#### IV. ADVOCACY UPDATE

Presentation by Ynez Canela.

A. Community College League of California Annual Legislative Conference

Members of the Board of Trustees, Campus Leadership, and the members of the Chancellor's Cabinet met with five legislative offices to advocate for eliminating barriers to accessing CalFresh food benefits, building student housing, ongoing funding for FNX, and more local news & diverse voices.

**B.** Association of Community College Trustees Legislative Summit Student leaders, Board Trustee Reyes, and members of the Chancellors Cabinet met with various legislators in D.C. The group advocated to streamline the CalFresh application process and increase federal funding for HSIs and facility improvements.

#### C. Bills of Interest

#### Goal 1: Eliminate Barriers to Student Access and Success

#### AB 870 (Arambula) Public social services: benefits for students.

• This bill would require the California Department of Social Services (CDSS) to convene a workgroup, comprised of relevant stakeholders as needed, to share best practices, updates, challenges, or other topics related to programs and vservices offered by the department that may be available to college students.

#### AB 928 (Reyes) CalFreshData Dashboard: students.

• This bill would require CDSS to update its CalFreshData Dashboard on an annual basis and as additional data become available about access to CalFresh by students enrolled in an institution of higher education.

#### AB 1173 (Ta) College and career fairs.

• This bill would require a school district or school that chooses to hold a college or career fair to notify each community college district that has overlapping jurisdiction with the school district or school of a college or career fair the school district or school is planning to hold.

#### Goal 3: Be a Leader and Partner in Addressing Regional Issues

#### AB 1198 (Grayson) GO-Biz: Equity in energy task force.

• This bill would establish, within the Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development (GO-Biz), the Equity in Energy Task Force with specified members, including the CCCs, to develop a comprehensive strategy aimed at addressing equity in the energy industry and increasing the participation rate of women, minorities, disabled individuals, and veteran-owned businesses, as well as individuals from disadvantaged communities.

# **2023 Advocacy Priorities**

**Goal 1:** Eliminate Barriers to Student Access and Success **CHC Strategic Direction 3:** Increase Student Success & Equity **SBVC Strategic Direction 5:** Utilize Quantitative and Qualitative Data to Understand Our Students' Lived Experiences and Better Support Them Towards Their Goals

- AB 870 (Arambula) Public social services: benefits for students.
  - This bill would require the California Department of Social Services (CDSS) to convene a workgroup, comprised of relevant stakeholders as needed, to share best practices, updates, challenges, or other topics related to programs and services offered by the department that may be available to college students.
- AB 928 (Reyes) CalFresh Data Dashboard: students.
  - This bill would require CDSS to update its CalFresh Data Dashboard on an annual basis and as additional data become available about access to CalFresh by students enrolled in an institution of higher education.
- AB 1514 (Reyes) Public social services: student eligibility.
  - This bill would require the State Department of Social Services to convene a workgroup comprised of, among others, the County Welfare Directors Association of California, to develop recommendations to allow data from Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) applications to be released to county welfare departments to authorize students to apply to receive public social services based on data collected pursuant to information from their FAFSA application.




