





In March 2018, the SBVC Foundation was approached by SBCCD to support Measure CC. A review of the Foundation by-laws revealed language prohibiting activity related to "any cause or measure" on the ballot. Discussions in Foundation Board meetings focused on nonprofit law, IRS regulations, the purpose of the bond, and the mission and vision of the SBVC Foundation.

On June 13, 2018, the Foundation approved revised by-laws. In October 2018, the Foundation used some if its unrestricted investment income from FY 2017-18 to donate \$2,000 in support of Measure CC. The Foundation saw Measure CC as consistent with 3 of its goals:

- 1. Function as a committed fundraising organization.
- 5. Contribute to the safety, comfort, beauty of the campus.
- 7. Function as informed, responsible, active members of society.





San Bernardino Valley College Foundation Named "2018 Volunteer Group of the Year"


