C. Chancellor

 Mr. Baron said we need to keep our eye on the economy and state finances. Education is threatened so it's important that we support the November tax measure. Those funds are earmarked for K-14 education and without those funds many districts will have no money to operate. This district would be looking at about a \$9 million deficit as opposed to \$3 million without that tax incentive. Mr. Baron thanked everyone who has been lobbying on behalf of education and our students. Dorothy Inghram who was a 1934 graduate of SBVC passed away. She was 106 years old and will be missed by a lot of people.

A. Southern California Edison Incentive Awards for the CHC Solar Farm Project

Beverly Powell and Matthew Pagano from Southern California Edison awarded the district with a 5-year \$1,830,000 million California Solar Initiative Incentive for the CHC Solar Farm Project.

Bruce Baron and Gloria Harrison were thanked for recognizing its value to the community and the district from a sustainability standpoint and making it a priority in the capital improvement program and funding it. He thanked Mike Strong who was involved in the process from the campus perspective, providing coordination and cooperation. Charlie Ng was also acknowledged for making things happen in the background.

Gary Weinstein, Project Manager with Kitchell-BRj-Seville, was recognized. Mr. Weinstein had the responsibility of the Solar Farm Project from start to finish. He worked closely with SCE, the contractor, and the district's engineers to submit the application and develop the system performance criteria that were ultimately approved for the California Solar Initiative.

B. Student Testimonials - SBVC

Dr. Larry Buckley introduced Interim Dean Roger Powell, the team coach for the college's Cyber Defense Team, a cutting edge program in defense of computer technology.

Mr. Powell introduced the individual team members.

C. Redevelopment Successor Agencies

Dante Gumucio CEO of Public Economics, Inc. and consultant to the district on all matters relating to redevelopment agencies, provided an overview of the elimination of RDAs per ABX1 26.

He reported our district has 13 former RDAs within its boundaries which have 49 project areas in whole or in part of our boundaries. We have entitlements to 50 different pass-throughs from the 13 RDAs and 44 projects. Pass-through payments should be paid as if the RDAs are still

in existence. The county auditor will be making the pass-through payments.

The district needs to nominate individuals to the oversight boards for each of the former 13 RDAs and transmit the information to the State Chancellor's office. The 13 oversight board appointees should participate in one-time training and ongoing staff support. PEI will provide supplemental ongoing staff to support the district appointments.

OVERVIEW

The STEM Transfer Services Coordinator is responsible for the development, coordination, implementation and evaluation of support services for STEM students.

ANALYSIS

It is necessary to develop a job description to meet the needs of the Stem Grant awarded by the U.S. Department of Education.

STEM TRANSFER SERVICES COORDINATOR

Class specifications are intended to present a descriptive list of the range of duties performed by employees in the class. Specifications are <u>not</u> intended to reflect all duties performed within the job; however, any additional duties will be reasonably related to this class.

SUMMARY DESCRIPTION:

Under the general direction of the Project Director, the STEM Transfer Services Coordinator is responsible for the development, coordination, implementation and evaluation of support services for STEM students. The STEM Transfer Services Coordinator will assist students in STEM fields with planning a program of study and navigating the transfer process. The STEM Transfer Services Coordinator coordinates efforts with the college's student services personnel to ensure STEM students' success while attending the College and with support staff at transfer colleges and universities to ensure success of the students upon transfer; assists STEM faculty with coordination of courses across disciplines to ensure transfer readiness and success; and assists the College's articulation officer in securing articulation agreements for STEM courses and programs with four year institutions.

REPRESENTATIVE DUTIES:

The following duties are typical for this classification.

- 1. Develops plans for implementation of student support services for students in STEM programs as identified in the grant in cooperation with the Project Director, STEM faculty, administration and other grant personnel.
- 2. Plans and oversees direct counseling services to STEM students including academic advising, education planning, career planning and transfer preparation.
- 3. Develops and teaches student success and guidance courses directly related to grant activities, including those courses associated with STEM learning communities.
- 4. Works cooperatively with college personnel, including student services faculty and staff, to ensure STEM students receive comprehensive student support services.
- 5. Facilitates communication between faculty and staff in STEM programs at a four-year institution and STEM employers toward the goal of promoting students' transfer to those programs and entry into the workforce.
- 6. Serves as a liaison between the grant and the college's Counseling, EOPS, and Disabled Student Services programs, Transfer Center, Articulation Officer and College Honors Institute.
- 7. Assists STEM faculty and grant personnel in the development, implementation and evaluation of activities for grant-related outreach events targeting elementary, middle and high school students, especially Hispanic and other low-income students, coordinating as needed with other outreach efforts.
- 8. Develops promotional and informational materials regarding educational planning and transfer preparedness across STEM disciplines.

- 9. Develops effective communication processes with STEM students and faculty regarding transfer options and opportunities.
- 10. Works cooperatively with the Research Analyst and the Director of Research and Planning to assess the effect of student support services on retention, persistence, success and transfer rates of STEM students.
- 11. Plans and organizes workshops for current and prospective STEM students regarding student success and transfer preparation in STEM courses and programs.
- 12. Works cooperatively with other grant personnel on efforts to improve transfer rates among students in STEM fields, especially Hispanic and other low-income students.
- 13. Assists the college's articulation officer and STEM Pathways Coordinator with articulation efforts and schedules as they relate to the activities and efforts of the grant.
- 14. Actively participates in meetings of grant personnel and STEM faculty and staff.
- 15. Assists the Project Director rand other grant personnel in assessment of grant activities and makes recommendations for improvement toward the goal of sustaining new practices, strategies and partnerships after the term of the grant.
- 16. Performs other duties as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS:

The following generally describes the knowledge and ability required to enter the job and/or be learned within a short period of time in order to successfully perform the assigned duties.

Knowledge of

California Community College system, including appropriate sections of the Education Code and Title 5, specifically Sections 55250 through 55257.

Theories and practices related to counseling, career development and transfer services; matriculation, articulation and transfer requirements as applied in general academic advising, educational planning, career counseling and personal counseling sessions.

OVERVIEW

Construction change orders may be generated by a number of circumstances. These include changes directed by the District to address contractor or architect recommendations for efficiency, occupant needs, or to improve future building or space usability. California Public Contract Code 20118.4 establishes a guideline that limits construction contract change orders to 10% of the base contract amount.

A construction contract is amended when there is a change in the scope of work due to unforeseen conditions that must be corrected in order for work to proceed. Amendments alter the base contract amount and are not limited to the 10% guideline.

All change orders and amendments are approved following a specific process of review by the construction manager, architect, program/project managers, and District staff. Nonessential changes are rejected and never receive approval. Any changes determined to be essential to the health of the project and of major benefit to the District are approved and implemented.

ANALYSIS

Construction contract amendments and change orders submitted with this board item total \$12,209.00, which is 0.050% of the total Measure M construction contracts of \$24,476,121.45.

The total of all Measure M amendments and change orders, including those submitted this month, increases the Bond Measure M construction contracts by \$1,003,415.49. The new overall Measure M change order percentage is 4.10%. The cost of these changes will be absorbed by bid savings; the construction projects remain within the approved budget.

OVERVIEW

On June 11, 2010, the Board Trustees approved a contract with Citadel Environmental Services for asbestos and hazardous material survey and oversight of removal on the Business Building Renovation project at SBVC.

The asbestos and hazardous survey was completed by Citadel for all areas available without destructive testing, and a licensed contractor (Janus Construction) was hired to abate and remove the asbestos and hazardous materials identified in the survey, which is now 90% complete. During the project demolition, additional asbestos and hazardous materials were discovered which increased costs to Citadel for identification and oversight of removal. Additionally, underground utility work still to be performed is anticipated to uncover further transite and other hazardous materials for identification and oversight of removal. These anticipated costs, in conjunction with costs for the unforeseen asbestos discovered during demolition, will exceed the contract amount for Citadel.

ANALYSIS

State law and District policy requires oversight of asbestos removal by a qualified company such as Citadel, who is currently performing the required services at the Business Building.

The effect of this amendment will be an addition of \$17,450.00 to the Citadel Environmental Services contract, resulting in a revised contract amount of \$145,664.00. This will not increase the length of Citadel's contract.

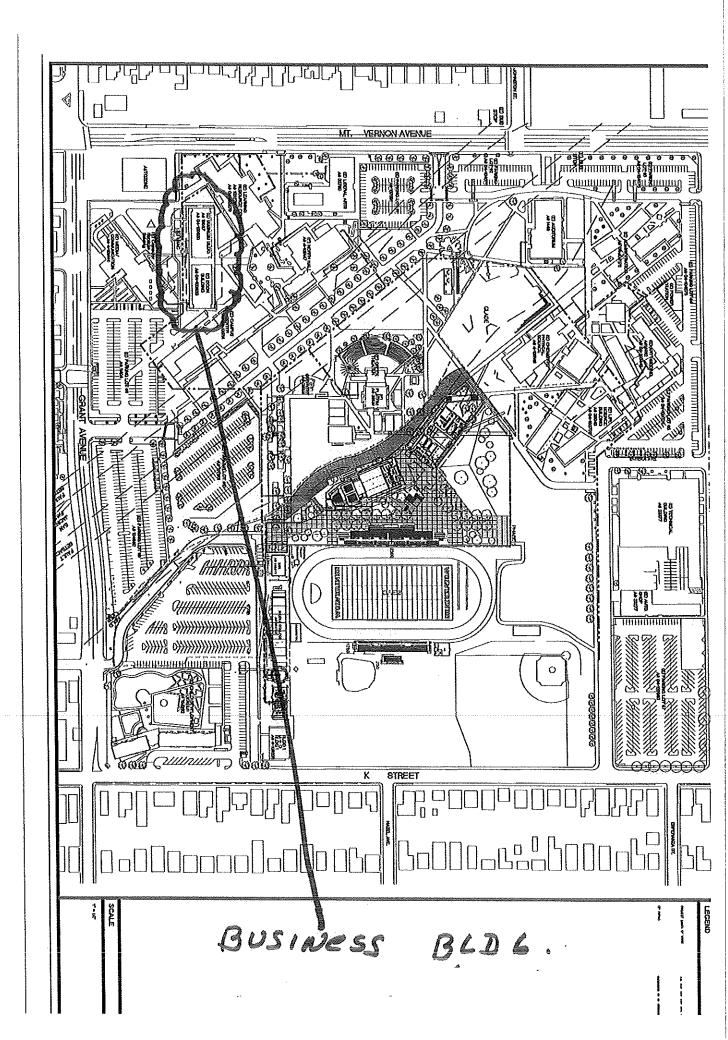

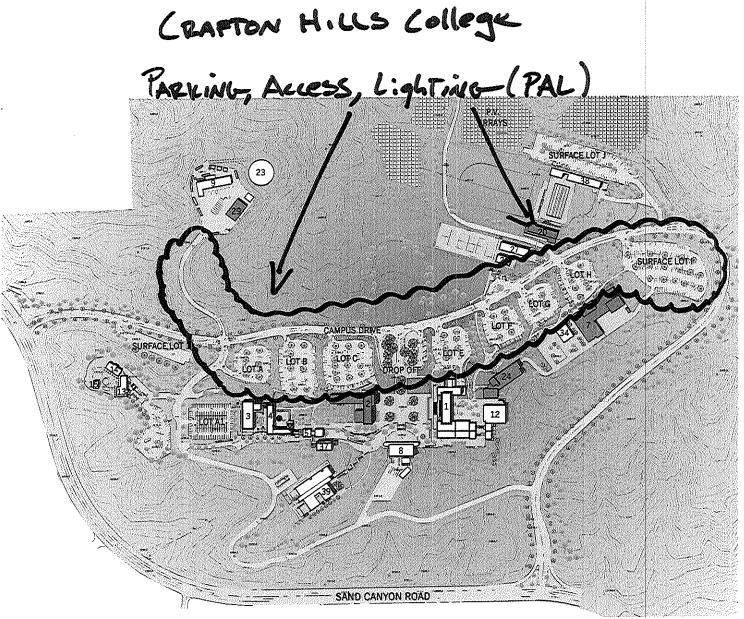

OVERVIEW

In light of budget uncertainty and apportionment deferrals by the State, the District is requesting a Constitutional Advance from the County of San Bernardino's Office of the Auditor/Controller-Recorder in order to meet cash flow projections. The anticipated need is \$10,000,000.

ANALYSIS

This action is necessary in order to guarantee the cash flow needed to conduct the ongoing business of the District. By using the Constitutional Advance offered through the County of San Bernardino, we have access to funds at a lower rate than with other borrowing options open to the District.

As an informational item to the San Bernardino Community College District Board of Trustees, this report is a summary of all construction change orders and amendments to date for projects at Crafton Hills and San Bernardino Valley Colleges, including those on today's Board agenda.

<u>ANALYSIS</u>

Current submitted construction contract amendments and change orders for currently awarded Measure M projects total \$12,209.00 which is 0.050% change of the overall project cost.

The analysis shows that construction contract change orders and amendments for currently awarded Measure M projects have been held to a minimal amount of \$1,003,415.49 which is only 4.10% of the project cost of \$24,476,121.45.

All change orders and amendments are approved following a specific process of review by the construction manager, architect, program/project managers, and District staff. Nonessential changes are rejected and never receive approval. Any changes determined to be essential to the health of the project and of major benefit to the District are approved and implemented.
