Budget Act



- Use LAO estimates for property taxes and DOF estimates for General Fund taxes to increase the level of funding available.
- This increases the Proposition 98 Guarantee.
- Less reduction in funding than in the Governor's May Revision.

Budget Act - COLA



- The budget uses about \$290 million of one-time funds to support a \$678 million investment in apportionment costs for 2023-24.
- This means that approximately 42% of the COLA is allocated using one-time funding creating a structural deficit that will need to be filled with the 2024-25 budget.
- Next year's COLA is initially estimated to be approximately 4%. The budget will have to backfill the \$290 million and fund the 4%.

Description
Provide priority enrollment for Higher School students participating in CCAP programs and provide that courses could be taught on high school or college campus - Signed
Provide estimated cost of course materials for each course - Signed
Authorize CSU to offer doctoral degrees not offered by UC - Signed
Adopt Satisfactory Academic Progress Standards that are similar with the federal government - Signed
Authorize a community college student to repeat one additional time a course they passed for enrichment purposes - Vetoed

Bill Number	Description
AB 1096 (Fong)	Authorize a CCC to offer course in a language other than English - Signed
AB 1291 (McCarty)	Create an ADT pilot project with UCLA - Signed
AB 1540 (Fong)	Require CCC to accept affidavit from CSAC for proof of AB 540 status - Signed
AB 1699 (McCarty)	First right of refusal for current classified employees - Vetoed

State Audits



- Transfer Including UC and CSU
- 50% Law



- COLA & Base Increase
 - COLA estimated at this point to be about 4%.
 - Top priority will be to backfill one-time funding going to COLA in 2023-24 and fund the additional COLA in 2024-25.



- Funding Formula
 - Funding floor kicks in for community colleges in 2025-26 so this is the last year that those districts that are not on the formula will receive a COLA.
 - Discussions regarding impact of formula on districts that are either on the funding floor or are on ECA.

> How much growth ought to be funded and how should it be applied.



• Implementation of Cal Grant Equity Framework

> The framework is in statute, it needs to be properly funded.

Would create a Cal Grant 2 for community colleges and a Cal Grant 4 for fouryear institutions.

Eliminate age and time-out-of-school limits for community colleges.

- Credit for Prior Learning
 - Mapping for military service
 - Expanding that mapping to the work world



• Faculty Support

Apprenticeship technical assistance

CPL curricular mapping

Professional learning for technology and AI





- Affordable Student Housing
 - Fund the projects that have already been approved either through a lease revenue bond or through additional (non-Proposition 98) General Fund.
 - Question if they will fund additional projects beyond what has already been approved.

Room for perhaps one or two more projects.



- Nursing
 - \$60 million in funding for nursing in the 2024-25 budget year to continue for five years.
 - Build out nursing capacity at community colleges.
