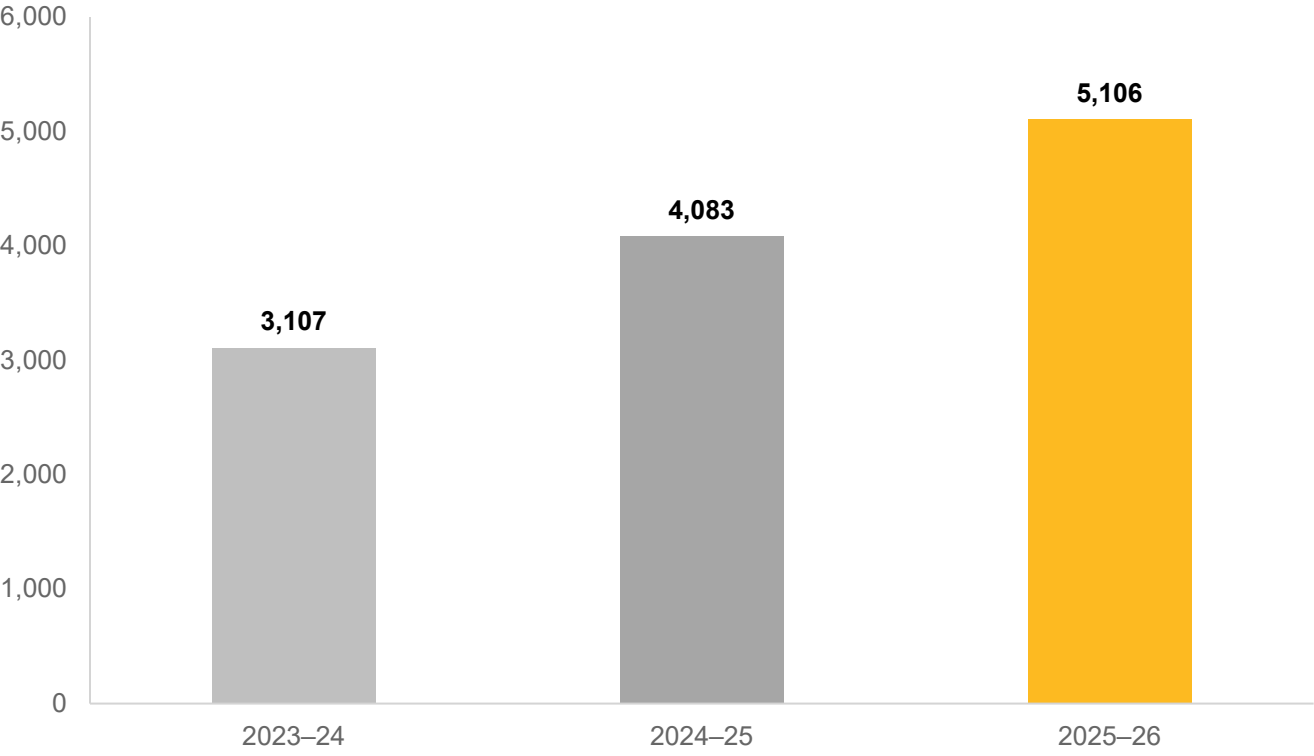

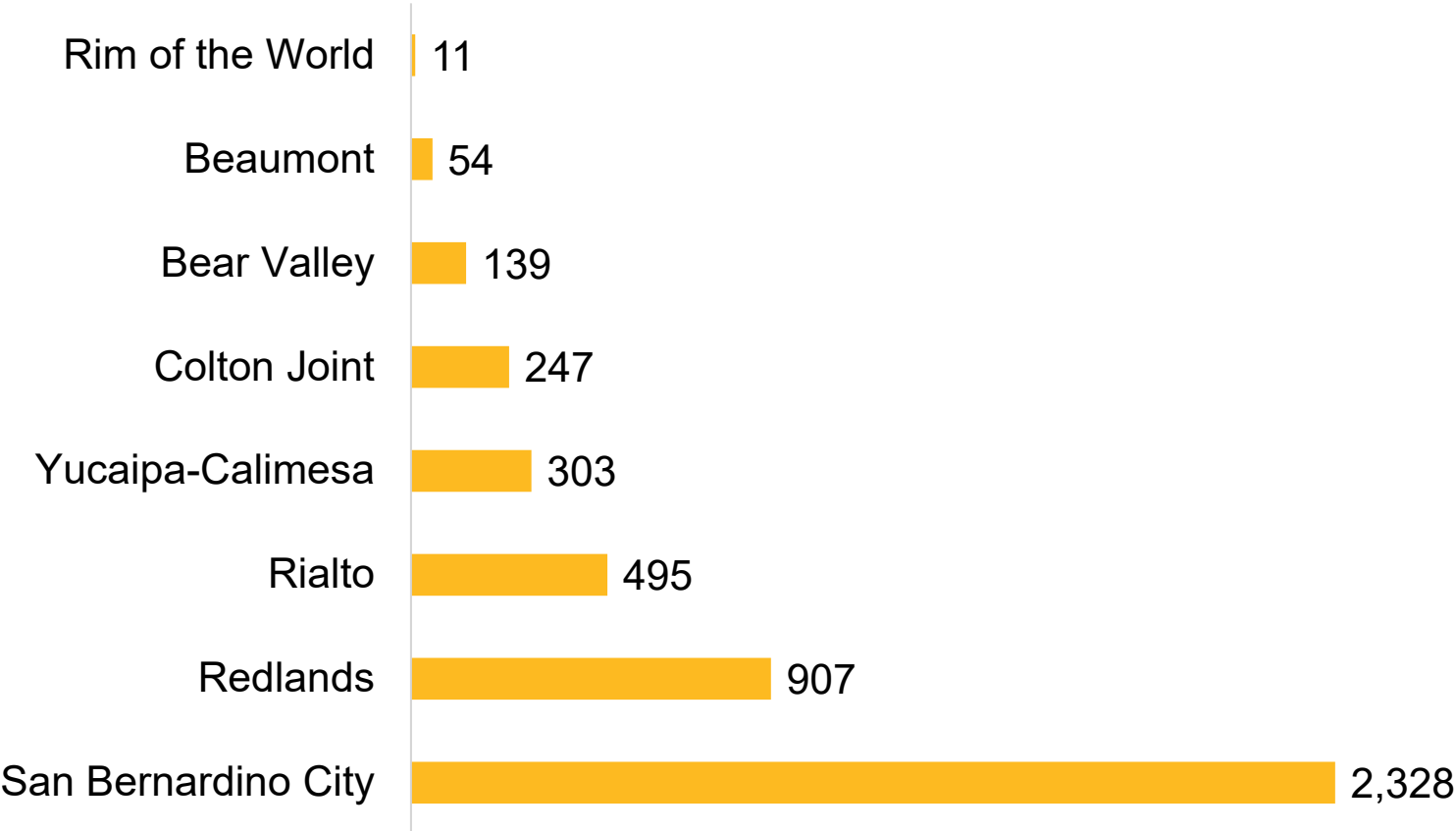

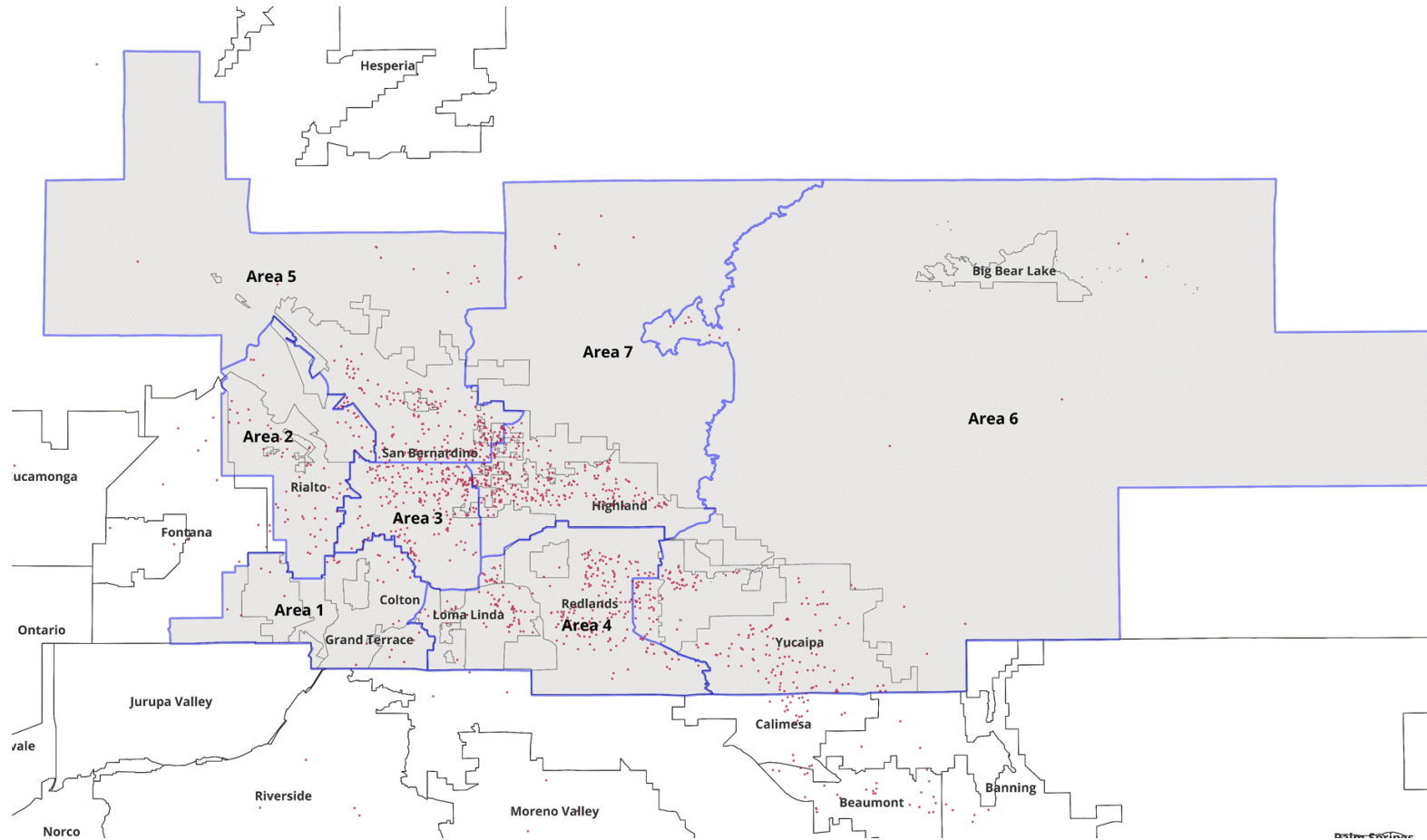

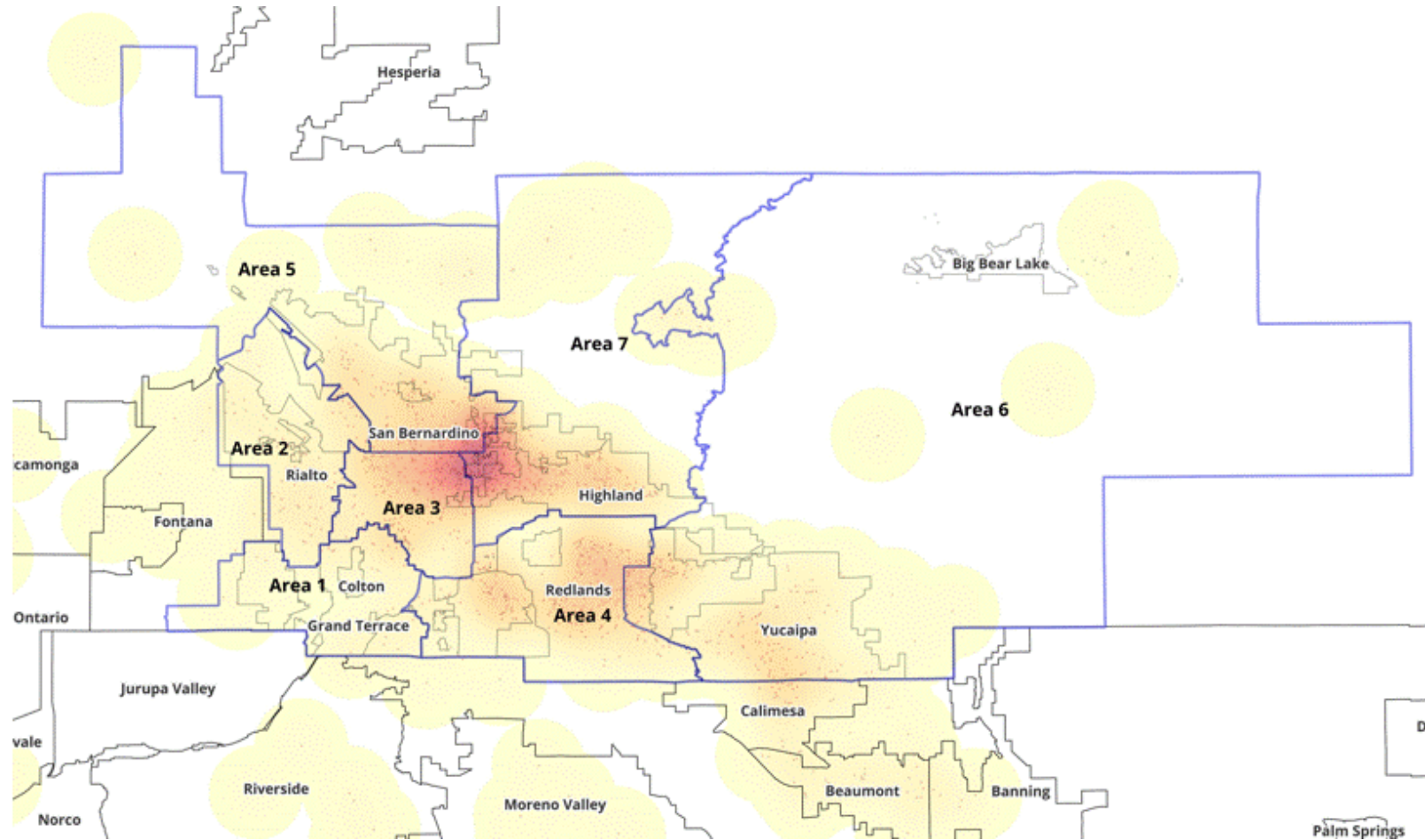

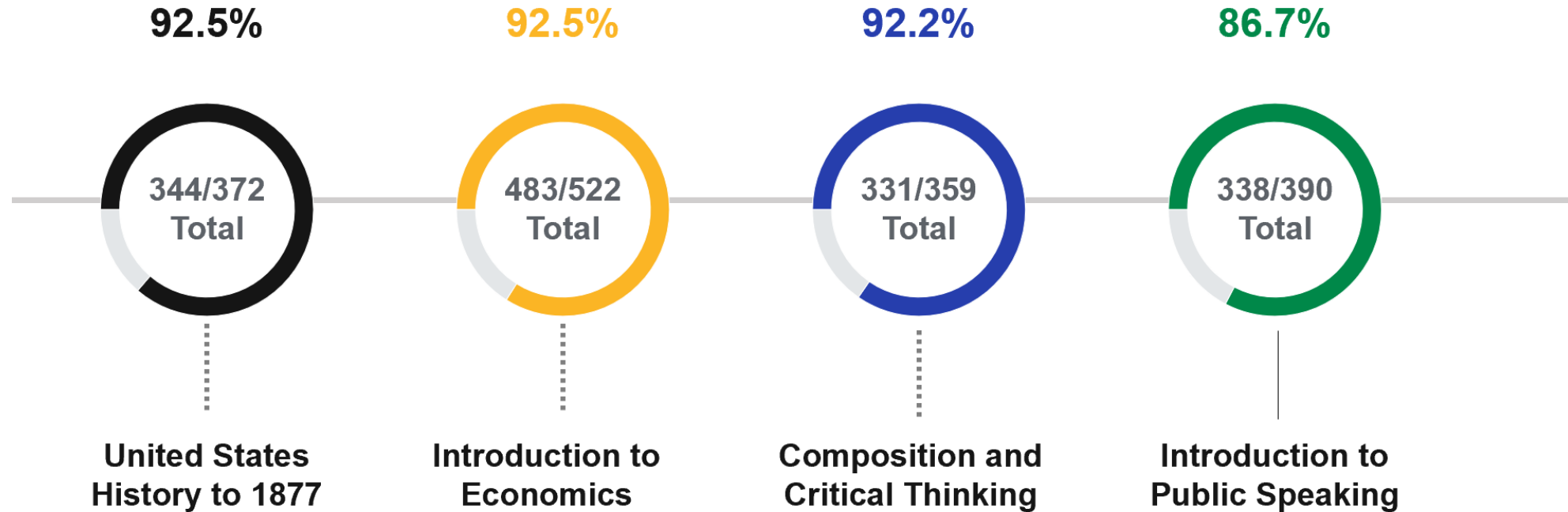

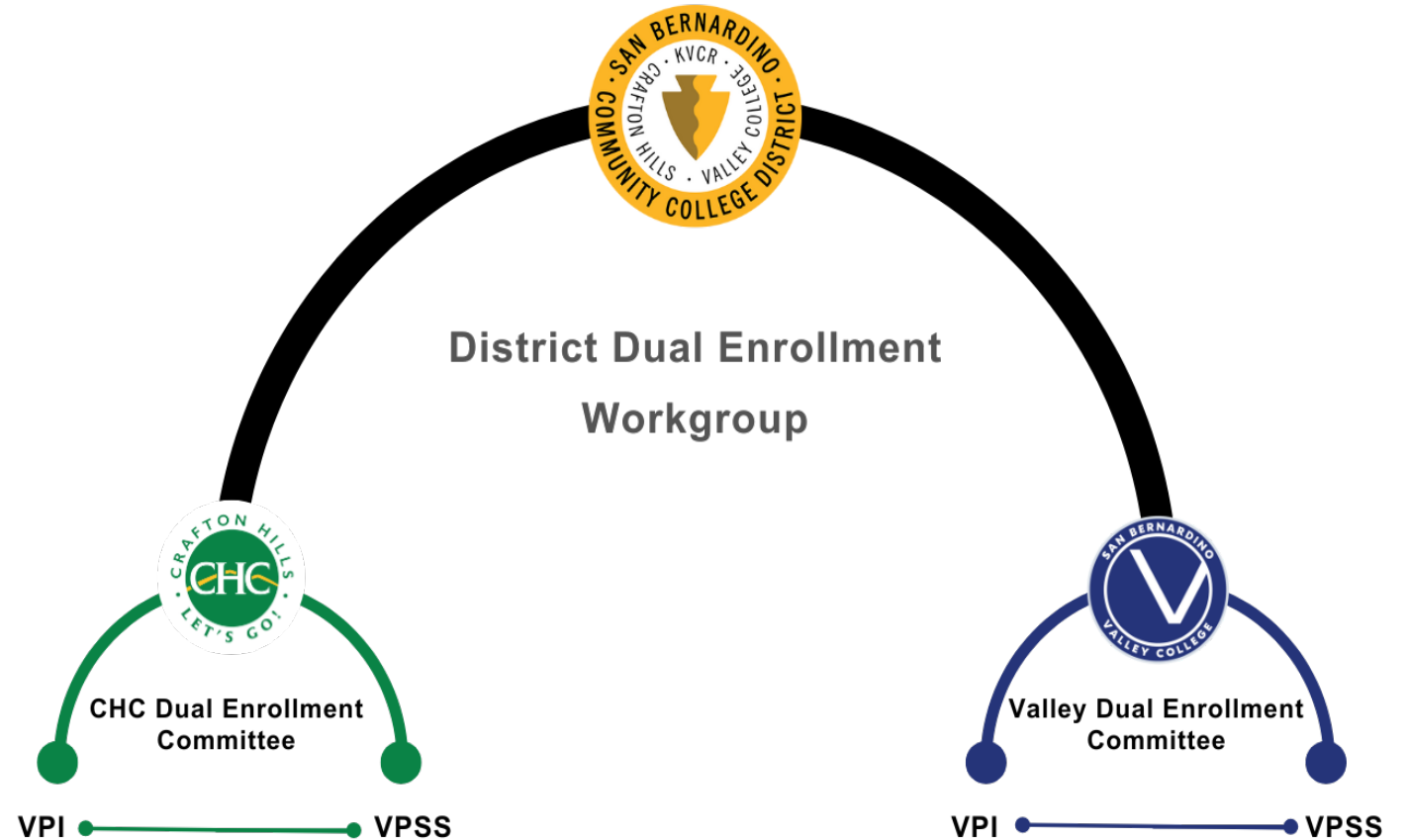

## Schedules that Work

- Course pathways aligned with graduation and college goals
- Flexible scheduling options
- Closer coordination with high school counselors

## Faculty Capacity

- Different bell schedules and instructor availability make staffing difficult. Crafton is developing clearer schedules and support for participating faculty.

**Focus: make dual enrollment easier to teach, schedule and sustain**

# A New Support Model Helps Students Stay Enrolled and Complete Courses

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## Dual Enrollment Counselor

- Builds an education plan tied to high school and college goals
- Helps students choose the right courses
- Connects students with counseling and campus resources

## Dual Enrollment Completion Coach

- Maintains regular contact during the semester
- Identifies attendance, academic or technology concerns early
- Provides focused help and follows up on next steps

**Success measure: more students remain enrolled and successfully complete their courses**
