# Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee (CBOC) Report To The Community





#### From Bruce Baron, Chancellor, SBCCD

It is my pleasure to bring you this Report to the Community on behalf of the San Bernardino Community College District (SBCCD). This brief but comprehensive overview of the current status of the Measure M Bond provides details on how your tax dollars are being spent, and how those dollars are making a significant

difference in the lives of our students.

The Bond programs have built classrooms, libraries and laboratories that are second-to-none, allowing those of us who work with the SBCCD to better prepare our students to compete in this ever-changing, very challenging global economy.

The voters in our service area have twice supported the District's mission through Bond issuances. The work set out in the 2002 Measure P is now virtually finished. The voters approved Measure M in 2008, a \$500M general obligation bond, to continue long-needed improvements on both campuses designed through our master planning process. However, we continue to be negatively affected by the steep drop in the economy and in property values, which have fallen 11.98% over the last two years, and the tax rate is now approaching the legal limit of \$25 for every \$100,000 of assessed value. As a result, the District remains unable to sell any more bonds in the near future, and what began as a \$500 million voter-approved bond program is now a \$258 million program.

The result is that many of the planned improvements have been put on hold at this time, and we have reprioritized our facilities plans and placed many taxpayer-approved projects on hold for an indefinite period. We continue to annually monitor conditions and will evaluate opportunities to realize the balance of the bond.

Regulated by the Ralph M. Brown Public Meetings Act, the Citizens Bond Oversight Committee reviews expenditure reports to ensure that proceeds of both bonds are expended only for the purposes described in the ballot measures, and that no funds go for unauthorized operating expenses. We appreciate their continued dedication and service.

Over 18,000+ students come each semester to our colleges for an Associate's Degree, to prepare to transfer to a four year institution, to earn a certificate in a particular skills program, or for courses to assist them with a better or new career. Education remains the ticket to a better life – and the community colleges remain the most reasonable way to acquire a quality education.

#### **Certification of Expenditures**

The SBCCD Vice Chancellor of Fiscal Services certifies that the bond proceeds for the fiscal year 2012 were expended only for the purposes set forth in the ballot measure and that no bond proceeds were used for teacher or administration salaries or for other operating expenses. The expenditures for fiscal year 2012 will be audited by external auditors Christy White, Accountancy Corporation, and the findings presented to the CBOC in early 2013.

#### **Issuance of Bonds**

Bonds have been issued for the San Bernardino Community College District Measure P and Measure M construction programs as provided below:

#### Measure P

From May 2003-June 2009, Series A-E Bonds were issued in the amount of \$190,000,000. No further issuances will be made pursuant to Measure P.

#### Measure M

From December 2008-June 2009, Series A-C Bonds were issued in the amount of \$258,312,389. Additional Series may occur pursuant to law and the Bond issuance schedule, up to the approved amount of \$500,000,000.

## What is the Impact of these Bonds on the Taxpayer?

For fiscal year 2013, the bond debt to be raised is \$22,806,426. Each property owner will be charged \$45.90 per \$100,000 of assessed value.

#### 2011-2012 CBOC Activities

The CBOC met on November 10, 2011; March 13, 2012; and August 21, 2012 to review bond expenditures and obtain updates on bond projects.

#### 2012-2013 CBOC Membership

The Committee is currently seeking a representative from the senior citizen community to replace James Booth, who is leaving after two terms of faithful service. Mr. Richard Greenhagen has graciously agreed to serve another twoyear term.


#### Crafton Hills College - Measure M Projects

#### Going Green Saves Big Bucks

The Crafton Hills College Solar Farm design process began in December 2011, construction started in February and the project went live on April 25. A 1.3 mW (megawatt) Concentrator Photovoltaic (CPV) system designed to produce 90-95% of the campus' electrical energy needs, the project will save approximately \$500,000-800,000 a year for the college. This is enough to power over 450 typical California homes or offset nearly 4 million pounds of CO<sup>2</sup> emissions, equivalent to removing over 4,000 cars from the road. \$14.2 million in engery savings is anticipated over the 25-year life of the power plant.

The project is part of the continuing renovations and expansions at Crafton Hills College provided by the Measure M Bond, California Community Colleges-Investor Owned Utilities (CCC-IOU) Partnership incentive program, and other financial programs such as the California Solar Initiative. In March, Southern California Edison presented the San Bernardino Community College District and Crafton Hills College with a check for \$1.83 million to be paid over five years as part of their solar initiative.

The system consists of 140 arrays spread out over six-seven acres at the campus, roughly located near the old golf course. The project



is the largest CPV plant in California and the largest SolFocus power plant in the world. Budgeted at \$7.4 million dollars, the project will pay for itself in less than eight years.



#### Smartphone, QR Codes, and Website Reveal Sustainable Features of New Physical Sciences Building

In August 2011, the new Physical Sciences building at San Bernardino Valley College opened for classes. It is the first Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED)-Certified building on campus and contains dozens of environmentally-friendly features such as water-saving toilets and native landscaping.

With the arrival of 13 different varieties of 10-inch square signs placed throughout 50 different locations in the 56,000-square-foot building's classrooms, labs, hallways, and elevators in December 2011, all visitors to the building can now interactively experience SBVC's commitment to sustainability. The signs promote the building's sustainable initiatives using a mixture of curious questioning and
