



- The Districtwide comprehensive master plan includes the following outcomes:
 - 1. Districtwide Student Support Services & Strategic Plan
 - ➤ Establishes the clear direction for the District in supporting each college's future of academic and student support
 - 2. College Educational Master Plan
 - ➤ Documents the college vision for the future academic and student support
 - 3. College Facilities Master Plan
 - Addresses the growth in enrollment planned over the next 15 years



Districtwide Master Planning

- The Facility Master Plan is an outcome of an integrated planning process that involves collegial consultation:
 - Technology, Enrollment
 Management, Budget, Grants,
 Marketing Plans
 - o Educational Master Plan
 - SBCCD's Strategic Plan
 - State Chancellor's Strategic Plan



- The Facility Master Plan at each Campus has been developed by doing:
 - ☐ Facilities Analysis
 - (Services Area, neighborhood Context, Existing Campus, Environmental Conditions, Vehicular Circulation + Parking, Facilities Conditions, Space Utilization, Site Facilities Infrastructure)
 - ☐ Needs & Assessments
 - Educational Plan Linkages, Quantified Space Needs, Planning Objective and Principals
 - ☐ Recommendations
 - Recommended Demolition + Replacements, Opportunities, Long-Range Campus Master Plan





Prioritization Process, Criteria and Considerations:

- ☐ Subject-matter experts in facilities management and administration
- Districtwide mission and goal to serve more students
- ☐ Institutional and program expansion based on community needs and assessments
- ☐ Major health and safety issues associated with the existing facilities
- ☐ Federal and State law compliances with specific college programs
- ☐ Impacts to the District due the failure of existing facilities that are unmaintainable
- ☐ Combining and phasing different facilities (new and repurposing) based on campus institutional program impacts, construction operation, planning and logistical consideration





- 1. SBVC Career Pathway 1 (New Construction) & M&O Building Repurposing.
- 2. CHC Performance Arts Center Renovation.
- 3. SBVC Parking Structure (New Construction).
- 4. SBVC Softball Field (New Construction).
- 5. SBVC Student Services + Instructional Building (New Construction), Admin Building Repurposing, and Campus Center Repurposing.
- 6. CHC Crafton Hall Renovation, West Complex Renovation, Student Support Building Renovation, and Gymnasium Demolition.
- 7. CHC East Valley Public Safety Training Center (New Construction).
- 8. SBVC Career Pathways, Phase 2 (New Construction) & PS/HLS building secondary effects
- 9. SBVC Warehouse Facilities (New Construction).



Prioritization (Continued):

- 10.SBVC Library Repurposing.
- 11.CHC Joint-use Tennis Facilities (New Construction).
- 12.SBVC Greek Theater + Planetarium Renovation.
- 13.CHC New Gymnasium (New Construction), including Soccer Field and Outdoor Kinesiology Laboratories.
- 14.CHC Maintenance and Operations Additions (Ne Construction).
- 15.CHC East Instructional Building (New Construction).
- 16.CHC Teaching Pool (New Construction).
- 17.CHC Central Complex 2 Renovation.
- 18.CHC Child Development Center Renovation.



Statewide Facilities Funding Updates

Last November election, the State of CA passed Proposition 51 approving \$9.0B.
Statewide Bond Initiative for Community College Districts is \$2.0B.
The state has developed three funding cycles : - \$750M for 2017/18 – cycle 1 - \$750M for 2018/19 – cycle 2 - \$500M for 2019/20 – cycle 3
In 2016/17, we submitted FPP (Final Project Proposal) to CCCCO for New Technology Building at SBVC. If it is approved then it will be qualified for cycle 2 funding.
Both New Parking Structure and/or New Softball Field at SBVC are not legible for State-Funding.
PAC renovation & Gym replacement at CHC and Students Services + Instructional Building at SBVC will be a good candidate for State-funding in 2019/20 if New Tech has been denied.
