	minimum for safety. Dave shared that we		
	are adhering to the state standard in		
	-		
	reference to slowly rolling back vaccine		
	mandates for the students. Tracking the		
	vaccine status of students will impose		
	barriers when the guidelines are being lifted.		
	Ruth stated that she asked her students in		
	February about going fully online. The		
	students wanted to be in-person with		
	precautions in place. She also asked about		
	masking, and they said that they felt safer		
	wearing masks. Larry mentioned that we		
	don't have a broad view of what the		
	students want. Does the committee need to		
	recommend that we reverse the vaccine		
	mandate in Summer, or can we remove the date?		
	Based upon this discussion, the Committee		
	revised a portion of the recommendation to		
	read: "Based upon the relaxing of pandemic-		

	driven safety measures, we recommend	
	reversing the implementation of the student	
	vaccine mandate in Summer 2022 and allow	
	for optional masking. following Spring	
	2022 ."	
	The committed discussed the	
	recommendation to poll the students and	
	employees and concluded it would be	
	informative to have the polling data.	
	Also, the committee wants to encourage	
	students/staff to get vaccinated. This is	
	going above the mandate.	
	Mike Alder stated that remote instruction
