

Role of Board of Directors

- To create opportunities for the Foundation by leveraging their network and resources to promote initiatives the Foundation pursues as well as to bring new resources to the Foundation.
- Oversee the administrative side of the Foundation by helping to adjust the bylaws as needed and to provide feedback on initiatives we pursue
- Fundraise on behalf of the Foundation by connecting potential donors, underwriters, and resources that are needed.
- Contribute \$2,000 annually to cover operational costs of the Foundation.
- Attend 75% of five or six meetings annually and participate and promote special events.

Role of Board of Trustees

- To approve all Foundation documents such as bylaws, master agreement, and articles of incorporation
- To approve all board of directors as they are appointed by the Board of Directors
- To approve any formal documents approved by the Board of Directors
- Working with Rebecca Orlauski at Mount San Jacinto College and Jose Marquez and Darcy McNaboe from the Community Foundation to get a training for the Board as well as to provide additional information to you all on responsibilities.

These grants allowed us to create the IE Accelerator, featuring Kids Camps where programs at SBVC will be highlighted along with employment data to help parent's understand how important SBVC is in their child's educational career. The IE Accelerator will support entrepreneurship and STEAM. This creates a central point with supporting KVCR, EDCT, SBVC, and the District.

These outcomes contributed to the competativeness and resulting award of the Department of Commerce grant for \$3,000,000 and purchase the San Manuel building on Highland and upgrade of the 8th Street Annex.
