved following a specific process of review by the construction manager, architect, program/project managers, and District staff. Nonessential changes are rejected and never receive approval. Any changes determined to be essential to the health of the project and of major benefit to the District are approved and implemented.

ANALYSIS

The overall impact of these change orders and amendments increase the Bond Measure P CIP construction contracts by \$1,998,397. The new overall change order percentage is 2.00%. The cost of these changes will be absorbed by bid savings and does not affect the budget. The construction projects remain within the approved budget.

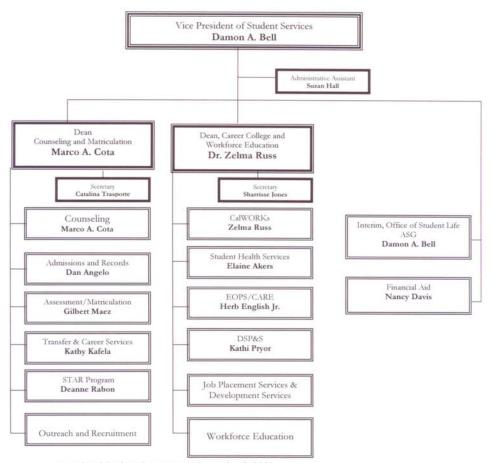

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees review the CHC Reassignment Plan.

OVERVIEW

The proposed reassignment plan for Crafton Hills College addresses administrative needs and represents the best approach to implementation and services. The reorganization is needed due to SERP retirements and the elimination of dean positions.

ANALYSIS

As a result of the retirements and the elimination of a dean's position, seven divisions were reduced to five. One position was filled with a new hire and two were reassignments. The five divisions are: (1) Career Education & Human Development; (2) Arts & Sciences; (3) Letters & Learning Resources; (4) Student Services, Counseling & Matriculation; (5) Student Services & Student Development.

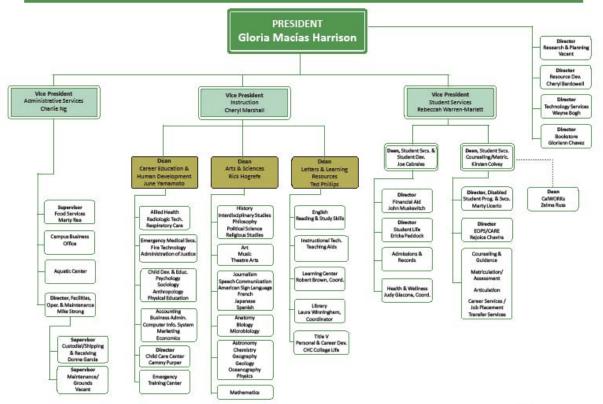

RECOMMENDATION

This item is for information only and no action is required.

OVERVIEW

As an informational item to the San Bernardino Community College District Board of Trustees, this report is a summary of all construction change orders and amendments to date for projects at Crafton Hills College and San Bernardino Valley College, including those on today's Board agenda.

ANALYSIS

The analysis shows that construction contract change orders and amendments for all Measure P projects have been held to a minimal amount of \$1,998,397.00 which is only 2.00% of the project cost of \$100,099,384.00

All change orders and amendments are approved following a specific process of review by the construction manager, architect, program/project managers, and District staff. Nonessential changes are rejected and never receive approval. Any changes determined to be essential to the health of the project and of major benefit to the District are approved and implemented.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF MONTHLY BUDGET REPORT

This revenue and expenditure report is for the period of September 10, 2009 through October 12, 2009. It reflects summary information for all District funds, grouped by expense category within each fund.

To date we have spent about 24.7% of our budget funds. Last year about this time we had spent 27.5% of our funds which reflects a somewhat slower rate of spending (-2.8%).

Also, we have updated our cash flow projection and due to the deferrals in receiving our operation funds from the State, we will be using our reserve cash plus the \$10 million Board approved, short-term TRAN (Tax and Revenue Anticipation Note) borrowing to meet payroll and other spending for this year. The State is scheduled to catch up on cash disbursements in July, 2010. This is a State accounting technique to move costs into the next fiscal year.

The State deferral mandates we reinforce the importance of maintaining an adequate cash reserve to fund ongoing obligations of the District.

We have proposed reductions in this current year of about \$2 million in ongoing expenses. As far as the 2010 budget, we do not know what the ongoing budget will be yet, but are anticipating additional cuts in ongoing expenses next year as well.

OVERVIEW

Each year, the District is required to submit the Annual Financial and Budget Report (CCFS-311) to the State Chancellor's Office. This report summarizes revenue and expenditures for each of the Funds of the District for the year ending June 30, 2009. It reflects the information that is presented and approved by the Board in the Adopted Budget.

ANALYSIS

This report shows that during the 2008-2009 fiscal year the District was budgeted to overspend its projected revenues by \$1.5 million and utilize additional fund balance to meet its obligations. That did not occur due to the early cut-off of spending and a positive adjustment in state funding due to prior year enrollment increases that were funded by the state. The District was able to end the year with a positive General Fund balance.

III. Resource management for efficiency, effectiveness, and excellence.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The District was able to maintain a balanced budget during the 2008-2009 year through careful spending measures. In 2009-2010, careful spending must continue to manage the additional budget reductions of the Restricted and Unrestricted General Fund.
