- Raising Web IQ of the campus
community on their own website, and the
web as a whole

- Offer a lot more training than what you
think might be necessary. It won't be
enough

- Separate trainings into smaller,
digestible chunks. Also the trainings should
lead them through the steps from
brainstorming content, to organization, to
inputting content.

- Offer many open labs so people can
get help

- Record trainings so people don't feel they
need to learn everything at the training and
feel rushed

- Decentralization isn't a one size fits all
plan. i.e. in some divisions, the dean is very
involved, in others it's the division secretary.
In yet others, the faculty chairs and
individual faculty will be more involved.

- Allowing customization of
decentralization will make it easier to push
out to different departments.

- Decentralized control can be motivating
to your community

- Decentralized control can help with speed
of updates, and allow content to be updated
at the speed the community expects it.

- Decentralizing responsibility for content
helps the community become more
accessible

Cons/Problems/Issues/Things to look out
for.

- The staff directory is not very reliable, not
consistent with brands, and doesn't allow
flexibility in display, i.e. embedded contact
information. Speed of display

- Not all information is in an easily
accessible format for posting on the web
with minimal effort.

- Do a more comprehensive audit of what
pages are not available/ready for launch.

- Discuss clearly the defining line between
control of content and freedom for editors.
i.e. how should information be displayed,
what information is necessary, how to link to
content to prevent duplicate content.

- Style Guide and enforcement of Style
Guide

- SBVC will come up with a summary of
what they were recommended and how
these recommendations worked for them, as
well as what they found out on their own
