Tatiana Vasquez and Dr. Thomas Lechuga have been serving as Mentors for a National Science Foundation (NSF) grant led by the Biology Majors Faculty at College of the Canyons. This NSF grant aims to enhance community college student involvement in undergraduate research, with the goal of educating the community to support native bee species and mitigate species decline. The grant funds paid internships for SBVC students through 2028 to research native bee biodiversity in our campus Botanical Gardens. This summer, our students, Ashley Durkin and Xareni Amezcua, presented their findings at a Zoom Undergraduate Research Symposium.
