SUBJECT: Consideration of Approval of Economic Development and Corporate Training Foundation (EDCT Foundation)

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the Economic Development and Corporate Training Foundation (EDCT Foundation) as an Auxiliary Foundation of the District and delegate authority to the Chancellor or his designee to take the steps necessary to establish the EDCT Foundation.

OVERVIEW

As a self-supporting arm of the District, the Economic Development and Corporate Training (EDCT) Division has been effectively providing customized training for incumbent workers and short-term job training for displaced workers for the past 12 years. By winning competitive state and federal grants, EDCT provides training and retraining services free of cost to the workforce and leads many to employment. EDCT can become even more effective if it can attract grants from private foundations, raise funds, and receive equipment donations to enhance training programs. Many of the private foundations offer grant opportunities primarily for tax-exempt and non-profit organizations. EDCT is hindered by its lack of ability to apply for grants from private foundations and attract donations. These programs are not-for-credit in nature and do not compete with San Bernardino Valley College or Crafton Hills College.

ANALYSIS

By establishing a tax-exempt Foundation, EDCT will become eligible to apply for grants from private foundations and some state and federal grants ear-marked for tax-exempt and non-profit organizations. The Foundation will support EDCT to develop resources and philanthropic support to advance its economic and workforce development mission.

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BYLAWS

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND CORPORATE TRAINING FOUNDATION A California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation

ARTICLE 1. N AME AND OFFICES.

1.01. <u>Name</u>. This Corporation shall be known as the Economic Development and Corporate Training Foundation (hereinafter referred to as the "Corporation").

1.02. <u>Principal Office</u>. The principal office of the Corporation shall be initially located at 114 South Del Rosa Drive, San Bernardino, California 92408. The board of directors of the Corporation (hereinafter referred to as the "Board of Directors") is hereby granted full power and authority to change said principal office from one location to another, within said county, by motion at an open meeting. Any such change of address will be noted by the Secretary in these Bylaws. The fixing or changing of such address shall not be deemed an amendment to these Bylaws.

1.03. Other Offices. Branch or subordinate offices may be established by the Board of Directors at any time and at any place or places.

ARTICLE 2. OBJECTIVES AND PURPOSES.

2.01. <u>Auxiliary Organization</u>. The Corporation has been formed under the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law for charitable purposes and to support the San Bernardino Community College District (the "District") as a recognized "auxiliary organization" as provided in *Education Code* Sections 72670-72682, as such law may be amended from time to time. This corporation shall operate in compliance with District policy and regulations, and with provisions of law pertaining to auxiliary organizations of community college districts, Sections 72670 *et. seq.* of the *Education Code* and Sections 59255 *et. seq.* of Title 5 of the *California Code of Regulations*, as such policies, statutes, and regulations may be amended from time- to-time.

2.02. <u>Specific Purpose</u>. The specific purpose of this corporation is to provide activities which are an integral part of the educational programs of the District's Economic Development and Corporate Training ("EDCT") programs. These activities may include, but are not limited to improving facilities and equipment to benefit program trainees; providing financial assistance to program trainees; developing workshops, conferences, institutes, and other mission related activities; fundraising and alumni activities; gifts, bequests, endowments, and trusts; and public relations.

2.03. <u>Limitations</u>. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall consist of carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate or intervene in any political campaign on behalf of (or in opposition to) any candidate for public office. The Corporation shall not, except to

an insubstantial degree, engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the charitable purposes described in its Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE 3. MEMBERS.

The Corporation shall have no "members" as that term is defined by *California Corporations Code* Section 5056 and shall be governed solely by its Board of Directors in accordance with these Bylaws. Pursuant to *California Corporations Code* Section 5310, any action which would otherwise require approval by a majority of all such members, shall instead require the approval by a majority of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE 4. DIRECTORS.

4.01. <u>Powers</u>. Subject to the limitations stated in the Articles of Incorporation, these Bylaws and the Nonprofit Corporation Law, and subject to the duties of directors as prescribed by the Nonprofit Corporation Law, all corporate powers shall be exercised by or under the direction of, and the business and affairs of the Corporation shall be managed by, the Board of Directors. The individual directors shall act only as members of the Board of Directors, and individually shall have no power to act alone. As an auxiliary foundation of the District, the Corporation shall comply with all applicable Board Policies and Administrative Procedures of the District.

4.02. <u>Number of Directors</u>. The Corporation shall have a Board of Directors composed of seven directors. Directors are collectively to be known as the Board of Directors. These numbers may be changed by a bylaw duly adopted amending this section.

4.03. <u>Selection, Tenure of Office, and Vacancies</u>. Each director shall hold office for a term of three years and until his or her successor is appointed and qualified, except for the initial directors of the Corporation. At the first regular meeting of the Board of Directors, the directors shall be divided by lot into three classes, to consist of approximately two members each and whose terms shall begin on the date of such meeting. The members of the first, second, and third classes shall hold office for a term of one, two, and three years, respectively, and until their successors are appointed and qualified. At the first meeting following the expiration of the term of a director, the Board shall proceed to fill the vacancy. The affirmative vote of a majority of the total membership of the Board of Directors shall be necessary to appoint a director.

4.04. <u>Vacancies</u>. Vacancies in the Board of Directors occurring other than by expiration of term shall be filled by appointment by the remaining directors in the same manner as the appointment of directors is made at expiration of the term of a director. Such vacancies may be filled at any regular meeting of the Board of Directors or at any special meeting called for that purpose and a director elected shall hold office for the unexpired term of the director whom he or she succeeds.

4.05. <u>District's Board of Trustee's Appointment of One Director</u>.</u> Notwithstanding the provisions of Sections 4.03 and 4.04 of these Bylaws, *supra*, the District's Board of Trustees shall appoint one of the Trustees to the Corporation's Board of Directors. The term of the Director appointed by the District's Board of Trustees shall be one year.

4.06. <u>Chair and Vice-Chair of the Board of Directors</u>. The Board of Directors shall annually elect a Chair and a Vice-Chair from among the directors. The Chair of the Board of Directors shall, if present, preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors and exercise and perform such other powers and duties as may be, from time-to-time, assigned to the Chair of the Board of Directors or prescribed by these Bylaws. The Vice-Chair shall preside at any meeting of the Board of Directors in the absence of the Chair.

4.07. <u>Compensation</u>. Directors shall serve without compensation, but may be reimbursed for the cost of travel to conferences or other activities related to the Corporation, subject to compliance with applicable Board Policies and Administrative Procedures of the District.

4.08. <u>Restriction on Interested Directors</u>. Not more than forty-nine percent of the persons serving on the Board at any time may be interested persons. An interested person is (a) any person compensated by the Corporation for services rendered to it other than those performed as a Director within the previous twelve months, whether as a full-time or part-time employee, independent contractor, or otherwise; (b) any shareholder, employee or officer of any corporation, or partner or employee of any partnership, which has rendered compensated services to the Corporation within the previous twelve months; and (c) any brother, sister, ancestor, descendant, spouse, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, mother-in-law, or father-in-law of any person described in (a) or (b) hereof. Any violation of the provisions of this paragraph shall not, however, affect the validity or enforceability of any transaction entered into by the Corporation.

4.09. <u>Nonliability for Debts</u>. The private property of the Directors shall be exempt from execution or other liability for any debts, liabilities or obligations of the Corporation, and no Director shall be liable or responsible for any debts, liabilities or obligations of the Corporation.

4.10. Indemnity by Corporation for Litigation Expenses of Officers and Directors. To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Corporation shall indemnify any present or former director, officer, employee or other "agent" of the corporation, as that term is defined in *California Corporations Code* Section 5238, against all expenses, judgments, fines, settlements, and other amounts actually and reasonably incurred by them in connection with any "proceeding," as that term is used in *California Corporations Code* Section 5238, and including an action by or in the right of the Corporation, by reason of the fact that the person is or was a person described in *California Corporations Code* Section 5238. "Expenses," as used in this bylaw, shall have the same meaning as in *California Corporations Code* Section 5238 (a). Expenses incurred in defending any proceeding may be advanced by the Corporation as authorized in *California Corporations Code* Section 5238 prior to the final disposition of such proceeding, upon receipt of an undertaking by or on behalf of the director or officer

to repay such amount unless it shall be determined ultimately that the director or officer is entitled to be indemnified.

4.11. Insurance. The Corporation shall have the right to purchase and maintain insurance to the full extent permitted by law on behalf of its officers, directors, employees, and other agents, against any liability asserted against or incurred by any officer, director, employee, or agent in such capacity or arising out of the officer's, director's, employee's or agent's status as such. The Corporation shall obtain liability insurance or the equivalent of insurance which covers the directors and officers issued either in the form of a general liability policy or a director's and officer's liability policy consistent with the requirements of *California Corporations Code* Section 5239.

ARTICLE 5. MEETINGS.

5.01. <u>Ralph M. Brown Act</u>. All meetings of the Board of Directors, including, without limitation, regular, adjourned regular, special, and adjourned special meetings shall be called, noticed, held and conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Ralph M. Brown Act (commencing with the *California Government Code*, Section 54950), or any successor legislation hereinafter enacted ("Brown Act").

5.02. <u>Regular Meetings</u>. The Board of Directors shall hold at least one business meeting every quarter, pursuant to *Education Code* Section 72674.

5.03. <u>Telephonic Meetings</u>. Subject to the provisions of the Brown Act governing teleconferencing, members of the Board of Directors may participate in a regular or special meeting through use of conference telephone or similar communications equipment, so long as all members participating in such meeting can hear one another.

5.04. Quorum. A majority of the authorized number of directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Every act or decision done or made by a majority of the directors present at a meeting duly held at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board of Directors, unless the Articles, these Bylaws, or the Nonprofit Corporation Law specifically requires a greater number. In the absence of a quorum at any meeting of the Board of Directors, a majority of the directors present may adjourn the meeting as provided in Section 5.05 of these Bylaws.

5.05. <u>Adjournment</u>. Subject to the provisions of the Brown Act governing adjournment, any meeting of the Board of Directors, whether or not a quorum is present, may be adjourned to another time and place by the vote of a majority of the directors present.

5.06. <u>Inspection Rights</u>. Every director shall have the absolute right at any time to inspect, copy and make extracts of, in person or by agent or attorney, all books, records and documents of every kind and to inspect the physical properties of the Corporation.

ARTICLE 6. COMMITTEES.

6.01. <u>Committees of the Board of Directors</u>. Subject to the provisions of the Brown Act, the Board of Directors may create committees.

6.02. <u>Minutes and Reports</u>. Each committee shall keep regular minutes of its proceedings, which shall be filed with the Secretary. All action by any committee shall be reported to the Board of Directors at the next meeting thereof and shall be subject to revision and alteration by the Board of Directors.

6.03. <u>Meetings</u>. Subject to the requirements of the Brown Act, and except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws or by resolution of the Board of Directors, each committee shall adopt its own rules governing the time and place of holding and the method of calling its meetings and the conduct of its proceedings and shall meet as provided by such rules, and it shall also meet at the call of any member of the committee.

6.04. <u>Term of Office of Committee Members</u>. Each committee member shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Directors but not to exceed such committee member's term as a director.

ARTICLE 7. OFFICERS.

7.01. <u>Officers</u>. The officers of the Corporation shall be an Executive Director, a Chief Financial Officer who shall hold title of Treasurer, a Secretary, and such other officers as the Board of Directors may appoint in accordance with the provisions of Section 7.03 of these Bylaws. These officers may be employees of the District and may be eligible for reassigned time from their usual District assignments to fulfill their responsibilities to the Corporation, and they will receive no additional compensation for their work for the Corporation. At such time as the Corporation determines the need for full-time staff, the recruitment will be conducted following the processes of the District's Office of Human Resources.

7.02. <u>Appointment of Officers</u>. The officers of the Corporation, except for such officers as may be appointed in accordance with the provisions of Section 7.03 of this Article, shall be appointed by the Board of Directors to one year terms pursuant to an annual election. Notwithstanding the above, the appointment of one or more officers may be continued to a regular meeting or special meeting held within six weeks of the one year appointment anniversary, in which case the term of the incumbent officer shall be continued until the new appointment is made.

7.03. <u>Subordinate Officers</u>. The Board of Directors may appoint such other officers as the business of the Corporation may require, each of whom shall hold office for such period, have such authority and perform such duties as are required in these Bylaws or as the Board of Directors may from time-to-time determine.

7.04. <u>Resignation</u>. Any officer may resign at any time by giving written notice to the Corporation, subject to the rights, if any, of the Corporation under any contract to

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which the officer is a party. Any such resignation shall take effect at the date of the receipt of such notice or at any later time specified therein; and, unless otherwise specified therein, the acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective.

7.05. <u>Removal of Officers</u>. Any officer may be removed, either with or without cause, by a majority of the directors then in office at any regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors, or by any officer upon whom such power of removal may be conferred by the Board of Directors.

7.06. <u>Vacancies</u>. A vacancy in any office because of death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or any other cause shall be filled in the manner prescribed in these Bylaws for regular appointments to such office.

7.07. Executive Director. The Executive Director shall be responsible for the day-to-day administration of the Corporation, including the right to employ and discharge all employees and agents of the Corporation and shall have the authorization to sign all contracts, notes, conveyances, and other papers, documents and instruments in writing in the name of the Corporation, except where such matters are prescribed in the Bylaws or by the Board of Directors and shall have such other powers and perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors or by these Bylaws. These duties must be carried with the managerial oversight of the District's Chancellor and following the Board Polices and Administrative Procedures of the District.

7.08. <u>Secretary</u>. The Secretary shall keep, or cause to be kept, a book of minutes in written form of the proceedings of the Board of Directors and committees of the Board of Directors. The Secretary shall give, or cause to be given, notice of all meetings of the Board of Directors required by these Bylaws or by law to be given, and shall cause the seal of the Corporation to be kept in safe custody, and shall have such other powers and perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors or these Bylaws.

7.09. <u>Treasurer.</u> The Treasurer shall keep and maintain, or cause to be kept and maintained, adequate and correct books and records of account in written form or any other form capable of being converted into written form. The Treasurer shall deposit all monies and other valuables in the name and to the credit of the Corporation with such depositaries or depositories as may be designated by the District. The Treasurer shall render to the Chair and directors whenever they request an account of all of the Treasurer's transactions as the Treasurer, and of the financial condition of the Corporation, and shall have such other powers and perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors or by these Bylaws.

ARTICLE 8. BOOKS AND RECORDS.

8.01. <u>Books and Records</u>. The Corporation shall keep adequate and correct books and records of account and minutes of the proceedings of the Board of Directors

and committees of the Board of Directors. The Corporation is subject to the Richard McKee Transparency Act of 2011, *Education Code* Sections 72690 *et. seq.*

8.02. Form of Records. Minutes shall be kept in written form. Other books and records shall be kept either in written form or in any other form capable of being converted into written form. If any record subject to inspection pursuant to the Nonprofit Corporation Law is not maintained in written form, a request for inspection is not complied with unless and until the Corporation, at its expense, makes such record available in written form.

8.03. <u>Audit.</u> The Corporation shall be a part of the District's annual certified audit performed by the certified public accountant retained by the District, pursuant to *Education Code* Section 72672(a). The Corporation shall submit the audit report to the District's Board of Trustees and to the State Chancellor's Office. The Corporation shall annually publish an audited statement of its financial condition which shall be disseminated as widely as feasible and be available to any person on request. Distribution of the published audited statement of the Corporation's financial condition at a regularly scheduled meeting of the District Board of Trustees shall be deemed compliance with this requirement.

ARTICLE 9. GR ANTS, CONTRACTS, LOANS, ETC.

9.01. <u>Grants</u>. The making of grants and contributions, and otherwise rendering financial assistance for the purposes of the Corporation, may be authorized by the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors may authorize any officer or officers, agent or agents, in the name of and on behalf of the Corporation, to make any such grants, contributions or assistance.

9.02. <u>Deposits</u>. The funds of the Corporation not otherwise employed shall be deposited from time to time to the order of the Corporation in such banks, trust companies or other depositories as approved by the District's Chancellor.

9.03. Conflicts of Interest.

A. Pursuant to the *Education Code* Section 72677, no member of the Board of Directors shall be financially interested in any contract or other transaction entered into by the Board of Directors, except as provided in Section 72678 of the *Education Code*. Specifically, such contract is permissible under Section 72678 of the *Education Code* if the fact of such financial interest is disclosed or known to the Board of Directors and noted in the minutes; the Board of Directors thereafter authorizes, approves, or ratifies the contract or transaction in good faith without counting the vote or votes of such financially interested member or members; and the contract or transaction is just and reasonable.

B. Nevertheless, pursuant to the *Education Code* Section 72679, no contract or transaction shall be permitted if any of the following conditions exist: (i) the contract or transaction is between the Corporation and a member of the Board of

Directors; (ii) the contract or transaction is between the Corporation and a partnership or unincorporated association of which any member of the Board of Directors is a partner or in which he or she is the owner or holder, directly or indirectly, of a proprietorship interest; (iii) the contract or transaction is between the Corporation and a corporation in which any member of the Board of Directors is the owner or holder, directly or indirectly, of five percent or more of the outstanding common stock; or (iv) a member of the Board of Directors is interested in a contract or transaction, and without first disclosing such interest to the Board of Directors at a public meeting of the Board, influences or attempts to influence another member or members of the Board to enter into the contract or transaction.

C. Additionally, pursuant to the *Education Code* Section 72680, no member of the Board of Directors may utilize any information, not a matter of public record, which is received by the person by reason of his or her membership on the Board for personal pecuniary gain, regardless of whether he or she is or is not a member of the Board at the time such gain is realized.

ARTICLE 10. INDEMNIFICATION OF DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS.

10.01. Indemnification by Corporation.

A. For the purposes of this Section 10.01, "agent" means any person who is or was a director, officer, employee or other agent of the Corporation, or is or was serving at the request of the Corporation as a director, officer, employee or agent of another foreign or domestic corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, or other enterprise, or was a director, officer, employee, or agent of a foreign or domestic corporation which was a predecessor corporation of the Corporation or of another enterprise at the request of such predecessor corporation; "proceeding" means any threatened, pending or completed action or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative; and "expenses" includes, without limitation, attorneys' fees.

B. The Corporation shall, to the fullest extent permitted by law, indemnify any person who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any proceeding by reason of the fact that such person is or was an agent of the Corporation, against expenses, judgments, fines, settlements, and other amounts actually and reasonably incurred in connection with such proceeding.

C. In the event entitlement to indemnification is required by law to be based upon a determination by the Board of Directors that the agent has met the standards of conduct prescribed by law, such body shall meet and shall reach a determination on the issue within a reasonable period of time after request for such body to meet is received by the Corporation from the agent.

10.02. <u>Advancing Expenses</u>. The Corporation may advance to each agent the expenses incurred in defending any proceeding referred to in Section 10.01 of these Bylaws prior to the final disposition of such proceeding upon receipt of an undertaking

by or on behalf of the agent to repay such amount unless it shall be determined ultimately that the agent is entitled to be indemnified as authorized in Section 10.01 of these Bylaws.

10.03. <u>Insurance</u>. The Corporation shall have power to purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any agent of the Corporation against any liability asserted against or incurred by the agent in such capacity or arising out of the agent's status as such whether or not the Corporation would have the power to indemnify the agent against such liability under the provisions of this section; provided, however, that the Corporation shall have no power to purchase and maintain such insurance to indemnify any agent of the Corporation for a violation of *California Corporations Code* Section 5233 (relating to self-dealing transactions).

ARTICLE 11. INVESTMENTS.

11.01. Standards, Retention of Property.

A. In investing, reinvesting, purchasing, acquiring, exchanging, selling and managing the Corporation's investments, other than assets held for use or used directly in carrying out a public or charitable program of the Corporation, the Board of Directors shall avoid speculation, looking instead to the permanent disposition of the funds, considering the probable income as well as the probable safety of the Corporation's capital.

B. Unless limited by the Articles, the Corporation may continue to hold property properly acquired or contributed to it if and as long as the Board of Directors, in the exercise of good faith and of reasonable prudence, discretion, and intelligence, may consider that retention is in the best interests of the Corporation. No retention of donated assets violates this Section 11.01, where such retention was required by the donor in the instrument under which the assets were received by the Corporation, except that no such requirement may be effective more than ten years after the death of the donor.

C. No investment violates this Section 11.01 by virtue of the investment's speculative character, where the investment conforms to provisions authorizing such investment contained in the instrument or agreement under which the assets were contributed to the Corporation.

ARTICLE 12. PURPOSES AND OPERATIONS OF THE CORPORATION.

12.01. <u>Purposes</u>. The business of the Corporation is to be operated and conducted in the promotion of its objects and purposes as set forth in Article II of its Articles of Incorporation.

12.02. <u>Dedication of Assets</u>. The income and assets of the Corporation are irrevocably dedicated to charitable purposes and no part of the net income or assets of the organization shall ever inure to the benefit of any Director, Officer, or member thereof or to the benefit of any private person.

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12.03. <u>Dissolution</u>. The Corporation may be dissolved by vote of the Directors, or by the action of the Board of Directors in accordance with the provisions of California law. Upon dissolution of the Corporation, and after payment or provision for payment, of all debts and liabilities, the assets of the Corporation shall be distributed to the District. If for any reason the District is unable or unwilling to accept the assets of the Corporation, such assets will be distributed to the United States government; to a state or local government for public purposes; or to a nonprofit fund, foundation, or corporation which is organized and operated for charitable purposes and which has established its tax-exempt status under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, Section 501(c)(3).

12.04. <u>Merger</u>. The Corporation may merge with other corporations organized solely for nonprofit purposes, qualified and exempt from Federal taxation pursuant to the Internal Revenue Code, Section 501(c)(3) of 1986 and from State taxation, upon compliance with the provisions of California law relating to merger and consolidation.

12.05. <u>Restrictions</u>. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall consist of lobbying, carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

ARTICLE 13. SEAL AND FISCAL YEAR.

13.01. <u>Seal</u>. The Board of Directors may adopt a corporate seal which shall be in the form of a circle and shall bear the full name of the Corporation and the year and state of its incorporation.

13.02. <u>Fiscal Year</u>. The fiscal year of the Corporation shall be July 1 through June 30.

ARTICLE 14. EXEMPT ACTIVITIES.

Notwithstanding any other provision of these Bylaws, no Director, officer, employee or agent of the Corporation shall take any action or carry on any activity by or on behalf of the Corporation not permitted to be carried on by an organization exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(3) of the Internal Revenue Code or by an organization to which contributions are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code.

ARTICLE 15. AMENDMENTS.

New Bylaws may be adopted or these Bylaws may be amended or repealed by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Board of Directors or by the written consent thereof, except as otherwise provided by law or by the Articles. Notwithstanding the foregoing, amendment of these Bylaws shall require the approval of a majority of the authorized number of directors.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND CORPORATE TRAINING FOUNDATION

1.

The name of the corporation is Economic Development and Corporate Training Foundation.

П.

A. This corporation is a nonprofit public benefit corporation and is not organized for the private gain of any person. It is organized under the Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law for public and charitable purposes.

B. This corporation is created to support the San Bernardino Community College District (the "District") as a recognized "auxiliary organization" as provided in the *California Education Code* Sections 72670-72682, as such law may be amended from time to time. This corporation shall operate in compliance with District policy and regulations, and with provisions of law pertaining to auxiliary organizations of community college districts, Sections 72670 et. seq. of the *California Education Code* and Sections 59255 *et. seq.* of Title 5 of the *California Code of Regulations*, as such policies, statutes, and regulations may be amended from time-to-time.

C. The specific purpose of this corporation is to provide activities which are an integral part of the educational programs of the District and to develop and operate services and programs, including those related to (a) the District's Economic Development and Corporate Training ("EDCT") programs; (b) District facilities and equipment; (c) loans, scholarships, and grants-in-aids for District students;
(d) workshops, conferences, institutes, and federal projects; (e) alumni activities; (f) gifts, bequests, devises, endowments, and trusts; and (g) public relations.

III.

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A. This corporation is organized exclusively for charitable purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

B. No substantial part of the activities of this corporation shall consist of carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and this corporation shall not participate or intervene in any political campaign (including the publishing or distribution of statements) on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

C. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, this corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (i) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (ii) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

V.

A. The property of this corporation is irrevocably dedicated to charitable purposes and no part of the net earnings or assets of this corporation shall inure to the benefit of (or be distributable to) any director or officer of this corporation or other private person, except that this corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of its charitable purposes.

B. Upon the dissolution or winding up of this corporation, its assets remaining after payment, or provision for payment, of all debts and liabilities of this corporation shall be distributed to the District for charitable purposes. In the alternative, the District may designate a nonprofit fund, foundation or corporation which is organized and operated exclusively for charitable purposes and which has established its tax exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, to receive such assets. In the event that the District does not accept any asset of this corporation on dissolution or designate a recipient, then any such asset shall be distributed to a nonprofit fund, foundation or corporation which is organized and operated exclusively for charitable purposes and which has established its tax exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding a recipient, then any such asset shall be distributed to a nonprofit fund, foundation or corporation which is organized and operated exclusively for charitable purposes and which has established its tax exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

She brought together local, state, and national government officials and entities with professional businesses and local residents, by helping them to establish communication for working relationships and creating mutually beneficial partnerships that would establish education, economic and business development achievements at the local level.

Frank Reyes, Executive Director, Arrowhead Regional Medical Center Foundation

Frank Reyes is the Executive Director of the Arrowhead Regional Medical Center Foundation. Prior to joining the ARMC Foundation, he served as the Executive Director of Governmental Affairs for the San Bernardino Community College District. Under his leadership, the District and its two campuses received more than \$100 million in grants. Reyes' expertise centers on his extensive knowledge of federal grants procedures and ability to identify potential funding sources. He has earned many distinguished awards, including selection to the prestigious International Conference for Leaders in Madrid, Spain. His goal continues to be to bring more funding to the area for the benefit of the community, its students, its patients and those in need. Reyes is a graduate of California State University at San Bernardino, where he received his bachelor's and master's degrees.

Master Agreement for Economic Development and Corporate Training Foundation

1. <u>**Parties.**</u> This Master Agreement ("Agreement") is between the San Bernardino Community College District ("District"), through its Board of Trustees, on the one hand, and the Economic Development and Corporate Training Foundation ("Foundation"), through its Board of Directors, on the other hand. The District and the Foundation are referred to herein as "Party" and collectively as "Parties."

2. Legal Authority. This Agreement is made pursuant to Section 59257 of Title 5 of the *California Code of Regulations* and Section 72670 of the *Education Code*.

3. <u>**Term.**</u> This Agreement will commence upon its approval by both of the Parties, and will terminate on June 30, 2016, unless extended by mutual consent of the Parties.

4. **District's Recognition of Foundation.** By approving this Agreement, the District's Board of Trustees hereby affirms its recognition of the Foundation as an auxiliary organization of the District within the meaning of Section 72670(e) of the *Education Code*.

5. **Functions and Purpose of Foundation.** The Parties agree and understand that the functions to be undertaken by the Foundation are for the sole purpose of providing activities which are an integral part of the educational programs of the Economic Development and Corporate Training Division of SBCCD. The Parties further agree and understand that the functions undertaken by the Foundation are more effectively and efficiently performed by the Foundation than by the District, pursuant to Section 59257(j)(2) of Title 5 of the *California Code of Regulations*.

6. <u>Services and Programs.</u> In furtherance of the Foundation's purpose, the Foundation may develop and operate services and programs related to the Economic Development and Corporate Training mission including soliciting funds and equipment to benefit program trainees; providing financial assistance to program trainees; developing workshops, conferences, institutes, and other activities related to the Foundation's mission; fundraising and alumni activities; gifts, bequests, endowments, and trusts; and public relations.

7. <u>Gifts.</u> The Foundation may not accept any grant, contract, bequest, trust, or gift unless it is so conditioned that it may be used only for purposes consistent with this Agreement, District policy and regulations, and law.

8. **Legal Compliance.** The Foundation agrees to operate in compliance with District policy and regulations, and with provisions of law pertaining to auxiliary organizations of community college districts, Sections 72670 *et. seq.* of the *Education Code* and Sections 59255 *et. seq.* of Title 5 of the *California Code of Regulations*.

9. **Board of Directors.** The Foundation shall have a Board of Directors composed, both as to size and categories of membership, in accordance with policy or regulations established by the District's Board of Trustees. The Foundation's Board of Directors shall hold at least one business meeting every quarter, pursuant to Section 72674 of the *Education Code*. The Board of Directors shall have the benefit of the advice and counsel of at least one attorney admitted to practice law in California, and at least one licensed certified public accountant.

Neither the attorney nor the certified public accountant need be members of the Foundation's Board of Directors. The Foundation's Board of Directors, and all standing committees of the Foundation, shall be subject to the Ralph M. Brown Act.

10. Audit. The Foundation, working with the District Chancellor, shall select a certified public accountant, and shall contract for an annual audit performed by the certified public accountant, pursuant to Section 72672(a) of the *Education Code*. The Foundation shall submit the audit report to the District's Board of Trustees and to the State Chancellor's Office. The Foundation annually shall publish an audited statement of its financial condition which shall be disseminated as widely as feasible and be available to any person on request. Distribution of the published audited statement of the Foundation's financial condition at a regularly scheduled meeting of the District's Board of Trustees shall be deemed compliance with this requirement. Also, the District's Board of Trustees shall insure that an annual audit is conducted on the Foundation, and that the audit report is submitted to the State Chancellor's Office, pursuant to Section 72672(a) of the *Education Code* and Section 59265(a) of Title 5 of the *California Code of Regulations*. The Foundation may rely on the audit contracted for by the District.

11. **Foundation Expenditures.** The Foundation's Board of Directors, at a duly noticed meeting, shall approve or ratify all expenditures of the Foundation. The District's Chancellor or designee shall be responsible for ascertaining that all Foundation expenditures are in accordance with this Agreement, District policy and regulations, and law.

12. **Employees.** If District employees provide services to the Foundation, on either a full-time or part-time basis, then, pursuant to Section 59257(j)(6) of Title 5 of the *California Code of Regulations*, the Foundation shall reimburse the District in full for the District's personnel costs. No more than 50% of the Foundation's reimbursement to the District; such non-monetary benefits that the Foundation provides to the District. The Foundation may provide monetary benefits to the District either directly, or indirectly. Non-monetary benefits that the Foundation provides to the District benefits such as developing good will towards the District or increased community awareness of District programs.

13. **<u>Recordkeeping</u>**. The Foundation shall be responsible for maintaining adequate records.

14. **Transfer of District Funds.** Pursuant to Section 59257(i) of Title 5 of the *California Code of Regulations*, the District shall not transfer any of its funds or resources, other than funds or resources derived from gifts or bequests, to the Foundation, when the purpose of such transfer is either to avoid laws or regulations which constrain community college districts or to provide the District with an unfair advantage with respect to the application of any state funding mechanism.

15. **Foundation's Use of District Facilities to be Determined.** The District hereby grants to the Foundation permission to use District facilities for the purpose of conducting business of the Foundation. Pursuant to Section 59257(j)(5) of Title 5 of the *California Code of Regulations*, and in consideration of the value that the Foundation provides to the District, the

Foundation shall pay to the District a nominal monthly fee of \$25, payable on an annual basis, for use of these Facilities and to cover operating expenses. The Foundation shall have the right to place and attach fixtures, signs, and equipment at these Facilities, as authorized in writing by the District's Chancellor or designee. Such fixtures, signs, and equipment shall be and remain the property of the Foundation, and shall be removed by the Foundation upon termination or expiration of this Agreement. The Foundation shall be liable for any costs incurred by the District in returning the Facilities to its original condition, upon termination or expiration of this Agreement. The District, and its agents and employees, have a right to enter these Facilities at any time. The District reserves the right to terminate the Foundation's use of the Facilities, or any portion thereof, if needed for another District purpose.

16. <u>Indirect Costs and Operating Expenses</u>. Pursuant to Sections 59257(j)(7) and 59257(j)(8) of Title 5 of the *California Code of Regulations*, the Foundation shall be liable for all indirect costs relating to federally-sponsored programs that it administers, and for maintenance and payment of the Foundation's operating expenses, unless otherwise agreed to by the District.

17. **Foundation's Funds.** The Foundation may expend funds on an annual basis for public relations and other purposes which serve to augment District appropriations for the operation of the District, as approved by the Foundation's Board of Directors. The District's Board of Trustees shall name a designee who shall file with the District's Board of Trustees a statement of the Foundation's policies on the accumulation and use of public relations funds. Pursuant to Section 59257(j)(9) of Title 5 of the *California Code of Regulations*, this statement also will include the Foundation's policies and procedure on solicitation of funds, source of funds, amounts, purposes for which the funds will be used, allowable expenditures, and procedures of control.

18. **Foundation's Policies.** The Foundation's Board of Directors shall ensure that the Foundation has adopted policies pertaining to ethics, conflicts of interest, roles of directors, committees, mission statement, gift-acceptance, and whistle-blowing. The Foundation shall review these policies, and shall submit these policies to the District's Board of Trustees, on a biannual basis.

19. **Foundation's Bylaws and Articles of Incorporation.** At least on a biannual basis, the Foundation's Board of Directors shall review its Bylaws and Articles of Incorporation to ensure compliance with law, District policies and regulations, and this Agreement. Any amendments or revisions to the Bylaws or Articles of Incorporation shall be reported to the District's Board of Trustees.

20. <u>Contracts.</u> The Foundation shall not enter into any contract that would obligate use of District funds or facilities without prior written approval of the District's Chancellor.

21. <u>**Real Property.**</u> The Foundation shall not accept any gift or bequest of real property without the prior approval of the District's Board of Trustees.

22. Conflict of Interest Prohibited.

(a) Pursuant to Section 72677 of the *Education Code*, no member of the Foundation's Board of Directors shall be financially interested in any contract or other

transaction entered into by the Board of Directors, except as provided in Section 72678 of the *Education Code*. Specifically, such contract is permissible under Section 72678 of the *Education Code* if the fact of such financial interest is disclosed or known to the Board of Directors and noted in the minutes; the Board of Directors thereafter authorizes, approves, or ratifies the contract or transaction in good faith without counting the vote or votes of such financially interested member or members; and the contract or transaction is just and reasonable.

(b) Nevertheless, pursuant to Section 72679 of the *Education Code*, no contract or transaction shall be permitted if any of the following conditions exist: (i) the contract or transaction is between the Foundation and a member of the Foundation's Board of Directors; (ii) the contract or transaction is between the Foundation's Board of Directors is a partner or in which he or she is the owner or holder, directly or indirectly, of a proprietorship interest; (iii) the contract or transaction is between the Foundation and a corporation in which any member of the Foundation and a corporation in which any member of the Foundation and a corporation in which any member of the Foundation and a corporation in which any member of the Foundation's Board of Directors is the owner or holder, directly or indirectly or indirectly, of five percent or more of the outstanding common stock; or (iv) a member of the Foundation's Board of Directors is interested in a contract or transaction, and without first disclosing such interest to the Foundation's Board of Directors at a public meeting of the Board, influences or attempts to influence another member or members of the Board to enter into the contract or transaction.

(c) Additionally, pursuant to Section 72680 of the *Education Code*, no member of the Foundation's Board of Directors may utilize any information, not a matter of public record, which is received by the person by reason of his or her membership on the Board for personal pecuniary gain, regardless of whether he or she is or is not a member of the Board at the time such gain is realized.

23. **Insurance.** For its day-to-day activities, the Foundation shall be included within the District's insurance policies. When special events are sponsored by the Foundation, separate insurance coverage may be required by the District.

24. **Indemnification.** The Foundation agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the District, and its trustees, employees, agents, and students, from and against any loss, damage, or liability that may be suffered or incurred by the District, caused by, arising out of, or in any way connected with the Foundation's activities or use of the Facilities, except to the extent caused by the negligence or other wrongdoing of the District. The District agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the Foundation, and its directors, employees, and agents, from and against any loss, damage, or liability that may be suffered or incurred by the Foundation, caused by, arising out of, or in any way connected with the District's activities or use of the Facilities, except to the extent caused by the negligence or other wrongdoing of the District or incurred by the Foundation, caused by, arising out of, or in any way connected with the District's activities or use of the Facilities, except to the extent caused by the negligence or other wrongdoing of the Facilities.

25. <u>Non-Assignability</u>. The Foundation may not assign this Agreement, in whole or in part, without the written consent of the District, with the granting of such consent at the District's sole discretion.

26. <u>Amendment</u>. This Agreement may be amended only by a writing approved by the Foundation's Board of Directors and the District's Board of Trustees.

27. <u>Severability</u>. This Agreement shall be considered severable such that if any provision or part of the Agreement is ever held invalid under any law or ruling, all other provisions or parts shall remain in full force and effect.

VICE PRESIDENT OF STUDENT SERVICES

Class specifications are intended to present a descriptive list of the range of duties performed by employees in the class. Specifications are <u>not</u> intended to reflect all duties performed within the job; however, any additional duties will be reasonably related to this class.

SUMMARY DESCRIPTION

Under the general direction of the President, the Vice President of Student Services manages, supervises, coordinates and provides professional leadership for all student programs and services in the student services area; supervises and evaluates special services and performance of the Division's deans, and implements long-range plans and goals for student services. Coordinates enrollment management (recruitment, outreach, retention) and matriculation efforts in a diverse, student-centered environment.

REPRESENTATIVE DUTIES

The following duties are typical for this classification.

- 1. Provides administrative leadership, direction and supervision to all Student Services program areas.
- 2. Recommends new programs and services as appropriate.
- 3. Provides accountability through quantitative and qualitative data for all Student Services programs and services, including research on student characteristics, needs assessments, and follow-up studies as needed for strategic planning, evaluation, and program review.
- 4. Prepares budget recommendations for all student services programs and diligently manages approved budgets.
- 5. Provides ongoing staff development.
- 6. Assumes administrative responsibility for Matriculation including student assessment, orientation and ongoing academic advisement for student academic planning.
- 7. Maintains relations and articulation agreements as appropriate with elementary, middle, and high schools, other colleges, and the community.
- 8. Works with instructional administrators and faculty in a student-centered learning environment, developing strong collaborative relationships toward the common goal of student development/student success.
- 9. Promotes student equity, Title IX compliance and compliance with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, and works to achieve diversity in accordance with District policy.
- 10. Assists faculty in resolving student problems which block the learning process.
- 11. Develops an out-of-class/campus life environment conducive to student learning, student achievement and mutual respect among the diverse college community.
- 12. Chairs regular meetings of the Student Services administrative staff.
- 13. Provides assistance to the College President in conducting and presenting administrative studies and annual budget preparation.
- 14. Assists students in crisis situations.
- 15. Implements policies related to Student's Rights and Regulations.
- 16. Initiates disciplinary actions and coordinates disciplinary grievance hearings as appropriate.

- 17. Works closely with MIS staff to assess technological capabilities to improve access and efficiency in providing quality support services to students on-and-off site
- 18. Coordinates the provision of support services as it applies to Distributed Education, Workforce Training, and non-traditional approaches to higher education.
- 19. Works closely with faculty and staff in the integration of outreach and retention strategies and in support of a student-centered learning environment.
- 20. Anticipates, prevents and resolves difficult and sensitive inquiries, conflicts and complaints.
- 21. Performs other duties as assigned by the President

OVERVIEW

Construction change orders may be generated by a number of circumstances. These include changes directed by the District to address contractor or architect recommendations for efficiency, occupant needs, or to improve future building or space usability. California Public Contract Code 20118.4 establishes a guideline that limits construction contract change orders to 10% of the base contract amount.

A construction contract is amended when there is a change in the scope of work due to unforeseen conditions that must be corrected in order for work to proceed. Amendments alter the base contract amount and are not limited to the 10% guideline.

All change orders and amendments are approved following a specific process of review by the construction manager, architect, program/project managers, and District staff. Nonessential changes are rejected and never receive approval. Any changes determined to be essential to the health of the project and of major benefit to the District are approved and implemented.

ANALYSIS

Construction contract amendments and change orders submitted with this board item total \$492.89 which is 0.001% of the total Measure M construction contracts of \$49,747,164.45.

The total of all Measure M amendments and change orders, including those submitted at this board meeting, increases the Bond Measure M construction contracts by \$1,963,389.14. The new overall Measure M change order percentage is 3.95%. The cost of these changes will be absorbed by bid savings; the construction projects remain within the approved budget.

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve this clarification of language for the award of contract to Woodcliff Corporation for the Auditorium Renovation project at San Bernardino Valley College. The original contract amount, approved by the Board on July 11, 2013, as set forth in the contract is \$6,800,000.00. Additionally, the express contract language, already approved by the Board of Trustees on July 11, 2013, has delegated authority to the Vice Chancellor for Fiscal Services to approve change orders to the contract up to and including an amount of 10% of the original contract amount. As such, the total approved amount, by virtue of the Board's prior approval, is up to but not exceeding, \$7,480,000.00 (original contract amount \$6,800,000.00 plus 10% (i.e., \$680,000.00) in change orders, if needed and approved by the Vice Chancellor of Fiscal Services).

OVERVIEW

The contract to Woodcliff for the Auditorium Building renovation contains language delegating the Board's authority to approve change orders to the Vice Chancellor for Fiscal Services. This is the first contract to do so. The language is as follows:

Notice Inviting Bids - Section 00 10 00

DISTRICT'S VICE CHANCELLOR – DELEGATED BOARD AUTHORITY TO INCREASE AND DECREASE CONTRACT TIME AND CONTRACT PRICE:

The DISTRICT'S Governing Board has delegated authority to the DISTRICT'S Vice Chancellor for Fiscal Services to execute change orders, partial change orders, Construction Directives, and compromises which may increase and/or decrease the Contract Price and/or may increase and/or decrease the Contract Time for this Project. As such, the Vice Chancellor for Fiscal Services' signature on a change order, partial change order, Construction Directive, and/or compromise is sufficient to bind the DISTRICT provided that the increased and/or decreased costs of individual changes do not exceed the amount specified in the applicable California Public Contract Code Sections 20118.4, 20651, 20655, 22032(a), as revised in accordance with Section 22020, if applicable, or ten percent (10%) of the original contract price, whichever is greater. See the General Conditions for more specific information regarding the level of the Vice Chancellor for Fiscal Services authority.

Approval means written authorization through action of the governing board. However, the DISTRICT'S Governing Board has delegated authority to the DISTRICT'S Vice Chancellor for Fiscal Services to execute change orders, partial change orders, and Construction Directives which increase and/or decrease the Contract Price and/or increase and/or decrease the Contract Time for this Project. As such, the Vice Chancellor for Fiscal Services' signature on a change order, partial change order, and Construction Directive is sufficient to bind the DISTRICT provided that the Vice Chancellor for Fiscal Services' delegated authority is limited to approving increased and/or decreased costs of individual changes that do not exceed the amount specified in the applicable California Public Contract Code Sections 20118.4, 20651, 20655, 22032(a), as revised in accordance with Section 22020, if applicable, or ten percent (10%) of the original contract price, whichever is greater.

ANALYSIS

At its February 14, 2013 meeting, item 2.C., the Board delegated its authority to the Vice Chancellor of Fiscal Services to approve change orders as stated in the contract in an effort to meet its responsibility to pay contractors promptly and to avoid the risks of delay created by having a process and/or procedure that requires every change order to be processed by the Board itself. As such, the language inserted into the contract is for these purposes. The recommendation set forth above is simply to clarify that this delegation is applicable to the contract and that the amount of the contract awarded can be increased by \$680,000.00 without additional Board action as the stated amount represents the limit of the Vice Chancellor's authority for this contract as previously delegated and approved by the Board.

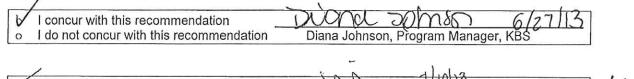

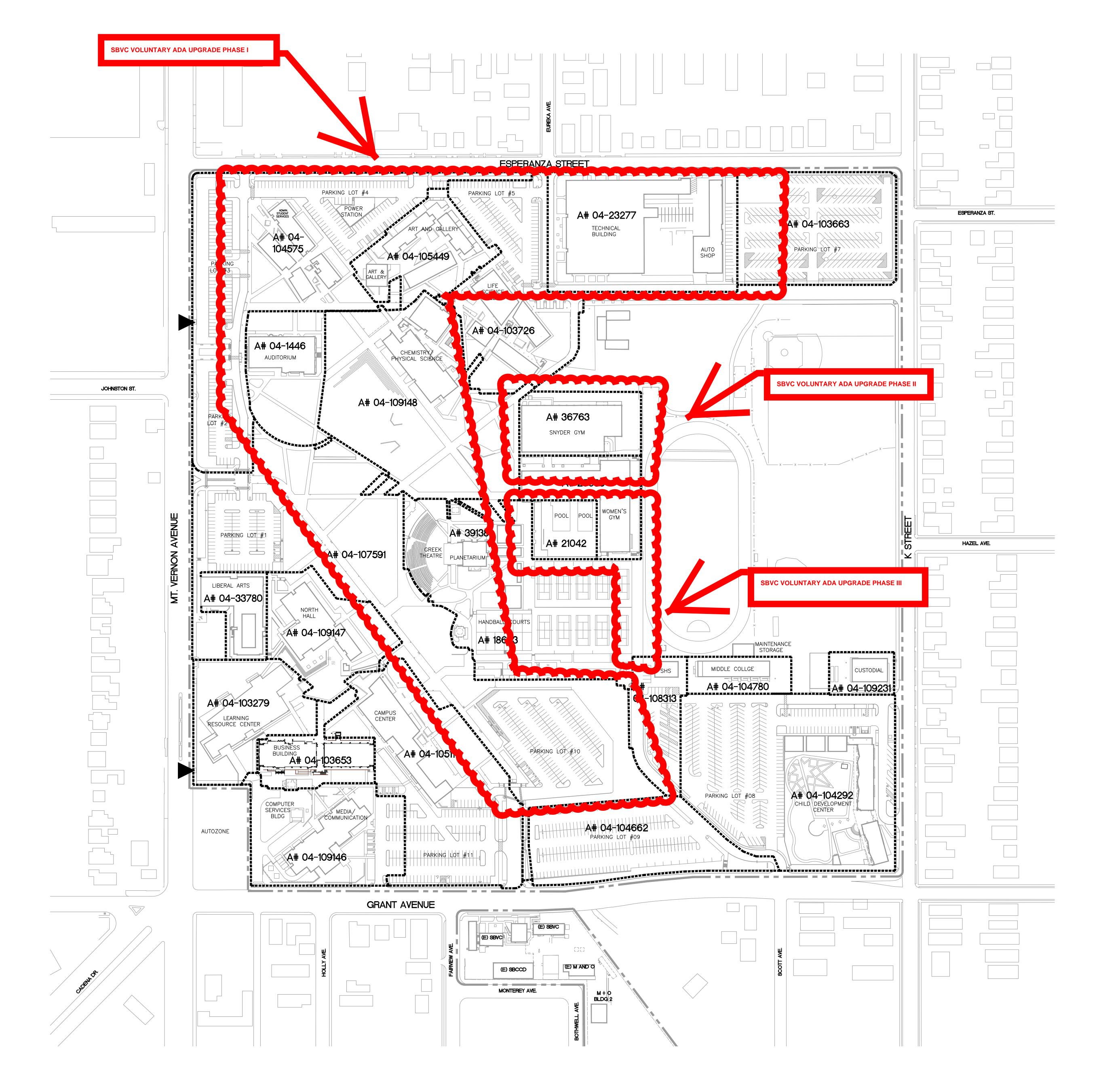

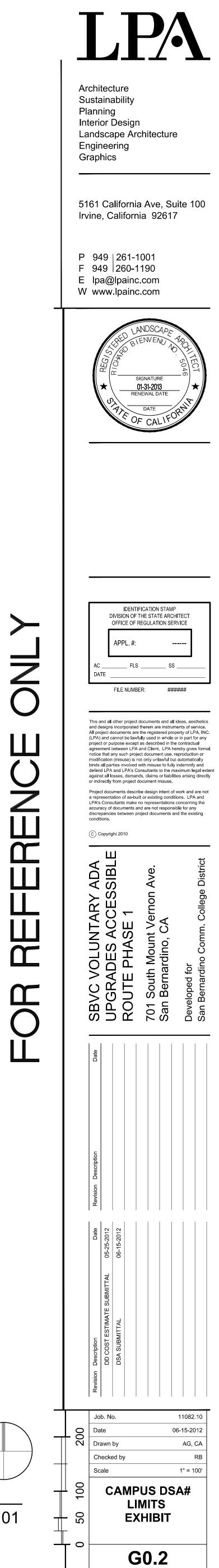

The CHC Circuit A project bid on February 22, 2013, prior to the start of programming for the SSA Renovation Project. Currently, the design progress for the SSA Renovation has reached the 100% DD phase and has identified the scope of electrical renovation needed. P2S, the Engineer of Record on both the Circuit A and SSA project has recommended a partial redesign of the scope of work for SSA on the Circuit A project that will accommodating the future needs of the SSA while providing a savings to the Campus for deletion of scope. The added scope of a transformer will unclutter the electrical room now and make the future SSA renovation more efficient. The redesign will reuse an existing air switch at SSA in the PAC, as well as eliminate the new Circuit A feed into SSA for an estimated overall savings of \$5,000.00.

RECOMMENDATION:

Kitchell/BRj/Seville recommends that SBCCD grant approval to amend P2S's contract in the amount of \$2,000.00.

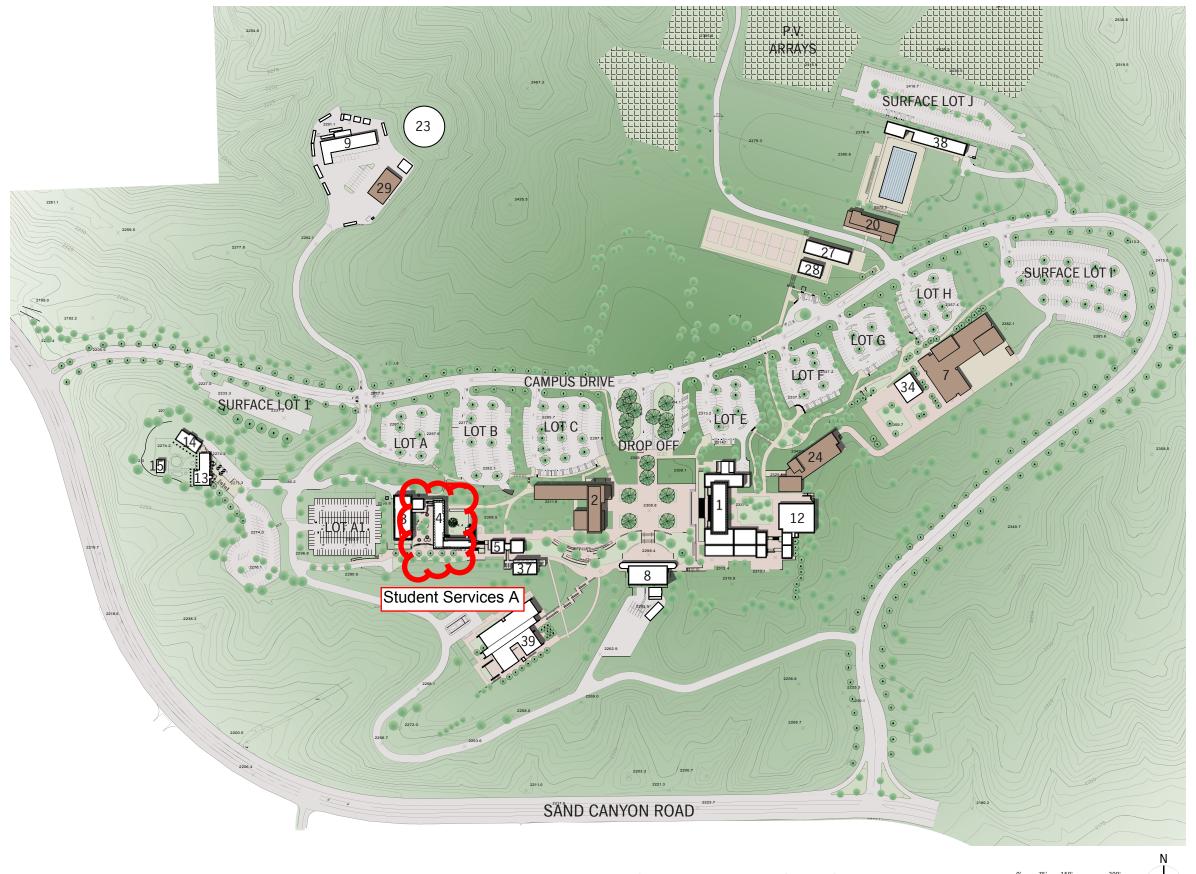

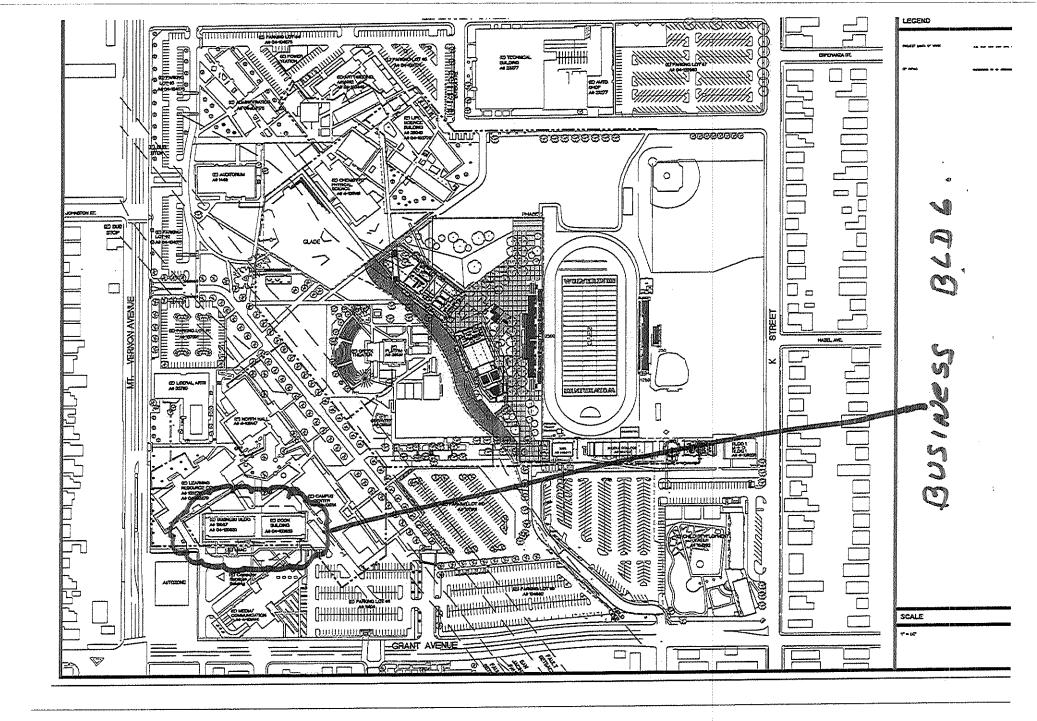

As an informational item to the San Bernardino Community College District Board of Trustees, this report is a summary of all construction change orders and amendments to date for projects at Crafton Hills and San Bernardino Valley Colleges, including those on today's Board agenda.

ANALYSIS

Current submitted construction contract amendments and change orders for currently awarded Measure M projects total \$492.89 which is 0.001% change of the overall project cost.

The analysis shows that construction contract change orders and amendments for currently awarded Measure M projects have been held to a minimal amount of \$1,963,389.14 which is only 3.96% of the project cost of \$49,747,164.45.

All change orders and amendments are approved following a specific process of review by the construction manager, architect, program/project managers, and District staff. OVERVIEW

This summary budget report is submitted monthly to the Board of Trustees for its review.

ANALYSIS

The attached Revenue and Expenditure Summary reflects activity for the 2013-14 fiscal year through July 24, 2013. It reflects summary information for all District funds, grouped by category within each fund.

As of July 24, the District was 6.6% through the fiscal year and had spent and encumbered about 8.1% of its budgeted general funds. While the percent spent and encumbered is slightly higher than the percent through the fiscal year, this can be attributed to the need to establish open purchase orders at the start of the fiscal year which will be used throughout the entire fiscal year. Please note that the 2014 budget is still tentative.
