Glossary of Terms

Collegial Process: Concept embraced by SBCCD to ensure faculty, management, classified staff, and students receive the right to participate effectively in particular areas where they have their responsibility and expertise as specified in Title 5 regulations, while the Board of Trustees retains its own right and responsibility in all areas defined by state laws and regulations. (www.sbccd.org – BP 2510)

Distribution: The amount of income generated from the investment of principal that is dispersed to SBCCD.

Educational & Facilities Master Plans: Refers to districtwide master planning documents entitled SBVC Comprehensive Master Plan and Appendix; CHC Comprehensive Master Plan and Appendix; and Districtwide Support Services Strategic Plan

FCC – Federal Communications

Commission: The Federal Communications Commission regulates interstate and international communications by radio, television, wire, satellite, and cable in all 50 states, the District of Columbia and U.S. territories. An independent U.S. government agency overseen by Congress, the Commission is the federal agency responsible for implementing and enforcing America's communications law and regulations. Fund Balance: The difference between fund assets and fund liabilities of governmental and similar trust funds; used to describe the net assets, or available resources, of funds.

General Fund: The fund used to account for the ordinary operations of the district. It is available for any legally authorized purpose not specified for payment by other funds.

Principal: Principal used to refer to the original amount of an investment, separate from any earnings or interest accrued. (www.investopedia.com)

Proceeds: The profits or returns from a sale, investment, etc. (www.dictionary.com)

SBCCD – San Bernardino Community

College District: The San Bernardino Community College District is comprised of two fully-accredited campuses – Crafton Hills College and San Bernardino Valley College, the Economic Development & Corporate Training division, and KVCR.

UHF – Ultra High Frequency: Radio waves with frequencies that run between 300 and 3,000 megahertz. (www.dictionary.com)

VHF – Very High Frequency: Radio waves with frequencies between 30 and 300 megahertz. (www.dictionary.com)
