1. Eliminate Barriers to Student Access and Success

Last Week (6/2 – 6/7), POA representation was fortunate to attend the NABITA/ATIXA Conference in Denver, CO alongside members of SBVC Student Conduct, Basic Needs, and Student Health Services to receive training in Mental Health Evaluation. Information learned from the conference will be disseminated to the rest of the Department and will be used to more effectively evaluate Violence Risk and Threat Assessment. Information was also gathered to better understand and evaluate suicidal subjects. We hope to use this information to improve our Police Interviews and increase safety among our campus communities.

NOTEWORTHY ACCOMPLISHMENTS/ACTIVITIES:

It is with a heavy heart that the POA bids farewell to the Chief of the SBCCDPD, Chief Alvin Jackson. Chief Jackson took Office in December 2017, when the Department was in a period of transition.
