3. ACCREDITATION REPORT REVIEW

Interim Chancellor Bruce Baron stated that this is the final review and update prior to submitting the reports to the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges. The reports reflected a great deal of work on behalf of Crafton Hills College, San Bernardino Valley College and the District Office. Bruce introduced Gloria Harrison who discussed the accreditation report process and gave thanks to faculty and staff who participated in the process. She indicated that Crafton Hills College now stands ready to continue work on all of the processes implemented and the culture of improvement has been internalized into the campus culture.

Dr. Matthew Lee's best judgment on what the commission will do after the visiting team submits its report in November or December is that Crafton Hills College's accreditation will be fully reaffirmed. The second most likely outcome is the college will be raised from probationary to warning status. It is possible that if the Commission has serious doubts about sustainability, they could continue CHC on probation. Given the scope and speed of the changes presented in this report, Dr. Lee expects that CHC will be required to make its mid-term report in October, 2011, a focused report. CHC will continue its good work and document progress every step of the way.

Crafton Hills College

The follow-up report summarized progress on Evaluation Team Recommendations made during the October 6-9, 2008 site visit to CHC. The report addressed the seven recommendations noted in the January 29, 2010 action letter from the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges that continued CHC on probation. Since February 2009, faculty, staff and administrators have made focused evaluation and improvement in the following areas a top priority:

- Integrated planning and program review process and quantitative effectiveness measures
- Long-term fiscal plans and access to financial information
- Data reliability, access and training
- Participation in planning and decision-making

In addition, the report shows that the District has fulfilled the following requirements:

- Development of the District program review process
- Development of the District strategic plan
- Development of District strategic plan for technology
- Development of District human resources plan
- Clarification and communication of the District resource allocation process

The follow-up report is due to the ACCJC by October 15, 2010. This report will demonstrate the college's resolution of the recommendations and will be followed by a visit of Commission representatives.

The report was reviewed, discussed and edited by the faculty and staff of the college both individually and through the collegial consultation representative groups of College Council, Academic and Classified Senates, and the Associated Student Government.

The follow-up report summarized progress on Evaluation Team Recommendations made during the October 6-9, 2008 visit to SBVC. The report addresses the three recommendations noted in the February 3, 2009 action letter from the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges that reaffirmed SBVC's accreditation.

This report provides information on the development of the following:

- Use of student learning outcomes as a component of evaluations
- Development of a District program review process
- Development of the District strategic plan
- Development of the District strategic plan for technology
- Development of the District human resources plan
- Clarification and communication of the District resource allocation process

The Commission requires that the follow-up report be submitted by October 15, 2010.

I am pleased to present the San Bernardino Community College District's proposed 2010-2011 final budget for all District funds, which was developed in accordance with Title 5, the California Community Colleges Budget and Accounting Manual, and the fiscal policies set by the Board. Specifically, these policies include:

- The annual budget shall support the District's master and educational plans.
- Assumptions upon which the budget are based are presented to the Board for review.
- A schedule is provided to the Board by January of each year that includes dates for presentation
 of the tentative budget, required public hearing(s), Board study session(s), and approval of the
 final budget. At the public hearing(s), interested persons may appear and address the Board
 regarding the proposed budget or any item in the proposed budget.
- Unrestricted general reserves shall be no less than 5%.
- Changes in the assumptions upon which the budget was based shall be reported to the Board in a timely manner.
- Budget projections address long-term goals and commitments.

BACKGROUND

At the time of this writing, California still does not have a budget enacted. This is the longest time the state has gone without a budget. With a \$19.1B deficit for 2010-2011 and the basic political divide between programmatic cuts and raising taxes, a budget compromise has been difficult to achieve. There is no new information that significantly changes our assumptions for revenue or expenditures from the 2010-2011 Tentative Budget adopted by the Board of Trustees in May, 2010.

The revenues and expenditures in this budget incorporate our best assumptions and the best information available at the time the budget is prepared. There is a great deal of talk about the legislators not incorporating the Governor's proposed COLA of -0.38% and incorporating the Governor's proposed growth of 2.21. We have taken a conservative approach with this year's budget and we must continue to be vigilant and prudent regarding our spending. We believe we will, again, get through this fiscal and academic year and survive any budget the state adopts.

A BALANCED BUDGET

The 2010-2011 budget is a balanced budget, which we are legally required to bring to the Board of Trustees for approval. This budget implements sound fiscal practices and it addresses the high priority needs of education and service to students during a most difficult and uncertain financial time in the history of California community colleges.

BUDGET ASSUMPTIONS

- Balancing the budget while maintaining an 18.6% fund balance of \$17,609,972. This level of fund balance is necessary to fund the cash flow needs of the District as the state's deferrals and ongoing budget concerns require ready access to funds to meet payrolls, pay vendors, and maintain the District facilities.
- Negative Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA): -0.38%.
- California State Growth Apportionment: 0%.
- Enrollment Target of 14,285 Full-time Equivalent Students (FTES) or about 507 FTES above the level funded by the State. We intend to serve these unfunded FTES through efficiency measures and **not** by increasing costs.
- Increases of \$3.9 million in federal revenues from 2009-2010 actual.
- Increases of \$1.3 million in state revenues from 2009-2010 actual.
- Reductions of \$0.9 million in local revenues from 2009-2010 actual.
- Reductions of \$0.5 million in other financing sources from 2009-2010.
- Avoid layoffs, if possible, of all full-time and part-time permanent contract employees.
- Full funding for all full-time and part-time permanent contract employees including their contractual step increases and full funding of negotiated health benefits.

BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS

Enrollment

The economic downturn that our state and country are experiencing has increased the demand for courses and services at our colleges. With an overall enrollment increase in 2009-2010 of over 3.64% while the state funded a 3.71% decrease in enrollment for 2009-2010, the District served over 2,094 additional FTES above our level of funding by the state. That demand is expected to continue as people in our communities take the opportunity to enhance their skills to increase employment opportunities to improve their lives.

We are using the best information available to move forward in presenting to the Board of Trustees a budget that is conservative and fiscally responsible to our students and community. In using the best information available, enrollment is being targeted at 4,275 FTES for Crafton Hills College and 10,010 for San Bernardino Valley College, for a total of 14,285 FTES for the San Bernardino Community College District. This is approximately 507 FTES over the funding level provided by the state, assuming the state does not provide additional funding for growth. This is a conservative assumption to protect the fund balance of the District in these difficult times. These are funded FTES targets only and in no way restrict each college from maximizing their resources and enrolling students above the average numbers used to calculate the budget.

We will do everything we can to provide instruction and services to students while being fiscally responsible and staying within our available resources. Class sizes may continue to be larger and students may need to continue attending classes at less desirable times. But, to the degree that we

can stretch our resources, we are committed to meeting the needs of our communities during a time when they need us the most.

Revenues

The final budget includes increases of \$3.9 million in federal revenues from last year primarily due to increased federal Department of Labor grants. The budget includes an increase of \$1.3 million in state revenues from last year primarily due to an offsetting decrease in local revenues for property taxes. The budget includes reductions of \$0.9 million in local revenues from last year primarily due to forecasts of lower prior-year taxes and other local revenues as well as not needing an intrafund transfer to accommodate uncertain expenditures for last year. The budget includes reductions of \$0.5 million in other financing sources from last year primarily due to the District satisfying its promise of a one-time commitment to augment categorical programs as a result of last year's cuts from the state.

Expenditures

The San Bernardino Community College District has done an excellent job in positioning the District to serve our students while protecting our employees and our financial stability for 2010-2011. Last year, the District implemented a series of cost-cutting measures in response to the state's financial condition. We offered a Supplemental Employee Retirement Plan, reorganized management and staff, abolished vacant positions, and implemented a series of other cost cutting measures at each site. We have reduced our budgeted full-time equivalent employee positions from 296 to 274, a net difference of 22. This has resulted in a savings of \$3,884,573 in academic and classified wages and benefits. Additionally, a \$5,218,153 reserve for contingencies that was in last year's budget to address the uncertainty in the state budget is not included or needed in this year's budget.

One-time savings from unspent funds in 2009-2010 will also provide \$1.8 million of additional funds. We will use these funds as a one-time safety net to fund necessary expenses to balance the budget. We believe further savings will be achieved by being very selective in filling vacant positions during this year. In addition, we will continue to examine line items in the budget to be sure we are prudent with our spending.

Capital Expenditures

A total of \$314 million is budgeted to continue implementing SBVC and CHC facilities master plans and the District's Five Year Construction Plan. Consistent with the Five Year Construction Plan approved by the Board of Trustees in August, 2010, projects scheduled to be designed or constructed in 2010-2011 that will utilize capital expenditure funds this year are as follows:

Unrestricted General Fund Balance

Presently, the district has about \$19.9 million in unrestricted general fund balance. For 2010-2011, we have budgeted a \$17.6 million fund balance, or about 18.6% of unrestricted general fund expenditures. The state mandates a minimum of 5% at all times. This is prudent given the year-to-year variances of the state budget process and the potential for an ongoing economic downturn. Historically, this reserve has served the cash flow needs of the district in fiscally challenging times and we continue to rely on it for cash flow needs as the state increases the practice of deferring appropriations. We appreciate the Board of Trustees' leadership and direction regarding this prudent reserve level. We must be very careful to maintain the reserve and recognize that we should utilize it as a last resort when all other cost-cutting and efficiency measures have been taken.

Integrated Planning And Budgeting

This budget implements a brand new Resource Allocation Model that was developed through our collegial consultation process. In addition, each college and the District office have used their program review and/or strategic planning processes to determine their highest priority goals and objectives and have authorized new allocations to departments based on those prioritized requirements. We anticipate this process will be one of planning, implementation, evaluation in a continued cycle of matching resources with goals and objectives.

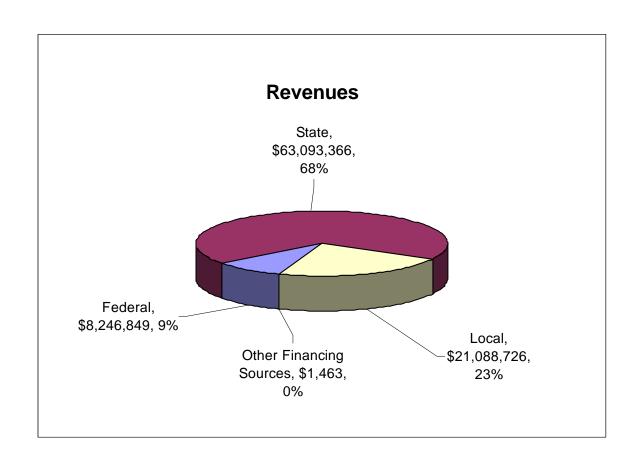
CONCLUSION

Where the Money Comes From

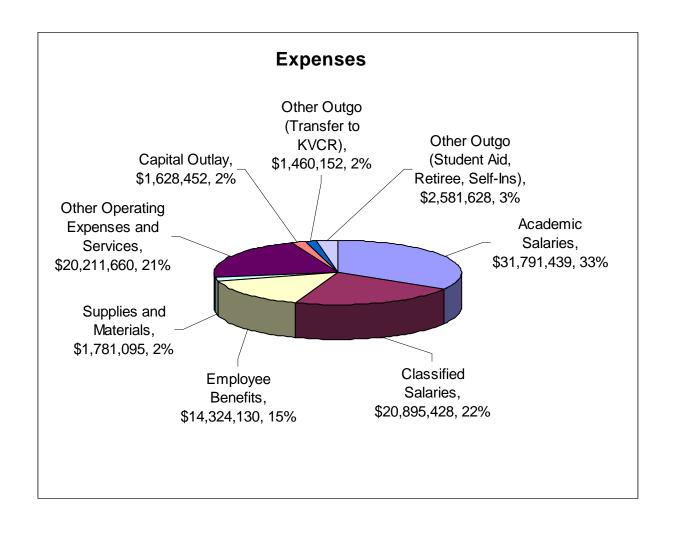
Unrestricted and Restricted General Fund Total Revenue Budget = \$92,430,404

Restricted and Unrestricted General Fund

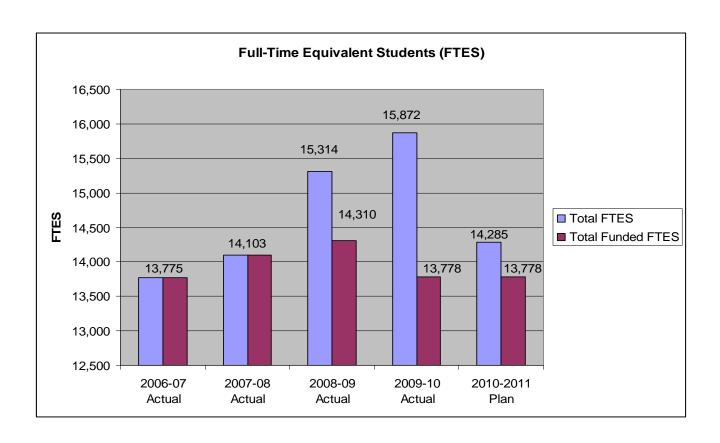

LABORATORY TECHNICIAN - ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE

Class specifications are intended to present a descriptive list of the range of duties performed by employees in the class. Specifications are <u>not</u> intended to reflect all duties performed within the job; however, any additional duties will be reasonably related to this class.

SUMMARY DESCRIPTION

Under general supervision, provides instructional support services by performing technical work in environmental science laboratories; orders, issues, prepares, and maintains laboratory materials, supplies, and associated equipment; performs related duties as required.

Positions in the Laboratory Technician class are assigned duties requiring considerable technical knowledge and ability in the assigned field of specialization. Incumbents are expected to exercise independent judgment in the performance of duties and are responsible for supervising and maintaining all laboratory supplies, materials, equipment, and records. Positions in this class specialize in the assigned subject area.

REPRESENTATIVE DUTIES

The following duties are typical for this classification.

- 1. Sets up and prepares class demonstrations and experiments working from knowledge of the subject area, reference materials, course outline, and without specific instructions.
- 2. Inventories, orders, receives, and stocks materials, supplies, and equipment for laboratory use.
- 3. Orders, receives, organizes, and provides care for laboratory collections in environmental science.
- 4. Issues and maintains records on materials loaned to students, instructors, and other departments; issues and maintains records on lockers.
- 5. Demonstrates and assists students in proper use and care of laboratory materials and equipment; assists in maintaining security of laboratories, laboratory equipment, supplies, and materials.
- 6. Prepares and dispenses solutions, and chemical materials used for lab classes which may include reagents, chemicals, acids, bases, buffers, stains, and unknowns.
- 7. Prepares and performs analyses on reagents and a variety of known and unknown chemical compounds.
- 8. Cleans up after each lab session by washing, and if necessary, sterilizing tools, equipment, and supplies.
- 9. Calibrates, maintains, and performs repairs on scientific equipment and supplies.
- 10. Monitors production of, collects, and processes hazardous waste materials and toxic chemicals materials resulting from lab classes; collects and properly stores biohazard waste.
- 11. May assist faculty in assembling printed class materials.
- 12. May supervise and assign work of student assistants.
- 13. May maintain expenditure records and provide data for budget estimates.
- **14.** Performs related duties as required.

QUALIFICATIONS

The following generally describes the knowledge and ability required to enter the job and/or be learned within a short period of time in order to successfully perform the assigned duties.

Knowledge of:

Course content, equipment, safety and other procedures, supplies, and reference materials related to the appropriate science laboratory.

Methods and procedures of preparing instructional materials used in appropriate laboratory.

Techniques and protocols for the care, collection and preservation of laboratory collections.

Mathematics skill to make calculations such as metric weights and volumes, percents, and molar solutions.

Sufficient human relation skills to guide students and student workers, and to convey technical concepts.

Operational characteristics of laboratory apparatus, equipment, and materials pertaining to assigned laboratory and subject area.

Occupational hazards and standard safety practices including methods and techniques used in handling hazardous chemicals and biohazardous waste.

Principles and procedures of record keeping and filing.

Basic inventory and purchasing processes and procedures.

English usage, spelling, grammar, and punctuation.

Ability to:

Set up, modify, service, adjust, and make minor repairs to laboratory apparatus and equipment.

Prepare chemical and reagent solutions, extracts, and dilutions to specifications.

Prepare instructional equipment and specimens for laboratory exercises.

Operate, calibrate, and perform minor troubleshooting and repair of laboratory and office equipment and tools.

Maintain the lab and equipment in a safe and organized manner including the handling of hazardous or dangerous materials and equipment as required for some labs.

Observe safety procedures and protocols, including those for safe handling and storage of hazardous materials.

Read and understand technical manuals and protocols.

Provide assistance to students in the use of lab equipment and lab procedures.

Listen actively and effectively, identify and solve problems, and facilitate problem solving.

Operate office equipment including computers and supporting word processing applications.

Perform routine record keeping and report writing duties.

Work independently and collaboratively.

Plan and organize work to meet changing priorities and deadlines.

Communicate clearly and concisely, both orally and in writing.

Establish and maintain effective working relationships with those contacted in the course of work.

Education and Experience Guidelines - Any combination of education and experience that would likely provide the required knowledge and abilities is qualifying. A typical way to obtain the knowledge and abilities would be:

Education/Training:

Equivalent to completion of 60 semester units of college level coursework that includes a minimum of 18 semester units in environmental science-related coursework. Courses may include, but are not limited to, ecology, environmental science, geology, geography, oceanography, atmospheric science, biogeography, climatology, soil science, and general, organic and environmental chemistry.

Experience:

Some experience as a laboratory technician in the appropriate subject field.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS AND WORKING ENVIRONMENT

The conditions herein are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential job functions.

Environment: Work is performed primarily in a classroom/laboratory setting; exposure to moderately high levels of toxic chemicals and solvents, allergenic plants and materials, and microbiological pathogens; work with laboratory equipment and apparatus.

<u>Physical</u>: Primary functions require sufficient physical ability and mobility to work in a classroom/laboratory setting; to stand or sit for prolonged periods of time; to occasionally stoop, bend, kneel, crouch, reach, and twist; to lift, carry, push, and/or pull light to moderate amounts of weight; to operate laboratory and office equipment requiring repetitive hand movement and fine coordination including use of a computer keyboard; and to verbally communicate to exchange information; requires the wearing of personal protective equipment including safety glasses or goggles, lab coats, rubber or plastic gloves, respirators, or face shields.

Under administrative direction, the Director, Engineering & Technology is responsible for the management and coordination of all technical activities related to the operation KVCR TV/DT/FM and KJHP-LP transmission facilities, including translators, maintenance and design of technical systems, installation and modification of all equipment; training of engineering personnel; and maintaining compliance with Federal Communications Commission (FCC) rules and regulations.

REPRESENTATIVE DUTIES

REPRESENTATIVE DUTIES

(CHANGE ORDER 03 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$17,000.00 AND AMENDMENT 01 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$13,000.00 WERE ORIGINALLY APPROVED AT THE SEPTEMBER 9, 2010 BOARD MEETING, HOWEVER, THEY ARE BEING RETURNED IN ORDER TO CLARIFY THAT THEY ARE NOT A CHANGE ORDER AND AN AMENDMENT, BUT A RESOLVED CLAIM, AS REQUIRED BY COUNTY COUNSEL. OTHERWISE, THE ITEMS REMAIN THE SAME.)

OVERVIEW

Mountain Movers is the prime contractor for the site work and they provided a request for additional cost for additional screening of fill material as well as extended general conditions and overhead costs due to an extended project schedule. The submitted claim totaled almost \$110,000.00 but was negotiated over multiple meetings down to \$30,000.00. The negotiated amount of \$30,000 was separated into a change order of \$17,000 for the additional screening, and a \$13,000 amendment for the extended schedule costs. Upon further review, the County's counsel did not agree that the \$13,000 could be defined as an amendment that was caused by unforeseen conditions. Therefore, the previous approved additional cost is now a negotiated claim of \$30,000.

If this negotiated claim is not approved it could result in the contractor claim not being withdrawn and involve the District in a litigation suit.

ANALYSIS

This resolved claim of \$30,000.00 to the Mountain Movers contract, will not result in an increase to the previously approved contract amount of \$203,912.00.

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve contract and adopt resolution for 403(b) services.

OVERVIEW

SchoolsFirst Federal Credit Union and National Benefits Services (NBS) are the Third Party Administrators that manage the 403b Tax Sheltered Annuity Plans for school districts within San Bernardino County. SchoolsFirst and National Benefits Services are responsible for fulfilling IRS requirements such as universal notification to employees, monitoring and processing employee salary reduction agreements and auditing maximum allowable contribution calculations. SchoolsFirst will remit employee contributions to 403b providers and will field employee questions and communicate with 403b vendors and their agents on behalf of the district and its employees. National Benefits Services will handle all compliance regarding the 403b plans. The District would like to re-enter into a Services Agreement 403(b) Plan contract for the term of July 1, 2010 to June 30, 2015.

ANALYSIS

The District has been satisfied by the services of this company and their ability to comply with the 2007 Internal Revenue Service (IRS) published final 403(b) regulations/interpretations. This contract would allow uninterrupted services to District Employees 403(b) plans and services.

SERVICE AGREEMENT 403(b) PLAN

This Agreement is hereby entered into by and between SchoolsFirst Federal Credit Union, hereinafter referred to as "SchoolsFirst FCU" and National Benefit Services, LLC, hereinafter referred to as "National Benefit Services," and "San Bernardino Community College District" hereinafter referred to as "Employer" and collectively referred to as the Parties for the purpose of this Agreement.

The parties hereby agree as follows:

1.0 SchoolsFirst FCU RESPONSIBILITES

- (a) SchoolsFirst FCU, in conjunction with National Benefit Services, will facilitate the provision of information services to participants regarding the rights, benefits, or elections available under the provider plans and in assisting employees in completing any forms necessary for participation;
- (b) SchoolsFirst FCU, in conjunction with National Benefit Services, will facilitate the collection of Provider Agreements and act as Employer's liaison to answer questions and inquires from providers. SchoolsFirst FCU will notify Employer and make recommendations regarding any provider or potential provider who does not agree to cooperate with all administrative and compliance procedures as established by SchoolsFirst Federal FCU and/or with the terms of the Provider Agreement;
- (c) SchoolsFirst FCU will receive and process all Salary Reduction Agreements for all participants of the plans;
- (d) SchoolsFirst FCU will provide the Employer with timely information of any additions or changes that may be required for payroll processing as a result of an addition, change or termination of a Salary Reduction Agreement;
- (e) SchoolsFirst FCU agrees to assist Employer to establish an employee education program that satisfies federal and state regulation requirements. The education program will be designed to meet the specific needs of the Employer and Employer's employees, including online website education resources, written material, and voluntary workshops.

- (f) SchoolsFirst FCU, in conjunction with National Benefit Services, will create and maintain a database of information provided by Employer or its designee and Employer's employees to monitor applicable contribution limits under IRC Sections 403(b), 402(g), and 415(c). The database will establish and monitor the maximum allowable contribution ("MAC") limit for each participant in the Plans. SchoolsFirst FCU shall make all reasonable efforts to prevent excess deferrals during the tax year. SchoolsFirst FCU will rely exclusively on information provided by the Employer and employee in establishing allowable limits and performing any required calculations;
- (g) SchoolsFirst FCU agrees that it will market its Retirement Builder investment program (Nationwide Financial) to district employees in accordance to guidelines and policies established by individual employers.

2.0 ADMINISTRATIVE DUTIES

SchoolsFirst FCU will perform services as Third Party Administrator as required for the proper administration of Employer's retirement plans that qualify under IRC Sections 403(b) ("the Plan"). SchoolsFirst FCU in conjunction with National Benefit Services shall be charged with the duties of the general administration of the Plan, including, but not limited to, the following:

- (a) SchoolsFirst FCU, in conjunction with National Benefit Services, will generate and maintain the "Plan Document" using IRC model language/prototype. All rights, privileges, and responsibilities for establishing the terms and conditions of the Plan, implementation of the Plan, and managing the Plan in all respects other than with respect to those services to be performed by SchoolsFirst FCU or National Benefit Services described in this Agreement and/or in the Plan, will be at the sole discretion and direction of the Employer as Plan Sponsor. SchoolsFirst FCU will review and make recommendations to the Employer or such other person designated by the Employer with regard to any plan changes that may be required to assist the Employer with continuing compliance;
- (b) SchoolsFirst FCU will be responsible to assist the Employer in maintaining its provider retirement plan meeting operational, compliance, and administrative guidelines under Section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.
- (c) SchoolsFirst FCU will determine the eligibility of participants to receive benefits and make contributions to the Plans;
- (d) SchoolsFirst FCU, in conjunction with National Benefit Services will maintain all necessary Payroll, Census, and remittance data for the administration of the Plans and file any necessary returns relating to the plans;
- (e) SchoolsFirst FCU will coordinate procedures to properly correct contributions made in excess of maximum allowable contribution limits, if any, with the participant and investment option provider; and

- (f) SchoolsFirst FCU agrees to assist Employer with employee data and to receive retirement contribution information for the Plans via secure file upload. Each pay period, Employer or their designee will remit retirement plan contributions for its employees to SchoolsFirst FCU via Arrowhead Credit Union.
- (g) During the term and renewal terms(s) of this agreement, SchoolsFirst FCU will remain a technical resource for Employer and Employer's employees, and will provide ongoing services to resolve operational, administrative, and compliance issues.
- (h) SchoolsFirst FCU agrees to make copies of all plan records in its possession or control available for Employer review upon receipt of written request from Employer.
- (i) SchoolsFirst FCU will also assist Employer in preparing and establishing a written loan policy and in processing loan applications as well as Hardship distributions.
- (j) SchoolsFirst FCU, in conjunction with National Benefit Services, will provide information services to participants regarding the rights, benefits, or elections available under the provider plans and will assist employees in completing any forms necessary for participation;
- (k) National Benefit Services agrees that contributions and loan repayments remitted shall be promptly transmitted to the investment options selected by the individual Plan participants as soon as reasonably possible, which is normally within one (1) business day of receipt of check/ACH/wire and remittance data in good order.

3.0 EMPLOYER RESPONSIBILITIES

The Employer will provide information for each employee participating in the Plans necessary for SchoolsFirst FCU and National Benefit Services to establish an information database, and to establish the Maximum Allowable Contribution limits and monitoring as set forth in Article 1.0. If necessary, information not available to Employer may be provided by Employer's employees. Employer acknowledges the importance of obtaining accurate data from the Employer's employees and agrees to facilitate the gathering of information from employees in any manner that is reasonable and permitted within IRS and State procedure, and that allows SchoolsFirst FCU to perform its duties under this Agreement. Employer understands that the Maximum Allowable Contributions are based solely on information provided to SchoolsFirst FCU by Employer and Employer's employees.

4.0 TERM

In consideration for the performance of the services delineated herein, Employer promises and agrees that SchoolsFirst FCU, in conjunction with National Benefit Services, shall be the exclusive third party administrator for the performance of said services with respect to the Employer's retirement plans that qualify under IRC Section 403(b), for a period of one (1) year, beginning the effective date of this Agreement and ending June 30 following the first anniversary of the effective date of the Agreement.

Upon mutual agreement of the parties, this Agreement may be renewed for four additional one (1) year terms for the total of a five (5) year term.

SchoolsFirst FCU or the Employer may terminate this Agreement for any reason upon thirty (30) days' written notice, but such termination shall in no manner affect any liability of SchoolsFirst FCU incurred prior to such termination. However, the Employer may terminate this Agreement at any time in the event of material and/or recurring breaches by the SchoolsFirst FCU of its obligations hereunder.

5.0 INDEMNIFICATION

SchoolsFirst FCU and National Benefit Services shall defend, hold harmless, and indemnify the Employer and its governing board, their officers, employees, and agents, from every claim, obligation, demand and suit at law or equity, which may arise out of, be connected with or be made by reason of the breach of SchoolsFirst FCU and National Benefits Services of the terms and provisions of this Agreement, and shall satisfy any judgment rendered or settlement against any indemnified parties, except for liability resulting from the gross negligence, willful misconduct, actual fraud or criminal conduct, of an indemnified party. The Employer shall notify SchoolsFirst FCU within a reasonable amount of time upon the receipt of any such claim, demand or suit. SchoolsFirst FCU and National Benefit Services also agrees to indemnify the Employer for penalties and interest payments imposed by the Internal Revenue Service, the Department of Labor or any other regulatory agency as a direct result of services provided under this Agreement, or SchoolsFirst FCUs and National Benefit Services failure to provide services as required under this Agreement, including inaccurate MAC limits provided by SchoolsFirst FCU and National Benefit Services, so long as the information provided by the Employer and the employee/participant is materially accurate and complete.

6.0 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

6.1 Status as Investment Companies

SchoolsFirst FCU and National Benefit Services warrants that at all times, the investment option providers whose shares are offered through the Accounts are regulated investment companies within the meaning of IRC Sections 403(b)(7)(c) and 851(a), are described as regulated investment companies in their current prospectuses declared effective under the securities Act of 1933, are eligible investments for the Accounts and are registered for sale with the State of California. SchoolsFirst FCU and National Benefit Services shall advise the investment option providers of all requirements and rely on reasonable representations made by them.

6.2 Withholding

SchoolsFirst FCU and National Benefit Services shall instruct the investment option provider or other disbursing agent to comply with all applicable withholding rules relating to distributions to employees and beneficiaries, and advise the investment option provider to file all required information returns relating to such distributions.

6.3 Privacy of Employee Information

SchoolsFirst FCU and National Benefit Services acknowledge that in the course of carrying out its duties under this Agreement it may receive confidential

information relating to the Employer's employees. SchoolsFirst FCU and National Benefit Services, its agents or affiliates, agrees not to use such information beyond the purpose for which it was provided and not to disclose such confidential information to other parties, other than its agents or affiliates as required for SchoolsFirst FCU and National Benefit Services to fulfill the responsibilities as stated in this Agreement, except to the extent required by the Internal Revenue Service, by law, or with the consent of the Employer or employee. Additionally, SchoolsFirst FCU and National Benefit Services, its agents or affiliates agree to take appropriate steps to secure such confidential information from misuse or unauthorized disclosure.

6.4 Solicitation and Directives

SchoolsFirst FCU and National Benefit Services, its agents, and representatives shall comply with all pertinent written directives from the Employer regarding the solicitation of employees of the Employer and the purchase of Accounts and Annuities. No contact of employees shall be made on premises of the Employer in person by telephone or by other means except as approved by the Employer.

6.5 Cooperation from SchoolsFirst FCU and National Benefit Services
SchoolsFirst FCU and National Benefit Services shall, in the event of an audit by
the Internal Revenue Service, an internal audit by Employer or a third party firm
designated by the Employer, or in any other instance in which Employer requires
it, promptly provide necessary information as requested by Employer for 403(b)
or 401(a) accounts held by SchoolsFirst FCU and National Benefit Services for
employees of Employer.

6.6 Prior Agreements

This Agreement supersedes and replaces any and all prior agreements of the SchoolsFirst FCU and National Benefit Services regarding the offering and administering of Accounts and Annuities to employees of the Employer.

6.7 Alteration of Terms

No alteration or variation of the terms of this Agreement shall be valid unless the parties mutually consent in writing to such alterations or variations.

6.8 Governing Law/Venue

This Agreement shall be construed, administered and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of California, and in conformity with IRC Section 403(b). The Parties specifically agree and recognize that all disputes between the Parties, their agents, affiliates, representatives, employees, successors or assigns, arising directly or indirectly from the services and obligations contemplated by this Agreement or any contemporaneous agreement between the Parties, shall be determined by binding arbitration to the full extent provided by law. The Parties agree that such mediation shall be held in the State of California, in the County of Orange, before a panel of three neutral arbitrators under the Commercial Arbitration Rules of the American Arbitration Association. Judgment upon an award of the arbitrators may be entered and enforced in any court having jurisdiction. The Parties to such dispute will equally share the fees and expenses of the arbitrators. The Parties agree that the prevailing Party in any such arbitration, as determined by the arbitrators, shall be entitled to reasonable attorney's fees. The Parties specifically waive the right to seek

remedies in court, including the right to jury trial. Nothing herein shall be interpreted to limit the rights of any Party to seek injunctive or equitable relief pending arbitration.

6.9 Severability

If any provision of the Agreement is determined to be illegal, unenforceable, or invalid, the remaining provisions of this agreement shall not be affected and shall remain in force and effect.

6.10 Assignment

SchoolsFirst FCU and National Benefit Services shall not assign any rights or obligations under this agreement to a third party without the written consent of the Employer.

6.11 Extraordinary Circumstances

No Party to this agreement shall be held responsible for the delay or failure to perform services obligations under this Agreement when such delay or failure is due to fire, flood, epidemic, strike, an act of God or any public enemy, unusually severe weather, failure or malfunction of any electronic, electric or mechanical equipment, legislative or regulatory acts of any public authority, delays or defaults caused by public carriers, or other circumstances which cannot reasonably be forecast or provided against.

6.12 Limitation of Authority to Act

No Party to this agreement shall have any authority to incur any expense or obligation of any kind or nature, in the name of or on behalf of any other Party, without express written authority.

6.13 Insurance Requirements

SchoolsFirst FCU shall, at SchoolsFirst FCU's sole cost and expense, maintain in force and effect, from the commencement of services until expiration of the contract a policy or polices of insurance covering SchoolsFirst FCU's services and furnish to Employer a certificate of insurance evidencing all coverage and endorsements required hereunder. SchoolsFirst FCU shall identify employer as a certificate holder under its Professional Liability Insurance coverage. Such insurance shall be with an insurance SchoolsFirst FCU admitted by the Insurance Commissioner of the State of California. Minimum coverage shall be as follows:

a. General Liability Insurance for injuries including accidental death, to any person in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 Per Occurrence

Professional Liability Insurance in an amount not less than \$1,000,000

Per Occurrence

Fidelity Bond Insurance protection in an amount not less than \$5,500,000 **Per Occurrence**

b. Statutory Workers Compensation Insurance in accordance with Sections 3700 and 3800 of the Labor Code of the State of California

c. SchoolsFirst FCU shall provide a thirty (30) day written notice in advance to Employer of cancellation or reduction in coverage.

6.14 Conflict of Interest

During the course of this Agreement, should conflicts of interest arise between SchoolsFirst FCU and National Benefit Services and Employer, SchoolsFirst FCU and National Benefit Services shall immediately notify Employer of conflict.

6.15 Compliance with Law

SchoolsFirst FCU and National Benefit Services shall be subject to and shall comply with all Federal, State, and local laws and regulations applicable with respect to its performance under this Agreement including but not limited to: licensing, employment and purchasing practices, and wages, hours and conditions of employment, including nondiscrimination.

6.16 <u>Fee for Services</u>

As consideration for the services provided hereunder, SchoolsFirst FCU and National Benefit Services shall receive a \$2.00 fee per actively contributing participant per month, to be divided between the SchoolsFirst FCU and National Benefit Services as SchoolsFirst FCU and National Benefit Services may agree. Employer/Employee shall have no financial obligation to SchoolsFirst FCU or National Benefit Services for services performed by them pursuant to this Agreement.

BOARD RESOLUTION

Adoption of a TSA/403(b) Plan

WHEREAS, the Governing Board of the San Bernardino Community College District "District", designated as a public education organization as described in Section 170(b)(1)(A)(ii) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC), desires to adopt an IRC Section 403(b) Plan in which all employees are permitted to make voluntary salary reductions; and to which the District may elect from time to time to make employer contributions on behalf of selected employees.

WHEREAS, the members of the Governing Board affirm that each participating employee retains all rights to the individual 403(b) account (or accounts), and, bears the sole responsibility of selection of any of the products or investment options made available by the District. The Board, District officials, or other District employees, make no representations or recommendations and bear no responsibility for any employee's selection of specific annuity products or custodial accounts, and further makes no representations to employees about the advisability, appropriateness or income tax consequences of any 403(b) account to which contributions are made.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

403(b) of the Internal Revenue Service Code is adopted, and that the following qualified annuities or custodial accounts will be made available for the employees' selection:
Fixed annuities which are qualified under Section 403(b)(1) of the IRC; and
Variable annuities that are qualified under Section 403(b)(1) of the IRC; and
Custodial accounts investing only in regulated investment company stock under Section 403(b)(7) of the IRC.

2. Employees of the District are given the opportunity to enter into an amendment of

Conformance: It is the intention of the members of the Governing Board that the District's 403(b) Plan will conform with the applicable federal and state statutory requirements, and that the employee salary reduction contributions, and the employer contributions (if any) to the 403(b) Plan be within eligible limits as set out in IRS regulations as currently stated, or as amended in the future. Each employee, and not the District or Governing Board shall be individually responsible for the determination of those eligible limits. Each employee should consult with his/her own tax advisor to determine tax consequences in investing in such 403(b) plans. The Board authorizes SchoolsFirst and National Benefit Services, Inc., the District Superintendent or designee to develop and establish appropriate procedures to insure proper administration of the Plan. The District Superintendent or designee is further authorized to act on the Board's behalf with respect to the Plan.

Compliance: Whereas the Governing Board has been made aware that the Internal Revenue Service has engaged, and continues to engage in the audit of 403(b) plans, and has reported plan defects on a large scale, the Board authorizes SchoolsFirst and National Benefit Services, Inc. to develop appropriate procedures to conduct a compliance review, followed by an ongoing compliance initiative, and to install necessary controls to insure that the 403(b) Plan is operated in conformance with Code and related regulations as currently stated, and as amended in the future; and is further authorized to act on the Board's behalf with respect to the Plan. These procedures shall, include, but are not limited to the following:

- a) Determine eligibility of participants to receive benefits, including loan and hardship distributions, and to make contributions to 403(b) accounts
- b) Monitor applicable contribution limits under IRC 403(b), 402(g) and 415(c), and coordinate efforts to correct any excess contributions between the participant and vendor.

Employer Contributions: The Governing Board hereby authorizes District Superintendent or designee to develop and implement employer contributions to 403(b) Plans as necessary and appropriate, and to establish Administrative Policies that conform with the Internal Revenue Service Code and relevant regulations for those contributions.

That this Resolution and the attached 403(b) Service Agreement are hereby adopted, approved, and supersede and replace any and all prior resolutions and plans of the District, authorizing the purchase of a TSA/403(b) for its employees.

OVERVIEW

Construction change orders may be generated by a number of circumstances. These include changes directed by the District to address contractor or architect recommendations for efficiency, occupant needs, or to improve future building or space usability. California Public Contract Code 20118.4 establishes a guideline that limits construction contract change orders to 10% of the base contract amount.

A construction contract is amended when there is a change in the scope of work due to unforeseen conditions that must be corrected in order for work to proceed. Amendments alter the base contract amount and are not limited to the 10% guideline.

All change orders and amendments are approved following a specific process of review by the construction manager, architect, program/project managers, and District staff. Nonessential changes are rejected and never receive approval. Any changes determined to be essential to the health of the project and of major benefit to the District are approved and implemented.

ANALYSIS

Current submitted construction change orders and amendments for Measure P total \$193,152, which is a 0.18% change from the original total contract amount of \$104,952,860.

The overall impact of amendments and change orders increases the Measure P construction contracts by \$4,371,240, resulting in a new overall change order percentage of 4.16%. The cost of these changes will be absorbed by bid savings; the construction projects remain within the approved budget.

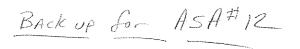

In 2002 a voluntary structural upgrade project was performed on the Business Building. An additional structural study is needed to verify if the structure is up to current code and, if necessary, provide a probable scope of retrofit.

Thank you for our continued relationship with San Bernardino Valley College (SBVC). Per your request, DLR Group WWCOT is pleased to submit an Additional Service request for Seismic Analysis of the Business Building.

Project Description

The San Bernardino Valley College Business Building is undergoing an extensive remodel of its classroom and faculty office spaces, mechanical, electrical and plumbing systems and an exterior façade upgrade. The remodel is anticipated to exceed the 50% replacement cost and is required to conform to current structural regulations of the California Building Code as stipulated by Title 24, Volume 1, 4-309 (c).

The structure underwent an extensive voluntary seismic upgrade in 2001, but specific note is made within the documents stating the voluntary upgrade was not intended to conform to current code.

Consequently, a new lateral review and analysis is required to determine the extent of further upgrades which may be required as part of our current project.

Scope of Work

The following is a description of the scope of work for the seismic analysis.

- Review existing original building structural drawings (to be provided by SBVC) and the 2001 voluntary seismic upgrade drawings.
- Construct a three dimensional computer model for analysis, which will include structural components from original and retrofit construction.
- Evaluate concrete shears, jamb requirements, overturning and out of plane design.
- Utilization of site specific seismic data.
- Issue a report of findings with probable scope of retrofit, if determined necessary.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the adoption of a resolution relating to the intent to dedicate easements to the Inland Valley Development Authority (IVDA) relating to the existing District site.

OVERVIEW

The Inland Valley Development Agency (IVDA) was established in 1990 and is responsible for the redevelopment of the non-aviation portion of the former Norton Air Force Base. IVDA subsequently entered into a Master Disposition and Development Agreement in 2002 with Hillwood/San Bernardino LLC to serve as the master developer for the IVDA redevelopment area. Previously, the District acquired Parcel N of the former Norton Air Force Base (along Del Rosa Drive) from the federal government, which is currently utilized for District offices and economic/workforce development. More recently, the Board of Trustees approved a purchase and sale agreement for the acquisition of 4.2 acres of land located on the west side of the existing District building from IVDA/Hillwood. Escrow is anticipated to close in the near future.

An existing road is located on the north side of the existing District building, with the northerly half of the road owned by IVDA and the southerly half owned by the District. The road will be widened in the future to provide more efficient access to both District and IVDA properties. Easements are proposed to allow both the District and IVDA to utilize the entire roadway. Similar easements are proposed for the existing road on the south side of the existing District Building.

ANALYSIS

Education Code section 81311 requires that the Board of Trustees adopt a resolution by a two-thirds vote of its members to declare its intention to conduct a public hearing on the dedication of an easement, as well as notification of this hearing. A resolution is attached for Board approval which indicates the intent to grant easements to IVDA which accomplishes this requirement and sets the next scheduled Board meeting (November 4, 2010) for the public hearing. Furthermore, the acceptance of easements from IVDA will be addressed at this meeting.

GIVING NOTICE OF INTENTION TO GRANT EASEMENTS TO THE INLAND VALLEY DEVELOPMENT AGENCY

WHEREAS, in order to provide roadway and utility access along Rialto Ave., a private road along the westerly line of Parcel N, and Enterprise Ave, the Inland Valley Development Agency, a joint powers authority, ("IVDA") has requested that the San Bernardino Community College District ("District") dedicate easements to the IVDA upon a portion of the District's Parcel N Site ("Easement"). A map depicting the location of the Easement is attached hereto as Exhibit "A," and incorporated herein;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code Section 81310, the governing board of a community college district may convey to the state, or any political subdivision or municipal corporation thereof, for public street or highway purposes any real property belonging to such community college district upon such terms and conditions as the parties thereto may agree;

WHEREAS, the District desires to provide Easements to the IVDA for road and utility access:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code Section 81311, the District's governing board must, prior to dedicating an Easement, adopt a resolution declaring its intention to dedicate such Easement in a regular open meeting by two-thirds (2/3) vote of all of its members;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code Section 81311, the District's governing board must fix a time at its regular place of meeting for a public hearing upon the question making the dedication of the Easement; and

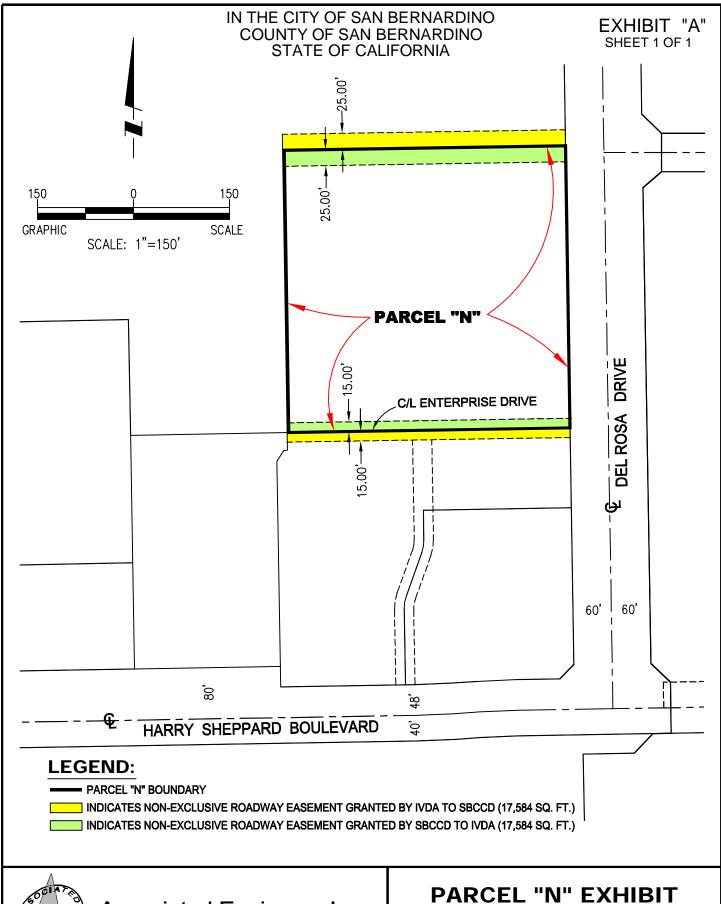

- **Section 2.** That the District's governing board ("Board") declares its intent to dedicate the Easement to the IVDA upon the terms and conditions set forth in the recitals.
- **Section 3.** That the Board establishes November 4, 2010 for a public hearing on the question of the District's intent to dedicate the Easements to the IVDA.

<u>Section 4.</u> The District staff shall post this resolution in three (3) public places within the District's boundaries and publish notice of the adoption of this resolution in compliance with Education Code Section 81312.

As an informational item to the San Bernardino Community College District Board of Trustees, this report is a summary of all construction change orders and amendments to date for projects at Crafton Hills College and San Bernardino Valley College, including those on today's Board agenda.

Current submitted construction contract amendments and change orders for all Measure P projects total \$193,152 which is an 0.18% change in the overall project cost.

RECOMMENDATION

OVERVIEW

The SBCCD is constantly reviewing its Board Policies and Administrative Procedures to ensure compliance with Title 5, California Education Code and current district/college needs.

ANALYSIS

Administrative Procedure 2045, Policies and Administrative Procedures, was reaffirmed as written by District Assembly at its September 7, 2010 meeting. No modifications have been recommended.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

None.

POLICIES AND ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES

The Chancellor, through the Collegial Consultation process, has the authority to develop new Board Policies and Administrative Procedures. The process for developing or changing administrative procedures is outlined below:

- 1. A proposal for a new Board Policy or a change in a current policy or Administrative Procedure will be submitted in writing to the Chancellor's Cabinet.
- 2. If approved for consideration by the Chancellor's Cabinet, the proposal will be shared with Collegiate Cabinet and given to the Academic Senate presidents to determine whether either believes the proposal is an "academic and professional matter."
- 3. If the proposal is deemed to be an academic and professional matter:
 - a. The proposal will be submitted to the Academic Senates on both campuses, which will have no more than a total of 3 months to review and suggest appropriate changes to the proposal, bearing in mind Title 5 and relevant state regulations.
 - b. After the Senates have completed their review, a Joint Senate Conference Committee, with representatives from each Academic Senate, will confer to iron out any differences.
 - c. The proposal will then be submitted to the District Assembly as an information item.
- 4. If the proposal is deemed **not** to be **an academic and professional matter:**
 - a. The proposal will be submitted for consideration to the District Assembly, which will have no more than a total 3 months to review and suggest changes. The proposal will simultaneously be submitted to the Academic and Classified Senates as an information item. (See 4.d below.)
 - b. The District Assembly will assign a subcommittee comprised of all campus constituencies, which will review and suggest appropriate changes to the proposal, bearing in mind Title 5 and relevant state regulations.
 - c. After the subcommittee has completed its review, the proposal will be submitted to the District Assembly for final review.
 - d. If the Senate at either campus disagrees with the presidents' assessment and deems the proposal an academic and professional matter, the proposal will be removed from District Assembly consideration and submitted to the Senates, as per Step 3 above.
- 5. After Step 3 or 4 above, the proposal will be submitted to the Chancellor. If the proposal concerns a Board Policy, the Chancellor will submit it to the Board for a first reading and/or approval. The Chancellor will submit changes in Administrative Procedures to the Board for information only.
