# Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee (CBOC) Report To The Community





### From Bruce Baron, Interim Chancellor, SBCCD

On behalf of our Board of Trustees, the SBCCD is very grateful for your support of our bond measures. The public trust in your local community colleges resulted in the approval of Measure P in 2002. This \$190 million bond

measure has improved safety and infrastructure, created new classrooms and training facilities at San Bernardino Valley College and at Crafton Hills College. The work in the Measure P Master Plan is just about completed.

To continue the work of the District Master Plan, the voters approved Measure M, a \$500 million general obligation bond, in 2008. The project list approved for both colleges under Measure M is now underway.

The community plays a significant role in the oversight of these bond measures through the Citizens Bond Oversight Committee. Regulated by the Ralph M. Brown Public Meetings Act, the Committee reviews expenditure reports to ensure that bond proceeds are expended only for the purpose described in the ballot measures.

Please take a moment to review the information in this report and to appreciate the wonderful resource that is in your own backyard. Your support of a community college education makes all the difference to the more than 20,000 students who come to us each year for an Associate Degree, to transfer to a four year institution, for a certificate in a particular skills program, or to take a course or two that will prepare them for a better job.

In this report you can see what the bond measures mean to the students attending both institutions, and why improved facilities, technology and infrastructure will enhance the learning environment for all those who study and work at the San Bernardino Community College District. Any investment in the community colleges will ultimately result in a citizenry better prepared to support their families and be productive members of our community.

#### **Certification of Expenditures**

The SBCCD Vice Chancellor of Fiscal Services certifies that the bond proceeds for the fiscal year 2010 were expended only for the purposes set forth in the ballot measure and that no bond proceeds were used for teacher or administration salaries, or other operating expenses. The expenditures for fiscal year 2010 will be audited by external auditors Eadie & Payne, and the findings presented to the CBOC in early 2011.

#### **Issuance of Bonds**

Bonds have been issued for the San Bernardino Community College District Measure P and Measure M construction programs as provided below:

#### Measure P

From May 2003—June 2009, Series A-E Bonds were issued in the amount of \$190,000,000. No further issuances will be made pursuant to Measure P.

#### Measure M

From December 2008—June 2009, Series A-C Bonds were issued in the amount of \$258,312,389. Additional Series will occur pursuant to law and the Bond issuance schedule, up to the approved amount of \$500,000,000.

# What is the Impact of these Bonds on the Taxpayer?

For fiscal year 2011, the bond debt to be raised is \$22,612,587. Each property owner is charged \$46.70 per \$100,000 of assessed value.

#### 2009-2010 CBO Committee Activities

The CBOC met on November 12, 2009, and on March 4 and August 24, 2010, to review bond expenditures and obtain an update on bond projects.

#### **Aquatics Center**

Dedicated on October 15, 2010, the CHC Aquatics Center contains an Olympic-sized swimming pool with eight long-course lanes, and a one-story building with locker rooms, showers, multi-purpose room, offices and mechanical equipment space. The facility will offer the Yucaipa swim teams and Yucaipa-Calimesa Joint Unified School District teams a place to practice and compete, as well as provide the opportunity for the creation of a swim curriculum at CHC.





#### **Library & Learning Resource Center**

Officially opened on the same day, the 60,000 square foot Library and Learning Resource Center houses an auditorium, copy center, art gallery, space for 80,000 books in the library, a multi-purpose learning center, and the technology and audiovisual services for the campus.

#### **Infrastructure Projects**

Infrastructure Project Packages 1-5 are all now complete.

#### SBVC Campus Welcomes Four New Buildings

The SBVC campus celebrated the completion and dedication of four new buildings in 2010, including two new classroom buildings opening in time for the Fall 2010 semester. Supported by the voter-approved Measure P in 2002, and bolstered by state funding, these facilities will serve the campus and student needs well into the 21st century.

Completed in 2009, the Custodial and Maintenance and Operations buildings are helping to support the infrastructure and operations of the campus.

Rising three stories and spanning 50,000+ square feet in the heart of campus, the new North Hall building is now the home for Criminal Justice, Music, Social and Consumer Sciences and Modern Languages.

On the southwest corner of campus near the corner of Mt. Vernon and Grant Avenues, the Media & Communications building is the new home of KVCR and the SBVC Radio, TV and Film program. More than 18,000 square feet of instructional and office space is highlighted by the latest and greatest technology in the electronic media industry.

Currently, a 56,000+ square foot Science building is under construction with plans to open in Summer of 2011. This facility will be the first LEED-certified structure on campus and will precede the vacating of the current Chemistry, Physical Science and old North Hall building.

Future projects on campus will be funded by the voterapproved Measure M and will include the first parking structure, Business building renovation, and major overhauls to the athletic and physical education facilities.
