## **ACTIONS and/or UPDATES RELATED TO GOALS:**

- 1. Eliminate Barriers to Student Access and Success
  - a. Last Senate meeting reported that Crafton Hills College Library will host "Lawyers in the Library," which has predominantly occurred in public libraries, so we are the first community college to provide legal services free of charge to our students.
- 2. Be a Diverse, Equitable Inclusive, and Anti-Racist Institution
  - a. The Student Equity and Achievement Committee brought the Equity Plan to the last Academic Senate of last semester for feedback. It is noted we are recognized as state leaders with acknowledgment to the Student Equity and Achievement committee. Congratulations to all faculty who have participated in the USC Race and Equity cohorts with the goal of providing equity-minded practices and student-centered language in syllabi and teaching practices.
- 3. Be a Leader and Partner in Addressing Regional Issues
  - a. The Senate Executive Team attended the statewide Academic Senate Plenary. We will be reviewing the upcoming resolutions that passed at our next meeting on Wednesday, September 17, 2:30-4pm at Crafton Hills College, where we will be prioritizing and localizing.
