- I. WELCOME & INTRODUCTIONS

Trustee Gonzales called the meeting to order at 2:30 p.m.

II. PUBLIC COMMENT

There were no public comments.

III. APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF June 8, 2023

Trustee Houston made a motion to approve the minutes which Trustee Gonzales seconded. The motion was approved by the following vote.

IV. CURRENT TOPICS

Bond Measure Construction Update

Members of SBCCD's Program Management Team, AECOM, gave a presentation of the Bond Construction Program, including its extensive Sustainability component. Highlights included:

- 14 projects are currently underway with an approximate \$80 million expended to date.
- Program wide change order percentage on the \$349 million in outstanding contracts is only 0.46%.
- The SBVC Tech Building, which is partially state funded, is 40% complete and anticipated to be finished November 2024.
- The CHC Performing Arts Center, also partially state funded, began construction in May 2023 and is projected to be complete in April of 2025.

• The program includes a robust effort toward Sustainability, including HVAC system upgrades, lighting improvements, sustainable landscaping, drip irrigation, and tankless water heaters to reduce waste.

It was explained that an Envisions Certification is to sustainable infrastructure what LEED certification is to a building.

Executive Vice Chancellor Torres pointed out that all these funds have been expended and commended those at the colleges and DSO that worked to make this happen to the benefit of our students.

C. Enrollment

BFC members were shown an FTES report that was revised and more up to date than the one received in their meeting materials packet. Vice Chancellor Ornelas reported that SBCCD is at 46% of its FTES target for 2023-24, which is a better start than that of the past two years.

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SUMMARY

This report summarizes the workforce of the SBCCD bond program construction projects completed or currently underway, including the following:

PMO Tenants Upgrade
SBVC Library Roof Replacement
SBVC Piping
SBVC New Softball Field
SBVC New Technical Building
SBVC Fume Hoods Upgrade
SBVC East Wing Mechanical Upgrades

Local contractors detailed in this report total 133 and represent cities such as San Bernardino, Colton, Redlands, Fontana, and others.

The CBA and District Board Policy 6610 establish a goal for local resident usage of 50%. The CBA lists two different methods for determining local hire – city residency and ZIP codes. The Solís Group (TSG) analyzed local hire through three lenses: head count of the workers on site, hours performed by workers on site, and payments made to workers. To date local workers have received \$1,462,170.62. The tables and graphs summarize attainment by all three metrics using city residency.

XBE (Minority, Women, Veteran) CERTIFIED CONTRACTOR USAGE

The report also details usage of local workers and businesses with an XBE Certification, also known as Minority, Women, or Veteran Businesses. An evaluation of their attainment of its goals allows an analysis of its success. To date Minority/Women/Veteran businesses have attained \$14M in contracts.


District Board Policy 6610 establishes a goal of 25% combined participation of minority and women owned certified businesses. It also establishes a goal of 10% participation of veteran owned certified businesses. Some of the Women/Minority owned businesses include: SailRock (CHC Gym Demo), AQS Mechanical (CHC Childcare Development Center), Ace Fence Company (SBVC New Technical Building), J's Pipeline Construction (SBVC New Technical Building) and Western Paving Inc. (SBVC New Technical Building). Veteran owned businesses include: American Iron (CHC Gym Demo), Green Contractors, Inc. (SBVC Softball Field), Choice Building Solutions (CHC Childcare Development Center).


Overall, as of August 2023, local businesses have been awarded \$163M in contracts. This includes services for architecture & engineering, civil survey engineering, commissioning, geotechnical survey, hazardous material assessment, special inspections and materials testing, landscape architects, mechanical electrical plumbing, construction, environmental consulting, environmental monitoring, and construction management.

2. Goals.

- A. Local Hires and Local Business: The Board establishes goals of fifty percent (50%) participation of Local Hires and twenty-five percent (25%) participation of Local Businesses in its District Bid projects awarded each fiscal year. These goals are reflective of the demographics and diversity of the District's community. Bid documents will be amended to include these responsiveness requirements on a project-by-project Bid basis, but the goal will be evaluated based on an entire fiscal year assessment.
 - B. Minority/Women Owned Business Enterprises: The Board establishes a goal of twenty-five percent (25%) combined participation of minority and women owned certified businesses as contractors on District Projects. Bid documents will be amended to include these responsiveness requirements on a project-by-project Bid basis, but the goal will be evaluated based on an entire fiscal year assessment.
- C. Veteran Owned Business Enterprise Program: The Board establishes a goal of ten percent (10%) participation of veteran owned certified businesses as contractors on District Projects. Bid documents will be amended to include these responsiveness requirements on a project-by-project Bid basis, but the goal will be evaluated based on an entire fiscal year assessment.

3. Bidding.

As a condition to be considered responsive, a Bid must include the following:

- A. Demonstrated participation of at least fifty percent, (50%), and twenty-five percent, (25%), of the total bid being performed by Local Hires and Local Businesses; or
- B. A demonstrated good faith effort to include Local Hires and Local Businesses, in accordance with regulations to be issued by the Chancellor; or,
- C. The bidder certifies that it intends to perform ninety-five percent (95%) of the work within the scope of their contract.

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- D. The District has set a goal of 25% combined utilization of MBE and WBE 86 contractors on its District Projects. 87
- E. The District has set a goal of 10% combined utilization of VOBE, VOSB, 89 SDVBE AND DVBE contractors on its District Projects. 90
- F. The District recognizes MBE, WBE, VOBE, VOSB, SDVBE, and DVBE 92 businesses certified by the appropriate federal, state, and local agencies 93 approved by the District for such purpose. 94
