Safety Inspections:

- Print Shop to CHC: Michael would like to conduct a chemical exposure assessment on employees using the printing presses, to ensure that ventilation is adequate for the new workspace. FP&C staff confirmed last-minute HVAC modifications were/are being made to accommodate.
- Formaldehyde: A new round of formaldehyde surveys to be conducted in Biology/Anatomy pending arrival of cadavers. Michael is coordinating with Rosemarie Hansen and Van Muse.

Keenan Report:

 The number of injury claims at CHC is trending proportionate to last FY's total number. The running total dollar amount for FY 20 is unusually high for the number of claims.

Safety Trainings:

- Online: Michael has begun inputting training assignments into Keenan Safe Colleges by job description.
 There are a few "holes" that need to be addressed with Keenan. Goal is for employees to receive automated email notifications for new assignments (current employees do not automatically get prompts directed toward new hires).
