A. <u>Board Members</u>

- Mr. Longville mentioned that he had recently attended a meeting of the ASB at Crafton Hills and was very impressed by the manner in which their president, Student Trustee Chris Walsh, chaired the meeting. He complimented Mr. Walsh's ability to move the agenda quickly, while still spending adequate time on the issues.
- Mr. Lockwood complimented Crafton Hills College on the kickoff to their 40th anniversary year, saying it was a perfect day and that he was looking forward to a year of celebration.
- B. <u>Student Trustees</u>
 - Mr. Sanchez advised that he has received positive feedback from students about parking for free at the Pro Swap Meet, and he thanked Dr. Daniels for that. He has also received positive comments about the women's soccer team whose current record is 5 and 1. He went on to thank Mr. Felix Cortez-Littlefield for enabling students to acquire replacement ID cards at the bookstore. Mr. Sanchez also advised the Board of student concerns surrounding the cancellation of an ASG meeting, the removal of the M.E.Ch.A Club from the student conference room, and the possible dismissal of Mr. Felix Cortez-Littlefield without due process. He stated that the Board would hear from students regarding these matters during public comment.
 - Mr. Walsh reported that he felt the trustee conference he and Trustee Sanchez attended last month was helpful in learning to manage his dual roles as ASG president and student trustee. He

thanked President Harrison for her continued support of himself and the Student Senate.

- C. <u>Chancellor</u>
 - Mr. Baron presented two articles from The San Bernardino Sun. These articles are part of a new monthly column on education which will afford SBCCD an opportunity to join together with the San Bernardino Unified School District and Cal State San Bernardino to jointly address educational issues relative to our community. Mr. Baron went on to express his pride in the District's role as host of an Early Assessment Program conference. This program is a tool to assess K-12 students' grasp of Math and English in order to better prepare them for college while they are still in high school. He thanked Dr. John Stanskas for working with the Math and English Chairs to pilot use of the Early Assessment Program for two years.. Finally, he congratulated President Gloria Harrison on the start of the 40th anniversary of Crafton Hills College.

9. PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. Scott Peattie from Amonix spoke to the Board about the Solar Farm Request for Proposal (RFP). He advised that a consortium featuring Amonix was denied consideration because their submission was eight minutes late. He requested their submission be reconsidered and presented a short video to the Board. Mr. Lockwood advised Mr. Peattie that this item would be considered later in the agenda.

Ms. Monique Magana, Finance Director, Ms. Cadelia James, Student Center Affairs Director, Mr. Christian Jacobs, Public Relations Director, and Mr. Anthony Victoria, Student Organizations Director, of the SBVC ASG addressed the Board regarding their ongoing concerns about the ASG president and requested that the ASG Board of Directors be allowed to do its job even if it meant impeachment of the current president.

Leobardo Rubio, Co-Chair of M.E.Ch.A at SBVC advised the Board that he was not speaking on behalf of the entire club, but rather with the support of some of its members. He expressed feelings that Mr. Felix Littlefield has been a strong supporter of their club and should be granted due process.

Mr. Lockwood thanked the students for coming forward. Mr. Ramos asked if there was a way to request clarification of the issues presented. Mr. Baron advised that this has been a highly complex and volatile situation for the past several months. He advised the Board that he will meet with the parties and will prepare a report that describes the situation and remedies.

Ms. Mary Valdemar, SBVC Classified Senate Vice President spoke to the Board as a former ASG member. She felt that previously the ASG received independent and unbiased support from tenured faculty whose goal was to bring the ASG together when they disagreed over various issues. Now, however, since the administration is over the ASG, the ASG no longer receives strong and independent advice.

Mr. Richard Bellis of Calimesa advised the Board that he was concerned about the pool being shut down. He also mentioned that some of the showers in the gym do not work, and felt that perhaps there was not enough custodial staff to support the facility. Mr. Bellis also mentioned having incurred a problem receiving technical support.

Ms. Joan Harder-Speers, a part-time faculty member at SBVC spoke about the need to foster a can-do attitude. She was searching for a more supportive approach.

She mentioned that she appeared before the Board on May 5, 2011 expressing concern about the District's failure to comply with the Clery Act, and advised that she is again requesting that the Board seek an investigation and report regarding the District's compliance with the Clery Act.
 - Mr. Ben Gamboa, State Communications Chair for CSEA, also spoke to the Board regarding the District's handling of the Stanley Roring incident, citing the Clery Act's Timely Warning and Emergency Notifications requirements. He asked that the Board direct the District to comply with the Clery Act immediately. Mr. Gamboa also mentioned District's Board Policy 7250, regarding the evaluation of managers and administrators. He recommended that the Board direct the District to review its managers and administrators, in order to hold them accountable.

Mr. Lockwood requested that Mr. Gamboa submit to the Chancellor the information presented to the Board.

# **OVERVIEW**

Construction change orders may be generated by a number of circumstances. These include changes directed by the District to address contractor or architect recommendations for efficiency, occupant needs, or to improve future building or space usability. California Public Contract Code 20118.4 establishes a guideline that limits construction contract change orders to 10% of the base contract amount.

A construction contract is amended when there is a change in the scope of work due to unforeseen conditions that must be corrected in order for work to proceed. Amendments alter the base contract amount and are not limited to the 10% guideline.

All change orders and amendments are approved following a specific process of review by the construction manager, architect, program/project managers, and District staff. Nonessential changes are rejected and never receive approval. Any changes determined to be essential to the health of the project and of major benefit to the District are approved and implemented.

# ANALYSIS

Construction contract amendments and change orders submitted for approval this month total -\$69,744. The percentage for this month's change orders is -0.065% of the total Measure P construction contracts of \$106,550,029.

The overall impact of amendments and change orders increases the Bond Measure P CIP construction contracts by \$6,249,661. The new overall Measure P change order percentage is 5.87%. The cost of these changes will be absorbed by bid savings; the construction projects remain within the approved budget.

Construction change orders may be generated by a number of circumstances. These include changes directed by the District to address contractor or architect recommendations for efficiency, occupant needs, or to improve future building or space usability. California Public

Contract Code 20118.4 establishes a guideline that limits construction contract change orders to 10% of the base contract amount.

A construction contract is amended when there is a change in the scope of work due to unforeseen conditions that must be corrected in order for work to proceed. Amendments alter the base contract amount and are not limited to the 10% guideline.

All change orders and amendments are approved following a specific process of review by the construction manager, architect, program/project managers, and District staff. Nonessential changes are rejected and never receive approval. Any changes determined to be essential to the health of the project and of major benefit to the District are approved and implemented.

# ANALYSIS

Construction contract amendments and change orders submitted for approval this month total \$95,542. The percentage for this month's change orders is 0.937% of the total Measure M construction contracts of \$10,192,526.50.

The overall impact of amendments and change orders increases the Bond Measure M CIP construction contracts by \$734,936. The new overall Measure M change order percentage is 7.21%. The cost of these changes will be absorbed by bid savings; the construction projects remain within the approved budget.

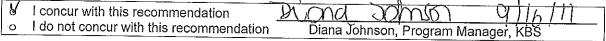

As a result of this process, NTD Architecture is being recommended to perform architectural services for the Measure M New Science Building at Crafton Hills College.

### ANALYSIS

During contract negotiations the news of the Measure M bond not reaching the original level of funding surfaced and Kitchell/BRj/Seville was asked to stop contract negotiations until further notice. A decision was made that the CHC New Science Building would move forward and the direction was given to once again enter into contract negotiations with NTD.

The negotiated fee for these services is \$1,950,661.

#### NARRATIVE:

In late 2010, SBCCD and CHC went through the SBCCD board approved consultant procurement selection process for architectural services for the CHC New Science Building. NTD Architecture was selected by the selection committee as the preferred architect and Kitchell/BRj/Seville began contract negotiations. During contract negotiations the news of the Measure M bond not reaching the original level of funding surfaced. Due to this information Kitchell/BRj/Seville was asked to stop contract negotiations until SBCCD and CHC went through the exercise of confirming what Measure M projects would move forward with the available Measure M bond funds. CHC has been engaged in these discussions for the past 6 months and the process is reaching its final stages. A decision that has been made through this process is that the CHC New Science Building will move forward with the available Measure M bond funds. Direction was received from SBCCD and CHC to once again enter contract negotiations with NTD Architecture for architectural services for the CHC New Science Building.

Since this direction Kitchell/BRj/Seville and NTD Architecture have had a series of meetings and discussions. Contract negotiations have been finalized and both parties are confident that a fair and reasonable contract and fee have been agreed upon. The final agreed upon fee is in the amount of \$1,950,661.00, which is 9.75% of the estimated construction budget of \$20,008,257.00 for the CHC New Science Building. One thing to note is that \$54,000.00 of the fee is a Not-to-Exceed amount for the Programming Phase of the project. This portion of the fee will be tracked and paid on a time and material basis with any and all remaining amount staying within the bond program dollars.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Kitchell/BRj/Seville recommends that SBCCD approve NTD Architecture's architectural service contract for the CHC New Science Building in the amount of \$1,950,661.00.

- 3. District Financial Services will review the District's compliance with the Fast Track Program's requirements and guidelines (Step by Step), and the Public Works Building Contract Procedures. Violation of the requirements or guidelines (Step by Step), or Public Works Building Contract Procedures will result in Letters of Notice to the District. If the District receives three (3) Letters of Notice or commits a major violation (for instance, failure to comply with the public bid requirements), participation in the Fast Track Program can be revoked.
- 4. <u>Charlie Ng</u> as <u>Vice Chancellor, Fiscal Services</u> and <u>Steven J. Sutorus</u> as <u>Business</u> <u>Manager</u> will be responsible for the District's compliance with all legal requirements and Fast Track Program requirements. In exchange, the District's construction payments will be expedited.

## **OVERVIEW**

As an informational item to the San Bernardino Community College District Board of Trustees, this report is a summary of all construction change orders and amendments to date for projects at Crafton Hills and San Bernardino Valley Colleges, including those on today's Board agenda.

## **ANALYSIS**

Current submitted construction contract amendments and change orders for all Measure P projects total \$-69,774.02 which is a -0.065% change of the overall project cost.

The analysis shows that construction contract change orders and amendments for all Measure P projects have been held to a minimal amount of \$6,249,661.71 which is only 5.87% of the project cost of \$106,550,029.39.

All change orders and amendments are approved following a specific process of review by the construction manager, architect, program/project managers, and District staff. Nonessential changes are rejected and never receive approval. Any changes determined to be essential to the health of the project and of major benefit to the District are approved and implemented.

As of October 2, 2011, we have spent and encumbered about 26.5% of our budgeted general funds and are 24.9% through the fiscal year. While these figures seem to indicate that we are spending at a faster rate than anticipated, this is due to the encumbering of funds for utilities and contracts costs which will be spent over the entire year.

# TENTATIVE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE SAN BERNARDINO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT And the CALIFORNIA SCHOOL EMPLOYEES ASSOCIATION CHAPTER #291

Article 14: LEAVES

14.4.10 After exhaustion of all paid sick leave, accumulated compensating time, vacation or other available paid leave, the amount deducted from a member's salary shall not exceed the sum which is actually paid a substitute employee employed to fill his/her position during his/her absence up to five (5) months from the first day of absence. The five (5) month period shall commence on the first day of absence.

14.4.10 An unit member shall be credited once a fiscal year with a total of not less than 100 working days of paid sick leave, excluding sick days under Article 14.4. Such days of paid sick leave in addition to those days of sick leave under Article 14.4, shall be compensated at 50% of the member's regular salary. Such additional days shall be exclusive of any other paid leaves, holidays, vacation or compensatory time to which the member may be entitled. The 100 working days of extended sick leave shall be allocated on July 1st, of each fiscal year; the 50% (half pay) extended sick days will be utilized only after all accrued regular full-pay sick leave is exhausted. Any remaining 50% half pay extended sick leave will not carry forward to the next fiscal year. At the conclusion of the 100 working days of 50% half pay extended sick leave the member may elect to use any other available leaves.

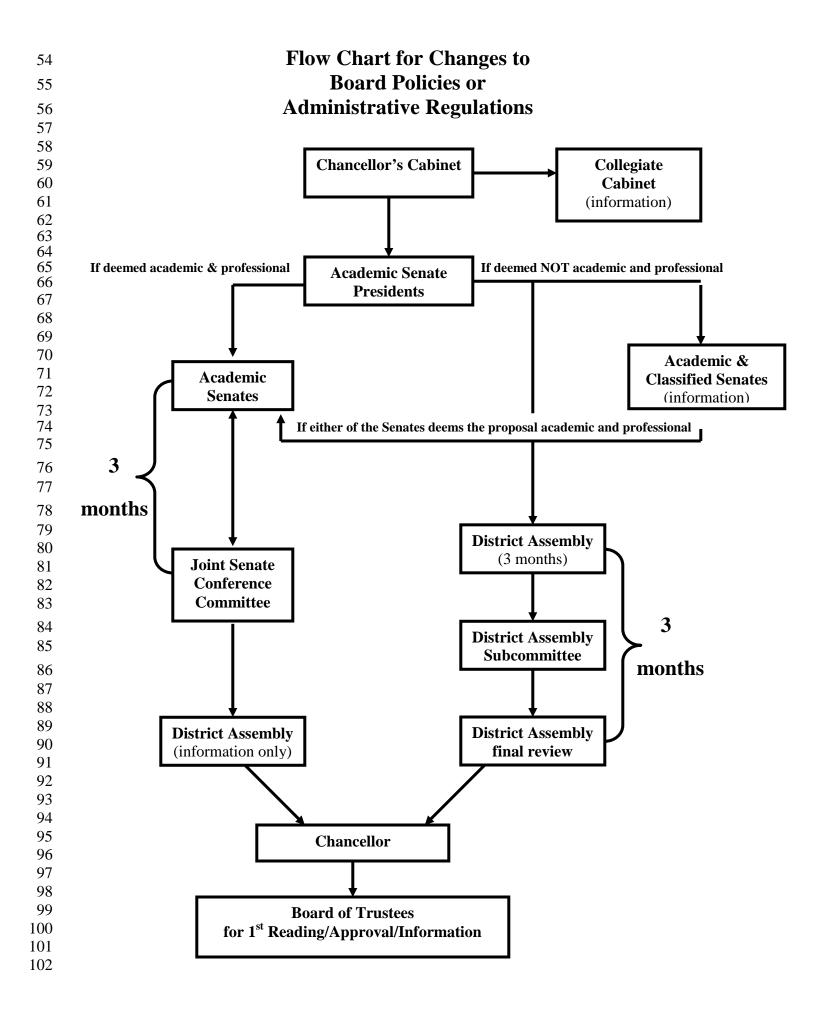

    - a. The proposal will be submitted for consideration to the District Assembly, which will have no more than a total 3 months to review and suggest changes. The proposal will simultaneously be submitted to the Academic and Classified Senates as an information item. (See 4.d below.)
    - b. The District Assembly will assign a subcommittee comprised of all campus constituencies, which will review and suggest appropriate changes to the proposal, bearing in mind Title 5 and relevant state regulations.
    - c. After the subcommittee has completed its review, the proposal will be submitted to the District Assembly for final review.
    - d. If the Senate at either campus disagrees with the presidents' assessment and deems the proposal an academic and professional matter, the proposal will be removed from District Assembly consideration and submitted to the Senates, as per Step 3 above.

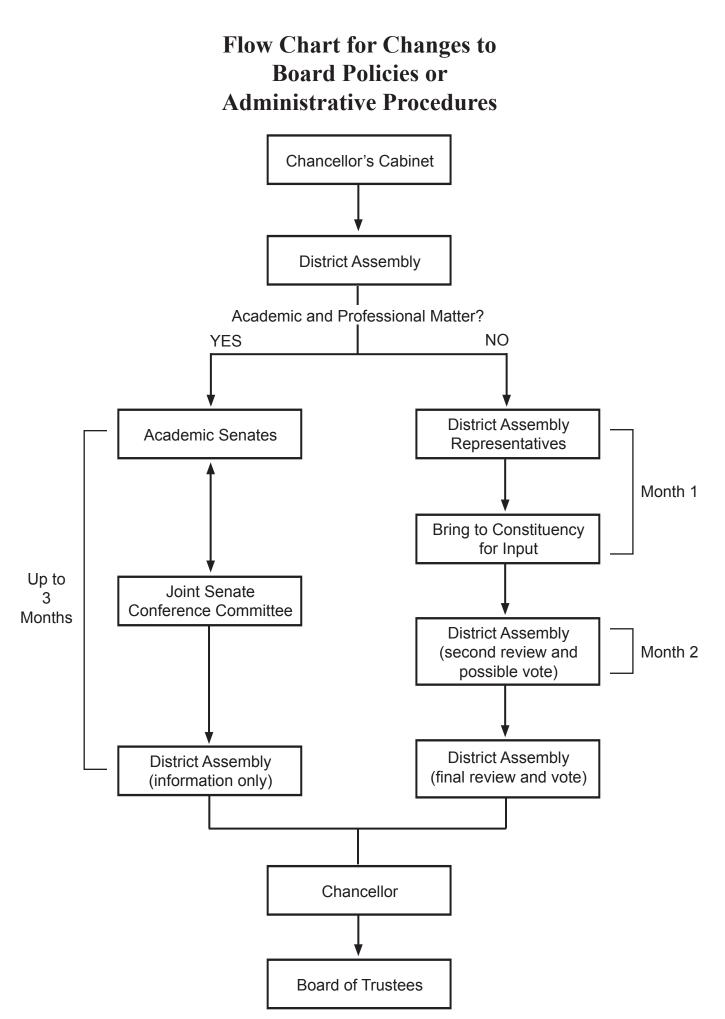

- b. The District Assembly will assign a subcommittee comprised of all campus constituencies, which will review and suggest appropriate changes to the proposal, bearing in mind Title 5 and relevant state regulations.
- c. After the subcommittee has completed its review, the proposal will be submitted to the District Assembly for final review.
- d. If the Senate at either campus disagrees with the presidents' assessment and deems the proposal an academic and professional matter, the proposal will be removed from District Assembly consideration and submitted to the Senates, as per Step 3 above.
- 5. After Step 3 or 4 above, the proposal will be submitted to the Chancellor. If the proposal concerns a Board Policy, the Chancellor will submit it to the Board for a first reading and/or approval. #### COMPUTER AND NETWORK USE

10 Purpose: The San Bernardino Community College District ("District") owns and operates a variety of

11 computer and communication systems, including voicemail, electronic mail (e-mail), telephone, and access

12 to the Internet, which are provided for the use of District faculty, administrators, staff, and students in support

13 of the programs of the Colleges and District. Here after, this system and all of its component parts shall be

14 referred to as the "District Network." This network establishes a communications platform that often

15 substitutes for in-person meetings regarding District business.

16 The Computer and Network Use: Rights and Responsibilities Regulation ("the Administrative Regulation")

17 applies to all members of the District community using the District Network including faculty, administrators,

18 staff, students, independent contractors, and authorized guests. The Administrative Regulation covers use of

19 computer equipment and communication systems at any District facility in computer labs, classrooms,

20 offices, libraries and the use of the District servers and networks from any location. If any provision of this

21 Administrative Regulation is found to be legally invalid it shall not affect other provisions of the Administrative

22 Regulation as long as they can be effective without the invalid provision.

# 23 Ownership Rights

24 The Administrative Regulation is based upon and shall be interpreted according to the following fundamental

25 principle: the entire District Network, and all hardware and software components within it, is the sole property

26 of the District which sets the terms and conditions of its use consistent with the law. Except as provided in

27 Board Policy or collective bargaining agreements pertaining to intellectual property rights, employees and

28 students have no rights of ownership to these systems or to the information they contain by virtue of their use

29 of all or any portion of the District Network.

# 30 Privacy Interests

31 The District recognizes the privacy interests of faculty and staff and their rights to freedom of speech,

32 participatory governance, and academic freedom as well as their rights to engage in protected union and

33 concerted activity. However, both the nature of electronic communication and the public character of District

34 business make electronic communication less private than many users anticipate. In addition, the District

35 Network can be subject to authorized and unauthorized access by both internal and external users.

36

37 For these reasons there are virtually no online activities or services that guarantee an absolute right of

38 privacy, and therefore the District Network is not to be relied upon as confidential or private. Nonetheless, the

39 District seeks to afford email communications privacy protections comparable to those it traditionally affords

40 paper mail and telephone communications.

# 41 District Rights

42 System administrators may access user files or suspend services they manage without notice: 1) to protect

43 the integrity of computer systems; 2) under time-dependent, critical operational circumstances; 3) as required

44 by and consistent with the law; or 4) when it is reasonable to believe that violations of law or District policy or

45 procedures have occurred. For example, system administrators, following organizational guidelines, may

46 access or examine individual files or accounts based on suspicion that they have been corrupted or damaged

47 or subject to unauthorized use or misuse. In such cases of access without notice, data or information acquired

48 may be used to initiate or extend an investigation related to the initial cause or as required by law or Board

49 policy. Such data or information may also be used as grounds for appropriate personnel action.

#### 50 User Rights

- 51 While the District monitors electronic usage as part of its normal network operating procedures, the District
- 52 does not routinely inspect or monitor users' computer hardware or files, email, and/or telephone message
- 53 system, nor disclose information created or stored in such media without the user's consent. The District shall
- 54 attempt to notify users before accessing computer hardware and files or prior to suspending service. In the
- 55 event that the District acts without user consent, under its District Rights specified above, the District shall do
- 56 so with the least perusal of contents and the least action necessary to resolve the immediate situation. When
- 57 the District accesses files without user consent, it shall notify the user within five working days of its access
- 58 and provide the reason for its action, except in cases involving personnel or legal investigations.

# 59 User Responsibilities

- 60 The Board recognizes that computers and networks can provide access to resources on and off campus, as 61 well as the ability to communicate with other users worldwide. Such open access is a privilege and requires
- 62 that individual users act responsibly. Users must respect the rights of other users, respect the integrity of the
- 63 systems and related physical resources and observe all relevant law, regulations, and contractual obligations.
- 64 65 For District employees the intended uses of the District Network are those which are reasonable and
- 66 necessary for the pursuit of job duties; for students, the intended uses are those which are reasonable and
- 67 necessary for the pursuit of instructional activities. Although personal use is not an intended use, the District
- 68 recognizes that the Network will be used for incidental personal activities provided that such use is within
- 69 reason and provided that such usage is ordinarily on an employee's own time, is occasional, and does not
- 70 interfere with or burden the District's operation.
- 71

72 "Unauthorized uses" include prohibited uses and any other use for a prohibited purpose, including illegal

- activities, messages which may constitute discrimination or harassment under state or federal law, or
   anything that interferes with the intended use. These types of prohibited uses and purposes are further
- 74 anything that interfetes with the interfete use. These types of prohibited uses and purposes are runn 75 defined in this Administrative Regulation.
- 76

77 All users of the District Network must read, understand, and comply with this Administrative Regulation, and

- 78 any additional guidelines established by the District. Such guidelines will be reviewed by the District and may
- 79 become subject to Board approval as a District policy or procedure. By using any part of the District Network,
- 80 users agree that they will comply with this Administrative Regulation.
- 81

82 Copies of this Administrative Regulation can be found in the policies section of the College Catalogues,

- 83 Schedule of Classes, Student Handbooks, Faculty Handbooks, New Classified Employee Handbook, and the
- 84 Handbook for New Administrators. Copies of this regulation are also available in the District Human
- 85 Resources Office, the Office of the Presidents (Crafton Hills College and San Bernardino Valley College), the
- 86 Office of the Vice-Presidents of Instruction, Student Services, and Administrative Services (Crafton Hills
- 87 College and San Bernardino Valley College), and on the District's Web site at http://www.sbccd.org
- 88

89 Abuse of computing, networking or information resources contained in or part of the District Network may

- 90 result in the loss of computing privileges. Additionally, abuse can be prosecuted under applicable statutes.
- 91 Users may be held accountable for their conduct under any applicable District or college policies, procedures,
- 92 or collective bargaining agreements. Complaints alleging abuse of the District Network will be directed to
- those responsible for taking appropriate disciplinary action. Illegal reproduction of material protected by U.S.
   Copyright Law is subject to civil damages and criminal penalties including fines and imprisonment.
- 95
- Examples of behaviors constituting abuse which violate Administrative Regulation 3720 include, but are not
   limited to, the following activities:

- Using a computer account that one is not authorized to use.

- 152 incidental personal activities and will take no disciplinary action provided that such use is within reason and
- 153 provided that such usage is ordinarily on an employee's own time; is occasional and does not interfere with or
- 154 burden the District's operation. Likewise, the District will not purposefully surveil or punish reasonable use of
- 155 the network for union business-related communication between employees and their unions.

#### 156 <u>Complaints</u>

- 157 A user who asserts that the District or District personnel have violated this policy shall file a complaint with his
- 158 or her immediate supervisor with a copy to the Vice Chancellor of Human Resources, and a copy to the
- 159 employee's bargaining unit. The supervisor shall notify the supervisor of the alleged violator to discuss the
- 160 complaint. The supervisor of the complainant shall initiate an investigation if necessary and determine an
- 161 appropriate remedy/resolution in consultation with the Vice Chancellor of Human Resources. In cases where
- 162 the supervisor is part of the complaint, the complaint shall be filed with the next level of supervision for 163 investigation and resolution and/or remedy. The complainant shall be informed in writing 1) of the initiation of
- 164 the investigation, and 2) of its outcome as appropriate, with copies to the Vice Chancellor of Human
- 165 Resources and the employee's bargaining unit. Complainants dissatisfied with the resolution/remedy have full
- 166 recourse to relevant contractual protections and/or legal action.
- 167

#### 168 Enforcement of the Administrative Regulation

- 169 The Board directs the Chancellor or designee to enforce all existing federal and state laws and District and
- 170 college policies, including not only those laws and regulations that are specific to computers and networks but
- 171 also those that apply generally to personal conduct. Violations of this Administrative Regulation will be dealt
- 172 with in the same manner as violations of other District policies or standards of behavior and may result in
- 173 disciplinary action, subject to applicable due process requirements.

- 175 Users who believe this Administrative Regulation has been misinterpreted or misapplied may file a complaint
- 176 in accordance with the Complaint Procedures found in this Administrative Regulation.
- Students who do not observe the requirements of this Administrative Regulation may be in violation of the
   Student Code of Conduct and subject to student discipline.
- 179 Board Policy and Administrative Regulation 3720 shall be distributed to all new and existing employees.
- 180 Nothing in this policy should be construed to interfere with First Amendment rights or with the academic 181 freedom of faculty as outlined in Board Policy 4030.

5	COMPUTER AND NETWORK USE
6	Ownership Rights
7	The San Bernardino Community College District ("District") owns, leases, and/or operates a variety of
8	computer and communication systems, including but not limited to: host computers, file servers, work
9	stations, stand-alone computers, laptops, software, and internal or external communications networks
10	(Internet, email, mass notification systems, telephone and voicemail systems). These systems are
11	provided for the use of District faculty, administrators, staff, and students in support of the programs of
12	the colleges and District. Hereinafter, this system and all of its component parts shall be referred to as

13 the "District Network."

#### 14 Privacy Interests

- 15 The District recognizes the privacy interests of faculty, staff and students and their rights to freedom of
- 16 speech, collegial consultation, and academic freedom, as well as their rights to engage in protected
- 17 union and concerted activity. However, both the nature of electronic communication and the public
- 18 character of District business make electronic communication less private than many users anticipate,
- and may be subject to public disclosure. In addition, the District Network can be subject to authorized
- and unauthorized access by both internal and external users. For these reasons, there are virtually no
- 21 online activities or services that guarantee an absolute right of privacy, and therefore the District
- 22 Network is not to be relied upon as confidential or private.

#### 23 District Rights

- 24 System administrators may access users' files or suspend services they manage without notice only: 1)
- to protect the integrity of computer systems; 2) under time-dependent, critical operational
- circumstances; 3) as required by and consistent with the law; 4) where evidence exists that violations of
- 27 law or District Policy or Procedures have occurred. For example, system administrators, following
- organizational guidelines, may access or examine individual files or accounts based on evidence that
- they have been corrupted or damaged or subject to unauthorized use or misuse. In such cases of access
- 30 without notice, data or information acquired may be used to initiate or extend an investigation related
- to the initial cause or as required by law or Board policy and/or to protect system integrity.

#### 32 System Abuse

- 33 Users are prohibited from the use of the access codes of other users to gain access to computer
- resources on the District network. Users are responsible to safeguard accounts given them. Therefore
- 35 they should not provide their access codes to others for the purpose of accessing District computing
- 36 resources.

- 37 Users shall not attempt to modify any part of the network, attempt to crash or "hack" District systems,
- 38 or tamper with any software protections or restrictions placed on computer applications or files. Unless
- 39 properly authorized, users shall not attempt to access restricted portions of any operating system,
- 40 security software, or application system. District computing resources may not be used to violate
- 41 copyright laws or license agreements.

# 42 Misrepresentation and Liability

- 43 Users of Electronic Communications Resources shall not give the impression that they are representing,
- 44 giving opinions, or otherwise making statements on behalf of the District unless appropriately
- 45 authorized to do so. The District is not responsible for any loss or damage incurred by an individual as a
- 46 result of personal use of the District's Electronic Communications Resources.

# 47 Harassment

- 48 Users are prohibited from using the District's information systems in any way that may be disruptive or
- 49 offensive to others, including, but not limited to, the intentional viewing and/or transmission of sexually
- 50 explicit messages, graphics, cartoons, ethnic or racial slurs, or anything that may be construed as
- 51 harassment or disparagement of others. This is consistent with the District's non-discrimination policy.

# 52 Commercial Use

- 53 Commercial use of the District computing resources for personal gain or illegal purposes is prohibited.
- 54 Computer resources on the District network are provided to support District-related academic and
- administrative activity. They may not be used for the transmission or storage of commercial, political, or
- 56 personal advertisements, solicitations and promotions, destructive programs (viruses and/or self-
- 57 replicating code), or any other unauthorized use. Transmitting unsolicited advertising, promotional
- 58 materials or other forms of solicitation are prohibited without prior authorization by District
- 59 administration.

# 60 Fair Use

- 61 Information appearing on the internet should be regarded as copyright protected, whether or not it is
- 62 expressly noted as such. Section 107 of the Copyright law (title 17, US Code) allows for Fair Use of
- 63 copyrighted materials. Teaching, scholarship, research, comment, news reporting, and criticism are
- 64 considered fair and allow for reproduction of a given work. Acknowledgement of the source is
- 65 recommended but is no substitute for obtaining permission (<u>http://www.copyright.gov/fls/fl102.html</u>).

# 66 Software Licensing

- 67 Software, used on District owned computers, must be properly licensed. These licenses provide the
- 68 acceptable use of the software and hold the user and in some cases the District legally responsible for
- 69 copyright violations.
- All software must be approved by district and/or campus technology departments prior to purchase.
- 71 Software, its associated license material, and proof of purchase will be submitted and stored with
- 72 district and/or campus technology departments. For specific District purchasing procedures, please
- 73 refer to Administrative Procedure 6330.

# 74 Exceptions

- Activities will not be considered misuse when authorized by appropriate District officials for security or
- 76 performance testing. Technology support staff, under the direction of senior management, may at any
- time examine the equipment, software and services of District owned equipment.
- 78 Technology support staff monitors for any unauthorized equipment or software on the District's
- 79 networks, and reserve the right to remove, disconnect, or disable the unauthorized equipment or
- 80 software.

# 81 Network Access, Media and Social Networking

- 82 SBCCD provides network and telecommunications services as a tool for students, staff and faculty.
- 83 Internet access is provided to assist in the completion of college related work and assignments. As such,
- 84 the district provides this service and is subject to state and federal regulations. This applies to all
- 85 equipment attached to the provided network, wired or wireless, without regard to ownership of the
- 86 equipment. The District recognizes that incidental personal activities may occur provided that such use
- 87 is within reason, is ordinarily on one's own time, is occasional, and does not interfere with or burden the
- 88 District's operation. (Please review "Privacy Interests" and "District Rights" sections above).
- 89 Personal social networking accounts shall not be used to officially represent campus or district entities
- 90 on social networking, wiki, or other social media sites. For official representation of any District entity, a
- 91 campus or district account, approved by the president/chancellor or their designee, must be used. The
- 92 account holders must agree to use the resources legally, ethically and in keeping with the intended use
- 93 per the procedures of their respective sites.

# 94 PDA and Smartphones

- 95 SBCCD does not provide support for PDAs and smartphones. SBCCD only provides the connection
- 96 settings to the Exchange messaging system for the synching of SBCCD e-mail, calendar and contacts on
- 97 smartphones and PDAs. It is the user's responsibility to enter the settings or get the services provider to
- 98 enter the settings.
