County department of public health dashboard has updated information on the positivity rate for Covid. The number of cases per 100,000. San Bernardino County is at 3.82%. We are at moderate in the orange tier, and we must maintain that for 2 weeks. We want to get to the yellow tier. 1% per 100,000. Yellow still maintains capacity at 50%.  Color coding may be scraped when we reopen.  Labs will remain online if we are limited to 50% capacity.  We must be consistent with CDC guidelines.
